

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PART II

- 1. During the month of June, 1969, the 9th Ingineer Battalion, under the command of Lieutenant Colonel B. F. VISACE, continued its primary mission of maintenance, upgrading and asphaltic paving of Republic of Vietnam Route #1, from Chu Lai (BT520044) to the Song Cau Lau (BT091544). Engineer support of Free World Forces in the Chu Lai TACR continued to require significant engineer effort.
- 2. Company A(-) located at Hill #10 (BT196391) continued to maintain and upgrade Republic of Vietnam Route #1 from BT259289 to Thang Binh (BT175418) a distance of 9.5 miles.
- 3. Company B located at Chu Lai was engaged in vertical construction in support of Free World Forces in the /merical TAOR. The Heavy Equipment/ Motor Transport section furnished augmentation support to the "X-Ray" task organized element located at Tam Ky (BT290230) to support upgrading and paving operations on Republic of Vietnam Route #1. In addition Company B is responsible for maintenance and repair of Republic of Vietnam Route #1 from Chu Lai (BT520044) to Tam Ky (BT330209), a distance of 16.5 miles.
- 4. Company C(-) located at Chu Lai was engaged in vertical construction in support of Free World Forces in that area. The 3d Platoon and the Heavy Equipment/Motor Transport section assigned to the "X-Ray" task element at Tam Ky, (BT290230), are presently in the process of upgrading and paving Republic of Vietnam Route #1 from Tam Ky North (BT269271) to Bridge #35 (BT299289). The 1st Platoon at AT922783 is presently providing vertical construction support to the 1st Marine Division.
- 5. Company D located at Landing Zone Baldy (BT136448) continued upgrading and maintenance to Republic of Vietnam Route #1 from Thang Binh (BT175418) North to the Song Cau Lau (BT091544) a distance of 11.1 miles, plus construction in support of Free World Forces. Concurrently, Company D is upgrading QI-1 (new roadway) from BT092537 to BT080548 a distance of 1 mile.
- 6. During the month of May, 1969, upgrading and repair of Republic of Vietnam Route #1 was broken down into four main areas of responsibility; Chu Lai to Tam Ky, Tam Ky to Bridge #35, Bridge #35 (BT259289) to Thang Binh, and Thang Binh to the Song Cau Lau River.
- 7. From south of Bridge #35, (BT259289) to Bridge #37 (BT269271), Republic of Vietnam Route #1, task element "X-Ray" augmented by Motor Transport elements of Service and Bravo Companies expended 1739 man-days and 7829 equipment hours in hauling 4185 cubic yards of mineral products and 12,116 cubic yards of laterite in upgrading Republic of Vietnam Route





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#1, to MACV standards for paving with asphaltic concrete. Headquarters Company spread 9300 gallons of peneprime/RC800 in the maintenance of Republic of Vietnam Route #1. As of 30 June 1969, Republic of Vietnam Route #1 had been paved from An Tan (BT379174) to Bridge #35, (BT259289) a distance of 21.4 miles. During the reporting period 1700 tons of asphaltic concrete was laid down from BT269271 to BT259289, a distance of .9 miles of paving.

- 8. Between Bridge #35 (BT259289 and Thang Binh, Company A personnel expended 328 man days and 2049 equipment hours in placing 6130 cubic yards of laterite and 1010 cubic yards of 2"(-) in upgrading of Republic of Vietnam Route #1.
- 9. Between Thang Binh and Song Cau Lau, Company D expended 276 man days and 1692 equipment hours in placing 1403 cubic yards of mineral products, 791 cubic yards of laterite, and operating a rock quarry in support of Republic of Vietnam Route #1.
- 10. During the month of June, 1969, the 9th Engineer Battalion installed the following culverts:

- b. The Battalion procured 6 hand water pumps for the Catholic orphanage in An Tan hamlet (BT506056). They also organized a cultural exchange between Marines and VN boy scouts at the same orphanage.
- c. The volleyball games with the Ly Tin volleyball team continued with improved fellowship between American Staff and Officers and the VN.
- d. The Battalion continued to supply garbage for the Tich Tay pig farm.
- e. During the reporting period the Battalion has accomplished 2 Popular Forces patrols within its Area of Operations.

- (1) Company D found one Frag Butterfly bomb Lot #100-249-62. BT128488. Destroyed in place.





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- (2) Company D sweepteam assisted in Medevac of one VMC. VMC tripped an anti-personnel mine. Multiple wounds in body. (BT114496)
 - c. 3 June, 1969:
- (1) Company D sweepteam assisted in Medevac of one WN civilian found lying on side of road at BTO85542. WN had head, chest, and publicarea wounds.
- (2) Company A sweepteam assisted in Medevac of 2 VN females brought in with burns and small arms wound at BT224351.
- (3) Company D sweepteam found one 105 H.E. round on side of road at BTOS4548. Destroyed in paddy.
- (4) Company A assisted in Medevac of 2 ARVN personnel brought to compound (BT196391) with head wounds resulting from traffic accident.
 - d. 4 June, 1969:
- (1) Company A found one K-79 round at BT201384. Destroyed in paddy.
- (2) Company D sweepteam assisted in Medevac at BT129479 of one VM civilian with head injuries after falling from bike.
- (3) Company D sweep team found 1-60mm round at ET105507. Destroyed in paddy.
- (4) Company D received 15 rounds AK fire, 1 round H-79 at BT109417. Returned fire. Regative friendly casualties. Megative enemy casualties.
 - e. 5 June, 1969:
- (1) Company C sweepteam found 1-60mm H.E. round lot #MA11255 at BT267273. Destroyed in paddy.
- (2) Company D sweepteam assisted in Medevac at BT103507 of one VN civilian with shrapnel wounds in neck.

