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COMMAND CHRONOLOGY

Period 1 September to 30 September 1965

1. Organizational Data

a. Reporting Unit. Ninth Marines

b. Location. The Ninth Marines command post is located at coordinates (AT 994723), DANANG, QUANG NAM Province, RVN. The 1st and 3d Battalions, Ninth Marines, occupy front line positions south of the DANANG Airbase in the south east sector of the DANANG TAOR. The 2d Battalion, which is under operational control of III MAF, occupies the perimeter of the DANANG Airbase.

c. Period Covered. 1 September through 30 September 1965.

(3) The net loss of personnel during September for the Regiment was a total of one hundred seventy-two. It is paramount to the accomplishment of the Regiment's mission that replacements be on a more timely basis, particularly the replacement of officers.

(4) Presently, only the 3d Battalion, 9th Marines is using the embossing system. All other units subordinate to the 9th Marines will be able to start using the embossing system when the supplies that are now on order are received.

b. Administration. Correspondence is used for all administrative communications where possible, thereby keeping the wire communication system free for operational communications.

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c. Intelligence.(1) Viet Cong Strengths, Disposition and Tactics.

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(a) Information derived from formalized intelligence sources, both U.S. and GVN, local official and civilian reports, after action reports, patrol debriefings, ITT prisoner interrogation reports, and other sources indicate that the Viet Cong forces operating in the 9th Marines TAOR during this reporting period consisted of the following:

The total Viet Cong strengths (less local guerrilla forces) believed to have been operation in the 9th Marines TAOR during this reporting period included elements of two battalions (700 men), four separate companies (350 men) and several "special mission" units (100 men), for a total enemy strength of 1150 men.

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Of the above units, one battalion and several Viet Cong company/"special mission" units were reported to have moved into the 9th Marines TAOR to support the Viet Cong rice gathering operations. During the same period, an estimated total of three hundred fifty field workers were brought into this area as Viet Cong laborers to assist in the rice harvest; but this group was believed to be primarily levies and to constitute no noteworthy addition to Viet Cong military strength.

Additionally, local guerrilla forces, organized in irregular units up to company strength (60-120), were operating in various locations. In some hamlets the Viet Cong force consists of little more than a "cell" of four or five local sympathizers, while in other Viet Cong dominated hamlets, the local Viet Cong force is estimated to consist of a well integrated, directed unit of full company strength (120 men) and equipped with a fair assortment of automatic and crew-served weapons. An approximate total of six hundred local Viet Cong (guerrillas and political activists) were estimated to have been operating in the 9th Marines TAOR. This force provided the regular (Main Force) Viet Cong units with exceptional protective surveillance, provided information of USMC operations, strengths and disposition, constituted a ready source of replacements to the Viet Cong ranks, and provided secure areas which magnified the difficulties in locating and restricting Viet Cong movements.

(b) Characteristic of insurgent tactics, the Viet Cong operations were primarily the "hit and run" type, usually initiated during periods of restricted visibility, whereby, the Viet Cong tried to gain a momentary advantage in firepower, inflict maximum casualties, and withdraw from the scene of action as rapidly as possible. Following well established insurgency patterns, the Main Force, Viet Cong units did not consistently operate in one locality or from an established and defended local base area. Rather, they varied their area of operations with considerable frequency. This tactic generated reports from local inhabitants and local governmental sources of considerable more Viet Cong forces operating in the 9th Marines TAOR than is accepted as probable.

(c) Mining and sniping were the two predominate types of enemy actions against friendly forces during September. A total of thirty incidents of mining and booby-trapping by the Viet Cong were reported to have happened in the 9th Marines TAOR. The effectiveness of this type of operation is indicated by the number of casualties. Thirteen

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Marines were killed and forty-two sustained wounds as a result of mines and booby-traps during the period 1 September through 30 September. In addition, Viet Cong mines damaged or destroyed three tactical vehicles, two Ontos, and an amphibious tractor. Forty-two incidents of sniping were reported by units of the 9th Marines during this period.

(d) During September, the Viet Cong directed a campaign of subversion and terrorism against the people in general, and more particularly, against village and hamlet authorities. There were several reports of Viet Cong political teams, accompanied by armed Viet Cong terrorists, visiting hamlets and isolated communities, where they delivered propaganda addresses and distributed subversive literature. The attendance of the villagers at these meetings was assured by threats of violence and reprisals. On 19 September, a HOA THAI Village policeman was killed in a daylight incident by a Viet Cong assassination team in PHUONG BAC (1) Hamlet (AT 995707).

(2) Viet Cong Casualties.

(a) During September, the 9th Marines inflicted the following casualties on the Viet Cong in operations within the 9th Marines TAOR:

It is accepted that the Viet Cong hold an almost fanatical compulsion to deny the bodies of their dead and wounded to their adversaries, so it is quite probable that the above figures reflect only a portion of the casualties actually sustained by the Viet Cong. Intelligence reports also indicate that the Viet Cong experienced a severe shortage of medicine and often medical supplies during this period which would tend to further increase the number of Viet Cong dead of wounds as the result of our operations.

(b) This reporting period also showed a material increase in the number of Viet Cong weapons captured. A total of eleven weapons were reported captured; the large majority of which were CHICOM MOSSIN-NAGANT Model 53, 7.62mm carbines. Of significance is that these carbines all exhibited identical arsenal markings and date of manufacture (1960). In addition, the components of each weapon, ie:

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stock, receiver, trigger assembly, bolt, etc, were all stamped with the same serial number, indicating that substitution of worn parts had, as yet, not been necessary. The weapons captured showed little field usage or wear. It is likely that these weapons were but recently introduced into this locality. A noticeable increase in reports of Viet Cong armed with shoulder weapons during this period also bears out the conclusion that an influx of well-armed regular Viet Cong forces into this TAOR has occurred.

(3) Sources of Intelligence.

(a) The primary source of information of military intelligence value was the units in contact with the Viet Cong. Contact reports, patrol reports, after-action reports, and observations by front-line troops constituted the major, and most reliable, source of information.

(b) In addition, periodic and special reports provided by MACV, I Corps, III MAF G-2, 3d MARDIV G-2, QUANG NAM Special Sector and other regular intelligence sources, were received and utilized. Local GVN authorities and officials, especially the HOA VANG District Chief and District Police Chief, also contributed much worthwhile information.

