NARRATIVE SUMMARY

The 7th Engineer Battalion continued support of the III Marine Amphibious Force within the Danang area. The Battalion continued maintenance responsibility of 70.0 miles of road and conducted daily minesweeps of 25.5 miles of road. The Battalion maintained six (6) water points in the Danang area producing 4,754,000 gallons of water.

Company "A", 7th Engineer Battalion, continued maintenance of Route 540 and Route 30 for class 50 traffic and maintenance of Route 540 from AT 899774 to AT 912743, Route 542 and Route 544. Company "A" also conducts daily minesweeps on Route 545.

- (a) Horizontal Construction During the first seven (7) days of April, the Battalion hauled 3,869 cubic yards of rock, 1,446 cubic yards of fill and 163 cubic yards of asphalt. The breakdown follows. Route QL-IS received 1,239 cubic yards of CBR and 163 cubic yards of asphalt in support of MCB-121 upgrade operations. CBR in the amount of 2,273 cubic yards was spread and compacted on the An Hoa road, and 1,446 cubic yards of laterite fill were placed and compacted on Route 4W. In addition, 30,000 gallons of oil were spread on the Battalion's lines of communication.
