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PART II

EXCLUDED FROM AUTOMATIC DOWNGRADING AND DECLASSIFICATION

1. This command's activities for the month of April may be separated into two parts. The first part concerns activities within the CHU LAI TAOR from 1 April to 10 April. During this period two organic rifle companies were detached to other commands. The remainder of the battalion conducted saturation patrolling throughout the TAOR with particular emphasis on increased security and surveillance measures in the area designated as the Missile Belt in order to prevent enemy rocket attacks on the airfield. No rocket attacks occurred during this period.
2. The second part of the month's activities covers the period from 11 April to 30 April, in which the battalion assumed responsibility for the northern sector of the DA NANG TAOR. As opposed to the Chu Lai TAOR, a designated missile belt covered a lesser portion of the battalion's 17 1/2 square mile sector of responsibility. Intensive patrolling was conducted in this area. On 18 April, a 155 man Bald Eagle reaction force was helilifted into an area where a sighting of 80-100 VC by a recon OP had been reported. The reaction force found no sign of enemy activity. Within the sector of responsibility two vital installations required permanent security forces; these installations were the NAM O Bridge AT 927843 and the ESSO Refinery AT 935864. The NAM O Bridge was blown by a suspected enemy underwater demolition team on 13 April. Intelligence subsequently received indicated that the demolitions used to blow the bridge had been placed on the piling in large quantities over a period of several weeks. In response to this action and reliable intelligence reports of enemy activity, a company size search and destroy operation was commenced on 28 April.

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PART III

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS1. TOPICSa. Personnel and Administration

(1) During the month of April, this battalion joined 2 officers and 72 enlisted personnel. 1 officer and 43 enlisted were processed for rotation.

(2) Promoted by rank were 63 corporals, 87 Lance Corporals and 2 PFC's.

(3) Recommendations are pending for the following awards: 2 Medals of Honor, 11 Silver Stars, and 10 Bronze Stars. Four Navy Commendation Medals and 40 Purple Hearts were presented.

(4) 110 Marines were processed for R&R.

(5) Casualties Sustained

(a) There were 45 casualties sustained during the reporting period of which 15 were KIA and 30 were WIA.

(b) Of the figures above, 9 of the KIA's and 24 of the WIA's were sustained by the company OPCON to 3/7 on Operation DESOTO.

(c) There were 5 non-battle casualties.

b. Enemy, Weather, and Terrain

(1) From 1-10 April while this unit was in the CHU Lai area, enemy activity and contact decreased from an all time high to an all time low. This drastic decrease must be directly attributed to the success of Operation PERRY conducted during the latter part of March when over 2,000 civilians were displaced to refugee centers. Contact action in the Battalion's sector of the Da NANG sector of responsibility has been confined to one incident when an estimated reinforced VC platoon attacked a Marine squad size patrol on 21 April.

(2) Promoted by rank were 63 corporals, 87 Lance Corporals and 2 PFC's.

(2) The amount of anti-personnel mining also decreased sharply in the CHU Lai area and can also be attributed to Operation PERRY. In comparing the emplacement of anti-personnel mines in the CHU Lai and Da NANG areas, it is noted that these mines were more strategically placed and better camouflaged in the CHU Lai area. On 13 April two spans of the N.M. O bridge AT 927843 were blown by an estimated 1500 pounds of demolitions. Investigation by divers revealed an expert demolitions job requiring a number of weeks to be carried out.

(3) Casualties Sustained

(a) There were 45 casualties sustained during the reporting period of which 15 were KIA and 30 were WIA.

(b) Of the figures above, 9 of the KIA's and 24 of the WIA's were sustained by the company OPCON to 3/7 on Operation DESOTO.

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(3) Revision and updating of contingency plans has been pursued.

(4) Enemy information is received more rapidly in this unit's Sector of Responsibility than the previous location, however, to date, the reliability of this information has not proven as accurate. Nevertheless, all information received is acted upon with the findings forwarded to the appropriate agency in an endeavor to assist in their evaluation of different agents.

(2) Fire Support

(a) During the reporting period, 39 observed fire missions were fired with a total of 456 HE, 19 illumination, 4 smoke, and 2 WP rounds expended.

