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~~SECRET~~PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY1. General Overview of Activities

This command has been primarily concerned with enhancing its operational capabilities by improving its combat equipment readiness posture and training.

2. Command Relations

This command is designated as a separate battalion under opcon/adcon of the Commanding General, 3rd Marine Division (-)(Rein), FMF.

3. Operations

This command is responsible for the Camp Fuji terminal of the radio circuit between Camp Fuji, Japan and Camp Courtney, Okinawa. This command also has standby responsibility for the Okinawa terminal.

On two occasions this command participated in a Commex with the USS Paul Revere (LPA-248).

4. Logistics

New equipment received includes one PU-781 and 11 PU-720's. The R&E program resulted in the receipt of two SB-86/PT's and the retrograde of one AN/MRC-87, one SB-86/PT and two SB-22's.

The command's AN/TTC-28 continues on temporary loan to CG MCB Camp Butler as a replacement for the Camp Hague telephone exchange.

Equipment readiness of combat essential items has averaged 76.6% for the period. Supplies on hand has averaged 97%.

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5. Civic Action

In a people-to-people project this Battalion provides instructors for weekly English classes at Kunigami Junior High School in Hentona, Okinawa and at Sate Junior High School in Sate, Okinawa. In addition, a team has installed shelves and painted a locker room at Kunigami Junior High School.

6. Personnel and Administration

This command has had acute personnel shortages. The manning level for the period of this report was set at 67.6% of T/O and the average personnel strength has been 62.7% of T/O.

7. Training

Training has been as extensive as possible consistent with the personnel situation and operational commitments. The following subjects have occupied the majority of training at the Battalion and Company level: venereal disease; drug abuse; map reading and land navigation; NBC; safe driving; military history, courtesy, and discipline; interior guard; artificial resuscitation; NCO leadership; code of conduct; first aid; sanitation and hygiene; physical conditioning; close order drill. Technical (MOS) training is continually taking place at the platoon/section level.

29 July 1970 - The Battalion completed moving from Camp Hansen to Camp Schwab.

27 July-21 August 1970 - This Command participated in the Military Assistance Program by conducting a four week communication course for CPO1 Ampai Maichareon, Royal Thai Marine Corps.

26 August 1970 - This Command hosted an "Open House" with an operational static display at Camp Schwab.

17 September 1970 - MajGen. L. H. Wilson, Commanding General, 3rd Marine Division, presented the Meritorious Unit Citation to this command for service in Viet Nam.

7-9 November 1970 - Communication Company conducted, under the direction of I MAF, a Commex with the USS Paul Revere (LPA-248). The purpose of the Commex was to test the communication capability of the ship.

3-5 December 1970 - The Battalion conducted a CPX/Commex in conjunction with the Division Commex 2-70. The Battalion simulated the communications of a Force Headquarters.

15-17 December 1970 - The Battalion provided equipment and personnel to Division units for the Division CPX 2-70, and was responsible for organizing and operating TEC communications.

17 December 1970 - The Commanding General, 3rd Marine Division, presented to this command the Commanding General's Trophy for intra-mural sports.

29-31 December 1970 - Communication Company and elements of Radio Relay and Construction Company conducted, under the direction of I MAF, a commex with the USS Paul Revere (LPA-248). The purpose of the Commex was to retest the communication capability of the ship and particularly to test the capability of the ship to handle a covered RATT circuit.

1. Purpose. To provide guidance for planning and the execution of training during the first quarter FY-1971.

2. General. Training will be conducted in accordance with references (a) through (d), this directive and such other directives as may be promulgated by this and higher headquarters. During phase I (7 Wks), emphasis shall be placed on individual training to include discipline, requalification firing, assignment to schools, MOS training, GMS training and team/crew training. Phase II (4 Wks), emphasis shall be on advanced unit and combined training. Requalification firing and assignment to schools will continue during phase II.

3. Mission. The training mission of the 7th Communication Battalion is to develop into a skilled force in readiness prepared at all times to carry out any mission which may be assigned. Training will be directed toward a capability of supporting units by amphibious, air or land movement.

4. Training Objectives. Training will be directed towards accomplishment of unit mission and attainment of combat readiness category of C-1 as defined by MCO P3000.2_.

