

2. Detailed Description of Significant Events.

a. Personnel

- (1) During the month of April this battalion joined 3 officers (2 Majors, 1 Captain) and 60 enlisted. One officer (Major) and 88 enlisted were transferred largely due to normal rotation.
- (2) Casualties during the period were two enlisted KIA and thirteen enlisted VIA's.
- (3) One lieutenant was promoted to captain, 63 promotions to corporal, 78 promotions to lance corporal, and 7 promotions to PFC were effected during this period.
- (4) One silver star, 22 Vietnamese crosses of gallantry and 92 purple hearts were awarded in April.
- b. <u>Intelligence</u>. Significant intelligence obtained and acted upon during the period resulted in Operation "NEVADA" and "HOT SPRINGS". Supporting information is contained in paragraph 7 of the combat after action reports attached as Appendix A.

c. Training. Extensive commitments to airfield defense and two battalion size operations limited training during the period. Four Marines received formal training on the portable "Mighty Mite" smoke generator. They will in turn conduct indoctrination for other members of the battalion. Seven men from Company "H" attended the Engineer Battalion Landwine Warfare School. Additional quotas are being requested for May.

d. Special Operations.

- (1) There were two operations of battalion size and two of company size during the month. The battalion operations were in rapid response to 2nd ARVN Division intelligence, to which a high credibility rating had been given. The one company operation was initiated due to sightings of VC activity by Reconnaissance Battalion units, while the other was on order of Commanding Officer, 7th Marines. All operations are covered in detail within the attached combat after action reports.
- (2) During the month the following small unit activity was conducted within the battalion TAOR.
 - (a) 2 Platoon search and destroy operations.
 - (b) 10 Squad search and destroy operations.
 - (c) 5 Squad night ambushes.
 - (d) 95 Fire team night ambushes.
 - (e) 95 Fire team night security patrols.
 - (f) 270 night listening posts.
- e. <u>Command and Control</u>. Battalion operations conducted during April were under the command and control of the Commanding Officer, 7th Marines. Company operations were under command and control of Commanding Officer, 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines.

f. Close Combat.

- (1) Close combat during battalion and company operations is described in the attached combat after action reports.
 - (2) Close combat within the TAOR was as follows:
- (a) On 6 April Company "H" position at BT 515012 received one incoming grenade resulting in one WIA and one KIA. VC were engaged with small arms in return and the area searched the following day with negative results.





(b) On 17 April Company "F" ambush moving into position received two rounds of small arms fire but no casualties. Returned fire with small arm and mutomatic weapons. Searched contact area and found only foot prints and blood stains.

g. Fire Support.

- (1) A concise picture of fire support furnished for operations is contained in paragraph 6 of each of the attached combat after action reports.
- (2) Fire support within the TAOR amounted to 180 H&I fire missions during the period.

h. Civil Affairs/Civic Action.

- (1) In late March and early April the First Tank Battalion, First Anti-tank Battalion and Headquarters Battery of Eleventh Marines moved into our TAOR at BT 518042. Liaison was made with these units and a division of responsibility was agreed upon for Civil Affairs/Civic Action activity.
- (2) A well and shower unit were completed near the school house in the hamlet of Long Phu (1) (BT 508034), and a similar well and shower project has been started in Long Phu (2) (BT 511032).
- (3) During Operation "NEVADA" and "HOT SPRINGS" med-cap activities were carried out among the civilians living in area of operation resulting in a total of 56 people being evacuated to Quang Ngai. An additional 77 refugees were evacuated from a company area of operation at BS 474955 to Quang Ngai. On 27 April LtGeneral WALT toured the area of Long Phu (1) to inspect the battalion civil affairs activity. He praised the accomplishment of the program and congratulated the hamlet chief for the progress his people had made. LtGen WALT also reemphasized the importance of Civil Affairs in the present conflict and reconfirmed our own beliefs in the necessity of living and working with the Vietnamese people. In spite of the security problem posed by the closeness of the peoples market Gen WALT wholeheartedly agreed with our method and praised our efforts in winning the friendship of the people. Gen WAMF further stated that he believed the hamlet of Long Phu (1) to be the most unique and successful civil affairs project he has witnessed in South Vietnam and directed that his staff make it the subject of a Huntley-Brinkly report.





These were the words of Lieutenant Ceneral Louis Walt, III Mapine Amphibious Force commanding general and senior Marine officer in Vietnam. He was speaking to Mr. So, Long Phu #8 village chief.

SCHOOLHOUSE

The three-starred general made the comment after viewing the civil affiairs program of 2/7 during a visit he made here Tuesday.

General Walt, accompanied by Major General Lawis Fields, 1st Marine Division commending general and staff officers, were met at the Long Phu #1 schoolhouse by Migutenant Colonel Leon Utter, battalion commander, and First Lieutenant Ken Snyder, civil affairs officer for the battalion.

Both generals, after a brief hand-hake and welcome, took seats in the long Fnu #1 schoolroom as the civil affairs officer explained 2/7's past and current records—to-people program.

An inspection of the schoolhouse's dispensary, newly completed well and half-finished shower unit, followed the briefing.

Fig. the school, the visiting generals were flown to the Long Phu &l market where they were greeted by shopkeepers and children of the market-place.

After a thorough look at what the village had to offer and a series of questions about the progress of civil affairs here, the general commented:

This is the best civil affairs program I've seen in South Vietnam."





Due to a lack of mail and the nearness of your departure from HVN, the following letter is dedicated to you.

THE MEMORY OF WAR

It was a long, hard, sweaty haul, but they packed the gear and now it is theirs forever the memory of war.

They landed in July 1965, at a place called Qui Nhon, Republic of South Vietnem. They had moved to the ports at San Diego, California under a heavy shroud. of secreey and sailed toward the setting sun to a place called Vietnam—to a place where they would fight and some would die, but none would forget.

They had a name and a creed. The creed made the name, but the

men made the creed and stuck by it.

Their creed was: "Ready for Apything, Counting on Nothing"-it belonged to them like the pride of holding a first place medal at a track meet; nobody could claim what was theirs, not even the Viet Cong.

They were the 2nd Battalion, 7th Marine Regiment Marines commanded

by Lieutenent Colonel Leon N. Utter.

When the battalion landed at Qui Nhon they didn't know what to expects The men were green and anxious and many were scared—as all men new to battle are.

The first night ashore many shadows became clandestine Viet Cong sneaking towards the lines, but soon the troops began to season with the

temperature, time and mosquitoes.

The battalion stayed at Qui Nhon for four months. They started with 21 squara miles and ended up with 81 to protect. Their mission was a big one, but they were a big battalion, tall in stature and 70 in strength. They were to provide security for the airfield, port and logistics facilities at Qui Nhon.

It was not before the monsoon came at Qui Nhon. A man's sweat was cheap and salt pills became life savers. Memories stick in the men's minds of hills—409 and its heavy terrain and back breaking height; 562 with its view overlocking the airfield; 586 and the Cu Mong Pass where the Viet Ceng occasionaly probed.

