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PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the month of October, 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines continued to provide saturation patrolling in the rocket belt portion of the TAOR, maintained a defensive posture at the Nam O Bridge and Ferry complex, and continued to provide security along Route One in Hai Van Pass. On 12 October the TAOR was extended to include the area south and east of Phu Loc, and Golf Company was helilifted and trucked to a new combat base at Phu Gia to assume responsibility of the area.

2. Contact was made with the enemy on seventeen different occasions with the majority of engagements characterized by brief contact at close range followed by subsequent withdrawal of the enemy. The most significant enemy contacts were as follows:

a. Ambush of a road sweep security team from Defend E in Hai Van Pass on 5 October using 1 250 pound bomb and automatic weapons.

b. Beachnut I OPCON 2/7 used to help recon team War Cloud on 14 October.

c. Beachnut I OPCON 2/7 and Defend F3 used to help recon team Texas Pete on 17-18 October.

d. Beachnut I OPCON 2/7 and Defend G used to help recon team Petrify 17-19 October.

e. Ambush of a bridge security unit from Defend E in Hai Van Pass on 19 October using grenades and automatic weapons.

f. Operation KNOX (See TAB C Part IV Command Chronology).

g. Ambush of night patrol from Defend F on 28 October using grenades and automatic weapons.

3. The Battalion conducted two designated operations during the month of October. Operation Golden Fleece 2/7-4 provided security for Vietnamese harvesters in the vicinity of Hoa Vinh, Hoa Loc, and Hoa Hiep from 1-23 October, during which time nine tons of rice were collected. Operation KNOX, 24-30 October, in the vicinity of Phu Loc was a regiment (-) search and destroy operation in the mountains and adjacent flat lands surrounding Dong Top. The operation had light contact during the first two days and inflicted 5 KIA (P).

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PART III

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTSI. TOPICSa. Personnel and Administration

(1) During the month of October, this Battalion joined 4 officers and 135 enlisted personnel. 4 officers and 150 enlisted were processed for rotation.

(2) Promoted by rank were 99 Corporals, 78 Lance Corporals, and 7 PFC's.

(3) Recommendations are pending for 3 Bronze Stars.

(4) 86 Marines were processed for R&R.

(5) Casualties Sustained

(a) There were 72 casualties sustained during the reporting period of which 10 were KIA and 37 were WIA.

(b) There were 25 non-battle casualties.

b. Enemy, Weather and Terrain

(1) During the month of October, 38 incidents occurred involving enemy forces in the Battalion TAOR. Of these, 23 were initiated by the enemy as follows:

Most significant of these was the heavy contact made on two occasions in Golf Company's TAOR near Phu Loc. This area, recently added to the Battalion TAOR, contains an estimated 1000 enemy Main and Local Force troops. Also significant is the increase in local force activity in the Fox trot area (Song Cu De).

(2) Fire Support

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(a) During the reporting period, 60 observed fire missions were fired with a total of 628 HE, 167 illumination, 20 smoke, and 46 WP rounds expended.

(b) During the same period, 5640 H&I missions were fired with a total of 26,737 rounds expended.

(3) Air Support. This Battalion submitted a total of 38 helicopter requests during the month of October with 37 of these completed. 18 of these requests were med-evac.

d. Plans. The 2nd Bn, 7th Marines occupies and defends positions within the assigned TAOR so as to contribute to the defense of the base area, airfield, and artillery facilities at Da Nang and conducts aggressive day and night patrolling and offensive operations within the TAOR. The Battalion is prepared, on order, to deploy on 12 hour notice as a reserve/reaction force. It assists in training of, and provides support to, Regional and Popular Forces and coordinates local security of all organizations and units in the battalion sector as assigned. It conducts pacification and civic action programs as directed and is prepared to deploy as a division reserve as directed.

Additional items of equipment specifically needed for use during the monsoon season were received. These include: rain suits, shower shoes, green wool shirts, and space heaters w/o conversion unit.

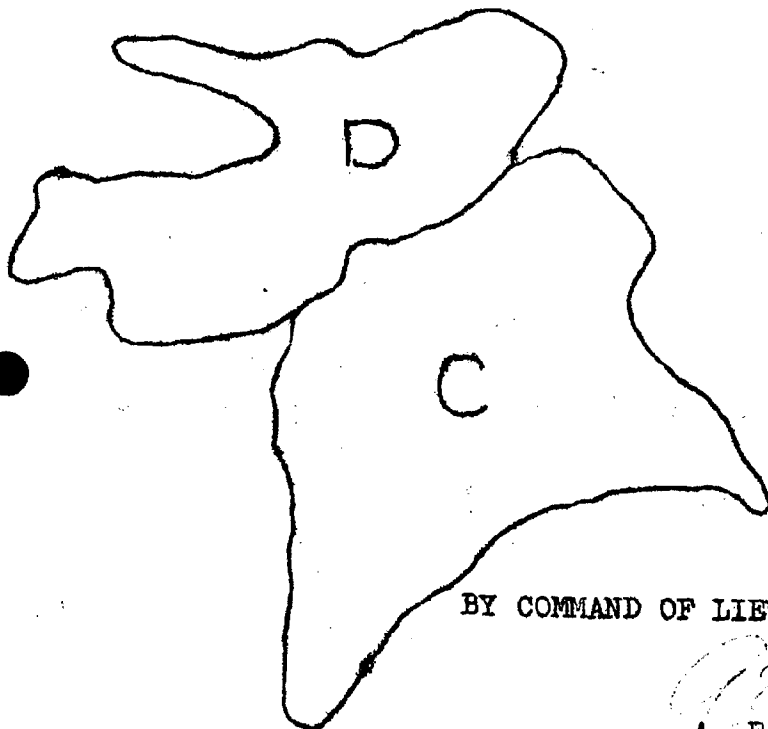

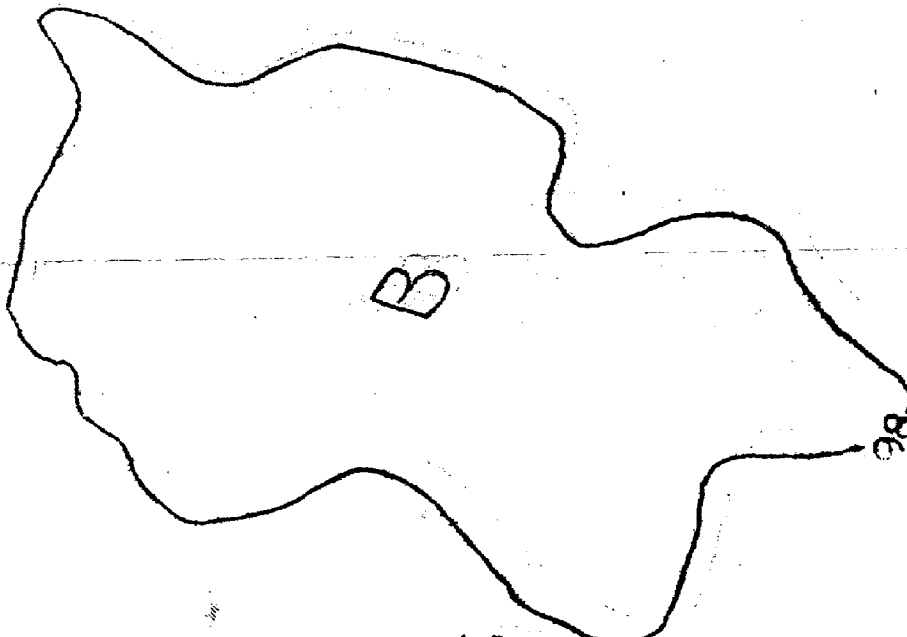
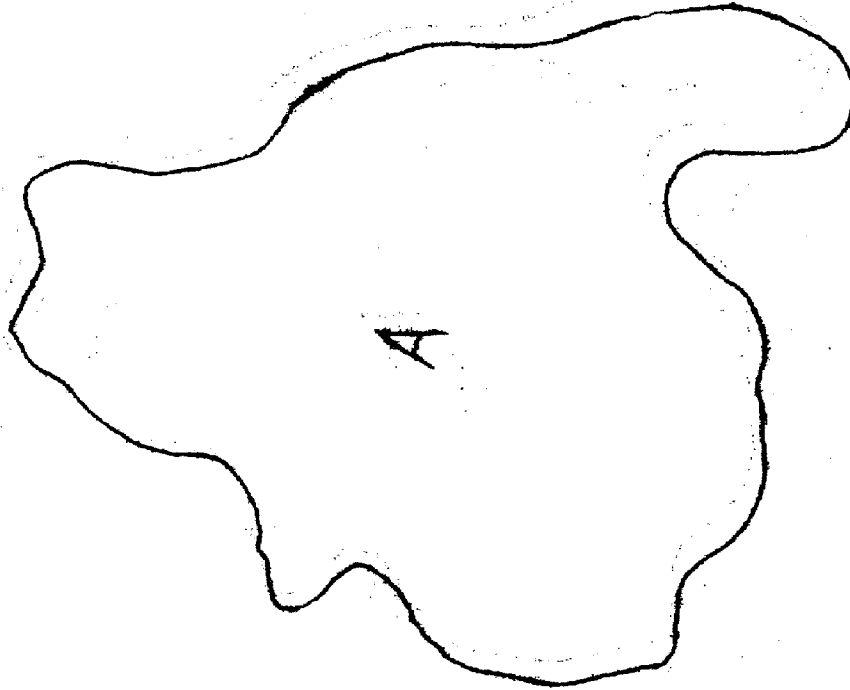

