

 NARRATIVE SUMMARY

The 7th Engineer Battalion continued support of the III Marine Amphibious Force within the DaNang area. Platoons from the attached 1st and 3rd Bridge Companies are rendering additional support in the Chu Lai, Hue/Phu Bai, and Dong Ha area.

Company "A", 7th Engineer Battalion continues upgrading of Routes 33 and 39 for class 50 traffic. Work also continued on the Ha Thanh Dam with that project being approximately 32% complete at the end of the reporting period.

Company "B", 7th Engineer Battalion continued upgrading of Route 1 for class 50 traffic. The Song Thanh Quit river bridge was completed on 30 May and opened for traffic.

Company "C", 7th Engineer Battalion continues upgrading of Route 5 north for class 50 traffic. Repairs to the Song Cau Do river bridge was started. This project will consist of replacing decking and curbing throughout the bridge. This work will be accomplished at night so bridge will be open for traffic during day light hours.

Company "D", 7th Engineer Battalion continued upgrading of Route 5 south and started opening Route 14 west in support of Operation Mameluke Thrust. A summary of work completed in support of the above operation is as follows:

a. Following a recent ambush Company "D" cleared the road of two blown vehicles, retrieved the remaining 6 vehicles and filled in 75% of the road craters.

b. Company "D" policed the road at the ambush site and destroyed 45, 155 rounds.

c. By-pass roads were prepared at the following bridge sites ~~209554~~, ~~191559~~, and ~~183555~~.

d. In addition, culverts were emplaced at ~~191559~~, and ~~183555~~ after recent hard rains by-passes at ~~209554~~, ~~191559~~, and ~~183555~~ were repaired, and serious road craters were repaired.

e. Artillery installations were also ably assisted by providing berms for 155mm and 105mm arty positions at Thung Duc.

f. Company "D" also helped to alleviate the fuel shortage at combat bases by hauling 800 gallon tanks of diesel oil to Thung Duc.

g. Company "D" has provided all required engineer support, both hasty and deliberate, thus far both.

h. Thus far 4 WIA's from 7th Engr Bn have been encountered in addition to 1 M-51 dump truck completely destroyed, 2 others badly damaged as was one MRS-100 and one grader. The MRS-100 and grader have been returned to operation, however the 2 M-51 dump trucks have not.

The 3rd Bridge Company continued to furnish tactical bridge support for the northern part of the I Corps area. Support consisted of installing and maintaining tactical bridging with emphasis being placed on Route 9.

c. Organization and Operations

(1) Officer Assignments - See TAB A, Enclosure (1)

(2) Operations

1 May: Battalion Commander effected liaison with the following organizations in the Phu Bai area relative to the movement/installation of M-4 and M4T6 bridging, 3rd Bridge Co., Task Force X-Ray, PCV and 32 NCR.

2 May: Completed upgrading of Route 12 east. Earth Dam (Ha Thanh Dam) gave way causing a 15 foot gap. Filled gap with laterite fill and stopped flow of water.

3 May: Song Thu Bon Ferry supported a 7th Marine Operation at Goi Hoi island. The ferry transported tanks, amtracs and personnel across river without incident.

4 May: Wing Engineer inspected and accepted bomb storage area at the DaNang Airbase. Project is 100% complete with exception of minor grading which will be accomplished by 6 May. On 6 May men and equipment will return to this CP from project site.

5 May: Bridge on Route 14 east at AT 932579 was blown up and completely destroyed including the abutments. Installed one 180' M-6 single truss bridge at BT 082555 on Route 1.

6 May: Completed berm job at DaNang Airbase. Earth work amounted to 91,049 cu.yds. of fill hauled and spread in 54 work days. As previously noted this job was accepted by the 1st Mar Air Wing Engr. Asphaltting of berms, laying of rock and asphalt roads are to be performed by another agency.

7 May: Removed class 60 superstructure bridge from Song Cau Do and delivered it to the III MAF Ferry Pier. Continued work of reinforcing the dam and digging original slab of concrete free of mud at the Ha Thanh Dam site. One 36" culvert was completely destroyed on Route 5 at AT 922563. Installed one 36" culvert in the same position as the one above was destroyed.

8 May: The increased number of alerts on Companies B, C, and D are having an adverse affect on the amount of productive hours.

9 May: Contact made with Mr. Iveton of Base Development pertaining to the design of the Ha Thanh Dam. Due to the high deadline rate of M-51 dump trucks at the present time, 23 of 50 M-51's are deadlined, this hampers this Battalions earth moving capabilities.