(c) Also, several local sources were utilized and developed by this Regiment. A most productive source of information proved to be the Chief of HOA HAI Village. His frequent, almost daily reports, constituted a major source of information of the Viet Cong strengths, disposition, and plans in the eastern portion of the Regimental TAOR. Of particular note was the exceptionally high percentage of his reports which proved to be substantially correct. The major portion of credit for the development of this intelligence source goes to the 1st Battalion S-2 who cultivated the Village Chief's cooperation and maintained an effective liaison with him.

(d) After an initial spotty performance during the beginning of this reporting period, ITT prisoner interrogation reports developed into a timely and usable source of information of Viet Cong procedures, locations, personalities and morale, and the impact and influence of Viet Cong and friendly operations on the local civilian population. ITT translation facilities, which provided rapid translation of captured enemy documents, also provided a worthwhile service.

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(e) Aerial photography was extensively utilized in operational planning to locate Viet Cong positions and prepared obstacles, to assist in terrain analysis, and to assess damage. Of especial note was the photo strips prepared by the III MAF API Section for use in planning operations in this TAOR. However, the current T/O for an infantry regiment does not provide imagery interpreters on the regimental and battalion levels, and the absence of such qualified personnel inhibited full utilization of this form of intelligence. Strip photos, while adequate, were not as readily usable as prepared mosaics. Hand held aerial photos provided by the Division Aerial Observation Section provided another useful source of visual intelligence.

(4) Significant Events.

Operation Golden Fleece (See Operations)

(a) (See the 9th Marines Intelligence Summary #54 dated 1 September 1965) The 1st Battalion S-2 reported that the HOA HAI Village Chief indicated to him that the villagers told him thirty or more Viet Cong were killed during the search and destroy operation conducted 29 August by the 1st Battalion in the Marble Mountain area. The village chief stated that the operation resulted in pro-government sentiments among the villagers and evident confidence in the ability of USMC forces to provide future security in the area. Also, the village chief requested that the battalion provide security for the villagers when they harvested the rice beginning on 10 September 1965, so as to deny the rice to the Viet Cong. The village chief related that the practice in the past was for the villagers to place a portion of the rice in an open field for the Viet Cong to retrieve as a tax, and thereby avoid Viet Cong reprisals. This report ultimately resulted in the 9th Marines Operation Golden Fleece to give protection to the villagers while they harvested the rice. This operation has continued into October due to the lateness of the start of the monsoon which brings seasonal rains to this area and marks the end of the Fall harvest. Reports during September have indicated that the Viet Cong have only collected ten per cent of their rice quota in this area.

(5) Electronic Surveillance Devices. During September, the Regiment employed the following electronic surveillance devices as indicated:

Maintenance difficulties, especially the lack of repair parts, inhibited the full utilization of these devices. The situation was improved during the later portion of September, and the last fourteen days of the month reflected increased utilization. An additional problem was the shortage of trained operators, which was materially relieved by the establishment of a local training course for operators.

(6) Psychological Warfare.

(a) Psychological warfare operations were frequent and diverse during this reporting period. Among the psywar activities conducted were leaflet drops, poster and leaflet handouts, helicopter loudspeaker broadcasts, I Corps Psywar Detachment Audio Team presentations, HOA VIANG District Propaganda Section presentations, face to face persuasion by patrol leaders through interpreters, erection and maintenance of a bulletin board at the MIEU DONG (1), (BT 017678), check point and the emplacement of banners proclaiming Vietnamese-American friendship and cooperation at selected points along Highway 1 and 1A south of Danang.

(b) Statistical information regarding psywar activities within the 9th Marines TAOR are set forth below:

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(c) The most significant of the psywar operations conducted were the helicopter loudspeaker broadcasts which immediately prior to the initiation of an operation, advised the inhabitants of a surrounded area to move to a designated civilian collection point in order to minimize casualties to the villagers and assist the friendly forces in their mission. Response in every case was significant with up to four hundred sixty-two villagers responding to instructions in one large hamlet area. In each instance villagers were screened by local authorities and provided with food, medical aid and temporary shelter for as long as they wished during the conduct of the operation.

(d) During September a discernable improvement in the extent of cooperation of the villagers with the Marines was noted. Their change was attributed in large measure to the continual presence of the Marines and the promise of greater security and stability. This indicates a degree of success from face to face persuasion during the patrols conducted during this period.

d. Operations.

(1) Operation RICE-STRAW. (See the 9th Marines Operation Order 325-65, 051600H September 1965)

(a) On 5 September 1965, the 9th Marines were already operating south of the CAU DO River in two zones with the 1st Battalion on the left and the 2d Battalion on the right. Under Operation RICE-STRAW the 9th Marines were to move south extending their control to the KY LAM River by 25 December 1965. The immediate objective, Phase Line Orange, was to be secured by 25 September 1965.

(b) Company "C", 1st Battalion, reinforced with five Amtracs, three tanks and two Ontos, conducted a search and destroy operation in the area of KHAI TAY (3), (BT 048639), which began at 070630H and was concluded at 071210H September 1965. (See 9th Marines Situation Report #61 and 9th Marines Frag Order 33-65)

(c) Company "A", 1st Battalion, reinforced with two platoons from Company "C", tanks, Ontos, and Amtracs, conducted a search and destroy operation in the vicinity of CA HA (2) Hamlet (BT 083670) from 091600H to 092300H. A Viet Cong Battalion had been reported in this area preparing to lay mines. (See 9th Marines Situation Reports #63 and #64 for details of this operation.)

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(d) The 2d Battalion cleared the Hamlets of YEN NE (4), (AT 975677), LA BONG (3), (AT 963677), and QUA GIANG (2), (BT 003688), on 9 and 10 September 1965. (See 9th Marines Situation Reports #63 and #64 for details)

(e) The 3d Battalion, 3d Marines, came under operational control of the 9th Marines on 10 September for a period of five days. On 10 September the 3d Battalion, 3d Marines, established a blocking position on Hill 55 at (AT 969619) in support of an ARVN operation being conducted to the south of the Regimental TAOR. For four days the 3d Battalion conducted aggressive patrols in the southern portion of the Regimental TAOR, and on 14 September the battalion conducted a search and destroy operation to the north clearing the area between Hill 55 and Phase Line Orange in the 2d Battalion's zone. (See 9th Marines Situation Reports Numbers 64-68)

(f) On 12 September 1965 the 2d Battalion cleared and established defensive positions in LE SON (1), (AT 980660), and YEN NE (1), (AT 987664), which are hamlets on Phase Line Orange.

