II. NARRATIVE SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. On 10 August, Company D (Rein) embarked and sailed for WESTPAC as part of the EASTPAC MAB. To prepare the company for movement it was necessary to transfer large numbers of Marines between companies of this battalion. After Company D was stabilized, personnel wise, this battalion transferred almost all remaining deployable personnel (4 officers, 34 enlisted) to 1st Motor Transport Battalion. The personnel picture for the 7th Motor Transport Battalion was bleak.

2. In excess of one hundred basic Marines fresh from recruit and individual combat training were joined, indoctrinated and trained in the various occupational fields necessary to support this battalion's combat mission. On about 7 December it was considered that these new Marines were sufficiently trained to commit this battalion to its combat mission

3. In mid-September the decision was made to re-equip this battalion with M-36 trucks, vice M-54 vehicles. The vehicles were driven from MSCS Barstow to Camp Pendleton on 30 September, spare parts were requisitioned on 20 September.

4. During October and November, acceptance checks were completed on the M-36 trucks. This represented a double work load in the maintenance effort of this battalion since the M-54 trucks required continued maintenance.

II. NARRATIVE SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS (con't)

5. On 13 December, 100% of spare parts were received by this battalion and on 16 December the new M-36 trucks were placed in service. The M-54 trucks are undergoing LTI's and disposition instructions will be forthcoming

III. DETAILED DESCRIPTION OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

10 Aug Company D Deployed, Information classified 121

30 Sep REPLACEMENT OF M-54 TRUCKS WITH M-36 TRUCKS
Received 68 M-36 trucks from MCSC Barstow as replacement vehicles for M-54 trucks. 3 Requisitions for spare parts to support M-36's submitted to Barstow on 20 Sep. 4 Vehicles are withheld from use pending receipt of 100% of spare parts.

15 Dec M-36 VEHICLES COMMITTED TO USE
100% of spares to support M-36 trucks on hand, M-36 vehicles placed into service. 2 M-54 trucks being LTI'd prior to disposition.

I. Organization of the 7th Motor Transport Battalion (-):

On 1 January, 1966, the 7th MTBn (-) consisted of H&SCo (-), Company B, and Company C. Commanding Officers, Staff and Chief Subordinates are as follows:

II. Narrative Summary of Significant Events

1. Having placed the new M-36 trucks in service, disposition instructions were received for the M-54s. On 4 January 1966, fifteen (15) M-54s were transferred and invoiced to the 9th Engineer Battalion. On 17 January 1966, fifty three (53) M-54s were transferred and invoiced to CG, Marine Corps Base, Camp Pendleton, of which six (6) were to be shipped to MCSC, Barstow and forty seven (47) were to be shipped to Marine Corps Base, Camp Lejeune. See Appendix A, references (1) and (2).

2. On 5 January, 1966 the 2nd Platoon, Company B was attached to BLT 2/5 for deployment to WESTPAC. To bring this platoon up to strength it was necessary to transfer many qualified and experienced drivers from other Companies into Company B. See Appendix A, reference (3).

3. On 31 January, 1966 Company B (-) shipped to CG, FMFPac and embarked for deployment to WESTPAC, destination classified. To fill the gaps left by the transfer of experienced personnel into 2nd Platoon, Company B, many new and inexperienced drivers were joined from Motor Transport School, MCB, Camp Pendleton. See Appendix A, references (4) and (5).

Enclosure (1)

4. On 10 February, 1966 7th Motor Transport Battalion (-) consisting of H&SSCo (-) and Company C chopped to FMFPac and embarked for deployment to WESTPAC, destination classified. As in the case of Company B, new and inexperienced drivers were transferred into these units from Motor Transport School, MCB, Camp Pendleton to replace those personnel previously deployed. See Appendix A, references (4) and (6).

5. On 7 March, 1966 7th Motor Transport Battalion (-) arrived in RVN and set up operations in direct support of FLSU-1. See Appendix A, reference (7).

6. On 13 March, 1966 Company B (-) arrived in RVN and joined 7th MTBn (-).

7. On 28 March, 1966 7th MTBn (-) reverted to the operational control of the First Marine Division and is presently in direct support of that Division. See Appendix A, reference (8).

8. During the month of March, elements of the 7th MTBn participated in the following operations:
