PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the month of March 1967, the 7th Separate Bulk Fuel Company issued approximately 13.5 million gallons of bulk fuel and 1,521,118 pounds of package and drum POL products were shipped by surface and air to the outlying POL areas. The supply and issuing of this fuel was coordinated by the POL inventory control point.

2. On 25 March 1967, Major H. C. SANFORD assumed the duties as Commanding Officer of the 7th Separate Bulk Fuel Company.

3. During March the following increases/decreases were effected at Dong Ha and Cau Viet.

- c. Truck Company, ForLogComd, Red Beach #2: 20,000 gallons MOGAS, 20,000 gallons DIESEL.

5. On 24 March the ISA at Duc Pho was attacked with 60 mm mortars. This company lost the following gear as a result of this attack: three 20GPM pumps, one 75GPM pump, four 30 lb fire extinguishers and three bung wrenches.