(g) Companies "A" and "D" conducted a search and destroy operation in the area south of Marble Mountain clearing the rice fields in that area on 13 September 1965.

(h) On 14 September, the 2d Battalion established positions from (AT 959658) to (AT 967661) and established a river check point at (AT 959658) on Phase Line Orange. (See 9th Marines Situation Report #68)

(i) The 1st Battalion conducted a search and destroy operation near TRA KHE (2) Hamlet (BT 075680) on 17 September 1965. (See 9th Marines Situation Report #72)

(j) On 19 September, the 2d Battalion occupied positions in the vicinity of NHON THO (1) Hamlet (BT 005660), MIEU DONG (1) Hamlet (BT 017679). A clear and hold operation was conducted in the hamlets of NHON THO (2), (BT 017656), and BO MUNG (2), (BT 021652). (See 9th Marines Situation Report #73)

(k) The 1st Platoon, Company "C", 1st Battalion, conducted a search and destroy operation in KHUE DONG (1) Hamlet (BT 056707) and HAI AN Hamlet (BT 055713) from 200800H to 201300H September 1965. (See 9th Marines Situation Report #74)

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(l) During the period from 21-24 September, the 2d Battalion moved to the Danang Airbase to become the Airbase Defense Battalion and the 3d Battalion moved forward to relieve the 2d Battalion on position. Operational control of the 2d Battalion passed to III MAF at 240900H. (See 9th Marines Situation Reports Numbers 75-78)

(m) The 1st Battalion (-), reinforced by Company "3d Recon Battalion, and Company "B" (-), 3d Tank Battalion, conducted a search and destroy operation east of the VINH DIEN River and south of grid line (T65) from 230635H to 231545H. (See 9th Marines Situation Report #79)

(o) During the period 19-21 September 1965, the 2d Battalion conducted a search and destroy operation along the YEN River from Phase Line Orange north to the vicinity of (AT 965690) and conducted searches in the hamlets QUA GIANG (1), (BT 017665), and NHON THO (2), (BT 017656). (See 9th Marines Situation Reports Numbers 73-75)

(p) On 26 September 1965, the 3d Battalion searched LE SON (2) Hamlet (AT 978650) and CAM NE (3) Hamlet (AT 965686) (See 9th Marines Situation Report #80)

(q) On 27 September, the 3d Battalion conducted a search of CAM NE (2) Hamlet (AT 980688). (See 9th Marines Situation Report #81)

(r) On 30 September, the 3d Battalion began Operation MUSKRAT, a five day operation to search the YEN River for tunnels and hiding places. (See 9th Marines Situation Report #84)

(2) Operation GOLDEN FLEECE. (See 9th Marines Frag Order 36-65 and the 9th Marines Intelligence Summary #54 dated 1 September 1965)

(a) U.S. and RVN military intelligence sources and local governmental authorities indicated that the Viet Cong would make a major effort to gain a sizeable portion of the rice harvested in the 9th Marine TAOR. The Viet Cong wanted the rice for their own use and wanted to deny it to the local governmental agencies in order to increase the problems with the refugees in this area.

(b) An adequate supply of rice is essential to the sustenance of the Viet Cong through the winter months and is essential to their capability for future operations. The

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disastrous floods of November 1964 ruined some of the food stocks of the Viet Cong and made it imperative they acquire this year's harvest. The Viet Cong obtain their rice by taxation, purchase, and by confiscating it. Intelligence reports early in the month of September indicated a discernable influx into the 9th Marines TAOR of Viet Cong regular forces as well as Viet Cong controlled and directed harvest workers. The increased number of contacts with enemy forces by Marine patrols early in September bore out the validity of these reports.

(c) On 8 September 1965, the Commanding Officer, 9th Marines, directed the forward two battalions to provide aid and security for the rice harvest within the 9th Marines TAOR. The 1st Battalion had already begun using patrols to aid the HOA HAI Village Chief in his harvest and called these Golden Fleece patrols. Golden Fleece was adopted as the Regimental Operation code name. Operation GOLDEN FLEECE was conducted as an additional mission to Operation RICE-STRAW.

(d) Patrols and ambushes were used extensively during September to protect harvesters in the fields. Amtracs were used to carry the rice to secure hamlets where Marines provided security for the common storage areas. When Viet Cong rice caches were located, combat patrols were dispatched to either recover the caches or to destroy them. A curfew was imposed on civilians in the area to prevent harvesting at night. When suspicious persons were observed working in the paddies, Marine patrols would clear the fields and the suspicious persons would be taken to the village chiefs to be identified.

(e) Operation GOLDEN FLEECE was considered a great success. Because of the late monsoon this year and the protection afforded by the Marines, the local government was able to harvest much more rice than usual, while it is believed the Viet Cong have only gathered ten percent of their quota for this area. Over fifty-five tons of rice were harvested in the 3d Battalion's zone by refugees from the HOA CAM Training Center working under HOA VANG District Headquarters. This area, which includes the CAM NE Complex (AT 990680), was usually not harvested because it was controlled by the Viet Cong before the Marines secured it. The total amount of rice harvested in the 1st Battalion's zone will not be known until the village chiefs make their reports to HOA VANG District Headquarters during the second week of October.

f. Fire Support and Fire Support Coordination.

(1) The Fire Support Coordination Centers at Regiment and Battalion levels operated in their normal capacity. Artillery and naval gunfire support was limited during this period due to the fact that control of fires within the 9th Marines TAOB is a combined consideration of the 3d Marine Division and I Corps. Harassing and interdicting fires were used extensively. Preparation fires were used in conjunction with helicopter assaults.

(2) For a narrative summary of fire support for operations and close combat see the following documents included with this report:

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(2) Helicopters were used extensively during September for resupply, reconnaissance and heliborne assault missions.

h. Nuclear, Biological and Chemical Warfare.

(1) The use of chemical agents was restricted during September. The 3d Battalion employed a commercial type smoke generator to flush caves and tunnels during Operation MUSKRAT. Smokepot HC was the chemical agent used.

i. Training

(1) Training for the 9th Marines during September was limited by heavy operational commitments.