b. Companies E, F, and H

(1) On D-Day, and until the conclusion of the harvest, establish at least one additional day and night activity in the vicinity of the harvest area to protect Vietnamese Nationals and to deny the area to the Viet Cong.

(2) Coordinate with adjacent village councils concerning the issuance and checking of temporary passes given to local laborers authorized to work in the rice fields.

(3) Provide reaction forces as required.

c. Coordinating Instructions

(1) D-Day - To be announced.

(2) Termination date - end of harvest.

(3) Rules of Engagement are applicable (Annex G to reference (b)).

(4) Additional patrol activities will be submitted with regularly scheduled activities on order.

(d) Other forms of assistance, such as transportation of workers, storage of rice, transport of rice, etc.

(e) ARVN/RF/PF participation in operation.

(8) Spot reports will be submitted as expeditiously and as completely as possible.

(9) Thrust points remain unchanged.

4. ADMINISTRATION AND LOGISTICS

- a. Routine supply procedures remain unchanged.
- b. Special requests for motor transport or logistical support will be submitted to the S-4 48 hours prior to D-Day.

6. Supporting Forces

a. Artillery

(1) Direct support was provided by Btry H, 3/11, with Btry M, 4/11 in general support.

b. Air

(1) Fixed wing and helicopter support was provided by 1st Marine Airwing units on an "as needed" basis. No missions were flown in support of the operation.

7. Intelligence

a. General Situation:

The operation took place within the normal battalion T&OR, thus there were no additional intelligence requirements levied upon the S-2 section, nor were there any anticipated changes in the enemy situation.

b. Overt Enemy Situation:

The intelligence information available concerning the operation area is derived from low-level agent reports and combat patrols. Prior to the operation, low-level agents reported a possible VC Main Force Company north of the Song Cu De in the area of AT 9090. Marine patrols north of the river made three contacts with small Main Force units during the month of September, to give some credibility to the reports. IR reports also gave some indication of a large enemy unit to the west of Elephant Valley.

c. Covert Enemy Situation:

The civic action program in the operation area is widely accepted and popular. This fact, compiled with the outstanding rapport between the indigenous officials in the area and the Marines, indicates that the

infrastructure within the area is weakening greatly. Information from the Hoa Vang District secret agents also indicates a rapidly failing infrastructure.

d. During the operation, no significant contacts were made with enemy forces. The possible large force north of the Song Ca De remained alerted, and no attempts were made by possible infrastructure cadre to seize rice for Viet Cong resupply.

e. Since the operation area was within the normal battalion TAOR, no significant intelligence information was gained.

f. The CA/PayWar evaluation of the area continues to be good. The people are becoming more cooperative daily, and the programs are becoming increasingly popular.

8. Mission. Commencing D-Day 2nd Bn, 7th Marines conducts operations to protect Vietnamese Nationals during the harvest of rice, to deny food to VC, to stifle VC control over the local populace, and to ~~aggravate~~ VC Logistic Problems.

9. Concept of Operation. Patrol activities in the 2/7 TAOR were augmented by one additional day and night activity from each company. Emphasis was placed on surveillance within the harvest area and patrolling the periphery of fields and paddies (see overlay). Because these patrols were closely coordinated with the normal day and night activities and were in no way distinctive, it is not possible to assess the use of organic, attached, and supporting arms in this operation.

10. Execution

a. Planning. Preliminary planning began approximately three weeks before commencement of the operation with liaison visits to Hoa Vang District Headquarters. The operation order (ref b) was put out on 25 Sep 1967 and Operation Golden Fleece 2/7-4 commenced on 1 Oct 1967.

b. D-Day 1 Oct 1967

10.2 sq km of harvest area was protected. 1210 pounds of rice was collected, and 540 Vietnamese workers were protected. ARVN/RF/PF participation in the operation consisted of a PF platoon size unit as security north of Kim Lien (AT 9285) and 13 PF troops as security in the vicinity CAP 1, CAP 2, and CAP 3 (see overlay).

c. D+1 2 Oct 1967

8.3 sq km of harvest area was protected. 1420 pounds of rice was collected, and 1714 Vietnamese workers were protected. ARVN/RF/PF participation in the operation consisted of 18 PF troops providing security in areas C and D (see overlay).

d. D+2 3 Oct 1967

8.2 sq km of harvest area was protected. 875 pounds of rice was collected, and 322 Vietnamese workers were protected. ARVN/RF/PF participation in the operation consisted of an ARVN platoon at a bridge (AT 926866) and 19 PF troops as a security in areas C and D (see overlay).

e. D+3 4 Oct 1967

8.3 sq km of harvest area was protected. 1210 pounds of rice was collected, and 304 Vietnamese workers were protected. ARVN/RF/PF participation in the operation consisted of 75 PF troops as security in areas C and D (see overlay).

f. D+4 5 Oct 1967

8.3 sq km of harvest area was protected. 1290 pounds of rice was collected, and 278 Vietnamese workers were protected. ARVN/RF/PF participation in the operation consisted of 22 PF troops providing security in areas C and D (see overlay).

g. D+5 6 Oct 1967

8.8 sq km of harvest area was protected. 1935 pounds of rice was collected, and 433 Vietnamese workers were protected. ARVN/RF/PF participation in the operation consisted of an ARVN platoon at a bridge (AT 926866) and 19 PF troops providing security in areas C and D (see overlay).

h. D+6 7 Oct 1967

7.8 sq km of harvest area was protected. 1340 pounds of rice was collected, and 253 Vietnamese workers were protected. ARVN/RF/PF participation in the operation consisted of an ARVN platoon at a bridge (AT 926866) and 16 PF troops providing security in areas C and D (see overlay).

i. D+7 8 Oct 1967

8.4 sq km of harvest area was protected. 215 pounds of rice was collected, and 80 Vietnamese workers were protected. ARVN/RF/PF participation in the operation consisted of an ARVN platoon at a bridge (AT 926866) and 25 PF troops providing security in areas C and D (see overlay).