5. Training Management

a. General guidance for the management of training is set forth in FM 21-5, Military Training Management.

b. Company Commanders will submit a weekly training schedule to this Headquarters in the format depicted in enclosure (2). In preparing training schedules, broad subject titles will be avoided. Every attempt will be made to include specific references which define the scope of training to be conducted. The names or billet titles of the instructors actually conducting the instruction should be used. When appropriate, training highlights will be included by annotating the subject in the remarks column.

c. Individual and technical training records will be maintained in the format prescribed by reference (d) and enclosure (3).

d. Independence Day, 4 July and Labor Day, 7 September 1970 are National Holidays. Friday, 3 July has also been designated a non-working day due to the fact that 4 July falls on Saturday.

e. Saturday afternoons normally will be utilized for physical fitness testing of those Marines who have previously failed.

f. This Headquarters (S-3) will schedule GMS training for all hands on broad subjects, such as Code of Conduct, FAM firing, CS Chamber, etc. This does not preclude Company Commanders scheduling GMS training for their units. Off/SNCO classes will also be scheduled by this Headquarters (S-3).

g. GMSPET will be administered to all Gunnery Sgts and below during subject training quarter as it becomes available from MCI.

h. Instructors assigned to conduct formal periods of instruction for all hands will submit lesson plans to this Headquarters (S-3) for approval five (5) days prior to scheduled date. Rehearsals may be on tape. Special Services have a tape recorder that may be utilized for rehearsal purposes. Company Commanders are responsible for approving technical training periods of instruction lesson plans and submitting Monthly Record of Training Accomplished in the format prescribed by enclosure (8).

i. This Headquarters (S-3) will publish a quarterly list of lesson plans on file.

j. Company Commanders will monitor their unit MCI program utilizing the monthly MCI Unit Activity Report. Submit one (1) copy of the UAR to S-3 with the monthly training report.

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k. Company Commanders will ensure that desktop procedures and turn-over folders are maintained by Ops/Trng Officers/NCO's in accordance with FMFPacO 5210.3.

6. Individual Training

a. Enclosure (4) lists the minimum required time to be devoted to training on selected subjects for all battalion personnel. Reference (a) lists the training objectives for NCO leadership training.

b. Rifle and pistol requalification firing will be emphasized to attain 75% completion during this quarter.

c. Company Commanders will establish and supervise a weight control program with medical control in accordance with MCO 6100.3_ and DivO 6100.1_.

d. Company Commanders will ensure maximum participation at scheduled periods of instruction.

7. Company and Combined Training. Company Commanders are encouraged to conduct field training during phase II training to include CP displacements, occupation of bivouac areas and blackout and noise discipline.

8. Officer and Non-Commissioned Officer Training

a. Required minimum training for officers/SNCO's is two (2) hours monthly. This Headquarters will schedule this training from the following subjects:

- Leadership
- Administration
- Human Relations
- Legal Matters
- Drug Abuse
- Tactics
- Security of Classified Material
- Communications Security
- Ground/Weapons Safety
- Counter Intelligence
- Current Events

b. Training for Sergeants and Corporals will include the below listed subjects and those listed in reference (a):

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Leadership
Technique of Military Instruction
Interior Guard
Map Reading and Land Navigation
Human Relations
Legal Matters
Ground/Weapons Safety
Discipline
Current Events

9. Schools. Information concerning schools availability is provided by separate message/bulletins. Nominees must be screened to ensure they meet the necessary prerequisites and are well motivated. Maximum utilization will be made of available schools.

10. Training Supervision

a. Battalion Commanding Officer's inspections will be scheduled by this headquarters.

b. Inspections of the type listed in DivO 5041.4_ will be scheduled by Company Commanders as necessary in the discharge of command responsibilities.

c. Inspections of training in progress may be conducted by the Commanding General, Assistant Division Commander, General and Special Staff Officers, this Headquarters (S-3), and appointed training inspectors on an unscheduled basis. This Headquarters will assign monitors for battalion level periods of instruction.

d. Company Commanders should appoint class monitors for scheduled periods of instruction. Attendance rosters (enclosure 5) will be submitted to this Headquarters (S-3) on all scheduled periods of instructions.

e. All training will be conducted within the constraints of sound safety principles.

11. Action. Company Commanders will pursue a vigorous and continuing program to ensure that the contents and spirit of this directive are followed in the conduct of training at all levels.

1. Purpose. To provide guidance for planning and the execution of training during the second quarter of Fiscal Year 1971.