(b) During the same period, 1847 H&I missions were fired with a total of 4468 rounds expended.

(3) Air Support

(a) This battalion submitted a total of 39 helicopter requests during the month of April, with 37 of these run. 9 of these requests were medevacs.

(b) 5 fixed wing air strikes were conducted by TAC (A) within the sector of responsibility.

d. MISSION. 2nd Bn, 7th Mar occupies and defends assigned sector of responsibility (SOR); conducts unilateral offensive operations and aggressive day/night patrolling and ambushing throughout SOR and, upon approval, in the RZ; maintains maximum surveillance and interdiction of waterway access/egress routes into SOR and of possible rocket sites located therein; prepares to conduct combined and coordinated operations with GVN forces within and beyond SOR; provides alert forces and convoy escorts from squad to company size, as directed, and prepares to deploy as a battalion, on twelve hour notice, as a reserve/alert force for operations anywhere in RVN; launches counterattacks against possible enemy penetrations in SOR; conducts a concentrated and sustained civic action and psychological warfare program in support of Revolutionary Development and in coordination with GVN officials; organizes, trains, advises and, as necessary, initially provides combat skilled leadership to the Popular Forces in the form of Combined Action units; and maintains security of vital lines of communications in coordination with GVN forces within SOR.

f. Combined Action Company Program

(1) Prior to departure from CHU LAM on 10 April, the battalion officially formed two CAP's, L-1-1 at PHU LU (1) and L-1-3 at CHAU TU (2). Upon arrival in the DA NANG SOC, 2nd Bn, 7th Marines assumed OPCON of three CAP's: B-1-1 at HON THACH, B-1-4 at HON VINH, and B-1-5 at CHO MAI. CAC "B" Company Headquarters is an administrative component of Sub Unit #1 of Headquarters Battalion, 1st Marine Division and is colocated with CAP B-1-1.

(2) CAP operations remained normal during the period. Problems encountered include shortages of T/E equipment, primarily communications and motor transport, and a lack of qualified interpreters.

g. Logistics, Equipment and Supply On 10 April the battalion moved from CHU LAM to DA NANG. The swiftness of the move required the battalion to leave behind many items of supply such as concertina wire, lumber, bunker material, crushed rock, sand, cement, telephone poles, 55 gallon drums of gasoline, stakes and ammunition. Since the battalion arrived in DA NANG, the supply situation has been generally good with some difficulty encountered in procuring class II supplies (spark parts for motor transport and seismic intrusion detectors) and class IV supplies (8' foot stakes and concertina wire). The shortage of parts for the 60mm mortar has been a critical problem with only 4 - 60mm mortars operational. The non-availability of spare parts, particularly suspension arm bearings has caused a high dead line rate in motor transport.

1. SUMMARY OF THE ENEMY SITUATION.

a. The P-31 VC Company operates in hamlets along the northern shore of the Tra Bong River. The exact location of this company is unknown, however the majority of recent enemy contacts and sightings has been centered in objectives SAVANNAH and DECATUR.

b. The VC subdistrict headquarters for Northern Binh Son District has been reported moved into Objective ATLANTA. This headquarters group consists of 50 VC.

c. Unidentified VC units have been observed moving north across the Tra Bong River into the objective area. There is no confirmed information regarding this unit's identity or mission.

d. The VC frequently have boobytrapped paths and edges of some fields in objective area. The possibility of one booby trap emplaced so as to cause a sympathetic detonation seconds later from another booby trap is very probable.

e. Enemy Capabilities.

(1) VC can withdraw from the objective area by clandestine movement southward across the Tra Bong River or westward attempting to evade blocking positions and OP's.

(2) VC can snipe from concealed positions, at a sufficient distance to allow retreat before forces can react.

(3) VC can employ mines and booby traps to impede our advance and to cover his retreat.

(4) VC can avoid contact by hiding in caves and tunnels and by blending with the local populace.

f. Probable Courses of Action. Withdraw from the objective area and/or avoid contact by hiding and blending with local populace, simultaneously conducting sniping and harassing activities.