j. D+8 9 Oct 1967

7.0 sq km of harvest area was protected. 740 pounds of rice was collected, and 158 Vietnamese workers were protected. ARVN/RF/PF participation in the operation consisted of an ARVN platoon at a bridge (AT 926866), and 22 PF troops providing security in areas C and D (see overlay).

k. D+9 10 Oct 1967

5.0 sq km of harvest area was protected. 1610 pounds of rice was collected, and 186 Vietnamese workers were protected. ARVN/RF/PF participation in the operation consisted of an ARVN platoon at a bridge (AT 926866) and 19 PF troops providing security in areas C and D (see overlay).

l. D+10 11 Oct 1967

4.3 sq km of harvest area was protected. 1355 pounds of rice was collected, and 187 Vietnamese workers were protected. ARVN/RF/PF participation in the operation consisted of an ARVN platoon at a bridge (AT 926866) and 21 PF troops providing security in areas C and D (see overlay).

m. D+11 12 Oct 1967

6.0 sq km of harvest area was protected. 1360 pounds of rice was collected, and 219 Vietnamese workers were protected. ARVN/RF/PF participation in the operation consisted of an ARVN platoon at a bridge (AT 926866) and 21 PF troops providing security in areas C and D (see overlay).

n. D+12 13 Oct 1967

1. Code Name, Operation KNOX, a Regimental (-) (Rein) Search and Destroy Operation.
2. Dates of Operation, 240700 - 301700 Oct 67 for 2nd Bn, 7th Marines.
3. Location, Thua Thien Province, Phu Loc District. The operation was conducted in an area bounded by north - south grid lines 10 to 89 and east - west grid lines 95 to 09 on reference (a).
4. Control or Command Headquarters, The operation was conducted under the operational control of Headquarters, 7th Marines (see ref (b)).
5. Task Organization, See Annex A (Task Organization) to Enclosure (1).
6. Supporting Forces, Supporting forces for this operation includes 3/11, 4/11, and 1/12. Battery E (A-RAY), 3rd Bn, 11th Marines direct support priority of fires to 2/7. Battery L, 4th Bn, 11th Marines general support to the forces on Operation KNOX. Air support, both fixed wing and helicopter, was provided by the 1st Marine Air Wing. The USS NEW (DD818) provided naval gunfire in general support of forces.

a. Artillery

- (1) Batteries in Support

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(a) Direct support was provided 2nd Bn, 7th Marines from L Hour (240800H) to L+4 by Battery B (X-RAY), 3rd Bn, 11th Marines. (4-105's).

(b) Direct support was provided 2nd Bn, 7th Marines from L+4 to D+6 (301200H) by Battery B, 1st Bn, 12th Marines. (6-105's).

(c) General support artillery for this operation was provided by Battery L, 4th Bn, 11th Marines. (3-155 How).

(2) Artillery was used extensively for prep fires, H&I's, and targets of opportunity.

(a) 240300 - 240545 - H&I fires covered the area of the operation. Total 40 rounds.

(b) 240600 - 240645 - An artillery prep fire neutralized LZ HAWK (2C 177993) and the surrounding high ground. Total 128 rounds.

(c) 241830 - Defend 64 called a fire mission on grid 179975. The target was VC mortars and small arms fire. The coverage was good and the enemy fire was suppressed. Total 42 rounds.

(d) 242050 - Defend 63 wanted illumination marking rounds. Total 2 rounds.

(e) 242230 - Defend 22 called illumination mission on moving lights at grid 175994. Lights went out. Total 2 rounds.

(f) 242200 - Defend 22 called in a fire mission on moving lights at grid 175994. There was good coverage of the target but no positive surveillance was possible due to darkness. Total 12 rounds.

(g) 250625 - Defend 64 called in prep fire at grid 178974. First round 800 meters short. Ended mission. Total 1 round.

(h) 250730 - Defend 64 called in another prep fire at grid 181971 and proceeded to move into the area. Total 29 rounds.

(i) 250825 - Defend 64 called in a fire mission on VC small arms fire at grid 182971. A check of the area after the barrage indicated blood trails in and around bunkers. Artillery and friendly small arms fire were credited with 5 VC KIA probable. Total 24 rounds.

(j) 250900 - Defend 64 called in zone fire on suspected VC. Total 38 rounds.

(k) H&I's were used extensively during the hours of darkness. Between 20-40 H&I missions were plotted each day with each target receiving 4-5 rounds.

(3) Sava-planes were handled by the 3rd Bn, 11th Marines and artillery liaison was coordinated with 7th Marines FSCC.

Note: All data is approximate due to the lack of accurate information on round expenditure.

b. Air

(1) Landing Zone Prep. Landing Zone HAWK and FALCON were prepped with 1000 pound bombs, 500 pound bombs, napalm, rockets, and 20mm fire prior to L Hour using a TAG (A). Coverage of the landing zones and surrounding critical terrain was excellent and none of the transport helicopters received hostile fire.

(2) Troop Lift

(a) Troop lift from Landing Zone 460 was accomplished using 19 H-34 helicopters for the initial assault wave followed by 3 CH-53 helicopters into LZ HAWK. All elements of Company I, Company H, and Alpha Command Group were in place by L+28. Company G was helilifted from Company G combat base into LZ FALCON using the second wave of H-34's, and all elements of Company G were in place at L+47.

(b) Upon completion of the operation on D+6, helilift of Company H, Company I, and Alpha Command Group from the LZ to the respective combat bases commenced at 1215. Two CH-53 helicopters were used and the helilift was complete at 1610.

(3) Close Air Support. Close air support missions were run during the first and second days using a TAG (A), but after contact was lost with the enemy, there was a lack of suitable targets and fixed wing support was confined to TPQ-10 drops.

(4) Med-Evac and Resupply. Med-Evac and resupply missions were controlled by the HST attached to each of the companies. Because the LZ was close to the operating area, little delay was experienced when helicopters were available.

(5) Aerial Observer. Aerial Observers were on station during daylight hours whenever possible. In general, they were not used because of the lack of contact; however, an AO proved invaluable in assisting Company I finding the wreckage of the downed AC-47.

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c. Naval Gunfire

(1) Ships in support

(a) USS NEW (2 5" 38's)

(b) USS ALLEGANTY (2 5" 54's)

(2) Naval gunfire was used in LZ prep and H&I fires.

(a) 240600 - 240645 - LZ FALCON, grid 156994, was neutralized by intense preparation fire. Total 60 rounds.

(b) Naval gunfire fired a total of 1018 rounds at 206 H&I targets in 2nd Bn, 7th Marines TAOR during Operation KNOX.

b. Enemy Strength and Situation Actually Found as Operation was Conducted. Solid contact was established on two occasions during the conduct of the operation. No other type of activity occurred during the operation.

c. Enemy Units Identified

(1) None.

d. Significant Intelligence Gained

(1) In view of light contact, except for the evening of 24 October and morning of 25 October, it appears the enemy did not desire to establish firm contact and reacted by withdrawing from the area of operation.

(2) On 24 October Company H made contact with an unknown

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number of enemy at objective 3. Enemy opened fire from bunkers along the trail with automatic weapons. They appeared to use the body of a Marine as bait.

(3) On 25 October Company H made contact with an unknown number of enemy near objective 4. Enemy was dressed in "tiger" utilities, helmets, and packs. Five (5) enemy were seen to fall, but on arriving at objective 4 no bodies were found. Numerous bunkers and fighting holes were found on objective 4 in a 360 degree perimeter. Also found was one (1) helmet, one (1) pair gray trousers, six (6) Chi com grenades, and one (1) Chi com claymore mine.