There was the Van Can Valley where operations were conducted to pacify and protect the area from the Viet Cong, and the long protective

vigil of Highway #1 when the Army was moving to an Khe.

The 2/7 Marines won't soon forget their airdale brothers from Qui Nhon. It was the helicopters from RMM 161 that brought mail and water to the troops on the hilltop outposts in any bind of weather.

The won't forgst the hullaballoo raised about the battalion commander's choice to use rict control agents—a choice that became standard procedure throughout Vietnam when the use of tear gas would save lives of civilians who the Viet Cong weed as shields in tunnels and caves.

As the men of the battalion recall the past at Qui Nhon there are thoughts of the rainy season when men slept on sand bags to keep from getting soaked by the streams of water on the ground; when their pancho's fell in on them in the morning because the rain had collected in gallons during the night and collapsed the shelter roof.

(Memory of War continued)

The men who patrolled Highway #1 won't readily forget the innumberable nights they spent wrapped up in panches between patrolling and perimeter guard, or the look of their wrinkled hands and feet from being wet for extended periods of time.

And then the battalion moved to Chu Lai, making an amphibious landing and sweep November 10—the Marine Corps Bitthday.

Their conditions were better at the Lai. Wooden tents replaced their paneho shelters and sand bag beds. They were closer to supplies and their own parent—The Marine Corps.

But the 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines weren't in for a rest at Chu. Lai. Operations were a keynote in their mission of protecting the Chu Lai enclave from enemy attack. Harvest Moon in late December was a long, wet, walk until the enemy attacked on the 10th day turning the operation into a hot fight for life. Ky Phu was the spot many 2/7 Marines won't forget. They fought gallantly that day, even though weary and fatigued from their 10-day march through the muck and mire of enemy territory.

Their wext big bettle with heavy contact was Utah. The Viet Cong were having lunch until the Marines came. It was hell that day for both sides. Nebedy in the battalion will forget the mertal chug, chug chug of the Viet Cong 50 caliber machine gun fire. Nebedy will forget the sight of the hills getting up and moving as the Viet Cong pressed closer dressed as bushes and brush—nebedy who was there that day will forget the valed and hereism of almost every man in defending and republing the enemy from his particular piece of the battalion, or the gallact corpshen and doctors giving their life saving attention to the wounded.

There were other operations, most of them bot walks in the sun with the Viet Cong fleeing from the wrath they knew 2/7 could wield.

And then came the climax of the pattalion's play in Vietnam-Cperation Hot Springs.

The operation only lasted two days but it took its toll on the V.C. Five 50 caliber machine guns were captured and 62 Viet Cong were killed. Only one Marine was lost that day.

These are a few of the memories the 2nd Bn., 7th Marines who landed in C. Nhon in July 1965 will have to remother about their war. Most of the "old timers" are rotating now during May and June. They've been through the guts of Vietnam, slapped the Viet Cong in the face and chased nim into a corner where he could be destroyed. They've seen their friends die and known the fatigue of week-long walks without solid contact. Now the replacements are coming and the "old" are drifting away one by one. The new blood is beginning to flow in 2/7's veins. Some wonder whether the battalion will be the same. But the spirit is there in the creed, "Ready for Anything, Counting on Nothing"—a creed that should easily take the "new" 2/7 safely and heroically through the same hell the "old" 2/7 has just completed.





6. Supporting Forces.


- a. Artillery. Elements of 1st and 4th Battalions 11th Marines supported 2/7 operations from Nui Vo (BS 521845) and Binh Son (ES 501927) during Operation NEVADA. Fire support amounted to H&I fixes the nights of D-day and D+1 and one fire mission on enemy troops in the open Did. All artillery fire support was considered responsive with very good communications prevailing.
- b. <u>Naval Gun Fire</u>. The Shore Fire Control Party provided spotter teams with two assault companies. Supporting fires were called for and received on D-day and D+1 with good target coverage. Communications with support ships was constant throughout the operation.



(1) <u>Helicopter Transport</u>. Helicopter support amounted to three separate through lists, helicopter resupply on D-day to D-3, and the evacuation of refugeerand in excess of 20 tons of rice to Quang Ngai. The battalion size list on D-day was supported by 22 MaG 36 belicopters from L2 Garp (31 509052) to L2 Brave (38 584853). On D-1 24 MaG 36 helicopters listed Company "F" from L2 at B's 692851 to an objective L2 at BF 724854. On D-3 the battalion was extracted by 24 MaG 36 helicopters from a L2 at BS 784853 to L2 Coose (55 504035). All lists ward because without difficulty.









(2) Azmed Helioopters. Armed nelicopter support was provided for all troop lifts. On Dal they detected and engaged VChin the open at BS ... 724872. The target area was covered well. Fesults unknown.

(3) CAS. Fixed wing aircraft provided LZ prep on D-day. No other support was requested.


Estimate of VC Strength, Location and Disposition in the Objective Area.





- (2) The intelligence information which predicated "Operation "MEWADA" was initially firmished to this unit on 11 april 1966 at which time it was considered reliable and valid.
- (3) The objective of the operation was to fix and dastroy and VC write in the assigned area, and to locate and confiscate or destroy VC Tack and arms caches which were burieved situated in the region.







- (1) With the exception of limited hostile sniper fire in LZ Pravo, coordinates BS 695847 on 12 April, and two VC killed by a Company "H" ambush in the early morning of 15 April, no solid enemy contact was established by 2/7 during the conduct of the operation.
 - c. VC Units Identified. None.
 - d. Significant Intelligence Gained.
- (1) No evidence could be found by 2/7 to support the contention that a VC secret base existed on the Eastern slope of the Nui Phoung Houng Houng hill mass vicinity BC 6585. The area was thoroughly searched by Company "F" with negative findings.
- (2) Two apparently temporary hamlets were located in 2/7's zone of operations at coordinates BS 693852 and BS 699853. No hamlets are located on map sheet 6756 I. Approximately 15-20 tons of rice was confiscated from these two locations; the majority of these supplies were hidden in earthenware jugs and baskets located in individual niches in hedgerows. Some rice was found in small tunnels and under false floors in the temporary living quarters constructed there. It is felt that the area in question was not a permanent VC storage facility but rather, a temporary installation to be utilized during the harvest season or until the rice supplies could be transported elsewhere for distribution.
- (3) Hamlets at the following locations were found to have major stores of rice:BS 693845, 697846, 745855, 755954.
- (4) Almost all the hedgerows in the area bounded by BS 780860, 788860, 788857, 780857 contained hidden paths and in some instances limited fortifications. It is doubtful that any of these trails or fortifications could be observed from the air.

(5) Tunnels and Caves.

