





From 2d January to 31 January, the evaluation of intelligence from sources in the DUC Pau area was indefinite and appropriate liaison was made to facilitate Tuture evaluation.


- (1) Formal training consisted of: 1) a two-day, indoctrination on the M-15 rifle was conducted by a 1st Marine Division contact team for selected 💛 personnel of the bandalion. Training consisting of numeric ture, functioning and familiarization firing, whenty-five M-LS rifles were issued to the battalion to provide capability for indoctfinating additional personnel. 2) a two-day lecture/demonstration of the Mannach Personnel Detector (Chamical) was given by a 1st Magine Division team. Two such devices were issued to the bettalion for tacaical usage whea empropriate.
- (2) Informal infantity training was conducted on the company level and included, in pastroular, training carried out in the Combined action Companies OPCOM to Branking 7th marines in the Bel Shot Laut. h. Close Compat. The actions engaged in on Operation Combot, and Operation Desort constituted the most significant close combat. (See sub par 3d (6))

i. Fire Support.

- (1) Battery "C", lst Bn, lltn marines continued to provide outstanding fire support to 3rd Bn, 7th marines in the D.1 LOO FACA. During the first two weeks of January, the battery fired 47 observed fire missions resulting in 14 VC AIA (conf) and 22 VC AIA (prob). Observed missions were fired on interdiction targets of boats traffic on the SOLE VC GIA and in support of Operation COUNCE.
- (2) Battery "H", 2nd Bn, 12th Marines was in direct support of the battalion at the Mr Dana Taut. One observed fire mission was conducted resulting in one VC Alm (conf).
- (3) dattery "I", 3rd Bn, 11th Marines was assigned in direct support of the pattalion upon displacement to woll Dand on 27 January in support of Operation Masoro. Sattery "I's" four-gun battery, with reinforcing fires from one platoon of 155Mm Adwitzers (Adva) located at holl Dand, provided the battalion with consistently outstanding fire support during the initial phases of Operation Dasoro. From 27 January to 31 January, on Operation Dasoro, 43 observed and 40 moderned file missions were fired in support of the battalion. A total of 372 rounds has, 223 rounds P, 5 rounds smoke and 3 rounds illumination were fired, resulting in 25 VC ala (couf), 10 VC ELA (prob) and extensive structural damage to fortified amplets in the vicinity of AdJ Dand.
 - j. <u>Logistics</u>. From 1-31 Jan, the logistics support of 3rd dn, 7th Marines was accomplished with few serious problems. Significantly, the battalion executed three successful displacements: a vactical move from the DaI LOC TAOA to the lie because find; an administrative move from the FI Demand FAOR to a staging area at CAD LAI; and a tactical move from CHU LAI to the DUC FAO area, where Mal Province, to initiate Operation DESOFO.
- (1) The move from D.T Lou to be D. Land, completed on to Jan, was ordered to facilitate logistical support by displacing closer to the air and sea facilities at D.L. Land; dependence on weather and uncertain road conditions was a serious problem in the D.T Lou area during the monsoon season. Minimum essential equipment was carried by all hands; other equipment was staged at 3rd Shore farty dattalion. Those alpha required organic reapons and equipment on a priority basis. The venicular move, beginning on 12 Jan with advance liaison parties, was completed sufficiently to assume tactical control and responsibility over the Land, on 15 Jan.
- (2) The administrative move to CHU hall was accomplished by AC-130 airlifts of personnel beginning on 22 Jan with Co M and an advance Sattalion Comhand Group. Co h completed the movement on 24 Jan. Again, minimum combat resential year was carried by all hands. Most of the pattalion's equipment, including that previously staged at 3rd Shore Party Battalion, was transported to Cho hal by LST, arriving there on 27 Jan. This at Cho hal, the administrative plan was developed for supporting operation. By establishing an





LSA at Dot PhO. Reflitting, redistribution and issue of equipment to the batvalion was also accomplished while elements of the onttalion remained at CHU L.I. (3) Logistically, Operation buselo, with its remainst for establishment of an ASA, was unique in that termain and the tactical situation demanded all support be accomplished by helicopter. By D plus 3 (31 Jan) the logistical build-up was lagging from the auticipated 50 tons per day.

1. Close Air Support, Fined-wing aircraft strikes were entensively used, in the initial stages of Operation DESONO, beginning 25 January and continuing through the end of the mouth. Wixed-ving aircraft provided daily preparation and supporting fires using mixed ordnance, primarily directed at entrenched Viet Cong in heavily fortified mositions. Close air support aircraft were conbrolled by merial observers, tactical air controllers airborne, ground forward wir controllers or combinations of the three. MAG 11, MAG 12 and MAG 13 provided the fixed-wing support during Operation BLSOLO with 5c attack missions. petails of close air support missions in support of operations are described in par 3.

m. Civil .ffairs/wilitary Government/Community Melations/Pacification.

