HARDATIVE SULFALII

- 1. During July 1970, the 9th Engineer Batvalion was under the command of Lieutenant Colonel John P. Kraynak. The Battalion convinued to perform its primary missions of conducting minesweeps of Vietnam Route #1, from Hill #29 (BF243317), to the Ba Ren River (BT102510), and upgrading and paving Vietnam Route #1 from Tam My City to the Ba Ren River (BT102510). The Battalion continued to provide engineer support to the Free World Forces in the Americal Division, Morean and 1st Marine Division areas of operation. On 19 July 1970, the Battalion began a standdown to prepare for redeployment to COMBS. On that date the Battalion started a massive program to clean up all of the vehicles, equipment and tools for embarkation.
- 2. Company "B", located at Hill #10 (Bf196366), continued to perform their primary mission of conducting deliberate and visual minesweeps and culvert checks from Hill 10 (Bf196386), to Hill #29 (Bf243317), a deliberate and visual minesweep and culvert check from Hill #10 (Bf196386), to the Ly Ly River (Bf115457), and the upgrade and maintenance of Vietnam Route #1 from Tam Ky (Bf296240), to the Ly Ly River (Bf145457). The company continued construction support to the Free World Forces in the Americal Division area of operations. On 19 July 1970, the company began a stand-down and started cleaning vehicles, equipment and tools to prepare for redeployment. The two minesweeps from Hill 10 to Hill 29 and Hill 10 to the Ly Ly River were turned over to the Americal Division on 19 July 1970. On 25 July 1970, the company command post and one plateon moved into the Dattalion compound in Dahang. A guard detachment will remain on Hill #10 until the compound is turned over to another unit.
- 3. Company "J", located in the Datlalion compound in DaWang began a stand-down on 1 July 1970, to clean vehicles and equipment for redeployment to COINS, and departed DaWang on 10 July 1970, for Camp Pendleton, California.
- 4. Company "D", located at Landing Zone Haldy (ET136446), continued to perform their primary missions of conducting a visual minesweep and culvert check of Vietnam Route (1 between the Ly Ty Miver (ET145457), and the Da Ren River (ET102510), and the hauling of base rock to Tam My City between BT330210 and ET293240 to prepare Vietnam Route (1 in the city for paving. The company continued to provide construction support to the Free World Forces in the 7th Marine Regiment and Morean areas of operation. On 19 July 1970, the company begin a standdown to clean equipment, vehicles and tools for rede loyment to COMS. On 10 July 1970, the company completed the training of the RF Group minesweep team and turned over the minesweep of Vietnam Route (1 from the Ly Ly River (ET145457), and the Ba Ren River (ET102510), to them on that date.

5. During the period from 1 thru 19 July 1970, the Battalion continued to perform its primary missions of providing haul support to the 3 NOB and upgrading of Vietnam Route 31 from Tam Ky to the Ly Ly River.

a. During the reporting period the following mineral products were placed on Vietnam Route 11 between Tam My and the Ly Ly River: 1,964 tons of asphaltic concrete, 6,872 tons of 2"(-), 194 tons of 3/4 inch aggregate and 99 cubic yards of sand for cement headwalls on the culverts, 33 cubic yards of ready mix concrete for headwalls.

b. During the reporting period the following mineral products were placed on Vietnam Route #535: 391 tons of shot rock in the construction of a by-pass.
