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PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the month of March 685 small unit patrol activities were conducted. These activities resulted in 125 contacts, of which 62 were initiated by friendly forces and 63 by enemy forces. Enemy casualties are listed in Part III.
2. There was one major Operation during the month of March (Oklohona Hills) which started on 31 March and is still in progress. 1st Plt Company C was open to 7th Marine Regt from 04 March to 07 March and from 09 March to 15 March. Company D was open to 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines from 09 March to 23 March. On 26 March open of 3rd Plt, Company A was transferred to 1st Marine Div for assignment to III MAF as a security plt. Company B conducted a company size search and clear operation from 14 March through 16 March.
3. Training for the Battalion during the month of March continued to place emphasis on small unit leadership. Also covered were fan firing of the M60 and M16, personal response, and first aid. During the month of March 4 Officers and 4 enlisted men attended formal schools both in country and out of country. 1st Bn. 7th Marines also conducted a Patrol Leader's school of one week duration and a Ground Surveillance Radar school of one week duration. In addition to the above schools the 1st Bn. 7th Marines hold indoctrination and orientation for 165 newly arrived men in the Battalion.

1. THE ORGANIZATION COMMITTED TO COMBAT

a. Combat Mission Assigned. Occupy and defend assigned TAOR. Maintain a saturation level of patrol activity within TAOR. On order be prepared to conduct offensive operations outside the TAOR. Interdict and deny the use of waterways and other routes of egress or ingress to the enemy. Provide security for the road net and traffic within the TAOR. Conduct a pacification program in support of the GVH. Assist in the RD Program. Provide Bridge Security for 5 Bridges in the TAOR.

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e. Logistics.

(1) There are two watch towers being constructed by D Company 7th Engineers for this battalion, one (1) 30 foot tower and one (1) 60 foot tower. These towers should be completed within ten days. Maintenance of all bunkers on Hill 37 is fair. A maintenance program is in effect and is being expedited.

(2) The Battalion Ammunition Bunker is in a good condition and control of all ammunition is in accordance with current Battalion and Division Orders.

(3) The messhall is in good condition and improvements are continually being made.

(4) All Grade III turn-in ammunition is being inspected for safety before leaving this combat base.

(5) There are no late reports.

(6) The overall transportation capabilities of the Battalion are excellent, but vehicle maintenance on rules at the present time is a problem due to the lack of spare parts, which are on order.

(7) The Embarkation Records are in order and are constantly updated to correspond with the equipment that is on hand in the Battalion. The Mechanized Embarkation Data System is being updated so as to effectively change over from the previous system of embarkation to the new data processing system. Overall the Battalion Embarkation is in excellent condition.

f. Civic Action.

(1) Held periodic Medecamps and Dentecamps through coordination with BAS and Army Advisors treating a total of 398 civilians.

(2) 1 Mar 69 S-5 picked-up civilian payroll at Camp Tien Sha and paid the workers.

(3) 3 Mar 69 Cultural Drama Team went to Loc Hung Village at District Headquarters. Favorable response.

(4) 6 Mar 69 S-5 went to pay condolences to family whose boy was shot by a Marine on or about 5 Mar 69.

(5) 8 Mar 69 950 inoculation shots (Diphtheria Plague) were given by 1st Med Bn. Preventative Medicine Unit to the people in the My Lien area.

(6) 10 Mar 69 Audio-Visual Team showed movies in the refugee vill at CAP 3.

(7) 11 Mar 69 S-5 Officer went to Hill 65 to investigate incident of a Bull-dozer raking over some graves.

(8) 13 Mar 69 Made solatium payment of 4,000 P's to Huynh Thi KIEM of Dai Phu Hamlet, Loc My Village for the death of her son who was shot by an element of this command on Hill 65.

(9) 14 Mar 69 S-5 used IIB Team during Medcamp to broadcast Pro GVN themes. IIB Team also distributed GVN newspapers.

(10) 16 Mar 69 S-5 procured 30 sheets of tin to refurbish a non GVN supported school. Six Gal cans of paint, and 107 mouse traps, were given to the CAP to distribute to the refugees at Tan Hoa.

(11) 21 Mar 69 Used P.O.B.T. to exploit VC terrorists who entered Ky Tan village and intimidated the people killing 13 water buffalo.

(12) 24 Mar 69 Personal Response Team from Division G-5 came out to give questionnaire on Personal Response.

