




During the month of November 1968, the 9th Engineer Battalion, LtCol D. U. DAVIDSON Commanding, continued as its primary mission the maintenance and upgrading of RVN Route #1 from Chu Lai (BT 520044) to the Song Cau Lau (BT 091554). The maintenance of road networks for the Americal Division, Supply Company (Rein) FLC, plus Engineer Support of Free World Forces in the Chu Lai TAOR continued to require a significant engineer effort.


Company "A" (-) was located at Hill #10 (BT 199390) and was in the process of maintaining and upgrading RVN Route #1 from (BT 259289) to Thang Binh (BT 175418), a distance of 10 miles. The 2nd Platoon, Company "A" was located on Hill #29. Between Bridge #35 (BT 259289) and Thang Binh (BT 175418), the "A" Company personnel expended 3,022 man hours and 974 equipment hours in hauling and placing 1,452 cubic yards of rock and spreading 34,000 gallons of pentaprime.

Company "B" was located at Chu Lai (BT 520044) and is engaged in vertical construction in that area. It also maintains RVN Route #1 from Chu Lai (BT 520044) and Ky Khoung (BT 417124), a distance of 5 miles.

Company "C" completed the upgrading of RVN Route #1 between Chu Lai (BT 520044) and Ky Khoung (BT 417124) and is currently upgrading RVN Route #1 from Ky Khoung to Bridge #35 (BT 259289), a distance of 5 miles. Between Chu Lai (BT 520044) and Bridge #35 (BT 259289), the Company "C" personnel expended 12,143 man hours and 11,242 equipment hours in hauling 17,612 cubic yards of rock and placing 552 cubic yards of shot rock and 20,900 gallons of pentaprime.

Company "D" continued maintenance and upgrading of RVN Route #1 from Thang Binh (BT 175418) to the Song Cau Lau (BT 091554), a distance of 11.1 miles and engaged in construction in support of Free World Military Forces. Between Thang Binh (BT 175418) and the Song Cau Lau (BT 091554), the Company "D" personnel expended 2,582 man hours and 2,282 equipment hours in hauling and placing 1,755 cubic yards of rock, 198 cubic yards of sand, 210 cubic yards of laterite and 18,400 gallons of pentaprime.





During the month of November 1968, the 9th Engineer Battalion units replaced, installed, or repaired twelve culverts along RVN Route #1. This required 120' of 18" culvert, 36' of 36" culvert, 224' of 48" culvert, and 106' of 60" culvert as shown below:





Company "A" continued the maintenance for the MAC-V Senior Advisor from Route #1 to BT 264252 a distance of 1.5 miles.


Company "B" maintains from BT 325180 to BT 330207 a distance of 2 miles for CAP Unit 1-1-2/1-1-3, also Route #22 West from BT 512053 to BT 493037 and Route #22 East from BT 538027 to BT 549049 a distance of 2.2 miles.

Company "C" continued (1) the maintenance of 2.0 miles of roadway within the Supply Company (Rein) FLC-C (BT 532111) and the maintenance of 3.5 miles of roadway within the Supply Company (Rein) FLC-ASP (BT 550044).

Headquarters Company Heavy Equipment Platoon retained the responsibility for the maintenance and repair of the Americal Perimeter Road (BT 521071)-(BT 519049) a distance of 8.5 miles. The Platoon is also responsible for upgrading 300 meters of road for MAG-13, and resurfacing roads in the MAG-12 area.
