## PART II

## NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of June, the 9thMAB continued to perform the assigned missions of intra-theater rotation of selected ground and aviation units, rehabilitation of equipment, replacement of personnel, training of rotating squadrons and contingency planning as the Fleet Marine Force component of the SEVENTH Fleet.

RLT 26(fwd) was primarily occupied with Operation CROCKETT in the Khe Sanh area. Emphasis was placed on continued defense of Khe Sanh Combat Base, combat outposts, search and destroy operations, and continued extensive reconnaissance and patrolling within artillery range.

Special Landing Force "A", TG 79.4 was engaged in Operation BEAR BITE from 2 - 12 June 1967 in the Quang Tri and Thua Thien Provinces, Northern I CTZ, RVN. On 13 June the ARG/SLF sailed for Subic Bay for general upkeep until 26 June 1967 while BLT 1/3 participated in Operation COLGATE with the 4th Marines. HMM 263 was offloaded at Ky Ha on 13 June 1967 and was rotated with HMM 362 upon return of the SLF on 28 June 1967. On 29 June 1967 BLT 1/3 was reembarked and the ARG/SLF remained in a holding area off Northern I CTZ, RVN on 30 June 1967.

During the period 1 - 10 June 2/3 remained in-country, OpCon to 3rd Mar Div for Operation CIMAARRON, while the ARG remained in Subic Bay for upkeep. On 11 June backloading was completed and planning commenced for Operation BEACON TORCH/CALHOUN. Operation BEACON TORCH/CALHOUN commenced in Quang Nam/Quang Tin Province, I CTZ, RVN on 18 June 1967. The operation was terminated on 2 July 1967.

b. Intelligence

- (1) During the period, the G-2 section collected and correlated intelligence data with emphasis on the coastal regions of RVN. Particular attention was paid to those areas that were prospective SLF targets. This section also initiated daily intelligence briefings for officers in transit to RVN.
- (2) Observers from the G-2 section were provided to SLF TG 79.4 during Operation BEAR CLAW.
- (3) The G-2 section represented CTF 79 at a SSO Intelligence Conference with CTF 76.

c. Training

- (1) During the period 1 - 30 June 1967, Headquarters, 9thMAB continued in its role of providing training support to the units of 9thMAB. This support required the scheduling of schools, firing ranges and other training requirements not available to units from within their own resources.
- (2) OJT. Four officers and four enlisted Marines of 9thMAB performed OJT with III MAF during the month in the following fields: G-3 operations, demolitions, motor transport, supply operations and administrative procedures. This training is designed to develop background knowledge and experience for selected personnel in order that they may be better equipped to carry out their training responsibilities in 9thMAB. Details of OJT are reflected in Appendix D.
- (3) Schools. 95 personnel attended 7 schools during the month. Statistical data on schools is included in Appendix D.
- (4) Firex. During the period 31 May - 25 June a Firex was conducted in the Camp Fuji-McNair training area for 1/13 Marines. The exercise was designed to give the unit practice and training in the firing of 155mm SP guns and 8" SP guns.
- (5) Military Assistance Program. Training was conducted for friendly foreign nationals under the Military Assistance

Programs. Statistical data of nationalities, types of training, and periods of training are shown in Appendix D.

d. Logistics

- (1) Significant tasks undertaken by G-4 and cognizant staff sections are as follows:
  - a. The Class V OpRes was off-loaded from the USS MERRICK and placed in storage at ASP II Okinawa.
  - b. The Brigade G-4A and AvnLogO accompanied BGen GLICK on liaison visit to III MAF and CTG 79.4. The Brigade Supply Officer visited CTG 79.4, CTG 79.5, FLC and III MAF. The Brigade Ordnance Officer visited III MAF and CTG 79.5

e. Embarkation

- (1) The embarkation section coordinated the embarkation of the 1st C&C platoon, Company D, 5th Medical Battalion from Okinawa to RVN, the embarkation/debarkation of units of 1st Battalion 13th Marines to and from Numazu Japan, and loading and unloading of LFORM as required to support contingency plans.
- (2) The Embarkation Office represented CG 9thMAB at the FMFPAC Embarkation Conference.

f. Community Relations

- (1) Band participation in community activities:

1st Marine Aircraft Wing Band

11 June 1967 - Played a concert at Shilling Community Center.
- (2) MACS-6 conducted twice weekly English classes for 40 school children of Henoko and Ginoza at Camp Schwab.
- (3) MCAS-6 continued with maintenance and repairs on the school house in Henoko. The command is presently awaiting paint for the exterior of the building.
- (4) Headquarters, RLIT-26 (Rear)
  - a. Beginning and Advanced English classes were conducted on Saturday for students at the Ryukyuan-American Cultural Center in Nago.

- b. Two visits were made to the Leper Colony (AIRAKU-EN) on Yagaji Island. Numerous items of used clothing, donated by members of RLT-26, were given to the residents of the colony during these visits.
- c. In response to Sister Francesca BROCCARDO's letter requesting funds for the Seibi Home Orphanage in Yamamaka, Japan, the members of RLT-26 donated \$450.64.
- d. Twelve Marines from RLT-26 units at Camp Schwab volunteered as blood donors at Chubi Hospital in Koza. This was in response to a request from Miss Funiko SHIMABUKU for her sister, Taskiko KEIDA who had become seriously ill. Miss SHIMIBUKU is an employee of Camp Schwab Officer's Club.
- e. A pioneer road project was completed on the off shore island of Hienza-Shima by members of Company A, 5th Engineer Battalion. In addition to blazing the road, it was compacted, graded, and culverts were placed where required. The project was completed using engineer equipment and personnel organic to RLT-26.
- f. Members of the engineer company also completed the preparation of a playground at the Gushikawa Elementary School and the grading of a civilian road in the range area adjacent to Sirohara Village.
- g. On 24 June 1967, an English Speech Contest, sponsored by the Nago Jaycees was held at the Ryukyuan-American Cultural Center, Nago to select a representative from Nago-Cho to compete in the Island-Wide Contest on 29 July 1967. Two Marines from RLT-26 were members of the Judges Panel.

(5) Provisional Service Battalion

- a. Collected \$218.35, to be delivered to the ISO, Camp Courtney, for donation to the Seibi Home Orphanage, Yamamaka, Japan.

(6) Chaplain's Office

- a. During the month of June, five classes were conducted in which 177 children (sum total of students attending) were taught rudimentary English by seven Marine personnel.

g. Communications-Electronics

The Communications-Electronics office conducted normal routine business during the period. Planning and inspections comprised

the bulk of the section's activities.

h. Financial

The Comptroller section continued normal fiscal year end closing procedures. Instructions for the new fiscal year were complicated by planned implementation of the Resource Management System and later cancellation of this plan. Another problem area was the realignment of funding for aviation ground support equipment from Navy channels to Marine Corps channels. This will cause changes in the budgeting and reporting procedures as well as changes in accounting data. Complete instructions have not been received for the administration of these funds.