- (1) 3rd 3n, 7th Marines assisted with the registration, control and movement of approximately 230 families from areas vest of fill 65 to D.I LOC d.rea 🖡 🖠
- (2) 60 I began an aggressive on morrow 12 January in hamlet of Doybia SOL (1). Ou L assisted with removating a dispensary, construction of public showers, Manuals, and distribution of clothing and some.
- (3) Public showers were consumpted in the implet of PAM HOA from 8-15 January.
- (4) From 8-12 January, 250 bounds of clothing, 200 bars of soap and 700 counds of rice were distributed within DaT Lot District. In addition, 30 bags of cement were provided for buying SU. (4) and TaM AU.
- (5) Assistance continued to be provided the TUY LOAM (AILU DUC District) Public Realth project at all 945699. The project included activation of public Lealth showers, methano generators, improvements on the dispensary and distribution of lanterns.

a. Frd In, 7th Marines was relieved of tactical responsibility for the DAI 400 rauk by the 2nd da, 4th marghes, and simultaneously assumed tactical respon-1111111 for the first raul from the 2 dean, 4th Marines at 1615000 Jan



the bactalion retained OPCOs over the MV Danage Fact for approximately one week prior to administrative displacement to CMV fall and further tactical displacement beginning 27 Jan into the DUC PAO area, going MGAT Province, to commence Operation D.SOPO.

- b. Within the Dal LOC rack and the M. Damad rack, intensive small unit parrolling and ambusning was conducted. Artillery interdiction of traffic on the Sour Vo Gla west of Dal LOC continued. Contact was infrequent in the M/Damage stack.
- c. On 2/ January 3rd Bn, 7th Marines initiated Operation Descript, which continued through the end of the month. Contact with Viet Cong forces varied from light to neavy; details are contained in sub part d (6) below.
- d. Significant events which occurred during the month are developed below in chronological order.
- (1) During New Year's truce period, approximately 100 separate crossings of suspected Vo supply boats were observed moving both north and south on the OAG VO GIA from an OP on mill 65 (DAI LOG); armed VO were not signted.
- (2) Co A, conducting Phase I of Operation CouDOA, reported negative sleap contact during a recommaissance-in-force of the high ground northwest and east of hill 65 from 5 January through 3 January.
- (3) An A4 "Skynawk" crashed at the western foot of nill 65 at 1024h on 5 January. Go I provided immediate security around the aircraft. The pilot was successfully bicked up at AF 873568 by nellcopters after successfully bjecting from the aircraft by paracrate. Go I directed 90MM fire on 5 VC who attempted to approach the pilot from the south bank of the 80LH VC JIA; result 5 VC LIA (prob).
- (4) Operation 60. Dut was a two-phased battalion (-) search and destroy peration of the Bai fall, ha bad, LaM Pattone and LOU Pattou hamlet complemen est of mill 65 to Grid Mine 20 in D. I LOC District. During Phase I, Co & conducted a recom-in-force of the high ground from vic ar 9263 to vic ar 8258 during the period 5-3 January; Co K then moved into pre-planned blocking positions estride suspected 70 withdrawal routes to support Phase II of the operation. wase II began at 090730n Jan with to I moving from aill 65 westward, guiding t souse 14. Co I took Vo under fire when VC were approximately 200 meters offshore; results: 10 VC MTA. Co M's search of treeline at AJ 811568 resulted in one detainee. Upon landing at mill 52, SPAddOha A platoon observed undertermined number of Vo riesing north vic Al 205562. Platoon engaged VC at long range with M-60 fire and diversed fixed-ving aircraft on target areas. Lowering cloud coiling and extreme range made accurate surveillance of target area impossible. From mill 52 the platoon also took four armed VC fleeing westward at Ar 206555 under fire. Ewo VC were dragged off by others. Contact resulted in two VC AIA (prob). In two additional daytime contacts, Co if captured one VC POV searing green utilities found miding in a cave at AF 804556, and took under fire with small arms two more fleeing VC at AP 807567 (two VC KIA (prob)). Co I conducted sweep was ward to vicinity of previous air strikes with no further contact, and repositioned east of mill 52, 800 meters south of to K, at Al 805558 for night defease. Co I search of the h. who hamlet complex produced considerable quantitles of VO medical gear. (5) A four-man daytime observation post of Co L at Hill 22 (DAI LOC) was attached by an estimated squad or larger size enemy force at 111400H January; results: 3 USNO AIA and one USMO DO, four individual weapons and one 2.0-25 captured by enemy. Enemy forces were pursued by reaction force from to L, but contact could not be regained.