- (a) General. For the most part no claves of particular interest were uncovered by 2/7 on Operation NEVADA! Of the numerous caves searched, the vast majority appeared to be small individual shelters for family groups. Moreover, many of these shelters contained sizable family rice caches, usually in earthenware or basker containers. These caves were not destroyed. Of some interest is the fact that English lettered signs posted on them which read: "This is a peoples bomb shelter please do not destroy or fill with noxious fumes". Civilians in the devastated hamlets in grid squares BS 7736 7785 were adament in their request that their shelters not be destroyed.
- (b) <u>Mumber and Locations</u>. Approximately 15 minor cave and tunnel complexes were searched and destroyed in the vicinity of Nhan Roa (1)(H), Binh Nom (V), Binh Son district on 13-14 April 1966. The two temporary







villages previously mentioned that are located at BS 694852 and BS 696853 contained most of the complexes. All appeared to be of recent construction and were combination shelter and storage facilities. Enclosure (1) is a representative diagram of the cave-tunnel complexes destroyed at the above locations. Engineers estimate 10-20 lbs demolitions were required to seal each of these complexes. Approximately 15 more significant cave and tunnel installations were destroyed in the vicinity BS 780860 to BS 787859 or 15 april 1966. All caves in this category were unoccupied and did not contain supply caches. Enclosure (2) and (3) are representative diagrams of the cave-tunnel complexes in this area. Again, 10-20 lbs of demolitions were used to destroy the entrances.

- (c) Fize and construction. The smaller completes were of 10' to 50' in length and had a tunnel diameter of 3' to 4'. In most cases little or no reinforcement was required except at the entrance. The majority had one to two entrances. The larger complexes were of 50 to 150 meters in length and had a tunnel diameter of 3' to 4'. Reinforcement was unnecessary except in porous or sandy soil. Sleeping and storage chambers were prevalent but empty when searched. Two to five entrances were encountered in each case.
- (d) Demolitions Required. Approximately 10-20 lbs of demolitions were used to seal the entrares to caves and tunnels. Fifty lbs of TNT, 40 lbs cratering charges, and 16 (C-4) kits were used to destroy the smaller complexes in grid squares BS 6984 and BS 6985. A total of 2800 lbs of explosives were used in sealing or destroying the larger complexes in the vicinity BS 780860 to BS 787859.

- (2) Observation and fields of fire. The torrain in the error of operation was comparatively flat interrupted only by absorbing bill masses. Fields of fire would have been excellent for both defender and attacker.
- (3) Cover and Concealment. Both were sparse except for those areas crisscrossed by hedgerows.
- (4) Obstacles. No major obstacles were encountered during the course of the operation.
- 8. Mission. 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines (-)(Rein) conducts operations in assigned area in Queng Nged Province at L-hour on D-day in conjunction with

coordinated ARVN operations to capture and equipment located therein.

9. Concept of Operation. After securing LZ Bravo (BS 684853) one company (-) would sweep the high ground at BS 681859. Once the high ground was secure the battalion would conduct search and destroy operations to the East with two companies abreast, one following in trace, and supporting elements and an H&S provisional platoon responsible for security to the mear. One artillery battery was in direct support of 2/7 and GAS was on strip alert. One company was designated as regimental reserve and under operations central of CO, 7th Marines,

10. Execution.

- a. Planning. Planning for this operation commenced as early as 9 April 1966, but execution was delayed by higher headquarters. On 11 April 1966 the CO, 7th Marines and Staff conducted a briefing for "Operation" NEVACAT with an execution date of 12 April 1966. Battalion Frag Order #4-65 was issued ll April 1966 at which time a full briefing was conducted by the Commanding Officer and Staff for all task organization unit commanders.
- b. P-day 12 april 1966. At 120500H Company "E" reported to CO, 7th Marines and remained under control of that Headquarters until 171430H. At. 120639H leading elements of Company "F" were lifted by 22 MAG 36 helicoptors from LZ Carp (BT 609052) to LZ Brave (BS 684853). Company "F" secured the LE followed by Company "H". The Company "H" lift had one helicopter fired upon going into LE Eravo from BS 655852 resulting in one WIA who was immediately evacuated. The helicopter lift was completed at 120915% without opposition. At 120930H elements of Company "F" started to sweep and secure the high ground at BS 690860 locking for any caves ar tunnels that might lead to a reported secret VC combat base. Results of this sweep were negatives. Simultaneously one platoon of Company "5" uncovered a large rice cache at BS 593852. On order, the rice was confiscated and baggod for helioppter evacuation. At 121145E Company "F" apprehended six VCS at BS 694852. One VCS bada VC flag in his possession. At 211330H Company "H" searched village at BS 692844, apprehended one VCC, and also found a large whee caches at this point further advance wast had to mease due to the number of tactical units involved in evacuation of large quantities of rice by heldcopter. In excess of 20 tens was eventually lifted out, Permanent positions were established during the day and patrol and sabush activity sent cut et nught. (Encl (4) and (5)). No contact during the night.
- Ptl 13 April 1966. At 131000H Company "F" conducted a helicopter borne assault from BS 393851 to an IZ at BS 724854 without opposition. (Mncl. (\mathfrak{f})). At 131040H Company "F" reported mines and booby traps at BS 733852. Companies "G" and "H" were committed to rice confiscation during the day with helicopters evacuating same to Quang Ngai. In excess of nine tens were taken out during day. At 131440H Company "F" Neval Gun Fire Spot Team, and subsequently their extillery FO, fixed missions on VC in the open at ES 724872. Target coverage was good but surveillance not possible. At 131530H



Company "G" sent a patrol to the West to meet an AT platoon moving East to provide direct support for 2/7. The AT's were slowed due to obstacles on the road. All units arrived in 2/7 CP at 131700H. The platoon was attached to Company "h" for the night. At 13200GH night ambush activity moved into position at locations indicated on enclosure (6). No contact was made during the night.

- d. Pr2 14 April 1966. At 140900H 2/7 (-) moved to the East astride road starting at BS 695844 with Company "H" leading followed by H&S elements and Company "G" bringing up the rear. A heavy and light section of AT's were attached to Companies "H" and "G" respectively. Company "F" supported this move from positions on hill 110 at BS 729849, (Encl (7)). At 140930H S-3 7th Marines directed the return of the AT platoon in view of the possibility that it would impede the progress of the entire tactical column to the East. One platoon of Company "G" provided excort for the AT platoon as it moved West to highway one. The 2/7 sweep to the East was conducted without major contact. One VCS was apprehended. A detailed search was made of villages at BS 745855, BS 755852 and BS 777858. Large quantities of the were found throughout these villages, and reports made to S-3 7th Marines. Local ARVN forces were sent to evacuate rice. Methodical cave and tunnel destruction commenced in areas incaded in grid squares 7785, 7786, 7885. The CP was established for the night at BS 776859 with all companies in a defenisve perimeter. Ambush abtivity was went out. (Encl (7)). The battalion was alerted for a possible help lift back to Chu Lai on 15 april 1986.
- e. Pt3 15 April 1966. At 150120H Company "H" ambush at BS 774856 was sprung firing upon suspected VC. Ambush returned to friendly lines and at first light searched the contact area finding two VC KIA with weapons. During the morning 2/7 conducted search and destroy of all caves and tunnels in operation area. (Encl (8)). At 151215H the Commanding "fficer advised 1/7 by radio of areas still to be searched for tunnels and caves as 2/7 was to commence helicopter lift back to Chu Lai at 151300H. The lift commenced at 151305H and was completed at 151630H without incident.