(4) Company I found two (2) Chi com concussion grenades on objective 3.

(5) Company H retrieved the body of a Marine. The body had approximately 7 to 10 bullet holes in the stomach and legs. An attempt to booby trap the body had been made by the enemy by placing a M-26 frag grenade under the body.

(6) Numerous small one and two man bunkers were found along the mountain trails in the operations area. These bunkers were approximately 4' x 5' x 3' and were constructed of 3" to 5" diameter logs and dirt.

(7) One large cave was found at ZC 178991. Cave was approximately 10' x 12' x 60'. Search of cave revealed negative results.

(8) Found considerable evidence of recent logging in the area and one (1) crosscut saw and four (4) axes were at ZC 172978. The tools were destroyed.

(9) Company H found four (4) empty 82mm fuse boxes and one shotgun shell of unknown manufacturer at ZC 945916.

(10) Interrogated several children found herding water buffalo in the vicinity of ZC 1397. Children stated that they had seen armed men wearing green uniforms coming from the mountains in groups of 3 to 12 about 30 days before the operation. Then, two weeks later, groups of the same number were seen heading back into the mountains. Children further stated that to their knowledge there were no mines in the area as they herd the water buffalo throughout the area and have never had an explosion. During the sweep of the area, no mines or booby traps were found.

(11) Many abandoned homes were found in grid squares ZC 1398, 1498, 1397, and 1497, but most showed evidence of daily use and the orchards and fields for the most part are being cultivated.

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(12) Only daylight activity by civilian personnel was noted.

a. Terrain

(1) Trail and LZ overlay is attached. (see overlay (2)).

8. Mission

a. Continue defense of TAOR. Assume OPCON Company C, 1st Bn, 7th Marines 1000H on D-Day for combat base security in assigned TAOR.

b. Assume Command Company I, 3rd Bn, 7th Marines L Hour on D-Day for employment Operation KNOX.

c. Commencing L-Hour on D-Day helilift Battalion Command Group and three rifle companies into LZ FALCON and HAWK and conduct S&D operation in O/A.

9. Concept of Operation. At L-Hour on D-Day Company I will land in LZ HAWK and commence attack on objective 1. At L+75 minutes Company G will land in LZ FALCON and commence the attack on objective 3. At L+105 minutes Command Group Alpha will land in LZ HAWK and follow in trace of Company I. At L+135 minutes on D-Day Company H will land in LZ HAWK, consolidate the position, and be prepared to assume the mission of either attacking company.

10. Execution

191345: Commanding Officer, 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines, S-3, and S-2 went to debriefing by G-3, concerning the intelligence and tactical information gained while on B&D B&GLE in Phu Loc District.

201000: Commanding Officer, 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines, and S-3 went to Division Conference Room for planning of the operation. Selected staff members were present for the initial staff briefing for Operation KNOX. The 1st Division concept of operation was announced and key staff officers briefed.

211100: Commanding Officer, 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines, and S-3 went to Headquarters 7th Marines for CO's conference.

221400: An initial planning conference was held by the S-3 for representatives of attached and organic units.

231310: Commanding Officer, 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines, and S-3 made final aerial observation flight of objective area.

232130: S-3 held final briefing of 2/7 and attached units before the operation.

0725 - Operation KNOX began with first helicopter lift of Company I (AT 943784).

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- 0749 - Defend 6 and Alpha Command Group were lifted (AT 943784).
- 0755 - Helicopter lift of Company H began (AT 943784).
- 0800 - First elements of Company I landed in LZ HAWK (ZC 177993).
- 0803 - Defend 6 and Command Group Alpha landed in LZ HAWK (ZC 177993).
- 0810 - Company I began attack of objective 1 (ZC 177988).
- 0815 - Lift of Company G began (AU 851002).
- 0828 - Remainder of Company landed in LZ HAWK (ZC 177993). Company H began moving in trace of Company I attack on objective 1 (ZC 177988).
- 0837 - Company I secured objective 1 (ZC 177988) and continued attack on objective 2 (ZC 175982).
- 0847 - All elements of Company G landed in LZ FALCON (ZC 156994).
- 0900 - Company G reported their gas masks dropped in wrong LZ.
- 0915 - Company G commenced the attack to seize objective 3 (ZC 175977), found the 250 pound bomb dud at ZC 156994 and engineers blew in place. Company G still had not received any gas masks. Company G continued search for trail leading to objective 3.
- 0928 - Defend 6 and Command Group (forward) joined Company I. Engineers blew LZ at ZC 176983.
- 0945 - Company G located trail leading to objective 3 (ZC 175977) with help of AO who marked the trail at ZC 168991.
- 0956 - Defend 6 and Command Group (forward) joined Company I. Engineers continued to improve LZ at ZC 176983.
- 1010 - Company I found 4 men fighting holes with covers on them (ZC 176984); search of area revealed 15 AK-47 cartridge casings. Company I reported fighting holes all along the trail.
- 1015 - Company H sent 1 platoon to check out trail that goes east around objective 2 (ZC 175982).
- 1045 - H-1 reported trail continued downward, and shows signs of heavy use. Remainder of Company H dispatched to link up with H-1.
- 1115 - Company G continued to move to objective 3 (ZC 175977). Company G present position at ZC 168990.
- 1200 - Company I forward elements on objective 2.
- 1200 - Situation report: Defend 6, Company H in vicinity of ZC 175983. Company I position in vicinity of ZC 176980. H&S Company in vicinity of objective 1 (ZC 175982).

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Plan: Company G continued to attack on objective 3 (ZC 175977), and Company I patrolling objective 2 (ZC 175982).

1300 - Company G continued to attack on objective 3 (ZC 175977), and Company I patrolling objective 2 (ZC 175982).

1330 - Company H joined H-1 on objective 3, Hill 478 at ZC 175977.

1335 - Company I sniper team observed 3 people in vicinity of objective 4 (ZC 178974), but did not fire because Company H exact position was not known.

1500 - Company G found 1 crosscut saw, 4 axes, and many trees cut at ZC 172978. The equipment was destroyed.

1540 - Company G and Company I linked up. Company G to continue attack on objective 3 at (ZC 175977).

1651 - Forward elements of Company G on objective 3 (ZC 175977).

1656 - Company H arrived on objective 3 (ZC 175977) and observed artillery impact area. Found one mutilated USMC ID card and blood.

1700 - Company H and Company G linked up on objective 3 with no opposition. Objective 3 secured.

1735 - Company G patrol located body from previous contact. While trying to recover body, squad came under 60mm mortar, M-79, and small arms fire. Returned fire but could not observe enemy. Enemy broke contact and Company G established night defense. Body was not retrieved at this time.

1800 - Situation Report

Defend 6 on objective 2 (ZC 175982). Company H and Company G on objective 3 in vicinity of ZC 175977. Company I on objective 2 (ZC 175982).

Plans: Remain in present location and conduct aggressive patrolling and establish IP's.

1810 - One man from Company I went to water point and returned to objective 3 (ZC 175977) instead of Company I. Man walked through Company H and Company G lines and was told to go no farther; however, he continued on.

1813 - Company H heard firing and then someone moaning.

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1827 - Company H dispatched a patrol to check out sounds in vicinity ZC 176975. The patrol rounded a bend in the trail and came under M-79, small arms, and possible 60mm mortar fire from bunkers. Patrol observed a body in the trail, but was unable to reach it because of intense enemy fire covering approaches to it. The patrol pulled back and called for 81mm support and artillery. Patrol returned to Company H lines because of darkness and lack of visibility. Received 3 WIA and to continue attack at first light. Unable to estimate enemy casualties.