- (2) Company a assisted in Medevac of VN child at BT237315 with shrapnel wounds.
- (3) Air recon reported culvert blown on bypass to bridge #29, BT219359.
- (4) Company A sweepteam found one 60mm round buried in road at BT174421. Destroyed in place.
- (5) Company A reported bypass at bridge #29 (BT219359) blown. 95% damage. Road repaired and reopened.

i. 9 June, 1969:

- (1) Company C sweepteam reported steel Stress Bridge side of bridge #37 blown at 0200 hours at BT268272. No security on bridge.
- (2) Company C sweepteam found one M-26 Frag, Lot #42-60 at BT262283. Destroyed in paddy.
- (3) Battalion S-2 reported WN bus hit approximately 40 pound mine in center of QI-1 at BT256294. Company A sweepteam sent to resweep area after removal of bus. Negative results.
- (4) Battalion S-3 reported ARVN truck hit approximately 80 pound mine west side of QL-1 at BT257293. 4 VN critically injured. Medevac ARVN and Company A reswept area.

j. 10 June, 1969:

(1) Company D reported 8'X10' hole on east side of QL-1. Estimated 80 pound charge. BT094535. Road repaired and reopened.





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- (2) Company D found one ChiCom Gren at BT151452. Destroyed in paddy.
- (3) Company A sweepteam found a 48" culvert blown at BT218362. Road repaired and reopened.
- (4) Company D received 5 rounds of small arms fire at BT106507. Negative damage, negative casualties.
- (5) Company A reported 25 pound mine detonated by VN on motorcycle at bridge #29 (BT219359). Negative injuries. Road repaired and reopened.

k. 11 June, 1969:

- (1) Company 5 reported a 60" culvert blown at BT358190. Road repaired.
- (2) Company C found two 35-40 pound nitrostarch pressure detonating mines on west side of QL-1 at ET256295. Destroyed in place creating 6'X5' crater.
- (3) Company D found one M-57 electrical firing device and wire and blasting cap and claymore mine at BTO88539.

1. 12 June, 1969:

(1) Company A sweepteam reported bridge #32 (BT230399) blown by approximately 30-40 pound charge. Bridge impassable. Bypass constructed. Road passable.

m. 14 June, 1969:

- (1) Company A assisted in Medevac of one VN child with face burns at BT199389.
- (2) Company D 25 ton: lowbed hit mine at BT074383. 1 USA soldier injured-Medivac. Lowbed damaged beyond repair.

n. 15 June, 1969

(1) Company D sweepteam at BT100518 found two command detonated mines (1-175mm and 1 155 mm round) Destroyed in place.

o. 16 June, 1969:

(1) Company B sweepteam found one 81mm illumination round on roadside at BT455097. Destroyed in place.



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- (2) Company C sweepteam found one 15-20 pound nitrostarch pressure electrical primed mine on west side of road at BT261285. Destroyed in place.
- (3) Company D assisted in Medevac at BT104507 of one VN civilian with shrapnel wounds on head and skull fracture.
- (4) Battalion S-3 Officer reported Service Company M-54 truck hit mine 200 meters south of BT259288. Mine was on east side of road. 25-30 pound. Truck destroyed, 1 MC WIA.
 - p. 17 June, 1969:
- (1) Company D sweepteam reported QL-1 mined with 150 pound explosive at BT116493, culvert installed and road opened.
- (2) Company A sweepteam reported bridge #31 at BT225347 blown. Damage; one span out, wing walls destroyed. Road not passable. Installed 105' Class 60 bridge. Boad Open.
- (3) Company D sweepteam found one 105mm round set for command detonation at BT099521. Destroyed in place.
 - q. 19 June, 1969:
- (1) Company A sweepteam found two mines w/blasting caps on side of road at BT247308. Destroyed caps, burned mines.
- 2. (2) Company D sweepteam found 4'X4' hole in road at BT110501. Road repaired.
- (3) Company A sweepteam found one 30 pound nitrostarch pressure release detonating mine east side of road at BT258290. Destroyed in place and repaired road.
- (4) Company C sweepteam found two 35 pound nitrostarch pressure electrical detonation at BT262284. Destroyed in place and repaired road.

- (1) Company A sweepteam reported three 48" culverts blown with 60 pound charge at BT258292. Road repaired.

- (4) Company A sweep team at BT258288 grader dug up 10 pound nitrostarch mine with pressure electrical firing device. Mine disarmed with negative damage.

- (1) Company A received six 122mm rockets at BT199389. Negative casualties, negative damage.

- (1) Company Λ sweep team found one M-79 round at BT208375. Destroyed in place.

- (3) Company D sweepteam found one AP mine Lot 42-5 with trip wire in culvert at BT125484. Destroyed in paddy.

 - b. Total funds expended for the period was 47,200 \$VN.

5. Patrols.

- a. During the month of June, 1969, the 9th Engineer Battalion at Chu Lai conducted thirty daylight and thirty night reconnaissance patrols in its Area of Responsibility with one contact.
- b. On 30 June, 1969 the daylight reconnaissance patrol received approximately 4 rounds of enemy fire. A reaction force was sent out to sweep the area with negative results.





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6. Patrol Training. During the month of June, 1969, the 9th Engineer battalion in conjunction with 1st Combined Action Group, Chu Lai, RVN, established a 10 day patrol orientation course to enhance the patrol capabilities of this Battalion. Personnel from 9th Engineer Battalion, under supervision of 1st CAG, participated with Combined Action Platoons in setting up night ambushes, recon patrols, and various Civic Action programs.