(5) The 2d Battalion, 12th Marines, were in direct support of the 9th Marines during September.

k. Communications-Electronics.

(1) Satisfactory communications have been maintained throughout the September period with the exception of the platoon and squad levels where the AN/PRC-6 is employed. The AN/PRC-6 has proven to be extremely limited in dense foliage and has caused more reliance upon the AN/PRC-10. Frequent use has been made of the artillery conduct-of-fire net and the tank companies and anti-tank companies command nets as alternate means of infantry communications. At this point a trade off of AN/PRC-6's for AN/PRC-10's would be welcomed by the front line battalions.

(2) There are some aspects of the 9th Marines communications operations that depart slightly from present doctrine:

(a) Wire is used extensively between unit command posts versus radio relay. The terrain in most instances will support the use of the AN/TRC-27 radio relay equipment, but logistics problems have made this equipment take on a secondary role to wire.

(b) Radio relay has as yet to be completely exploited as few high frequency sets have been employed other than TAR and NGF circuits.

(3) No new equipment or techniques have been employed this period.

l. Logistics.

(1) No supply problems were encountered during September that effected the accomplishment of the 9th Marines mission. Problems were experienced in the resupply of batteries and parts to repair communications equipment and motor vehicles. There has been a shortage of tentage and lumber.

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(2) Cantonment Program. Construction of the 9th Marines cantonment was scheduled to begin on 29 September 1965; but was delayed because of a shortage of lumber. However, with assistance from the Division Clubs Officer in obtaining materiel, personnel of the Headquarters Company constructed an enlisted club and a SNCO club that are now in operation. These clubs serve all the 9th Marines

(3) Highlights.

(a) The displacement of the 1st Battalion CP from (BT 023723) to (BT 068715) was begun on 3 September and completed on 19 September. The Regimental S-4 assisted the 1st Battalion S-4. The move was made over the MSR using M35 trucks. A fork lift was provided by the 3d Marine Division at the request of the Regimental S-4. It was necessary to use barges provided by the 3d Engineer Battalion and two LCU's from the Naval Component Command because the bridge at (BT 038762) spanning the TOURANE River was being repaired. Coordination was made with the Division PMO prior to the displacement and no major traffic problems were caused in the city of DANANG. The 1st Battalion received priority over all other traffic moving across the river.

(b) On 10 September 1965, the 3d Battalion, 3d Marines, were lifted from CHU LAI to the DANANG Airbase by KC-130 aircraft and came under operational control of the 9th Marines for a five day period. From the airbase they were heli-lifted in CH-34's south of the MLR in the 2d Battalion's zone to positions in the vicinity of (AT 9661). The rapidity of movement and secrecy of planning precluded the coordination of logistical requirements prior to their arrival. The Regimental S-4 sent a liaison team to the LZ an hour after the lead elements of the battalion had landed and effected coordination on all logistics matters with the battalion commander and his S-4. On 12 September, the Regiment coordinated the heli-lift of two 4.2" mortars, twenty men, and 6.4 tons of ammunition to their positions. During the five day operation, all classes of supplies were provided by the 9th Marines and the resupply was coordinated by the Regimental S-4 and Air Liaison Officer. 35.5 tons of supplies were heli-lifted to the 3d Battalion. Every effort was made to replace Class II, Type 1, end items, through the Regimental communications section by giving them replacements, and then repairing the damaged equipment and then returning it to the unit, normally within fourteen hours. On 15 September the 3d Battalion, 3d Marines, returned to an

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assembly area at (AT 999698) where they were given fresh food and water. It took eight trucks one hour and a half to carry the battalion to the DANANG Airbase.

m. Medical and Dental Support.

(1) Routine medical and dental support has been available on a continuing basis from the 3d Medical Battalion. Helicopter evacuation of casualties directly to 3d Medical Battalion has eliminated the traditional function of the Battalion Aid Stations. The aid stations have functioned as dispensaries. There have been no medical problems which have effected the accomplishment of the 9th Marines mission.

(2) Preventive Medicine. There were no outbreaks of communicable diseases. No major sanitation problems were reported. All personnel of the 9th Marines are in a prophylactic immunization program.

(3) MedCap. The medical officers and hospital corpsmen operate aid stations for the civilian populace under the civil affairs program. The Majority of treatment is for ulcerations, skin disorders, dermatitis, lacerations, and vitamin deficiency. (See the Civil Affairs portion of this report for details).

n. Chaplain Support.

(1) The Regimental Chaplain's primary responsibility is providing religious and moral guidance to the men of this command. In addition, he offers his services to those commands in the area not having a chaplain attached. To this end he conducts Sunday worship services, evening prayers and weekly Bible study classes. He offers counsel to men with personal or marital problems.

Each of the three battalions of the 9th Marines has a chaplain attached. There are Protestant chaplains in the 1st and 3d Battalions, and there is a Catholic chaplain in the 2d Battalion. The Regimental Chaplain visits the three battalions on occasion, and supervises the religious coverage. When any unit is without Protestant coverage, the Regimental chaplain provides it.

(2) During September, the Regimental chaplain conducted nine worship services with a total attendance of two hundred sixteen. Memorial services were held for nine men.

ENCLOSURE (1)

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The chaplain counseled twenty men who had serious problems.

(3) Funds. The chapel offering for September totaled \$83.84. These funds were deposited in a central chapel fund from which the individual chaplain may draw for approved usage. During the month \$100.00 was given from the fund to the Danang Orphanage, and \$17.00 was expended for sandals for the children of BINH THAI Hamlet (BT 013720).

(4) Library. The Regimental chaplain maintains a book exchange for the men of the camp. About two hundred fifty books have been given outright, and there are about three hundred books on the shelf for exchange. Each evening a reading and writing tent is set up where books, magazines and writing paper is available for the men.

(5) The Regimental chaplain accompanies the medical staff when they conduct sick call in the BINH THAI Hamlet on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday. Approximately one hundred people are treated on each visit.