2400 - Situation Report

Plans: Company H to attack bunkers and seize objective 4 (ZC 178974), and retrieve body. Company G to check out trail network on objective 3 (ZC 175977) and search area for KIA of last BALD EAGLE. Company I to continue patrolling of trail network and to move to objective 3.

D +1 25 October

0600 - Situation Report. Same as 242400.

0655 - Company H prepared to attack objective 4 (ZC 178974).

0700 - Air strikes could not be used because of low cloud cover. Attack was delayed for 30 minutes. Artillery and 81mm mortars fired preparation fires on objective 4 (ZC 178974).

0750 - Company H attacked objective 4.

0810 - Company H received fire from objective 4 but continued to advance up the trail despite heavy undergrowth which necessitated a frontal assault. The enemy was observed to be wearing "tiger" utilities, helmets, and packs.

0834 - Company H reported that there are many fighting holes on the trail leading to objective 4 (ZC 178974).

0838 - Company H observed 5 VC retrograding; 81mm mortars and artillery called to cover possible routes of enemy egress.

0910 - Company H found one KIA, identified as the body of the missing Marine from Company I with multiple wounds of the abdomen and legs. The body was returned to Company G C.P. Company I and Defend 6 moving to objective 3 (ZC 175977)

0930 - One squad from Company G recovered the body of the Recon KIA. The body was returned to Company G C.P. Company I and Defend 6 moving to objective 3 (ZC 175977)

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Company H to continue patrolling to Phase Line Gold. Other plans depend on approval of Defend 6's proposal.

2110 - Company H continued patrolling to Phase Line Gold. Company G and Company I continued to check out trail complexes in vicinity of objective 3 (ZC 175977).

2400 - Situation Report. Same as 251800H.D+2 26 October0600 - Situation Report. Same as 252400.

0655 - Defend 6 instructed H&S Co to move from objective 1 to LZ FAIGON. Company H continues to patrol to Phase Line Gold. Company G is to check out trail complex east of objective 3. Company I is continuing to patrol trails west of objective 3.

0810 - Company G began movement to Hill 602 (ZC 183966).

0830 - Defend 6 to Impressive (forward) by helicopter.

0843 - AO reported a cave at ZC 178991. H&S Company to investigate.

0900 - Company G and Company H linked up on Hill 602.

0918 - Defend 6 returned from Impressive.

0945 - Company H at Phase Line Gold reported trail overgrown; found one fighting hole and one beer bottle.

1030 - Company Commanders from Companies H, I, and G to Defend C.P. for a meeting.

1135 - Phase II of Operation KNOX is to commence. Two companies, H and I, are to sweep in the low lands west of Dong Top, and Company G is to sweep in the valley to the east of Dong Top.

1200 - Situation Report. Awaiting orders to execute Phase II of Operation KNOX.

1235 - Company G patrolling down trail to northwest. Trail was narrow, heavily covered, and showed no sign of enemy activity. At ZC 185971 trail widened to about 5 feet.

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1400 - Company G stopped at junction of two swift flowing streams. At ZC 187975 found two water cans (salad oil cans) and a wood saw. Company G destroyed water cans and saw.

1455 - Impressive passed word to move off the high ground in preparation for commencement of Phase II. One platoon from Company I is to find the downed AC-47 in vicinity of ZC 133939.

1500 - Company G began movement to valley to the east. At ZC 191984 trail widened to six feet and had stakes marking the sides. The trail was well used, but the only sign of recent enemy activity was one .30 cal casing at ZC 187978.

1516 - Company H, Company I, and the Alpha Command Group commenced movement down the mountains to the west in preparation for Phase II.

1700 - Company G reached valley floor at ZC 192986. Established night defensive position at ZC 192987.

1800 - Situation Report

Company G at ZC 192987.

Defend 6 and H&S Company at ZC 157992.

Company H at ZC 156984.

Company I at ZC 145975.

Plan: One platoon from Company I to look for downed AC-47 in vicinity of ZC 133939. Company H and Company G prepare to commence Phase II.

2200 - Yankee Platoon and 81mm mortars enroute from objective 1 to LZ FALCON by Otters. Otters became stuck in rice paddy.

2300 - Yankee Platoon has joined Defend 6 at LZ FALCON (ZC 156994). 81mm mortars and Otters enroute.

2400 - Situation Report. Same as 261800H.

D+3 27 October

0600 - Situation Report. Same as 262400H.

0630 - Company G moving down into the valley east of Dong Top in preparation to commence Phase II of the operation.

0647 - Phase II to start on order of Impressive 6. One platoon from Company I on way to look for downed AC-47. Air is "on call" for Company I. All units to patrol CP area until receipt of orders for Phase II to begin.

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0745 - Defend 6 and Company I 6 were picked up by helicopter to recon the area of the downed AC-47. 81mm mortars linked up with Defend 6 C.P.

0917 - Because of the terrain on the area where the AC-47 went down, it was decided to commit all of Company I in the search. In Phase II Company H is to take the west side of the Song Bu Lu, and two platoons of the Company G will sweep the east side.

1000 - Company I moving to area of downed AC-47.

1045 - Company G (-) moved to LZ at ZC 190988 in preparation for Phase II. Company I continues to move toward downed AC-47.

1200 - Situation Report

Company G (-) helilifted by (2) H-34's to ZC 158779 in preparation for Phase II. Company I continues to move toward downed AC-47.

1300 - Helilift of Company G (-) completed. Company I received incoming sniper round from unknown direction. Kit Carson Scout received a flesh wound.

1330 - Yankee Platoon found 5 Vietnamese males of military age near Defend 6 C.P. They had ID cards but were detained for further questioning by ITT.

1440 - Company G (-) moved to ZC 151974 in preparation for Phase II.

1625 - Phase II commenced.

1745 - G-3 found 1 Vietnamese male with another man's ID card at ZC 191986. Interpreters questioned the man and released him.

1800 - Situation Report

Units to establish ambush and IP's as necessary. PF's to join Company H and Company G tomorrow.

2400 - Situation Report. Same as 271800H.

D+4 28 October

0600 - Situation Report. During resupply, Company H and Company G (-) sent units to check area swept the previous day. At 0530, G-3 moved to blocking position in vicinity of ZC 165014. Company I continues to look for downed AC-47.

0650 - Company H and Company G (-) ready to begin Phase III of operation.

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0700 - G-3 to sweep area vicinity LSA, Company and Company G (-) began sweep at grids ZC 1501 and ZC 1502.

0910 - Sweep of area completed with negative results.

0920 - Company I found the downed AC-47, the remains of 6 bodies, 3 mini guns, and 4 M-16's. There were no signs of VC activity in the area.

1200 - Situation Report

Company H and Company G continue S&D mission north of Highway 1 with G-3 as a blocking force. Company I is to provide security for downed AC-47 pending further word from Impressive.

1400 - Company I is to carry the bodies and all possible equipment to Defend 6 position. What can not be carried will be destroyed in place using thermite and explosives.

1425 - Defend 3 informed Impressive 3 all equipment will be blown.

1450 - Company H completed sweep to Highway 1 with negative results.

1505 - Company I is returning to LZ FALCON.

1700 - In conjunction with Phase III, Company H is to move north through Thon Phu Cuong and Thon Phu Xuyen, and Company G is to sweep Thon Phuoc Hung.

1800 - Situation Report

Company G (-) (ZD 157000), G-3 is at the LSA, Company H (ZD 143007) and Company I at base camp. All units are setting in, and night activities are scheduled.

2400 - Situation Report. Same as 281800Z.

D+5 29 October

0600 - Situation Report. Same as 282400.

0715 - Company H and Company G continue to sweep designated areas.

0800 - Company H to sweep back to Highway 1 using one platoon as a blocking force.

0855 - Company H and Company G (-) checked out the area south of the Song Bu Lu.