12. Administrative Matters.

- a. Communications. Some difficulty was experienced when support helicopters repeatedly came up on the battalion tactical not instead of the 42 control net upon arriving in our sector on support missions. Increased helicopter traffic, due to maneous missions flown to evacuate rice and civilians, resulted in frequent intermutions of traffic on the battalion tactical net. A LZ control net had been established, was in use, and control was by the attached Melicopter Support Team Amphabas needs to be placed on utilization of the 42 control net by helicopters on support missions to avoid similar occurrence in the future.
- b. Support. If evacuation of rice can be forseen as a requirement for units conducting search and destroy operations, then containers in sufficient quantities and of durable construction should be stocked in the LSA to ensure responsive and effective execution of such a mission.


14. Commander's Analysts.

- a. Considerable effort was expended by members of this command to evacuate rice in excess of 20 tens. Choe this task was undertaken it was done so at the expense of committing tactical units to other then their primary task to finding, fixing and desurging the VV.
- b. There were 48 refugees who requested to be evacuated to Quang Ngai from the objective area. Helicopters were requested and provided for this civil affairs project. An additional 50 civilians with all their livestock were provided escort from the objective area to highway one where they were to go on to Quang Ngai.
- c. The center of the objective area was an exceptionally fertile valley which gave every indication of being a major rice producing area. A rice between had just been completed and obviously explains the major rice caches uncovered. Without government control it is also obvious that the VC derive soundant food supplies from this area.

15 Recommendation

- a. Should the local province authorities have no immediate plans for the pacification and resettling of refugees under government control in the objective area, then serious consideration should be given for a plan of orog destruction.
- b. Establish a requirement for local PF or PF units to supervise and evacuate any large rice caches once uncovered by U.S. forces. This would pormit tactical units to continue their primary mission, and permit local









government agenicies to deal directly with the people from whom rice is

being taken. The latter would negate a possible VC propagance effort of disclaining U.S. forces for taking food supplies from the populace.



c. Atillery. "H" Battery 3/11 provided fire support from their permanent position at BT 501033. Six missions were fired during the operation in direct support of Company "F". In most cases artillery fires covered targets very well. Timeliness of fire missions became a problem in two instances. One mission was delayed when the 7th Marines FSCC had to check on the location of a recon unit working in what was presumed to be a close proximity. Another fire mission called by an AO was delayed due to communication difficulties,

b. Air.

(1) Helicopter Transport. Helicopter support amounted to separate troop lifts, helicopter resupply on D-1 and the evacuation

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
of civiliars on D-day. The company size lift was supported by MAG-36 helicopters from LZ Carp (BT 509052) to a LZ in the objective are (BS 468965). The lift was completed in 30 min. On D+3 the company was extracted by MAG 36 helicopters from a LZ at BS 449937 to LZ Goose (BT 504035). All lifts were completed without difficulty except for the lift on D-day when one aircraft was downed temporarily due to mechanical difficulty.

- (2) <u>Armed Helicopters</u>. Armed helicopters supported all troop lifts. On D-day they received some sniper rounds from the village of Tho An (BS 474954). The armed helicopters conducted an air strike on the village in response.
- (3) CAS. Fixed wing aircraft provided LZ mrep on D-day. A napalm run was made on a portion of the village of Tho An (BS 474554), after excert helicopters received fire from this area. Target coverage was very good. On D+1 a strike was called in response to visual sightings of 20-30 VC in the vicinity of BS 457980. The strike came in just after first light and gave adequate coverage to the target area. Besults could not be evaluated.
- c. Radio Pelay. A radio relay site was maintained at BS 573963 and gave cutstanding support throughout the operation.
- d. Reconnaissance Element. Two recon teams were operating in the hills to the North (BS 479968) and West (BS 454956) of the objective area and were able to provide the company with timely observations. One recon member, familiar with the area, were attached to the company as a guide.

7. Intelligence.

a. Estimate of VC Forces in the Operation Area.

- (1) It was initially anticipated that only local force VC guerrillas were active in the objective area. The area had long been under recon surveillance and no sightings of any sizable VC forces had resulted.
- (2) The objective area appeared to have a recent increase in possible VC supply activity. It had long been felt that the VC might be using this foothill area as a logistics base and possible harbor sites.
- (3) Evidence had recently become available that the VC were infiltrating sizeable units into Quang Ngai Province from Quang Nin via the area North of the Song Tra Bong River. It was considered possible that the VC might be attempting to shorten this infiltration route into Binh Son and Son Tinh Districts by cutting through the Tinh Trung Hamlet area. Vicinity BS 4395.








- (4) The intelligence information which generated the operation was predominantly obtained from the patrol reports of lat Reconnaissance Battalion.
- (5) The objective of the operation was to find, fix and destroy any VC units that might be harboring in the area, demolish any VC fortifications and harbor sites that might be located, and to confiscate or destroy any VC food caches.
 - VC Strength and Situation Actually Found as Operation was Conducted.
- (1) The intelligence had been correct in that no sizeable VC forces were located in the objective area. James a first the Tar golf
- (2) Periodic sight contact with small groups of VC (3-4) prevailed during the course of the operation.
 - c. VC Units Identified. None.
 - d. Significant Intelligence Gained.
- (1) Villagers at Tho An Hamlet (BS 4795) reported 10-15 VC had departed when Company "F" began landing at BS 459962 on the morning of 19 April 1966.
- (2) Company "F" reported finding extensive turnel network and shelters in Tho An. Those encountered were of various dimensions, the longest being approximately 40' with 2-5' wide entrances and canouflaged air vents.
- (3) At 191800H, approximately 25-30 VC were sighted in the vicinity of hall 661 BS 444986. It was believed that the VC were using the site as an OP or harbor site.
- (A) At 201240H Company "F" sighted 5-7 VC at BS 413958. Artillery fire was requested and resulted in a secondary explosion at the same location.
- (5) On 20 April Company "F" located and systematically destroyed the POW camp and political indoctrination center previously located by recon units at 82 453933. The area was reported as well camouflaged fortified and considered capable of harboring from 400-600 persons.