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

b. Friendly Forces.

(1) 1st Mar Div and Task Force X-RAY provide reinforcing and supporting forces as required. Task Force X-RAY exercises operational control.

- (2) 2nd Div ARVN maintains operational units within QUANG NGAI Province. QUANG NGAI Military Sector provides two RF companies in DUC PHO area, located at District Hq and on NUI DAU, BS 8037. Popular Forces units located at BS 800394, 819391, 809378, 816363, 830337, 863315.

- (a) 3rd Bn, 11th Marings provides one Btry(-), with FDC capability, FO teams, NGF teams and liaison teams.

1. SITUATICH

- a. Enemy Forces. See Annex B (INTELLIGENCE) to Ref (f)
- b. Friendly Forces
- (1) Detachment (AA) Platoon from 29th CA Company provides personnel for conducting survey of area to gain information pertinent to Civil Affiars/Civic Action program in accordance with reference (a).
 - (2) USMACV Sub-Sector Advisor team located at TUC PHO.
- (3) USAID Province Representative, QUANG NGAI Province, has capability of providing information concerning refugee control and resettlement.
- 2. MISSION. 3d Bn (Rein), 7th Marines conduct Civil Affairs/Civic Action operations in support of combat operations to control movement of non-combatants and to provide them with medical treatment, food, shelter and clothing as necessary and as dictated by the tactical situation.

3. EXECUTION

- a. Concept of Operations. In support of combat operations, primary effort will be directed toward providing essential assistance to populace to maintain order and to most the minimum needs for survival of civilians left homeless or seeking refuge as a result of tactical operations.
 - b. 3d Bn (Rein), 7th Marines
- (1) Initiate a civic action program in assigned areas of operations when tactical situation permits. Degree to which civic action will be accomplished is dependent upon tactical situation, population density, and attitude of populace.

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- (2) Be prepared on order to execute or assist with the following in support of combat operations:
 - (a) Population control.
- (b) Medical assistance to civilians. Civilians requiring medical treatment of emergency life saving nature will be evacuated to QUANG NGAI Civilian Hospital. ME CAP teams may perform monor medical treatment in objective areas, resources, personnel, and time permitting.
 - (c) Operation of assembly areas for refugee and evacuee control.
- (d) Coordinate with U. S. Army Civil Affairs Teams as required and available.
 - c. Coordinating Instructions
- (1) Initiate immediate liaison with MACV Sub-sector Advisor (NC PHO) and his staff to gain information concerning the area.
- (2) Captured VC rice that is not contaminated will be evacuated for return to GVN control. Unit commanders will not destroy this rice unless it is considered absolutely impossible to evacuate it. In these circumstances, permission to destroy rice must be obtained from Task Force X-Nay Headquarters prior to destruction. Evacuation will be accomplished as follows:
- (a) Rice bags or a suitable substitute will be provided to unit from ISA on request.
- (b) Rice will be evacuated to the nearest district headquarters. Receipts will be obtained in possibility exists that the rice may be owned by persons other than VC. In this connection, liaison should be established with appropriate GVN officials prior to delivery.
- (3) Civic Action Situation Reports will be submitted in accordance with reference (c).
- (4) Claims will be investigated and processed in accordance with reference (c).

4. LOGISTICS

- a. Civilian Assistance
- (1) Civic Action commodities will be requested through this Headquarters in accordance with reference (d).

(2) Sufficient METICAP supplies and other commodities to execute an effective initial civic action program should be maintained on hand.

b. Sociological

- (1) Public Health. Assistance will be provided to civilian personnel as operations, supplies, and personnel permit.
- (2) Refugees
 - (a) Refugees will not be evacuated from area of operations without their consent, and approval of the appropriate GVN efficials such as district or province chief or designated representatives.
 - (b) Commanders will direct handling of non-combatants in accordance with reference (e) and establish standards of care to prevent disease and unrest.
 - (c) Care and support of refugees will be provided from supplies received for civic action purposes through civic action channels.
- (3) Arts, Monuments, and Archives. Commanders will insure that troops are especially careful not to damage, defant, or remove cultural property such as religious structures, graves, tombs, archeological, historic, scientific, and artistic objects and collections.
- (4) Cultural Relations
 - (a) Maximum respect for customs, traditions, and desires of the people will be enforced within the requirements of military situation,
 - (b) Use of Churches, pagedas, temples, and other religious attructures for military purposes is prohibited.
