PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the period 1-30 June 1968, this Battalion participated in forty-three (43) tactical movements and sixty-two (62) Rough Rider operations in support of the 3d Marine Division, 1st Marine Division, FLSG-B, MCB-5 and ARVN. During the same period this Battalion has driven 66,676 miles, transported 38,973 tons of supplies and 19,651 troops.