0932 - Company G (-) linked up with G-3.

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1030 - Company G and Company H back to CP's. Establish ambushes and LP's as necessary to provide security.

1230 - All PF's to report to Company G and go to ISA. Company G to ISA by 1300 in order to be trucked to AT 829005. Company H, Company I, and Command Group to move to ISA tomorrow. Order of march: Company I, Defend 6 Command Group, 81mm mortars, and Company H. Company G attachments to remain at ISA.

1245 - Company I at Defend 6 CP for reserve. The bodies from the downed AC-47 were placed in Otters and taken to the ISA.

1320 - Company G arrived at ISA for transportation to AT 829005.

1400 - Company H dispatched a patrol to ZC 127988 to check out 30 Vietnamese. The patrol was called back when an AO reported that they were Vietnamese farmers working in a field.

1800 - Situation Report

Plan - Company G to act as a reserve force, provide local security and prepare to go OPCON 2/3. Company H and Company I provide security for their own CP's. Company H, Command Group, and Company I prepare to move to ISA to be helilifted to LZ 460.

2400 - Sit

date as 291800H.

D+6 30 October

0945 - Company I, Alpha Command Group, and Company H moved to ISA.

1030 - Company I and Command Group at ISA.

1115 - Company H at ISA.

1200 - Company G returned to combat base (AT 833888) - OPCON 2/3.

1215 - First units of Company H lifted to LZ 460.

1355 - Remainder of Company H helilifted to LZ 460, and elements of Company I helilifted to Liberty Bridge.

1435 - Remainder of Company I to Liberty Bridge - chopped OPCON to 3/7 at 1430.

1515 - Defend 6, Command Group, 81mm mortars, and Yankee Platoon to 2/7 CP.

1625 - Last troops in LZ 460.

12. Administration Mattersa. Supply

(1) A Regimental LSA was utilized during Operation KNOX by 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines. Resupply was requested through Helicopter Support Teams (HST) attached to companies and the Battalion Command Group. Resupply was accomplished through the use of two helicopters and five Otters.

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(2) The following supplies were requested from the USA during the operation (asterisks) indicate those items not available).

- (a) C-rations w/sundry packs.
- (b) *Heat tabs (insufficient quantity).
- (c) Water.
- (d) Salt tablets.
- (e) Gas masks.
- (f) Mosquito repellent.
- (g) *Foot powder.
- (h) *Rubbing alcohol.
- (i) *Packboards.
- (j) *Jungle utilities (insufficient quantity).
- (k) *Boot sock (insufficient quantity).
- (l) *Jungle boots (insufficient quantity).
- (m) PRC-25 batteries.
- (n) AT 892 antenna w/base.
- (o) AT 2714 antennas.
- (p) *RC 292 antenna.
- (q) *Stake bag for 81mm mortar aiming stakes.
- (r) *Tube carrying straps for 81mm mortar.
- (s) Class V items.

(3) During the five days that units from 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines operated in the mountainous regions of Dong Top and Hill 340, resupply could only be accomplished by back-pack or helicopter. Since resupply was not scheduled until D+2, ammo, chow, and water comprised most of the individual load for the first two days. The nature of the terrain necessitated that the individual Marine travel light; therefore, from D+2 until D+5 ground units were totally dependent upon helicopter resupply.

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(4) The absence of adequate LZ's made helicopter resupply difficult. During the operation, 4 LZ's were blown by engineers; however, only one of these LZ's was suitable for a helicopter to land (ZC 177975). The one useable LZ took approximately 115 man-hours and 100 pounds of C-4 to construct. Upon completion, one CH-46 could land in the LZ. Due to the extended time element involved in construction (one day) and the tactical situation at the time, this LZ was used only once.

(5) Because of inadequate LZ's, helicopters were forced to hover to drop resupplies to the ground units. The "hover and drop" method of supply was satisfactory for all supplies except water supply. Although some natural water sources were located, water resupply was still required for most units. The three gallon disposable water containers proved unsatisfactory in the manner used; i.e., dropping from approximately 20 feet by a hovering helicopter resulted in approximately 75% of all containers bursting upon impact.

(6) The rough terrain and the requirement to travel light made large scale resupply of individual clothing necessary. Because of the great demand for individual clothing the USA stocks were rapidly depleted during the operation.

(7) From D+5 to D+6 resupply presented no problem for units located on the low ground, except for those items already discussed.

b. Maintenance

(1) Maintenance support was available at the USA.

(2) Third echelon repair was required on a M9A1 sight and one bipod set for an 81mm mortar. Replacements were not available at the USA and the parts were returned unrepaiied.

c. Casualties and Evacuation

(1) Casualty evacuation in the mountainous regions was handled adequately by helicopters from the USA. The inadequacy of LZ's required the use of hoist and basket. It is imperative that in rugged terrain a casualty's personal equipment not be left with the evacuating unit, but be evacuated with the casualty.

(2) In the lowland, helicopters and litters from the USA proved satisfactory in evacuating casualties.

(3) Most of the casualties sustained on Operation KNOX were routine and were treated by attached corpsman and returned to their companies. The more serious casualties were evacuated to Naval Support Activity or to 1st Medical Battalion for treatment.

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d. Transportation

(1) Transportation over the mountain areas was strictly by foot. On the lowland, Otters proved capable of traversing the rice paddy areas, and could be effectively utilized.

(2) Transportation to the operational area was by H-34 and 3 CH-53 helicopters. Transportation to the LZ area was accomplished in an expeditious manner. However, transportation back to the Battalion CB was slower since only 2 CH-53 helicopters were available for the return lift.

e. Communications. Communication, when operating on the high ground, was unsatisfactory. The steep rugged terrain necessitating the use of the "leaf antenna" made communications with higher headquarters difficult and sometimes impossible. However, when a unit was in a static position and could utilize the "whip" antennas, communications with higher headquarters was satisfactory. In addition, simple wavelength antennas and counterpoise antennas were utilized on the low ground to improve communications. The simple wavelength antennas and the counterpoise antennas made possible successful communications with higher headquarters. Communication in the lowland was marginal while moving, and when units would move into "dead space" areas, communication was non-existent. This period of broken communication would only be for a short duration and did not materially effect the success of the operation.

13. Special Equipment and Techniques. None.

14. Commander's Analysis

a. Operation KNOX can be classified as a typical search and destroy operation against the insurgent forces. Although the success of the operation cannot be measured by the small number of enemy casualties, the following accomplishments indicated the values of the operation:

(1) This operation provided the initial insertion of major 1st Marine Division forces into the recently expanded TAOR. The operation clearly demonstrated to the Main Force and the Local Force Guerrillas the steadfast intention of the 1st Marine Division to positively control Highway 1 and the approaches thereto within the new TAOR.

(2) Fortified positions which had previously been encountered in the area of operation were destroyed. Several bunkers were destroyed by the enemy prior to their withdrawal, and the remaining fortifications were demolished by the attacking units.

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(3) Even though there is no clear measurement of Operation KNOX's influence upon the local populace, it was apparent that the villagers were not hostile to the intrusions of the Marines. Possibly some value may be placed on the psychological effects on the villagers, as well as the enemy, of having friendly forces operating in the Phu Loc District.

(4) Phase II and Phase III of the operation provided members of the 1st Marine Division their first opportunity to work closely with the Popular Forces from Phu Loc.

b. The rugged terrain encountered on the first three days of the operation afforded the enemy a distinct advantage in tactics. Marines are largely restricted in avenues of approach over trails or streambeds. The enemy is thoroughly familiar with this tactic and simply waits for friendlies on these avenues of approach or retires. To revise our stereotyped plan of attack is imperative. Attacking units must control the key terrain early in an operation. Landing zones need to be made on, or adjacent to, the key terrain for the assaulting units while blocking positions are rapidly established on the enemy's routes of egress. Terrain can, and should, be used to our advantage.