- (2) Observation and Fields of Fire. The objective area was dominated on all sides by prominent high ground providing excellent observation for whoever occupied it. Fields of fire were satisfactory except for those areas covered with dense underbrush.
- (3) Cover and Concealment. The area of operations offered both attacker and defender excellent materials for cover and concealment.
 - (4) Obstacles. No major obstacles were encountered.
- 8. Mission. Company PPU 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines conducts search and destroy operations in assigned area in Quang Ngai Province at L-hour on D-day to capture and destroy enemy forces, supplies and equipment located therein.
- 9. Concept of Operation. One rifle company conducts heli-borne assault to conduct search and destroy operations. After securing the LZ two platoons would assault the village of Tho An. Once the village was secure, the company would conduct search and destroy operations in the valleys to the West and South.

10. Execution.

UNIGENIADONI UEL

- a. Planning. Planning for this operation commenced as early as 22 March 1966, but execution was delayed due to a battalion sized operation. Battalion Frag Order #5-66 was issued on 17 april 1966, at which time a full briefing was held by the Commanding Officer and staff for Company "F" commander and all attached unit leaders.
- b. D-day 12 April 1966. At 191057H the Company "F" helicopter lift commonded. The dompany was placed in an LZ at BS 468965, which was somewhat North and East of desired LZ. One aircraft was downed in LZ due to mechanical troubles. Upon completion of the Helicopter lift, the 1st plateon was ordered to provide security for the downed aircraft. F-2 and F-3 moved to assault the village of Tho An (BS 474954) (Encl (1)). The recon unit at BS 479968 reported that the armed helicopters were receiving fire from the village, and the FAC requested a napalm run from the "on-station" aircraft. The village was assaulted after the air strike. The two platoons entered and searched the village without opposition. Two squads were positioned on the Southeastern side of the village and the remainder of the area was checked out a second time. One shot gun was uncovered in a house and serral tunnels were blown. These tunnels were short, narrow, and poorly hidden, however, they were considerably more extersive than the normal house - shelters. During the assault of the village F-2 continued to remain in the vicinity of the LZ. After the village was secured, F-1 conducted search operations in the stream beds and on the hillsides at BS 4596 and BS 4696 with negative contact. All civilians in the village were gathered together and questioned. They all admitted that the VC used the village and that 8-12 VC had been there that morning. One VCS was taken into custody, interrogated, and later evacuated. Initially there were approximately 130 people who requested evacuation to the





refugee center; but during the period of interrogation VC snipers fired into the immediate vicinity where the civilians were located and many flods F-2 was deployed to attack the snipers, and 60mm fire was used to drive them away. The VC were pursued for 800-1000 meters but escaped into another village. Company "F" suffered 2 WIA's during the engagement. At approximately 191730H, Company "F" withdrew from Tho An and established a combat base at BS 466956. Seventy-seven civilians were evacuated by helicopter to Binh Son, At 191901H a detail of Marines getting water at BS 474954 were taken under fire by 2-3 VC with M-3 SMG's and machine pistola. The detail returned fire with small arms and automatic weapons. Artillery and 60mm mortans were also used to engage the VC. No friendly casualities. Estimated two VC KTAI's. At the same time an estimated 18 VC wore seen climbing the side of hill 661 in the vic of BS 457986. Artillery fire was ineffective due to nature of terrain and an airstrike was requested for early on Dal. Three night ambushes were set out by squad size write. But no contact was made with the VC (Emcl (2)).

- b. Del 20 April 1966. At 200640H The An was attacked for the second time, assoched for the third time, and found to be empty. The company moved in tactical column to the west. At 201018H F=2 was detached to search and destroy in the vienity of BS 4295, BS 4395, BS 4495, BS 4294, BS 4594, and BS 4494. The remainder of the company moved to vicinity BS 453931 and established a combat base, F-3 accompanied by a guide from the Recommaissance Battalian proceeded to the South to conduct search and destroy in the vicinity of a reported POW and reeducation camp (Encl (3)). F-3 found the camp described. The camp consisted of several structures, believed to be a POW helding facility, a messhall, two living structures, and one classroom. A tunnel complar was also found in this area. All structures were burned and the tunnels were gassed and blown shut, Ambushes were set out the night of D+1 but no contact was made. (Encl (4)).
- c. <u>D+2 21 April 1966</u>. At 210040H a message was received from Commanding Officer of 2/7 directing the Company to be prepared for helicopter extraction on 21 April 1966. Further operations were cancelled. The company moved rapidly to enother LZ at BS 449937 at first light on 21 April 1966 for extraction. The lift did not commence until late afternoon and was completed without incident.



- a. Communications. The communications support throughout the operation was excellent with the exception of some difficulty experienced on the artillery conduct of fire net.
- b. <u>Support</u>. The company received satisfactory helicopter resupply support after initially experiencing some confusion. A message was neceived on the TAR net that the request for resupply had been unlikely and would not be filled. This proved to be false as the Battalion ALO had submitted an official request the day previous.
- 13. Special Equipment and Techniques. None.
- 14. Commanders Analysis. There were two areas that effected the responsiveness of artillery fire support during this operation. The first was the astablishment of the "no fire area" for a recommaissance element that was operating in a close proximity to Company $^{6}F^{10}$. In one instance, a Company "F" target overlapped into the "no fire area" resulting in an extensive delay of fire support while the reconnaissance personnal were contacted by radio from the Eaginer tal FSCS to determine their location. Prior adjustment of the "no fire area" and direct communications between the reconneissance and other operating unit can resleve this time delay. The second delay factor was the reconnaissance element relaying fire missions through Company "F" is conduct of fire net rather than going direct to the supporting artillery agencies as they normally do. (The recon unit was not attached, but only provided enemy sightings). The procedure of relaying fire missions through Company "F" was for one of safety, but is considered unnecessary as long as the two operating units are talking and coordinating by radio and the common FSCC is monitoring the requested fire mission.

15. Pacommendations. That search and destroy operations of company size and of 5 or 4 day duration, continue to be conducted in this area to offset utilization and control by VU farces.

6. Supporting Forces.

a. Artillary. Elements of 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines located in Chu Iai were propared to support the company during D-day and Dal. Other than night defensive fires for the night of D-day, no other fires were requested.

b. Air.

(1) Helicopter Troop Lift. Twenty-four MAG-36 helicopters transported Company "G"from landing zone Carp (BT 509052) to the objective area LZ (BS 625928) on D-day. Lift commenced at 160805H and was completed at 160822H. Negative enemy contact on landing.

- (2) Armed Helicopters. Armed helicopter support was provided for the helicopter lift on D-day, and for security and observation during the initial movement to the objective area. Effective close supporting fires on a VC trench line and cave were delivered during the initial movement.
- (3) Helicopter Med-Evac. Request for med-evacs for heat casualties were both timely and without incident.
- (4) CAS. Fixed wing aircraft were on strip alert during the operation. No support was required.