1. SUMMARY OF ENEMY SITUATION.

- a. Composition and Strength. Enemy strength in proximity of the area of operations is estimated to be approximately 1200, armed with rifles, automatic weapons including 18 LMGs, 6-10 81mm mortars, 12 60mm mortars, and 8 57mm Recoilless Rifles. Elements of three Viet Cong battalions have been identified; the 16th Battalion operating in the vicinity of coordinates (BT 0065); the 7th Battalion operating in the vicinity of coordinates (BT 0061), and a battalion (tentatively identified as the 23rd) operating in the vicinity of coordinates (AT 9665). In addition local force guerrilla units up to company strength (60-130) can be used to supplement and reinforce, as required. A fourth Viet Cong Battalion, identified as TA-27, and believed to be a Main Force unit is reported to be operating in the vicinity of coordinates (BT 0663). (This report lacks verification and additional information will be published as available).
- b. Recent and Present Activities. Viet Cong actions in the area have recently indicated an acceleration in the tempo of their operations with numerous small unit probes of front line and outpost positions, frequent sniper activity, and several ambushes of patrols. In addition, there has been a marked increase in the use of mines and booby-traps, with several reports of bold placement of mines and booby-traps within areas generally considered under our control and constant scrutiny. There has been an increase in Viet Cong psywar operations, with emphasis on subversion in the rural areas and terrorist activities against local government officials. There have been frequent reports of Viet Cong propaganda teams, usually armed, visiting hamlets and isolated communities in the area, conducting propaganda meetings and distributing subversive material. Propaganda leaflets (printed and handwritten), in English and addressed to U.S. Forces, have recently made an appearance in this locality.

2. ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS OF INFORMATION.

1. General. The area of this operation extends from the line of our present positions (generally forward of the SONG CAU DO) to a line extending from the vicinity of the AN TRACH hamlet complex on the west coordinates (AT 960658), along the trail running generally due east across National Highway #1 to the SONG VINH DIEN, continuing in a south-easterly direction along the trace of the SONG VINH DIEN to the junction with the SONG THANH QUIT, and continuing generally east to the coast in the vicinity of HA QUANG (4) hamlet, coordinates (AT 102669). The SONG YEN delineates the western boundary and the South China Sea provides the eastern boundary. National Route #1 parallels the coast about 4 miles inland and connects the major population centers.

2. Weather. (For period 5 through 30 September 1965).

a. Temperature

Mean maximum - 88 degrees
 Mean minimum - 75 degrees
 Daily average - 82 degrees

b. Winds

Nighttime: Northerly, 9 knots. (Mean speed - 4 knots).
 Daytime : (Same as above).

c. Cloud cover

Nighttime - Buildup of Cumulus clouds varying with occurrences of showers and thundershowers.
 Daytime - Early morning patches of dense stratus with Cumulus clouds becoming more numerous until the sky is almost covered with clouds by 1300 LST or shortly thereafter.

d. Visibility

Less than 5 miles - 3.4%
 Less than 1 mile - 0.3%

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SECRETe. Precipitation

Primarily in the form of showers and thundershowers, occurring most often during the afternoon and early evening. Rainfall for the period:

Maximum - 46.3 inches
Minimum - 3.0 inches
Mean - 15.7 inches

3. Terrain. The area of operations is a low, flat plain largely devoted to wet rice paddies. Trafficability is difficult to impossible in much of this area for all vehicles. The terrain near the shore is generally unfavorable for off-road movement due to extensive sand dunes. Vegetation in the area of operation includes localities consisting of sparse, cultivated fields which do not hamper observation or movement, and other areas, usually surrounding hamlets and/or villages, where dense foliage restricts observation and movement. Many of the sandy areas near the beaches contain numerous dome-shaped graves and swelling dunes which provide covered and partially concealed routes of approach in areas which are generally devoid of foliage and open in appearance.
4. Roads. Route #1, a main hard-surfaced road, traverses the area of operation generally from north to south about four miles inland. There are few secondary roads in the area, and the trails are generally unsuited for other than 1/4 ton combat vehicles. (Trafficability studies to be issued).
5. Politics, Sociology, and Economics. The area of operations is situated in HOA VANG district of QUANG NAM province. Within this district are several cantons, which, in turn, are each composed of several villages. The villages are made up of hamlets, which may be from a hundred yards to several miles apart. To the majority of the Vietnamese in this area, "the government" is the administrative group which runs his village. The village government is administered by a council who elect their president to act as village representative in dealings with superior government authorities. Family and village life is strongly centered on Buddhism/Animism although a substantial portion of the populace are Catholics. The inhabitants of the area of operations are predominately ethnic Vietnamese. The economy of the area rests on an agricultural base, with about 90% of the population involved in agricultural pursuits.

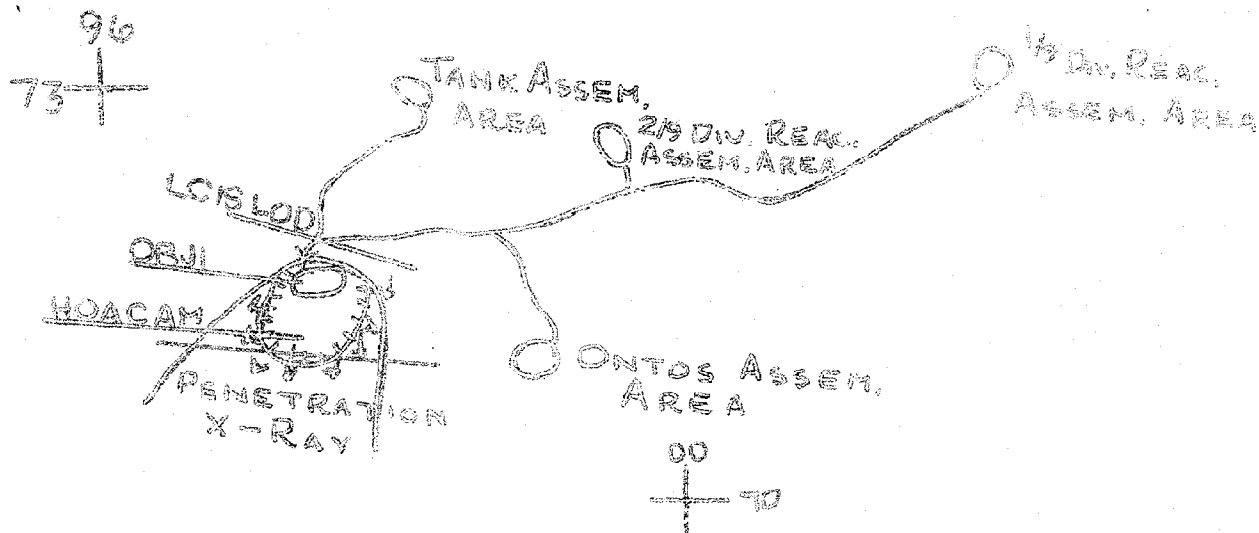

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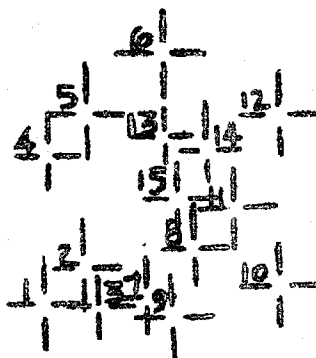
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MAP 3 TO GTR MARINES