15. Recommendations

a. Fire Support

(1) Artillery

(a) Fire support would have been more effective if a decentralized FDC had been used instead of a centralized artillery battalion FDC. A battery FDC is more responsive to fire requests since a direct line is established between the Forward Observer and the firing battery. The location of the firing battery is known to both the FSC and the FO expediting coordination and fire adjustments.

(2) Air

(a) All units should be thoroughly briefed on med-evac procedures when a HST is to be attached to the unit.

(b) Secondary and tertiary frequencies should be established for TACP Local to preclude interference from the stations using the net.

b. Administrative Matters

(1) The water supply method using the expendable containers must be improved to enable the containers to be used in resupply from hovering helicopters. Possibly the water containers could be lashed together and lowered by hoist to the deck. If the water containers must be dropped, they could be lashed together and covered with a

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shock absorbent to reduce damage.

(2) An adequate stock of 3rd and 4th echelon repair parts would be an aid during the operation. Provided sufficient parts, weapons could be repaired in the field and returned for use.

c. Communications

(1) Battalion radio operators and company radio operators should be trained in the construction of field expedient radio antennas. The simple wavelength antenna and the counterpoise antenna proved valuable on Operation KNOX. In addition, all radio operators should carry a small length of communication wire so that "field" expedient antennas can be established without delay in order to facilitate positive radio contact at all times.

(2) In areas of heavy vegetation, and throughout areas of rugged terrain, planning should be taken to establish satisfactory communication with higher headquarters. In terrain such as that traversed on Operation KNOX, an Airborne Automatic Radio Relay is necessary for positive, continuous communication with higher headquarters.

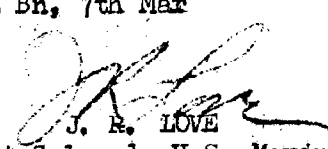

1. Considerations Concerning The Area of Operation

a. Area of the Study. For purposes of this estimate, the Phu Loc area (Southern Portion) is considered bounded on the North by National Route #1, on the West by National Route #1 running from Thon Lap An (AU 855001) to Ca Lang Co (AU 887953). To Then To (AT 860906). The area is bounded to the South by the Quang Nam/Thua Thien Province Boundary running West from (AT 860906) to (ZC 103937). The area is bounded on the West by a line running from (ZC 103937) to the ocean at (ZD 070014).

b. Terrain.

(1) The portion of the area immediately south of National Route #1 consists of a ribbon of flat, sandy terrain, much of it flooded due to recent rains. This ribbon varies in width from about 4000 meters in the western area, to about 200 meters in the eastern portion on the banks of the Dam (lagoon) Lap An. The western, and thickest portion of the flatland, is the most largely populated, with Loc They being the principal village. Vegetation in the area is scrub growth, sparsely situated with a maximum height of about 1 to 2 meters.

(2) The portion immediately south of the flat ribbon area is extremely mountainous. The area, which encompasses the remainder of the area under consideration, is typified by steep slopes and high mountains overgrown with thick vegetation and canopy. Particular pieces of high ground include Dong Top (ZC 177976), Noi Chin (AT 812983), and the Nui Cai Tong area (ZC 198949). Movement in these areas is difficult at best, and often limited to trails and the few available breaks in vegetation.

c. Population. The population centers in the study area are in the Phu Loc area (ZD 0800). The slopes, ravines, and ridges of the mountains are believed to be uninhabited. The attitude of the people is neutral to hostile.

2. ENEMY SITUATION

a. Enemy Situation. Enemy strength within the area is estimated to be 800 main forces and NVA forces.

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b. Strength, Location, and Disposition. See Tab A.

c. Recent Activities. In the flat portion of the area under consideration, enemy activity has been confined to harassment along National Route #1, and some harassing attacks by fire at such installations as Phu Loc District Headquarters. In the mountainous area, however, recent engagements by recon inserts, "I" 3/7, and "G" 2/7 indicate that the enemy has extensive fortified areas and desires to defend the area from intrusion.

3. CONCLUSIONS

a. The enemy has several capabilities in the study area. First he has the demonstrated ability of harassing and interdicting National Route #1. He can attack in up to battalion strength. He can defend the mountain area to the south by up to battalion sized units, utilizing extensive fortified positions. Furthermore, he can avoid contact with friendly forces.

b. The enemy's most probable course of action in response to the intrusion of friendly forces is to defend his area initially, then fall back and attempt to avoid contact when he realizes the strength opposing him.

1. In accordance with references (a) and (b) enclosure (1) is forwarded herewith.

2. Operation YAZOO was a search and destroy operation which was conducted by the 7th Marines (-) (Rein) in the HIEU DUC District (Happy Valley). Contact with the enemy was light throughout the operation. Commitment of the 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines to Phase II of this operation was never realized due to the requirement for security patrol activities by this unit in connection with the Vietnamese elections.

3. The recommendations contained in paragraphs 15a and 15b of the 1st Battalion, 7th Marines report are concurred in.

4. The 1st Marine Aircraft Wing has initiated requests that UH-34 and CH-46 helicopters be fitted with a 200 foot long hoist cable as recommended in paragraph 15c.

5. A request has been forwarded by the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing for the rapid development of a litter for use in penetrating the jungle canopy as recommended in paragraph 15d.

6. SUPPORTING FORCES.a. Air.

(1) Helicopter Support.

(a) The operation was conducted in primarily mountain rain forest where the jungle canopy varied from 30-130 feet and consisted of primary, secondary, and tertiary growth. Suitable landing zones were not available and visibility from the ground was extremely limited due to the undergrowth.

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(b) Attempts to utilize the UH34 for resupply and med-evac were completely unsatisfactory and resulted in one UH34 crashing during a resupply mission. After this incident the CH46 was used exclusively for med-evac missions in canopy that did not exceed 100 feet in height. The CH46 proved satisfactory to accomplish the mission under the conditions imposed on YAZOO.

(c) The U. S. Air Force provided a search and rescue CH53 helicopter (Jolly Green Giant) for medical evacuation when the CH46 could not accomplish the mission because of jungle canopy. The reaction time was generally 40 to 60 minutes, therefore it is recommended that when a large size unit is operating in terrain similar to that encountered on YAZOO, the Jolly Green be placed on an alert status to provide quicker reaction to emergency medical evacuations.

(d) The litter basket, the three pronged seat and the horse collar are not suitable for medical evacuation in dense jungle canopy. A litter basket, with a heavy canvas cover to provide protection, and a bridle assembly, for use by the ground unit to guide the basket through the jungle canopy, is required to prevent further injury to the evacuee.

(2) Fixed Wing Support.

(a) A4's, F4's and F8's were used to destroy enemy fortifications. All enemy staging areas, assembly areas, trails systems discovered on YAZOO were subjected to TPQ-13 strikes.

(3) Aerial Observation.

(a) Air observers were indispensable in locating likely terrain for trails, likely enemy avenues of approach, pin pointing friendly positions and controlling artillery fires and air strikes.

b. Artillery. See Enclosure (2).

c. Fire Support Coordination.

(1) No significant problems were encountered in fire support coordination.

(2) Liaison representatives from reconnaissance units were located in the Seventh Marines FSCC and with maneuver elements in the field. This arrangement facilitated the coordination between the infantry and reconnaissance elements.

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7. INTELLIGENCE.a. Enemy.

