1. 1-22 June, Communication Support Company, 7th Communication Battalion, continued to fulfill the mission of providing communication support to the 3d Marine Amphibious Brigade.

1. Combat Operation: 1-22 June, the Company continues to fulfill a commitment of providing a rifle reaction force for the defense of Camp Brooks.

a. 23-24 June, the company, remaining aircraft flight and shipboard embarkation detachments provided local security in respective areas.

2. Routine Operations

a. Support Platoon

(1) The motor transport section dispatched 341 vehicles during the month. These vehicles logged 6,430 miles, while transporting 1,550 passengers and 2,000 tons of cargo.

Encl: (1) Training Schedule

1. Purpose. To publish a Company Training Schedule requirements for the period of 1 through 30 June 1971.

2. Cancellation. CoBul 1510 dated 1 May 1971.

3. Information. Company training is designed to present instructions on subjects necessary to enhance personnel qualifications in their MOS and to increase the overall professional knowledge of individual Marines of this Command.

4. Action.

a. Platoon and Section Leaders.

- (1) Conduct MOS training in accordance with enclosure (1).
- (2) Insure maximum attendance of personnel at all scheduled training.
- (3) Insure that appropriate training records, personnel data cards, and/or lesson plans are maintained for personnel or occupational field.

b. Instructors.

- (1) Prepare two copies of lesson plans for all assigned period(s) of instruction, section or company level.
- (2) One copy, will be used for instruction, one copy available, during the class, for use by a monitor, if assigned.
- (3) Lesson plans may be typed or handwritten, but must be legible and in the format prescribed in reference (a).
- (4) The lesson plans will be turned into the Company Training NCO, within three days after the class is presented, for file purposes.

c. Company Training NCO.

(1) Will assign monitors to each scheduled company conducted class, and as a minimum requirement, those scheduled by the individual platoon or section and as are designated for the weekly training highlight, as shown in enclosure (1).

(2) Will prepare rosters for each scheduled company period of instruction, in order that sections/platoons may update individual training records/forms.

(3) Will periodically screen instructor personnel, to insure that they are effective in presentation, lesson plans and knowledge of subject.

d. Uniform for Inspections.

(1) Company inspections will be conducted in the Uniform of the Day, with normal arms; cartridge belt with four magazines and pouches, one canteen with cup and carrier, on the right hip, and first aid packet centered in the rear.

(2) Embarkation inspections will be without normal arms; I.D. tags, cards, shot bands and malaria tablets will be worn or carried.

(3) Bayonets will not be worn or issued.

5. Training Sections.

a. Each Section/Platoon will initiate a PORT and STARBOARD training section of available personnel, and furnish up-to-date rosters to the Company Training NCO, as required.


b. Company training and inspections will be conducted by this port/starboard designation.

6. Special.

a. Due to projected commitments in support of the 3rd Marine Amphibious Brigade, formal technical training will not be conducted or scheduled, maximum of on-the-job training will be used during this period, to support the MAB or for recovery for embarkation and deployment.

b. The Advance Party and both Shipboard Detachments will be furnished GMS available for training, during movement to new duty station.