- (b) On about 15 April 1966 reports were recieved indicating one company had moved to the northwest into the objective area, from where Maxine units were located during Operation "NEVADA". These reports were not given a reliability rating.
- Throughout the conduct of the operation, no resistance was encountered. Two VC tranch lines and other prepared positions indicated recent use in the vicinity of the objective area. One trench line was located at BS 629936 and the other at BS 628940. Both had adjoining caven extending about 10 meters back into the hill. If the statements of the two civilians from the village located at BS 629943 are valid, the VC use that area as a rice collection point for further transportation to the East. One male civilian reported 30 VC arrived with carbines and automatic rifles, dressed in khaki and black uniforms, and stayed in their village on the night of 14 April 1966. He further stated the VC were North Vietnamese and that they collected 50 kilo of nice per mouth from each family in the village. Further indications of VC activity were discovered in the vicinity of ES 641936 where numerous foot panil stakes were found throughout the area.
- c. VI Units Indentified. No Viet Cong units were identified through documents or interrogation of local civilians.
- d. Significant Intelligence Gained. No significant information was obtained other than mentioned in paragraph b. above.

- (2) Observation and Fields of Fire. The area of operation was characterized by low mulling hills with heavy dense vegetation at places, and large open rice paddies. Fields of fire and observation were excellent over the open areas surrounding the hill.
- (3) Gover and Concealment. Heavy vegatation growing in patches on the hills could have provided excellent concealment for a platoon to company size force.

(4) Obstacles.


8. Mission. Company "G" 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines (Rein) conducts a helicoptemborme assault in the objective area at L-hour on D-day to evaluate air strike on a reported Viet Cong company located at BS 629957. and to conduct search and destroy operations against possible remaining elements of the VC Unit.

9. Concept of Operation.

a. On D-day Company "G" conducts helicopter-borne assault into the objective LZ (BS 625926) to evaluate an earlier air strike in the vicinity of a small hill located at BS 629937. Further, to find, fix and destroy Viet Cong forces reportedly operating in the objective area. (Encl (1)).

10. Execution.

as Flanning. Company "G", 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines was alerted to be prepared to conduct a two day search and destroy operation correspond 16 April 1966 at approximately 151800H. At about 152230H, the Company 1. 运输工程设施通过



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Commander received a briefing by the Battalion Commander, and Staff representatives concerning the operation. An oral frag order was issued at this time by the Battalion Commander and arrangements were made for a helicopter recommanders at 160650H, to select among other things the objective Ms. At approximately 152330H the operation order was issued to the platoon and attachment commanders based on 60, 2/7 verbal frag order.

b. P-day 16 April 1966. At 160730H the Bettalion Commender and Cornending Officer Company "G" made an aerial recommissance of the objective area and selected a helicopter landing some. Company "G" was staged in LZ Carp (ET 509052) at 160630H. Twenty-four MAG 36 helicopters commenced the assault lift at 160755H arriving in the LZ at 160805H. The lift was completed at 160822H. Each plateon had been assigned responsibility for one third of the LZ perimeter with the Company Headquarters and attachments deployed on the high ground on the North and of the LZ (BS 625930). At 160345H a sweep of the high ground at (BS 629935) was initiated with two platoons abreast. One plateon with one section of 61mm mortars attached were held in reserve (BS 629950) to support the assault elements by fire if mecessary. During the sweep, two trench lines were found with small adjoining caves located at BS 629936 and BS 628939. Individual firing positions located around the trench lines were also observed. Approximately 5000 pounds of mice vits found in Giao Thuy (3) village (BS 629942) and reported to 2/7 Headquarters. Two local civilians reported 30 VC were in the village on Li April 1966. They were reported as North Vietnamese who collected and transported rice from the village to the West. Based on this information a search and destroy operation was conducted to the West to include the high ground at BS 641935) and village at BS 642941 with negative results. Company "G" them moved to the vicinity of BS 622954 without contact where resupply by two MAG 36 helicopters was completed at 161700H. At the same time, Commanding Officer 2/7, arrived with the resupply helicopter, and was briefed on the days operations. The Company set in for the night at 161800H in a defensive perimeter around a deserted harlet at BS 617957. Ambush sites were established at BS 616953, BS 611949, BS 623956, and BS 617962. (Encl (2)). At 162215H a fire team amough reported seeing two men approximately 50 meters north of their ambush site (BS 617962). Approximately 20 rounds were fired at the two men, but a search of the area after the firing and the next morning produced negative results.

c. <u>D+l 17 April 1966</u>. At 170800H a search of the island at BS 623963 was conducted with negative results. At 170945H the someony commenced its return to the 2/7 CP area. Two Popular Force Plateons were observed at BS 604953 who had reportedly moved into that area about 5 April 1966. Company "G" returned to its position by foot march at 171545H without incident.

- 14. Commanding Officer's Analysis.
- a. Company size operations outside the TAOR, of 2-4 day duration, may be used to attain several coals including timely intelligence, disorganizating small enemy units operating outside the Chu Lei enclave, and denying the enemy the use of established resupply routes and areas. Continued consideration should be given to maximum helicopter support during the initial stages of the operation as was done in this operation. Helicopter lift time for the rifle company reinforced was 17 minutes which is considered excellent. A ready reserve unit of company size or larger should have the ability to reinforce the committed unit within one hour to enable the timely exploitation of any tactical advantage.
- b. While this was an excellent exercise in the rapid deployment of a Marine Rifle Company by helicopter and served to give added spirit and cohesion to Company "G", it was, nonetheless, fruitless. The operation leunched on uncredited intelligence to the effect that the VC had fled toward the Marines positions at Ghu Lai in order to emcape the Marines participating in Operation "NEVADA". Such a report hardly makes sense as was proved by the operation.
- c. It was readily apparent from the presence of two plateons of PF units at ES 604953 that a determined effort had recently been initiated to provide protection for the resettlement of the area.

Recommendations. It is recommended that our resources and time not be expended in chasing such unreliable reports in the future.


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MAP: SOE TRA Sheets 6757 I Series 1701 1:50,000 Co G 2nd Ra; 7th Marines




CONCEPT OF OPERATIONS

6. Supporting Forces.

We (28 621844), one battery of 155's at Queng Ngai (BS 628722), and one platoon of 8" at Binh Son (BS 597626). All artillery was in general support. Artillery was not used on D-day due to the fact that the guntarget line pointed directly at advancing friendly troops. Fortunately this poor positioning of artillery was offset by the prependerance of close air support. H and I fires were requested for the night of D-day but were disapproved due to close proximity of friendly forces. On call fires were planned but not utilized the night of D-day. Prop fires to support a tactical maneuver were fired on D+1 on a village complex at BS 544920 with good coverage. Approximately 20 rounds of this mission landed long and showered friendly positions with nearly spent shell fragments. One Marine received a slight wound and was evacuated.

b. Air.