10 May 1968: Furnished 2 Simco's with K-G blades to 1st Engr Bn in the Land Clearing Project. Made liaison with 30th NCR about transit mix concrete for Ha Thanh Dam. They said that they would not be able to support us on this project. Began providing assistance to MAG-11 for moving 28 huts and 5 maintenance buildings. Removed M-4 pontoon bridge at BT 430109; have started to put it in for bridge at BT 498066.

11 May: All materials have arrived for Hue river bridge job. (200 feet of M-4 arrived from DaNang). The cable system will be completed by 11 May. Assembly of the bridge will begin 11 May.

12 May: Lack of security for the opening of the road between An Hoi and Phu Loc-6 has, as all interested parties concerned are aware, been halted. This problem, if not resolved prior to 1 June 1968, will necessitate the withdraw of the men and equipment in order that they may be gainfully employed elsewhere in the southern AOR of this Battalion. It is the intent to execute the above commencing 1 June 1968 unless otherwise directed by higher headquarters. 3rd Bridge Company repaired the damaged Eifel span on the An Lo Bridge by shoring with 14 wide flanges and 12 I-beams. The bridge is now restored to its former classification. Personnel have installed 30 sections of M-4 bridging in the water at the Hue river bridge. The ARVN's are going rather slowly, however, with a little assistance they should also finish on time. The ARVN Commander has reassessed his cable system and now thinks that he must have an unspliced 1-1/8" cable of 1,650ft. in length or 2 unspliced 3/4" cables each being 650 feet in length. The ARVN Co. will be at the site to help acquire material.

13 May: Air lifted one M-37 truck and one M-51 from An Hoi to DaNang for 3rd echelon maintenance. Once repaired these items will not return to An Hoi. One 36" culvert was blown on Route 5 at AT 916594 and repaired.

14 May: The Ha Thanh Dam job is 28% complete. Most of the work expended to reach this percentage of completion was achieved last summer. Presently work continues on cleaning up the dam foundation. Seventeen Vietnamese Nationals are now assisting in the work at the dam.

15 May: Cleared right of way on both sides on Route 1 south for approximately 600 meters of Section II of Dien Ban.

16 May: Increase in the number of alerts is adversely affecting the work of Companies "B", "C", and "D". Put up 200 meters of single apron fence at DaNang barrier job, project is 2% complete.

18 May: Both bridge boats at the Song Thu Bon Ferry broke down at the same time. Received ARVN bridge boat and found it to have a six inch split along a seam in starboard hull. ARVN bridge boat is inoperable. Continued work on DaNang defensive barrier. 220 meters of wire barrier are complete. Project is 18% complete.

19 May: The following difficulties have been encountered with the Ha Thanh Dam project: 30th NCR will not support the project with transit mix. All available rebar (of any size) will have been expended by 20 May 1968. There is no concrete aggregate available at this time. 450 cu.yds. are required, III AF Engr has been notified. "CORDS" has provided no materials whatsoever for this period of construction. The following is a synopsis of the 7th Engr Bn's requirements and progress on operation Mam Luke Thrust: Responsibility for direct support of this operation has been assigned to Company "D", 7th Engr Bn and 1st Bridge Company, 7th Engr Bn. The maintenance and operation of two class 60 ferries

across the Song Thu Bon at AT 922533 has been changed by the Div Engr to one class 60 ferry which was installed and is operational. The opening, maintaining of Route 14 from Hill 37 to Thuong Duc has reached Hill 52. Attempts to continue westward from Hill 52 were halted yesterday because of enemy action. Further movement is dependent upon the tactical situation. The opening and maintaining of Route 5 from Liberty Bridge to An Hoa will be accomplished when adequate security forces are provided by the infantry agency in charge of the operation.

20 May: Cleared approximately 600 meters of right of way of Route 1 on Section II for the upgrading of QL-1. Graded Route 14 west from AT 918578 to AT 870574. In support of operation Hameluke Thrust. 450 meters of barrier complete (30%) at DaNang Airbase. 1st Bridge Company checked cable system and bridge boat at the Song Thu Bon in support of operation Hameluke Thrust.

21 May: 45' of 60" culvert installed on Route 1, Section II-Dien Ban.

22 May: Cleared right of way for 150 meters on Route 1, Section II of the QL-1 upgrading project.

23 May: 45' fixed span has been installed at the An Lo Bridge (YD 623303). Installed 60' fixed span (YD 796283) with transom trestle for intermediate support. Removed 45' fixed span bridge at BT 075559. Removed 135' M-6 bridging (YD 127668).