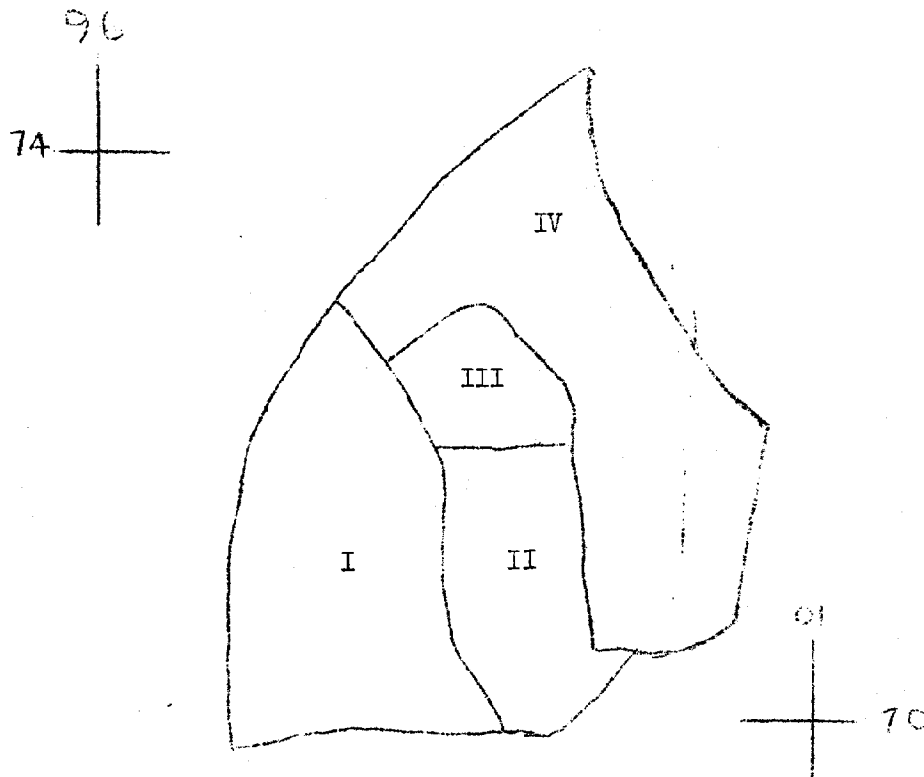

1. Reporting Unit. Ninth Marines
2. Period Covered. 010001H to 012400H September 1965
3. General Summary of Events. The Ninth Marines continue to defend in their assigned TAOR south of the Danang Airbase and south of the CAU DO River. Fifteen patrols were conducted in this area in the last twenty-four hours. Five ambushes and twelve listening posts were established last night. Seven scout-sniper teams were employed. A platoon from "G" Company made a sweep of the hamlet of LA CHAU (3) (AT 956678), beginning at 011400H. There were no Marine casualties today. There was no VC captured today.

a. 1st Battalion. The 1st Battalion continues to occupy positions south of the Danang Airfield and south of the CAU DO River in the south portion of the Regimental TAOR. During the last twenty-four hours the 1st Battalion conducted seven patrols, established three ambushes and nine listening posts. Three scout-sniper teams were employed last night.

b. 2d Battalion. The 2d Battalion continues to occupy defensive positions south of the CAU DO River in the southwest portion of the Regimental TAOR. Eight patrols, two ambushes, and three listening posts were sent out during this period. A patrol from Company "G" was taken under fire by VC snipers in LA BONG (2), (AT 967667). A fire fight ensued. Three Vietnamese civilians were wounded during the fight and two later died. All were evacuated to C&C. One platoon from "G" Company departed at 011400H to sweep LA CHAU (3), (AT 956678).

4. Activitiesa. Operations~~CONFIDENTIAL~~

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(1) 1st Battalion. The 1st Battalion continues to occupy defensive positions south of the airfield and south of the CAU DO River, with one reinforced squad remaining at the hospital site at (BT 075713) with MCB-9. One tunnel was located and destroyed in the vicinity of (BT 042692).

(a) Company "A" continues to occupy positions south of the CAU DO River from the vicinity of the hamlet of MAN QUAN (2), (BT 044686) to (BT 079699) and patrols extensively in this area. At 010036H the 2d platoon of Company "A", located at (BT 055698), received ten rounds of small arms fire from an estimated distance of seven hundred fifty meters from the vicinity of (BT 075698). The rounds fell short of the platoon's position. The snipers were out of small arms fire range. At 010115H an artillery FO with Company "A" requested to fire a mission on an estimated forty VC who were beating drums at (BT 081689). Fourteen rounds of 105mm HE were fired and fell on the target but the damage was unobserved due to darkness. The FO reported small secondary explosions after the fire mission and after one adjustment round. At 311900H the 1st platoon of Company "A" spotted two VC crossing a rice paddy in front of their position at (BT 044693). The platoon fired on the VC and lost contact. The 1st platoon also destroyed a tunnel in this area.

(b) Company "B" remains in the vicinity of the Battalion CP at (BT 023733) and has the responsibility of CP security and patrolling the area between the Battalion CP and the CAU DO River.

(c) Company "C" continues to occupy positions south of the CAU DO River from (BT 017683) to (BT 034687) and patrols extensively in this area.

(d) The 2d and 3d platoons of Company "D" continue to occupy positions in the vicinity of (BT 068708) with the Company CP while the 1st platoon (Rein) remains in the vicinity of (BT 085697). One reinforced squad continue to provide security for MCB-9 at the hospital site at (BT 075713).