(13) 26 Mar 69 Interviewed applicant to work at the LMI Club. Applicant has been cleared by CIE, and is now awaiting a clearance by District.

g. Administration. No problems have been encountered.

h. Personnel. The Battalion is presently at C1 manning level. Total strength is 40 Marine Officers, 1068 Marine Enlisted, 3 Naval Officers, and 52 Naval Enlisted.

i. Communications.

(1) GENERAL. All of the communications area docking has been cemented except the switchboard and Comm Center area. Fluorescent lighting has been installed in all working areas. The living area is being refurnished one hut at a time. Communications Platoon continues to provide personnel for road sweep, guard, and reaction squad in addition to providing radio operators and instructors as required for normal operations.

(2) RADIO. The radio shop was rebuilt in an existing area. The dock was cemented and new paneling was installed. Usable area was increased. The AN/PRC-77 was returned to regiment, depriving the Battalion of a very vital replacement covered circuit. The AN/PRC-77/KY-38 is much more reliable than the compatible KY-8 due to power fluctuations. The KY-38 operates with batteries while the KY-8 operates from generator power.

(3) WIRE. Sgt Ragedale, the Battalion Message Center Chief, continues as Wire Chief/Message Center Chief. Wirelines are being overhauled and lines along with several electrical wire lines. New waterproof terminal boxes are being installed throughout the area. Electrical wiring is being replaced as wire becomes available.

j. Special Services.

(1) Special Services received 160 cases of beer and 160 cases of soda. Eighty cases of each were issued to troops on the operation.

(2) Two Special Services Shows were provided for Hill 37.

(3) The following items were received from Division Special Services:

1. Intelligence.

(1) Usually Reliable Sources, Low Level Agent Reports, Chieu Hoi and POW read-outs indicate that elements of the following enemy units are operating in the TAOR.

- (a) Q-93 (IF) Bn
- (b) 21st (NVA) Regt
- (c) 141st (NVA) Regt
- (d) 31st Bn/341st (NVA) Regt
- (e) 1st Regt/2nd (NVA) Div

(2) Significant Trends:

(a) AP mining incidents were fewer in number than the previous reporting period; however, there has been noted increase in Anti-Vehicular command-detonated mining incidents.

(b) Enemy-initiated ambushes and sniper incidents have shown a marked rise during the month. The enemy conducted several probes against RF units near Dai Loc District Headquarters. In addition, all USMC combat and support bases in the 1/7 TAOR received harassing mortar fire, including Hill 52 which was recently occupied by "C" Company.

(c) There was one daylight incident of 120mm rockets fired at Hill 37 during the reporting period. On the night of 30 March Hill 37 received several rounds of what is believed to be high velocity recoilless rifle fire.

(d) Enemy movement has been at a low level in the TAOR this month as compared to the previous two months. The enemy appears to be concentrating on avoiding contact and gathering food.

c. Medical.

(1) GENERAL. During the post-Tet offensive the BAS was adequately manned and supplied to handle mass casualties. The BAS bunkers were also well supplied and are constructed in such a manner that mass casualties could be handled in relative safety.

(2) RECORDS. A review of the records for the month of March reveals a total of 947 patients treated (military) and 63 (civilians). This total includes 93 Gastro-intestinal disturbances (nausea, diarrhea, cramps, etc.) 11 shrapnel wounds, 2 gun shot wounds, 12 fevers, 2 psychiatric problems, 6 physical exams, 3 heat exhaustion, 3 bronchitis, 7 routine medevacs, 1 priority medevac, 3 emergency medevacs. Not listed are headaches, colds, immersion foot, fractures, sprains, VD, jungle ulcers, etc which came to a total of 867 miscellaneous patients treated.

(3) C-P TABLET. There has been no documented problem in the area of personnel taking their Chloroquine-Primaquine tablets weekly. Each Company CO is still required to submit to the DAS a list of personnel who have not taken the C-P pill and the reason for not doing so.

(4) MEDCAP. The Med Cap program has been running smoothly.

(5) EVACUATION. Medevacs continue to be handled rapidly and efficiently.

(6) SUPPLY. The DAS recently acquired a new refrigerator which is more than adequate to meet our needs and alleviates a major problem. The rest of the medical supplies are in sufficient quantities.

(7) SANITATION. The past month has shown an improvement in the sanitation conditions of the compartment. The new baffle-type grease pit for the galley has been completed. The GI can house has also been completed. There has been some new soakage pits dug for the individual showers but more are needed. The refuse burning area is adequate but a better policing is needed.
