

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of May, the 9thMAB continued to perform the assigned missions of intra-theater rotation of ground and aviation units, rehabilitation of equipment, replacement of personnel, training of rotating squadrons and contingency planning as the Fleet Marine Force component of the SEVENTH Fleet.

On 13 May 1967 Special Landing Force TG 79.4 terminated Operation BEAVER CAGE. During the period 18 - 26 May 1967, Special Landing Force TG 79.4 conducted Operation BEAU CHARGER in the Trug Luong and Gio Linh districts, of Quay Tri Province, Republic of Vietnam.

On 12 May 1967 Special Landing Force TG 79.5 terminated Operation BEACON STAR. During the period 20 - 25 May 1967 Special Landing Force TG 79.5 conducted Operation BELT TIGHT in the Demilitarized Zone South of the Ben Hai River in Quang Tri Province, Republic of Vietnam.

b. Intelligence

- (1) During the period, the G-2 section collected and correlated intelligence data with emphasis on the coastal regions of RVN. Particular attention was paid to those areas that were prospective SLF targets.
- (2) Observers from the G-2 section were provided to the SLFs during operations BEAU CHARGER, and BELT TIGHT.
- (3) The G-2 section participated in SEATO Operation AURORA at Bangkok, Thailand. The section also represented CTF 79 during the SEVENTH Fleet Quarterly Scheduling and Planning Conference at Yokosuka, Japan and at the Technical Security Liaison Group Conference at Fuchu Air Base, Japan. The section also provided a representative to the SLF camp at Subic for Psychological Warfare Matters.
- (4) The G-2 section hosted a Contact Instruction Team from 1st Radio Battalion, FMF on Electronic Warfare. A two day course was presented to Marine units on Okinawa.

c. Training

- (1) During the period 1 - 31 May 1967, Headquarters, 9thMAB continued in its role of providing training support to the units of 9thMAB. This support required the scheduling of schools, firing ranges and other training requirements not available to units from within their own resources.
- (2) OJT No OJT was conducted during the month of May.
- (3) Schools 145 persons attended schools during the month. Statistical data on schools is included in Appendix D.
- (4) Amphibious Training No amphibious training was carried out during the month of May due to nonavailability of shipping.
- (5) Military Assistance Program. Training was conducted for

friendly foreign nationals under the Military Assistance Program. Statistical details are included in Appendix D.

d. Logistics

- (1) Significant tasks undertaken by G-4 and cognizant staff sections are as follows:
 - (a) Elements of BLT 3/4 were airlifted from Naha, Okinawa to Danang, RVN from 13-16 May 67. The airlift of 1,233 men and 471,200 tons of cargo was provided by the 315th Air Division USAF and consisted of 44 KC-130 A/C loads.
 - (b) The remainder of BLT 3/4 embarked aboard the U.S.S. Seminole (AKA 104) and the U.S.S. Terrell Cty (LST 1157) on 16-17 May 67.

e. Embarkation

- (1) The embarkation section coordinated the embarkation of units rotating to the Special Landing Force, the debarkation of units rotating from RVN to Okinawa, and loading and unloading of LFORM as required to support contingency plans.

f. Community Relations

- (1) Band participation in community activities were as follows:

- (4) HqCo, RLIT 26 (Rear) conducted weekly Beginning and Advanced English classes for students at the Ryukyuan-American Cultural Center.
- (5) Numerous visits by HqCo, RLIT 26 (Rear) personnel were made to the Leprosarium (AIRAKU-EN) on YAGAJI island. A check for

- (6) HqCo, RLT 26 (Rear) hosted a party for ninety children of a new kindergarten school in NAGO.
- (7) Members of the English class, Ryukyuan-American Cultural center and the NAGO English school planted thirty-five "friendship" trees at Camp Schwab.
- (8) Open house was conducted at Camp Hansen and Camp Schwab by organizations of the Brigade on Armed Forces Day.
- (9) Various luncheons and dinners were hosted for officials from Kushi-Son and NAGO-CHO for purposes of discussing current projects and planning of future endeavors.
- (10) Marine Aircraft Group 15 devoted a total of 192 man hours, distributed evenly between four orphanages in the Iwakuni area, in up keep, and repair of building and entertaining the children.

g. Communications

The Communications-Electronics office conducted normal routine business during the month of May. Planning, conferences, and inspections comprised the bulk of the section's activities.

Camp Hansen Okinawa May 18 - Brigadier General Jacob E. Glick assumed command of the 9th Marine Amphibious Brigade today during formal ceremonies here.

Outgoing commander, BrigGen Louis Metzger will be assigned as assistant division commander, 3rd Marine Division in Vietnam.

More than 750 Brigade Marines participated in the ceremony. Civilian and military dignitaries from throughout Okinawa and Western Pacific commands attended the honors given to the generals.

General Glick was commissioned a second lieutenant while attending the U. S. Naval Academy in December 1941. He was graduated in 1942 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Electrical Engineering.

General Glick served as a company commander and radar officer in the South Pacific during World War II. He received a Letter of Commendation with ribbon for meritorious conduct during the seizure and occupation of Woodlark Island, British New Guinea, and during the assault and occupation of Cape Gloucester, New Britain.

Returning to the United States as a major in December 1944, he served at Headquarters Marine Corps until June 1946. From there he attended the U.S. Naval Academy at Annapolis, receiving a masters degree in Electrical Engineering in May 1949.

General Glick was assigned as Officer in Charge, Marine Corps Electronics Design Department, Bureau of Ships, in Washington D.C. until February 1952.

During the Korean Conflict, General Glick served as Signal Battalion Commander and Assistant Division, Communication and Electronics Officer with the 1st Marine Division from April 1952 until February 1953. For his service in Korea he was awarded the Legion of Merit and the Bronze Star Medals, both with Combat "V".

After his tour in Korea, General Glick served in various command and staff assignments in the United States until his transfer to Hawaii in 1959.

After a three year tour at Fleet Marine Force Pacific Headquarters, he went to Headquarters Marine Corps as Assistant to the Deputy Chief of Staff (Research and Development).