(2) 2d Battalion. The 2d Battalion occupies defensive positions south of the CAU DO River. Companies "F", "G" and "H" occupy front line positions while Company "E" provides security for the FLSG ammunition dump (AT 988733) and railroad bridge and water point (AT 998707).

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(a) Company "E" provides security for the FLSG ammunition dump (AT 988733) with two platoons. One reinforced platoon also provides security for the railroad bridge and water point (AT 998707). Patrol activities are conducted in the assigned sector.

(b) Company "F" occupies front line defensive positions from (AT 977683) to (AT 988678). One squad continues to provide security for the medical station located at (AT 980686). At 312200H two VC snipers crawled to within thirty meters of Company "F" front line positions at (AT 977683). The snipers fired a few rounds into Company "F" positions and then ran to CAM NE (1), (AT 975684). Company "F" did not return fire due to the location of friendly troops in their vicinity. There were no USMC casualties.

(c) Company "G" occupies front line defensive positions from (AT 962674) to (AT 972682). At 011400H Company "G" dispatched one platoon on a search and destroy mission of LA CHAU (3), (AT 956678). At 011420H the platoon conducting the sweep received four rounds of sniper fire from (AT 955683) while moving to LA CHAU (3).

(d) Company "D" continues to occupy front line defensive positions from (AT 991676) to (BT 009676).

b. Patrols

(1) 1st Battalion. The 1st Battalion conducted seven patrols during the last twenty-four hours.

(a) Company "A" conducted three patrols during the last twenty-four hours. At 311830H Redwood Alpha Homer 7 left the IP (BT 074701) and moved southwest along the trail in that vicinity to (BT 068698). Then this patrol moved southeast to the vicinity of (BT 075686) and north along the western banks of the CAN BIEN River, back to the IP. Today Company "A" conducted two additional patrols in the area forward of their positions. The first patrol was a squad reinforced with 81mm mortar support, tanks and LVT's. This patrol departed at 010630H, covered area in grid squares (BT 0466) and (BT 0467) and returned to the IP at 011600H. The second patrol was a squad also reinforced by 81mm mortar support, tanks, and LVT's. This patrol departed at 010630H, covered the area included in grid squares (BT 0766) and (BT 0768) and returned at 011500H. Neither patrol had enemy contact.

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(b) Company "B" dispatched one patrol today. This patrol designated Redwood Bravo Homer 10, departed the IP (BT 023733) at 011230H, covered the area in and around the hamlets of HOA MY (BT 024737) HOA KHUE (BT 024745), TRUNG TAY (BT 029745) and BINH HOA (BT 025731) and returned to the IP at 011500H without enemy contact. A platoon size extended patrol departed the 1st Battalion CP today at 011324H in LVT's. This patrol will make contact with all of the front line positions and return to the Battalion CP on 3 September 1965.

(c) Company "C" conducted two patrols during the subject period. Redwood Charlie 2B departed the IP (BT 022686) at 010200H. This patrol covered the area in and around the hamlets of LIEM LAC (1), (BT 025685), LIEM LAC (2), (BT 028698) and CO MAN (BT 028691), and returned to the IP at 010500H without enemy contact. This morning at 010700H Company "C" dispatched a patrol designated Redwood Charlie 3A. This patrol crossed the IP located at (BT 035689) and moved south covering the area in and around the hamlet of AN LUU (BT 035676) and returned to the IP at 011200H without enemy contact.

(d) Company "D" conducted one patrol during the reporting period. Redwood Delta Homer 1 departed the IP (BT 035696) at 010300H, moved south to the hamlet of TAN AN (BT 092688) and then moved north along the beach and returned to the IP at 010500H. This patrol had no enemy contact.

(2) 2d Battalion. The 2d Battalion sent out eight combat patrols during this period.

(a) Company "E" sent out two patrols last night and one today. At 311800H a patrol was sent from (AT 975724) south to CAM HOA (2), (AT 977703). This patrol returned at 010450H without making contact. Another patrol was sent from the railroad bridge (AT 998707) north along the MSR to (BT 002725). This patrol departed at 010305H and returned at 010650H. No contact was made. Today a patrol was sent from (AT 983737) northeast to (AT 997744) and then south to (AT 999735). From here the patrol covered the area south of the FLSC ammunition dump at (AT 983728) and then returned. The patrol departed at 010920H and returned at 011130H without making contact.

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(b) Company "F" sent out two patrols during this period. Last night a patrol departed from (AT 989680) and moved south to YEN NE (1), (AT 985665) and returned. The patrol departed at 312330H and returned at 010805H. No contact was made. Today a patrol was sent from (AT 977683) north through CAM NE (6), (AT 975686). The patrol then moved along the northern edge of CAM NE (1), (AT 987694) from west to east. The patrol returned by moving through CAM NE (2), (AT 987687) from east to west. The patrol departed at 010800H and returned at 011300H. No contact was made.

(c) Company "G" sent out one patrol last night. This patrol departed from (AT 967685) at 312215H. At 010328H this patrol was taken under fire at (AT 966675) by approximately five automatic weapons and seven rifles. The fire came from LA BCNG (2), (AT 967668). During the action, the patrol discovered three Vietnamese Civilians had been wounded as a result of the VC firing. The patrol administered first aid but did not attempt to evacuate them since the patrol was heavily engaged. The patrol withdrew and returned to their front line positions, arriving at 010420H. At first light the wounded civilians were evacuated. One boy and one girl was dead. The other casualty, a woman, was in serious condition. There were no USMC casualties.

(d) Company "H" sent out two patrols during this period. Last night a patrol was sent from DUONG SON (2), (AT 993677) and moved south to (AT 995660). This patrol departed at 312230H and returned at 010420H. No contact was made. Today at 010456H a patrol was sent from DUONG SON (2), (AT 993677) south to YEN NE (1), (AT 989663). From here the patrol moved east to (BT 002665). At 010947H the patrol received small arms fire at (AT 996662) from DUONG SON (3), (AT 994670). The patrol returned fire. There were no USMC casualties. The patrol returned at 011115H.

c. Ambushes

(1) 1st Battalion. The 1st Battalion established three ambushes last night.

