NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 1. During August 1969 the Seventh Communication Battalion continued to provide communication support to the 1st and 3rd Marine Divisions, 37th Signal Battalion (USA), 2nd Combined Action Group, 2nd Republic of Korea Marine Brigade, and U.S. Navy Riverine Flotilla 1.
- 2. Radio Relay and Construction Company continued its program of training allied personnel. A two-week program on cable and construction was conducted with four ARVN communicators from I Corps Signal Battalion. A six-day period of instruction on the operation and maintenance of the AN/MRC-62 and associated equipment was given to the communication detachment of the 2nd Republic of Korea Marine Brigade.
- 3. Improvements and additions continue to be made in the cantonment. Completed during the month were shower facilities, security towers, an IRO building, and a new Butler type building for Supply. Future plans call for hard surfacing of the Motor Transport area and construction of a new infiltration water system.


- a. Radio Relay and Construction Company

- d. Battalion Motor Transport made 1,213 runs for a total of 37,446 miles and transported 287 tons of cargo and 11,088 passengers during the period covered.



Third Marine Division is supported by a 41 man detachment with two AN/TRC-97E's and assorted comm center equipment.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of August, Communication Company continued to provide operational communication support to the 3rd Marine Division, Danang Signal Battalion (USA), 37th Signal Battalion, and 2nd Combined Action Group. On 5 August 1969, the personnel at Vandegrift Combat Base moved to Dong Ha to continue communications support within the 3rd Marine Division TAOR. A Battalion Staff Inspection was conducted during the week of 4-8 August 1969, and remedial action was affected within one week. Company personnel augmented the Battalion security force and working parties. Preventive maintenance was accomplished on organizational equipment. Several convoys were sent to Dong Ha to take care of administrative needs of personnel TAD to Communication Company, 3rd Marine Division. The Company football team captured the Battalion Intramural Flag Football Championship.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Radio Relay and Construction Company is now deployed from the DMZ to the Delta in support of III MAF Units and ComNavForV Riverine Operations in the Delta. Two AN/MRC-62 teams and equipment were deployed to Vung Tau and Dong Tam in support of River Flotilla on 2 August 1969.


On 12 August a company jeep carrying the Construction Platoon Commander, his driver and Major LAWBAUGH hit a mine resulting in 1 KIA and 2 WIA's. Both WIA's were evacuated out of country.

On 19 August, a change of command ceremony was held at which time Captain M. J. HILSINGER relieved Major J. H. WICKENS as Company Commander.

On 2 August 1969, a team led by GySgt BEAN returned from KMB after a six day period of instruction on operation and maintenance of the AN/MRC-62, GRC-10 and associated equipment. Results were satisfactory.

On 16 August 1969, a two-week cable and construction OJT program with four ARVN Communicators integrated into the Construction Platoon was concluded. These communicators ate, slept and worked alongside our own as members of the platoon.