- (1) Helicopter Troop List. The battalien had only one troop lift which occurred on D-day. Twenty MAG-36 helicopters lifted the battalion from LZ Carp (BT 509052) to LZ #1 (BS 523823) in the objective area. The troop lift went smoothly with the exception that separate divisions of helicopters landed in the extreme north and south ends of the LZ. This involved a separation of tactical units over an area of some 500 to 800 meters, and hindered unit commanders in regaining unit libragrity. This also resulted in some helicopters landing outside of the established security perimeter for the LZ. First elements were lifted from LZ Carp at 210830H. All units were in the LZ by 211050H.
- (2) Close Air Support. All close air support in the objective area on D-day was controlled by USAF TAC (A). Since the TAC (A) had additional aircraft waiting on station they were used to control CAS on targets with minor adjustments by the 2/7 FAC. CAS struck three targets for 2/7. The first was the village at BS 537845 on which three strikes were called. The first strike was made at 211345H by two F-8's with 20mm on a run from the south to north. Coverage was good with inpact on northern portion of target. The second and third strikes on the same village were made at 211430H with two A-4's and two F-4's equipped with "zuni" rocket pods and 20mm on runs from west to east. These runs were on target and skillfully executed considering the hill mass in the immediate vicinity on the east side of the target. These letter strikes were the turning point of the engagement as rockets stunned the enemy enough to permit Company "H" and elements of Company _ The 2rd target "G" to naneuver and then assault with m

was 40 VC in the open at BS 542810. This target was spotted by the 3rd Plat of Company "G" from hill 85 (BS 542816). Two A-4's nade bomb runs with excellent coverage. The 3rd Plat of Company "G" observed the strike and conservatively estimated 10-15 VC KBA. The third target was a village complex at BS 548821. Two USAF B-57's were called in with napalm, bombs, and 20mm. Ordnance was on target with good effect. All requests for 2/7 air support were made directly to the TAC (A).

- (3) Armed Helicopters. 2/7 did not use UH-IE aircraft until Delaborause of non-availability of air space on D-day. On Delatwo UE-IE's were requested via the HAR net to fly in firect support of 2/7 in its sweep to nighway #1. Within 30 minutes two HU-IE's were on station. No targets were discovered while the first two HU-IE's were on station. Two more UH-IE's were requested and promised to relieve on station, however, none arrived.
- (4) Helicopter Med-Evac and Resupply. Reaction time was generally excellent except in a few instances where poor communications delayed nequests. On one occassion helicopter pilots demonstrated their highly professional ability when they were fired upon in the 4% by . Socal machine guns while autempting a med-evac. They took off, circled around, and made a low level appearant to a near-by area behind a screen of trees from which they successfully effected the med-evac.

7. Intelligence.

a. Estimate of VC Strength, Location, and Disposition in the Objective

- (2) The intelligence information which predicated Operation "HOT STRINGS", was initially obtained by 2nd ARVN Division forces from a VC who defected at Vui Tuon on 20 April 1966. The information was attracted furnished to 2/7 at 2230 on the same day at which time it was considered to be reliable and valid.
- (3) The objective of the operation was to fix and destroy suspected WO white in the assigned area of responsibility.

b. To Strongth and Situation Actually Found as Contacted. It is readily apparent that the VC unit angreed by 277 or 21 April was part

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of the heavy weapone bettalich initially enticipated to be in the objective area. The number of VC killed at the site of contact (BS 537814), plus the number and type of weapons captured, indicate the unit was of company size. Better then half of this company was eliminated.

- c. VC Units Identified. None.
- d. Significant Intelligence Gained.
- (1) The diagram in enclosure (1) and the following parrative is presented as significant intelligence gained by 2/7 on Operation THOT SPRINGS" about VC weapons deployment and defensive tections.
- (a) The occupied VC .50 cal MG positions were located on line along the trail at BS 536814 as indicated on the diagram. All the weapons were positioned to cover the trail and the open rice paddy area to the West. The positions were circular with a reised mound in the center to afford a 360% sweep of the area.
- (b) Position number 6 on the sketch contained an antiaircraft mount but no weapon. The position was masked by a house
 to the West and North, and a hedgerow to the South. Observation of
 the position would have been almost impossible from the ground or
 the air. It is significant to note that effective ground fire could
 not be delivered from this location, however, it appeared to be an
 excellently concealed position from which to observe and fixe on aircraft.
- (c) During the initial contact, and prior to the air strikes on the hamlet at BS 537814, the VC wisely fired only one or two short bursts at a time with one .50 cal MG, thereby giving no indication that more than one such weapon was located there. This procedure may have been a ruse in an attempt to draw Marine units close to the hamlet without the benefit of supporting arms preparation.
- (d) Camouflage and concealment of the 50 cal MG positions was excellent. In fact, position number 3 on the diagram was not located until the morning following the battle when a second search was being conducted and a Marine fahl through the camouflage covering wherein a 50 cal MG was located. In addition, the VC gunners did not use tracer amunition making it difficult to pinpoint the gun locations.
- (2) The bablets in grid squares BS 5285, 5282, and 5382 showed a noticeble lack of civilian habitation. It is believed that these areas were being used exclusively for the quartering of VC forces. However, an abundance of farm tools and new entrenchments were discovered in these locations.
- (3) The hamlet of Dei Loc (1) at BE \$10620 was found to contain a comparatively new series of excellently way red and conceded positions at US 571621. The quality of these fortifications were comparable to those encountries by 2/7 on Operation. "TTAH" at BE 555871. [[MALACCIPAL]]



e. <u>Terrain</u>.

(1) Critical Terrain Features.

- (2) Observation and Fields of Fire. The terrain in the area of operations was comparatively flat interrupted only by hill masses and built up areas of habitation. Observation and fields of fire would have been in favor of the defender had he chosen to occupy any of these locations.
- (3) Cover and Concealment. It is becoming increasingly obvious that the apparent sparsity of cover and concealment in an area does not hinder VC movement for deployment. He is able to make maximum use of previously prepared and concealed positions in almost any area of operation. In addition, by making use of a hand made circular wicker covered with camouflage and sorn on his back, he is able to adequately conceal himself even in a wide open area.
- (4) Obstacles. No major obstacles were encountered during the course of the operation.
- 8. Mission. 2nd Battalion, 7th Marine's (-)(Rein) conducts helicopters bonne assault on 21 April 1966 in conjunction with RVN forces to conduct search and destroy operations in designated zone.
- 9. Concept of operation. 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines (-)(Rsin) conducts helicopter-borne assault on D-day at L-hour in LZ #1 (BS 523823). One company initially secures LZ then the eastern L80° of zone on arrival of the second company. The second company secures western 180° of LZ on landing. The battalion command group, H&S Company (-) and reserve company follow into LZ in that order. On order 2/7 commences search and destroy operations to the East with two companies alreast, one company in trace and H&S Company provisional platoon in reserve.