24 May: Conducted preliminary survey of QL-1 from the Song Thanh Quit river to Route 538 for purposes of determining real estate requirements.

25 May: Installed 3, 40' 36" culverts at ZC 184555. Company "D" continued with road work (Route 14 west) for Operation Hameluke Thrust.

26 May: Filled crater and graded area of mine incident of Route 5 south (AT 943678).

27 May: Installed 5 float reinforced raft (BT 064562) to support tactical operations.

28 May: Increased alerts are adversely affecting the work of Companies "B", "C", and "D". Awaiting the "go ahead" from the I Corps Engineer Advisor on the DaNang defensive wire project. At present no clearing of the area from the railroad tracks to the water has been begun by ARVN Engineers as required.

29 May: 7th Engr Bn has made liaison with 27th Marines concerning security for the re-opening of Route 5 to An Hoa. All their command efforts have been for no avail. Until security is obtained no work can be started. 105 tons of concrete aggregate was delivered to the An Thanh dam site, along with ten (10) 20' rebars. Dam project is now 32% complete. Survey team chained off 4.5 miles from the Tuy Loan bridge

(AT 946706) south along Route 5 and they surveyed 2 miles south from Tuy Loan bridge down Route 5. Company "D" continues to support operation Mameluke Thrust with deliberate force engineer work.

(3) Continue maintenance of Bridges within 1st Marine Division TAOR, or as directed by III MAF Headquarters.

(4) Continue upgrading of Route 1.

(5) Continue upgrading of Route 13C.

(6) Continue upgrading of Route 33.

(7) Continue upgrading of Route 30.

(8) Continue upgrading of Route 5.

(9) Continue upgrading of Route 14.

(10) Continue construction of the Ha Thanh Dam.

(11) Continue construction of the Song Thanh Quit River Bridge.

7th Engineer Battalion FTF (AC 21300)

During the month of May the Battalion Supply Section processed 365 priority 02 and 598 priority 05 requisitions and 687 priority 12 and 17 requisitions. Also processed were 1158 receipts from due, 740 issues from due and 167 issues from warehouse.

1st Bridge Company FMF (AC 21325)

During the month of May 1st Bridge Supply Section processed 500 requisitions. Also processed were 200 receipts from due, 170 issues from due and 60 issues from warehouse.

Motor Transport

Approximately 147,007 miles were logged on the Battalion's Motor Transport Vehicles during May.

Maintenance

The Battalion Maintenance Platoon completed 138 Motor Transport work orders during the month of May. A total of 170 work orders were submitted, 22 were sent to Maintenance Battalion. Total work orders for Engineer Equipment numbered 138 with 109 completed and 22 were sent to FSR.

Messing

The Battalion Mess Staff continued to provide four meals daily except on Sunday; the fourth meal being a midnight ration for night crews. On Sunday a brunch replaces breakfast and dinner.

Medical

The Battalion Aid Station treated 752 Military and 30 Vietnamese. During the month of May the Dental Clinic treated 400 Military and 60 Vietnamese.

During the month of May 1st Bridge Supply Section processed 500 g. Civil Affairs/Civic Action were 200 receipts from due, 170 issues from due and 60 issues from warehouse.

- (1) The civic action program continues on a daily basis.

Motor Transport

- (2) Activities were as follows:

(a) The MedCap Program provided treatment for three hundred and thirteen persons.

Maintenance

(b) The Battalion sponsored, Vietnamese Brickyard produced a total of twenty-four thousand eight hundred and ninety-five bricks (24,895). Transport work orders during the month of May, a total of 170 work orders were submitted. (c) A total of thirty-two thousand nine hundred and six bricks were released from the Battalion sponsored brickyard during the month of April in support of various projects throughout Quang Nam Province.

(d) Through the manufacture of concrete well rings in the Battalion sponsored brickyard, four new wells were completed by the local populace 2 old wells improved. Staff continued to provide four meals daily except on Sunday; the fourth meal being a midnight ration for night crews. On Sunday a (e) Routine support was given small building projects through distribution of salvaged building materials.

Medical

The Battalion Aid Station treated 752 Military and 30 Vietnamese. During the month of May the Dental Clinic treated 400 Military and 60 Vietnamese.

During the month of May 1st Bridge Supply Section processed 500 g.

(f) A police Chiefs office was completed in the hamlet of Tung Son by the local populace.

(g) A (5) room school in the hamlet of An Ngai Tay is 65% complete.
