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PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of May 1968, the 9th Engineer Battalion, LtCol H. E. PEREA Commanding, continued as its primary mission the maintenance and upgrading of RVN Route # 1 from Chu Lai (BT 520044) to the Song Cau Lau (BT 091554). The maintenance of road networks for the Americal Division Supply Company (Rein) FLC, plus engineer support of free world forces in the Chu Lai TAOR continued to require a significant engineer effort.

Company "A" continued maintenance and upgrading of RVN Route # 1 between Chu Lai (BT 520044), and Tam Ky (BT 330209), a distance of 16 miles and engaged in vertical construction in support of the Americal Division.

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Company "B" was located in the Hue - Phu Bai area, RVN YD 893129 in direct support of Task Force X-Ray.

Company "C" (-) was located at Hill # 10 (BT 199390) and was in the process of maintaining and upgrading RVN Route # 1 from Hill # 29 (BT 226320) a distance of 11 miles. The 2nd Platoon, Company "C" was located on Hill # 29 and was in the process of upgrading and maintaining RVN Route # 1 from Tam Ky (BT 300233) north to Hill # 29 a distance of 8.2 miles.

Company "D" continued maintenance and upgrading of RVN Route # 1 from Thang Binh (BT 175418) to the Song Cau Lau (BT 091554), a distance of 11.1 miles.

During the month of May, upgrading and repair of RVN Route # 1 was broken down into three areas of responsibility; Chu Lai to Tam Ky, Tam Ky to Thang Binh, and Thang Binh to the Song Cau Lau.

Between Chu Lai BT 520044 and Tam Ky (BT 330209), 9th Engineer Battalion personnel expended 2019 man hours and equipment hours 1471 in hauling and placing 2826 cubic yards of rock.

Between Tam Ky (BT 330209) and Thang Binh (BT 175418), the 9th Engineer Battalion personnel expended 2286 man hours and 2178 equipment hours in hauling and placing 2829 cubic yards of rock and 2933 cubic yards of fill.

Between Thang Binh and the Song Cau Lau (BT 091554), 9th Engineer Battalion personnel expended 1772 man hours and 1672 equipment hours in hauling and placing 4744 cubic yards of rock and 2452 cubic yards of fill.

During the month of May, the 9th Engineer Battalion units replaced and/or repaired nine (9) culverts along RVN Route # 1. Replacement of these culverts, necessitated by enemy demolitions, required 40' of 60" culvert 40' of 48" culvert and 120' of 36" culvert as shown below.

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2. Civic Action

During the month of May, medical assistance was provided to the people of Tich Tay Hamlet (BT 496067) three (3) times weekly. Corpsmen from the 9th Engineer Battalion treated (8) women, (1) man and (16) children. The Buddhist Temple in Tich Tay presently under construction was supported by 2 truck loads of lumber and 2 truck loads of 1"-3" rock. The An Tan Orphanage (BT 503063) was supplied with 10 loads of lumber. Civic Action performed for the village of Phu Huong (BT 143431) was as follows: (1) Donated scrap lumber and bent culvert to village chief, (2) Hauled 42 cubic yards of sand and 25 cubic yards of DG, (3) Installed 57' of 18" culvert, (4) Made two metal flag poles and (5) ripped 500 linear feet of 1x6 for church.