10. Execution.

- a. <u>Planning</u>. At 202230H the Commanding Officer and his staff were briefed by the CO 7th Marines and his staff, on operations to be conducted on 21 April 1966. Combat and combat service support unit commanders were present. All orders and instructions were verbal, and based on orders and instructions received and liaison conducted. Commanding Officer 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines issued verbal orders for execution of Operation "HOT SPRINGS" at 210010H at the Battalion CP.
- b. D-day 21 April 1966. 2/7 (-)(Rein) commenced helicopter lift at 210815 from LZ Carp (BT 509052) to objective LZ #1 (BS 528824) supported by 20 MAG 36 Helicopters. (Encl 2). Leading elements of Company "H"





landed in LZ at 210845H and encountered the lone sniper resulting in one friendly WIA. Company "H" was widely scattered due to separate helicopter divisions landing at extreme ends of the general area of the LZ. At 210915 Company "H" killed one VC, found 300 rounds of 50 caliber machine gun ammunition, a sight for an anti-air-craft .50 caliber machine gun and some documents. At 211050H the helicopter lift was completed and after some delay all units were densolidated and dispersed in the LZ. Company "H" recon element scouted out village at BS 528823 at 211115H with negative. results. 2/7 continued East at 211145H with Companies "G" and "H" abreast Company "G" on the left. The Command Group and H&S Company (-) followed in trace with Company "E" bringing up the rear. Company "H" received heavy caliber automatic weapons fire from BS 537816. The coup position was engaged with 81mm mortars, small arms and automatic weapons fire, Air strikes on the enemy position followed. Company "H" had one KIA and 2 WIA. Company "G" s 3rd Platoon moved aggressively to seize hill 97 (BS 538825) and did no without opposition while air strikes continued on enemy positions. Med-eves helicopters were fired on by the same enemy .50 caliber machine gun had were unsuccessful. Evacuation helicopters were diverged to a covered area to execute the mission. Air was again called on target of 211470H after which Company "H" launched a second assault on enemy positions only to be minned down once again. Company "G"'s 3rd Platoon then worked South on ridge line at BS 529823 to gain high ground above the enemy position. A third air strike was called with excellent target coverage, after which the 3rd platoon of Company "G" provided supporting fires for Company "H" who launched a determined assault at 211515H and successfully carried the enemy position. (Encl (3)). One platoon of Company "H" maneuvered to the South end of the village and destroyed VC forces attempting to flee through this avenue of escape. The 3rd platoon of Company "G" continued to spot fleeing targets for Company "H", and was also successful in providing target information for an air strike on VC in the open at BS 539811. Company "H" commenced consolidation and a thorough search of village at 211550H, finding numerous dead VC and weapons. The remainder of 2/7 moved to the high ground and consolidated for the night on hills 97 (BS 538825) and 85 (BS 5418k6). After completing its search, Company "H" joined the battalion night defensive perimeter at 211845H. An air strike was called at 211730H on the village complex at BS 546827 with good target coverage. 3/7 elements on the left requested to evaluate results of the air strike as they had received heavy small arms fire from this area earlier. Permission was granted by CO 2/7 with all 3/7 units pulling back to their zone at 211845H. Night activity was sent out a 212100H (Encl (4)). There was no enemy contact throughout the night. On call fires were planned but not used. H&II fires were denied by CO, 7th Marines due to close proximity of friendly forces.

Company "B" commenced search and destroy of village complex at BS 547820 at 220730H after a forty minute artillery preparation. Company "G" was prepared to support from hill 97. Cless proximity of artillery caused one minor WIA in Company "E". Also one other WIA was incurred from a panji stake as Company "E" moved out to objective area. No contact was encountered in village.







At 220900H Company """ rejoined battalian forces, and Company "G" moved to come up on line with Company "E". Company "G" found 70 packs, annumition and miscellaneous equipment as they swept through village at BS 551823. Six dead 70 in village were eradited to 3/7 action in this area on 21 April 1366. Search and destroy operations to the RR tracks were made without contact. Destroyed bunkers, caves and tunnels were discovered throughout the area during search and destroy operations. Progress was slowed due to excessive hour and med-even heat exhaustion cases taken out by help. 2/7 closed on the mailread tracks at 221535H. Armed hele's escented the battalian part way, but were not replaced as requested and promised. CO 7th Marines directed CO 2/7 to continue to highway #1 for vehicle pickup at 221700H. Armived at highway #1 at 221645H, departed aboard trucks from IP (BS 632820) at 221820H with all units closing permanent CP without incident at 222015H.



12. Alministrative Matters.

as Higher headquarters should not rely on casualty frames contained in martical spot reports or situation reports. Responsibility for connect escuelty figures rests with the S-l and is given in reports by the S-l. The present escuelty reporting system employed by Regimental S-l is unacceptable as it groups together MA and non-battle evacuations into the rights. This does not reflect a correct picking for the required reports. Firsther, no provision is made for wounded in action, not evacuated.

b. Resupply requests were not properly filled. On D-day one case of M-26 frag granades was ordered and thirteen cases came in. The excess was







immediately placed aboard a later arriving belicopter for return to the LEA. A 72-day request for 40mm ammurition for the M-79 grenade launcher was not fullfilled. No reason was given for lack of resupply.

- c. Separate radio nets operating in the immediate vicinity of one another lacked sufficient span between radio frequencies. En Tac net was 41.7 mcs while the helicopter direction net was 41.5 mcs. The result was constant interference on one or the other net.

- 14. Commanders Analysis.
- volume and accuracy of enemy fire, thus permitting enemy positions to be overrun by the infantry with minimum casualties. Control of close air was once again by TAC (A) even though an FAC team was attached to the assault company. The latter only recommended minor adjustments to the strikes and then only to the TAC (A) who in turn relayed the corrections to the strike eigenaft. If the TAC (A) is going to continue to menepolize control of attack eigenaft when it comes on station, then we best reevaluate the present mission of the FAC. This battalion stands solidly on the position that FAC's should control strikes.
- b. Attacking on the gun-target line of artillery requires detailed coordination with both the supported and supporting agencies. When possible pre-positioning of artillery should be influenced by an attempt to locate fixing positions that would be perpendicular to the assumed direction of attack.
- c. The enemy's tenacious effort to resist capture was evidenced by his refusal to surrender when encouraged to do so from a trapped position. His roply was a grenade thrown in response. Even against superior odds the enemy shows a determination to resist. This is certainly an indication that he is a better trained fighter than some would believe.
- d. The Battalion Civil affairs Team treated two adult females and six children who had received wounds when the enemy positions were under attack. All were evacuated to Quang Ngai Hospital by helicopter for further treatment.

15. Recommendations

- a. In a helicopter-borne assault into a large area of uniform terrain, every effort must be made to mark the location of where the intial lift has Manded. In the absence of such markings, pilots of subsequent lifts can be oriented by armed escort helicopter who remain in the vicinity of the assault MZ.
 - b. Requested air support must be confirmed or denied not ignored.









- c. Ensure positive control of all artillery, U.S. and ARVN, in the area of operation. Farticular emphasis should be made to position artillery so that the gun-target line does not coincide with the axis of advance of infantry.
- d. Radio frequencies assigned to units in the area of operations must have sufficient spread to avoid radio interference with tactical nets.


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
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
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
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
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