(1) During the period following Operation PECOS, sightings by elements of the First Recon Bn, patrols from 1st Bn 7th Marines, infrared readouts and interrogation reports indicated the use of the operation area by the enemy as a route of infiltration into the rocket belt and as a site of possible storage facilities for rockets to be used against the DA NANG vital area. There were no confirmed enemy units in the operation area. Unit suspected of being in the operation area consisted of unidentified elements of the 368th Artillery Brigade. Units in the area adjacent to the operation area consisted of the 402nd Sapper Battalion, the Q-14 Local Force Company and the Q-16th Local Force Company.

(2) VC strength and situation actually found as the operation was conducted.

(a) During the operation friendly units encountered the enemy in force on two occasions. At 290745H B Co 1/7 encountered what was believed to be a force of 20 VC in the vicinity of AT 793644 resulting in 1 VC KIA probable, and at 311155H B Company received a heavy volume of fire from an estimated 12 VC resulting in 2 VC KIA probable at ZC 791611.

(b) Other Significant Findings.

271830H: B Co AT 818643 found and destroyed 3 caves as well as a battalion size defensive area.

281005H: Recon insert Byelet ZC 156644 found 3 huts and captured 5 lbs of paper, hand ax, 2 steel spoons, cups, carbine magazines and 2 magazine pouches.

281400H: C Co AT 820650 found 4 thatched roofed huts, 4 fighting positions, storage holes and caves.

281435H: C Co AT 810644 located 14 bomb shelters, 3 caves and 20 graves. They captured 1 M-14 rifle, 2 chicom grenades, 2 magazines and 1 cartridge belt.

281600H: Co B AT 808656 located a VC defensive position.

281830H: Co B AT 818648 located 3 caves.

311100H: Co C AT 795645 found 1 bunker.

011700H: 1/7 AT 794664 found cultivated field.

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b. Weather.

(1) The weather during the period 26 Sept-5 Oct was overcast with showers and thunder storms during the latter part of the day. The high and low temperatures for the period were 91 degrees and 73 degrees respectively. The average temperature was 80 degrees. The average relative humidity was 79 percent.

(a) Most of the ground activities were conducted on the sides of the valley and were unaffected by the heavy rainfall. However, that portion of the sweep conducted on the valley floor was encumbered by accumulations of water which in conjunction with the heavy ground vegetation made foot traffic difficult. Air support, also, was limited by the weather.

c. Terrain.

(1) The terrain consisted of steep heavily forested valley sides and the flat heavily vegetated valley floor.

(a) Observation and fields of fire were limited to 10-15 meters by the dense vegetation.

(b) Cover and concealment were excellent.

(c) The heavy vegetation limited the employment of ideal combat formations. Troop movement was generally limited to column formations.

(d) The major accomplishment of Operation YAZOO was the location and search of the major East-west trail networks leading from Happy Valley into the vital area of the DA NANG Air Base complex.

8. MISSION. Seventh Marines (-) (Rein) conducts S&D operations for a period of 10-15 days in HAPPY VALLEY area, QUAN HIEU DUC and QUAN THUONG DUC Districts, QUANG NAM Province, RVN, to seek out enemy LOC's and capture or destroy enemy forces, equipment and facilities in OA.

9. CONCEPT OF OPERATION. See Reference (c).

10. EXECUTION. The 7th Marines promulgated Operation Order 7-67 for Operation YAZOO at a conference held at the 7th Marines GP on 25 Aug 1967. Enclosures (1) and (2) contain a daily narrative of the sequence of events.

12. ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS.a. General.

(1) Planning. The logistical planning for Operation YAZOO commenced on 19 August 1967 with liaison visits to G-4, 1st Marine Division; S-3 Supply Battalion, Force Logistic Command; Platoon Commander, Aerial Delivery Platoon, 1st Force Service Regiment; and Division Engineer Officer, 1st Marine Division. The Regimental S-4 and/or his assistant participated in all planning conferences and briefings.

(2) Logistical Support Units. All logistical support units did an excellent job. No problems arose at anytime from the personnel of the 1st Marine Air Wing, Force Logistic Command, Shore Party Battalion or M. P. Company, 1st Marine Division. Of particular significance was the fine job accomplished by the Aerial Delivery Detachment, 1st Force Service Regiment. Through the application of their capabilities, the LSA was able to resupply units located in terrain inaccessible by other resupply delivery means.

b. Supply/Resupply.

(1) The Logistic Support Area (LSA) was established at Hill #55. On 25 August, Prior to the staging of supplies, an oil spreader was used to prepare the LZ. One coat of oil accomplished this job adequately.

(2) All delivery was made by helicopter using the following means:
 700-800 lb pallets dropped by cargo chute.
 200 lb packages wrapped with honeycomb and dropped with a pilot chute.

Internal loads with helicopters landing in LZ's.
 Manually lowering of bundles of less than 50 lbs by rope.

(3) The nature of the operating area precluded widespread use of LZ's resulting in extensive use of the aerial delivery detachments.

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The use of the cargo chutes proved unsatisfactory on the first attempt in that the load landed within 150 meters of the drop zone yet could not be located for one and a half hours due to the heavy vegetation. It became necessary to send the helicopters back to hover over the cargo so that the unit could home on the sound of the aircraft. When using the pilot chutes a drop zone of 50 meters radius must be cleared of all personnel for safety reasons. 1st Battalion, 7th Marines experienced a mishap when a helicopter drifted and dropped its cargo 50 meters from the smoke marker, striking a man on the ground.

(4) Midway through the operation all CH-46's were grounded thus seriously hampering the resupply effort due to the lack of helicopter availability.

(5) Units supported from the LSA were as follows.

(a) Two (2) rifle companies, 1st Battalion, 7th Marines. Approximately 400 men.

(b) One command group, 1st Battalion, 7th Marines. 30 men.

(c) Radio relay and accompanying security force. 95 men.

c. Services.

(1) Maintenance. Arrangements were made to evacuate all malfunctioning equipment to Maintenance Battalion, 1st Force Service Regiment for immediate repair or replacement, however this service was not required.

(2) Medical. All med-evac went directly to 1st Medical Battalion. A 1st Battalion, 7th Marine Supply Representative was located at 1st Medical Battalion to reclaim and receipt for the equipment of casualties. This arrangement proved very satisfactory.

(3) Duration. All staging of materials in the LSA commenced on 25 August and was completed on 26 August (D-1). The operation secured on the evening of 5 September 1967 and all supplies were disposed of by 7 September.

13. COMMUNICATIONS. During the subject operation, communications were established with participating units through an automatic retransmission site established on Hill 1467. This site was composed of six (6) radio retransmission stations; two utilized by participating infantry units, two for the supporting artillery units, one for air and one for the supporting LSA. Overall, the retransmission site functioned favorably with the exception of some slight problems with the removal of retransmission

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cable MX-456. Units utilizing this system should man such sites with personnel well trained in the use of the equipment and with the radio procedures involved in the operation of these stations. In addition such teams should be provided with at least two (2) pair of spare frequencies to be utilized in the event that mutual frequency interference is encountered.

14. COMMENTS ON THE RECOMMENDATIONS CONTAINED IN THE ENCLOSURES.

a. Operation YAZOO was conducted to exploit intelligence gained on Operations FICOS and STOCKTON. The major trail network partially uncovered on those two operations was thoroughly explored from its outlet westward along the prominent ridge line into Happy Valley. The recommendations concerning continued operations along the trail system are considered valid and will be implemented.

b. Operation YAZOO was planned as a Regimental (-) operation with Phase I being carried out by the movement of 1st Bn, 7th Marines overland into Happy Valley. Phase II, as originally conceived, called for the helilift of the 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines into landing zones at the western end of Happy Valley. Phase II, however, never materialized due to the commitment of 2nd Battalion elsewhere for the conduct of intensive patrol activities during the period immediately prior to the Vietnamese elections. The First Battalion successfully continued its mission and Operation YAZOO terminated on 5 September.
