PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

The battalion continued to operate extensively in the eastern portion of the Regimental TAOR. All four companies were in the field for the greater part of the month operating independently within their respective AO's. Emphasis was placed on platoon day patrol activities and area saturation by squad ambushes at night along enemy routes of infiltration into known VC/NVA controlled areas. Enemy activity appeared to be steadily declining. Of primary concern was the locating of enemy caches, harboring sites and new routes into TAOR. It is anticipated that the battalion will continue this scheme of maneuver. Rice denial operations, in conjunction with RF/EF units, are currently in progress.

PART III

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. TOPICS

a. Personnel and Administration

The battalion strength remained stable during the month of October and continued at C-1 personnel level. There was no significant loss of key personnel.

(1) Administration within the Battalion continues to improve, most significantly in the area of the unit diary. The battalion reached a 0.9 percentage error rate for September, which shows a marked improvement over previous periods.

3. INTELLIGENCE

4. SIGNIFICANT TRENDS

a. AP and AT mining incidents remain at a low for the second straight month. The majority of the mines were AP type and were found near enemy rice caches.

b. There were several incidents where large caches of rice were discovered due to constant patrolling of known rice collection points, the total amount of rice coming to 25,395 pounds.

c. There were no reported incidents of rocket attacks during the month of October. Elements of the battalion did however experience on numerous occasions, heavy mortar fire, RPG, M79 and S/A fire from the enemy.

d. A great deal of intelligence information placed elements of the 36th NVA Regt in the general area of AR 9644 to AR 9947.

6. ORGANIZATION AND OPERATION

Emphasis was on battalion size operations with companies operating independently. Small unit day and night patrols and ambushes highlighted the month. Most significant was the locating of an enemy cache of over 7,250 lbs of unpolished rice in a two day period by Company D. This rice denial will continue through November 1969. No significant change in supporting arms functions was noted during the reporting period.

7. PLANS

Future plans of the battalion, predicated on regimental plans, will be to continue rice denial operations, small unit operations along the Que Son Mountain range and combined operations with RF/PF units in the 1st Battalion, 7th Marines AO.

8. TRAINING

No significant changes are anticipated in the battalion training program. A new battalion SOP for operations and training is being developed and will be published in the near future.

9. LOGISTICS, EQUIPMENT, AND SUPPLY

a. Supply. During the month, the logistics effort centered around resupplying elements in the field by helicopter and improvement of the battalion area.

b. Logistics

(1) The general state of police improved considerably and the battalion area itself improved due to the current construction by the Seabees.

(2) There was no battalion ammunition bunker as all ammunition was drawn from the ASF on LZ BAIKY. All grade III turn-in ammunition was inspected prior to turn-in to the ASF on LZ BAIKY.

(3) The messhall was in a good state of police and is continually showing improvement.

(4) The overall transportation capabilities of the battalion were fair, but vehicle maintenance was somewhat of a problem due to the heavy work load and lack of spare parts. In addition, the transportation problem was compounded by the poor state of the roads leading to Banang due to the monsoons.

(5) The embarkation records were in order and are constantly updated. One deficiency was apparent wherein there was a critical lack of embarkation boxes.

10. TACTICAL AIR CONTROL PARTY

- a. Resupply: 186,000lbs
- b. Medevacs: 59 missions called with an average emergency medevac time of 25 minutes.
- c. Airstrikes: 22 called, all AO controlled.
- d. Air Observer Requested/Used: Seven (7) for general visual reconnaissance.
- e. Spooky Requested/Used: One (1).
- f. Helicopter Visual Reconnaissance: Six (6).

11. CIVIL AFFAIRS AND CIVIC ACTION

a. Psychological operations were conducted throughout the month on a daily basis. However, many programmed flights were cancelled due to maintenance and inclement weather.

b. 10,000 lbs of rice and other food were distributed to refugees in Que Son District. The remainder of the rice captured in the field could not be evacuated, and was destroyed.

c. Requests for building materials for a school in Phu Huong village were submitted to GVN authorities through the 1969 Village Self Development Program. Actual construction should begin in the near future. A school for Phu Hiep Village is in the planning stage.

d. A new medical program was initiated in this CAOR. The program called for the village health workers to play a major role in treating their own people. Village aid stations have been completed. Medical supplies have been requested through GVN channels. Health record books have also been requested.

e. A program was undertaken to restore the gravesite of a Vietnamese war hero killed in the 13th century. This is a very important "high impact" project.

f. Supplies were requested to repair the roof of a school in Phu Hiep village which was partially destroyed when a helicopter landed nearby.

g. The U.S. Army HB (Psychological Broadcast) Team was requested from 7th Marines, and was used to good effect.

h. The number of children attending elementary and secondary schools under the General WALT Scholarship Program increased to 24.

12. MEDICAL

a. During the month of October the BAS was adequately staffed. Little or no problem was experienced in the relocation of our medical facilities.

b. The general working conditions at the BAS were greatly improved since moving to the present area. A covered area is now available for patients awaiting Sick Call. Sick Call itself is dryer and more easily kept clean in its hard back metal roofed hootch.

c. The Med Cap program for the first half of October was most effective with two Med Caps being held weekly.

d. The effort put forth on malaria control, both chemoprophylaxis and urine testing, paid off in a marked reduction of malaria cases.

e. There was an adequate amount of medical supplies on hand. Cooperation between the Motor Transport Section and the BAS enabled us to make weekly runs to FLC to procure all needed supplies. The BAS was, however, still without a biological reefer and has been in this situation since June.

f. Sanitation in the area was satisfactory in general throughout the month. The new area provides better housing and messing facilities. The addition of urinoids has also added to the effective sanitation efforts.

13. COMMUNICATION

a. General. During the period covered, the move from the north side of Hill 63 to the south side was completed, and the platoon continued improvement of our communications facilities. The platoon has supplied personnel for a Forward CP, the rear COC and H&S COC. The communications platoon hold internal classes on communications security procedures.

b. Radio. The radio section has hold three classes for transit personnel on radio equipment and correct procedures for calling medevacs. The section installed radios and antennas for the new battalion COC. The section has continued to improve the new 28 shop.

c. Wire. During the month of October, the wire section wired the new battalion CP and policed and serviced all the wire in the old area. After the move was completed wire personnel turned their attention toward the Army's old wire and cleared the CP of it. Preparations were made for the upcoming courtesy inspection in anticipation of the CMMI in December.

d. Tech Shop. Continuing emphasis was put on the upcoming division inspection. The personnel began reconciling the supply logs and components on hand. The move from the north side of Hill 63 to the south side was completed and a new tech shop was constructed.

e. Communications Center. During the month of October, this comm center

was not on circuit but handled 1169 incoming and 39 outgoing messages, via guard mail. All monthly reports (EPR, transfer, burn reports) were prepared as required. During the move from one area to another, the communications center personnel built new facilities according to security regulations; the facilities were fully operational within 24 hours. The communications center was represented in the field CP group and all classified material needed for the field was in the field and safe guarded.
