NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Company "A" (Rein), 7th Engineer Battalion continued support of the III Marine Amphibious Force within the Danang area. The company continued maintenance responsibility of 32.2 miles of road. In addition the company carried the mine sweep responsibilities of 9.3 miles of road until 25 December 1970. Subsequent to to 25 December 1970 the mine sweep responsibility was reduced to 5.1 miles of road.

Company "A" (Rein), 7th Engineer Battalion conducted the following daily mine sweeps.

Route 545 - from AT942787 to AT875829 from 21 December to 31 December 1970
Route 1 D & LTL - 4 from AT965605 to AT992578 from 21 December to 25 December 1970.

The Route 1 D and 4 mine sweep was turned over to the Regional Forces.

The company operated one water plant and produced 205,00 gallons of water.

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1. Sequential Listing of Significant Events

a. Personnel and Administration: During the period the company received thirteen men through normal replacement, ten corporals and below, one Gunnery Sergeant, and one Staff Sergeant and one First Sergeant. The company lost one First Lieutenant and thirteen men through normal rotation.

b. Enemy, Weather, and Terrain: During the period the weather was warm and clear for six days and cloudy and cool with some rain on five days. The rain has not hampered road maintenance.

c. Horizontal Construction: During the period the company hauled 2000 cubic yards of fill for road upgrade on LTL-4 W, 500 cubic yards of rock in support of MCB-3 road maintenance on LTL-4 E.

d. Vertical Construction: The company continued the warehousing of TSEP materials at Camp Haskins in support of III MA F. The company completed the construction of one sea-hut and one bunker and started the dismantling of the cantonment area on Hill 327.

e. Utilities: The company continued the electrical upgrade of the cantonment on Hill 65 and Landing Zone Baldy, plus the perimeter lighting on the Division Ridgeline.

f. Miscellaneous:

(1) The company prefabricated and issued two sea-huts.

(2) The company received and issued materials for construction of huts and bunkers.

g. Logistic, Equipment, and Supply

(1) Administrative - One Grinder - Code H

(2) Company Supply has processed 282 new documents, received 19, 23 were cancelled, 240 were placed on back order. Old documents; 28 were received, 138 were cancelled. There are six priority O2 over 30 days old. Total back order is 554. Direct exchange; 17 new items exchanged with 14 being filled and 3 placed on back order; 8 of the old direct exchange have been completed leaving 23 yet to be received.

(3) Motor Transport: A total of 34,870 miles were logged in by the company motor transport vehicles. There were 4,910 tons of earth products, 1174 tons of general cargo and equipment hauled, and 1,525 passengers transported, 64,000 gallons of potable water, 12,000 gallons of nonpotable water, 12,000 gallons of oil for road construction, 14,400 gallons of fuel for generators, trucks and equipment use.

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h. General Engineer Comments

- (1) 21 December 1970 - Completed the Goi Noi resettlement access road.
- (2) 21 December 1970 - Provided personnel for Battlefield Clean-up Operation.
- (3) 21 December 1970 - One M-51 Dump truck involved in accident with RVN vehicle.
- (4) 22 December 1970 - Dismantling of Hill 327 commenced.
- (5) 25 December 1970 - Assisted Camp Butler Liaison in shipment of material.
- (6) 27 December 1970 - Turn over of Route 1 D and 4 East minesweep to Regional Forces
- (7) 26 December 1970 - Commenced the road upgrade of LTL-4 East.
- (8) 28 December 1970 - Commenced the electrical upgrade of Division Ridgeline perimeter lighting.

- (1) Continue support of all units in the Danang area as assigned by III Marine Amphibious Force Headquarters.
- (2) Continued maintenance of assigned roads as directed by III Marine Amphibious Force Headquarters.