(a) Company "A" established an ambush at (BT 074685) which stayed in position from 312000H to 312300H with no enemy contact.

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(b) Company "C" established two ambushes last night. One ambush site was at (BT 033680). This ambush remained in position from 312000H to 010300H. Another ambush was established at (BT 022684) between the hours of 312200H and 010100H. Neither of these ambushes had enemy contact.

(2) 2d Battalion. The 2d Battalion sent out two ambushes last night.

(a) Company "F" established an ambush at (AT 977664) from 212330H to 010500H. No contact was made.

(b) Company "H" established an ambush at (BT 003672) from 312100H to 010230H. No contact was made.

(b) Company "C" employed a scout-sniper team at (BT 025683) between the hours of 312000H to 010500H without enemy contact.

(c) Company "D" employed a scout-sniper team at (BT 069696) which stayed in position between the hours of 312000H to 010500H.

(2) 2d Battalion. The 2d Battalion sent out four scout-sniper teams last night.

(a) Company "F" had a scout-sniper team at (AT 034674). No contact was made. This team went out at dark and returned at dusk.

(b) Company "G" had two scout-sniper teams in position last night. One team was in LA CHAU (3), (AT 956677) and the other in LA BONG (3), (AT 963677). No contact was made. These teams went out at dark and returned at dusk.

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areas. The LVT patrol being conducted by the 3d platoon of Company "B" will be continued as planned. In addition to this patrol the 1st Battalion plans to conduct seven other patrols, establish four ambushes and nine listening posts, and employ three scout-sniper teams. The 1st Battalion will continue its civil affairs program with increased emphasis in its assigned area.

b. 2d Battalion. The 2d Battalion will continue to occupy front line positions in the southwest portion of the Regimental TAOR. Five patrols, three ambushes, and two listening posts will be sent out tonight. Continued emphasis will be placed on the 2d Battalion's civil affairs program in the CAM NE Complex (AT 990690).

9. None.

10. Civil Affairs

a. 1st Battalion. The 1st Battalion treated eighty civilians in the Battalion Aid Station today. One hundred twenty villages were treated at the orphanage near Marble Mountain.

b. 2d Battalion. The 2d Battalion treated a total of one hundred and twelve Vietnamese civilians medically today. The 2d Battalion B.A.S. treated thirty-eight civilians. A total of sixty-six was treated in the village of DUONG SON (1), (AT 997687). Corpsman from Company "H" treated eight civilians today. The totals from Companies "E", "F" and "G" have not been reported at this time and will appear in tomorrow's situation report.

11. Late Entries

a. 1st Battalion. At 011200H small arms fire was received by Company "D"'s CP at (BT 068713). Fire was coming from NUNG's chasing Vietnamese wood choppers and firing over woodchoppers heads into Company "D"'s CP. Woodchoppers and NUNG's crossed highway and appeared to be rushing Company "D"'s CP (BT 068713). The NUNGs, not being in uniform, Company "D" was unable to identify the group. Company "D" returned fire killing three woodchoppers and wounding one NUNG in the leg. The NUNG shot in the leg was cared for and returned to NUNG CP. The NUNG OIC expressed regret and chastised the NUNG's for crossing the road. An investigation was instituted. At 011345H the 3d

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platoon of Company "A" received 15 rounds of small arms sniper fire at (BT 075678). Fire was returned with small arms fire. One VCS was captured. One Marine was wounded in the leg. The wound was not serious enough to require evacuation.

12. At 311630H, the battalion S-2 reported that the chief of HOA HAI Village contacted the battalion S-2 to report that comments of the villagers indicated thirty or more VC were killed during the search and destroy operation conducted 29 August in the Marble Mountain area. The village chief stated that the operation resulted in pro-government sentiments among the villagers and evident confidence in the ability of USMC forces to provide future security in the area. The report added that the village chief requested that the battalion provide security for the villagers when they harvest the rice crop beginning ten days hence, so as to deny the rice to the VC. The village chief stated that the practice in the past was for the villagers to place a portion of their crop in an open field for the VC to retrieve as a tax and therefore avoid VC reprisals. Regardless of the accuracy of the reported thirty VC KIA's - which is not an improbable total for the operation referred to - the fact that the village chief accepts this figure is in itself, important. HOA HAI Village has a population of over 3000, and has been considered VC controlled territory. If the villagers are now willing to risk possible VC reprisals by refusing to pay the usual rice tax, it would indicate a confidence and firmness heretofore lacking in this locality.

1. Reporting Unit. Ninth Marines
2. Period Covered. 021801H to 031800H September 1965
3. General Summary of Events. The Ninth Marines continues to defend south of the Danang Airbase and south of the CAU DO River. The Ninth Marines assumed defense of the Monkey Mountain joint radar site today at 031400H in relief of the 2d Infantry Division (ARVN). The Ninth Marines patrolled extensively and employed ambushes, listening posts and scout-sniper teams throughout the regimental area. One VC was killed, two wounded and six captured during this period. Three Marines were wounded in action.

a. 1st Battalion. The 1st Battalion continues to occupy positions south of the Danang Airfield and south of the CAU DO River in the southeast portion of the Regimental TAOR with one reinforced squad on Monkey Mountain at (BT 087692). During the last twenty-four hours the 1st Battalion conducted six patrols, established four ambushes and nine listening posts. Three scout-sniper teams were employed last night. The 1st Battalion sustained two WIA and one non-battle casualty during the last twenty-four hours.

b. 2d Battalion. The 2d Battalion continues to occupy defensive positions south of the CAU DO River in the southwest portion of the Regimental TAOR. One company provides security for the FLSG ammunition dump (AT 998707). Five combat patrols, two ambushes, three listening posts and three scout-sniper teams were sent out during this period. Company G had one WIA this morning. The casualty had a minor gunshot wound in the hand which did not require evacuation. Companies E and H rotated positions today so that company E now occupies defensive positions south of the CAU DO River and Company H provides security for the ammunition dump and railroad bridge and water point.

4. Activities

a. Operations

(1) 1st Battalion. The 1st Battalion continues to occupy and defend positions south of the airfield and south of the CAU DO River. One reinforced squad occupies positions on Marble Mountain at (BT 087692). The 1st Battalion also has the

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responsibility of furnishing the Division mobile reserve company. One squad relieved units of the 2d Division (ARVN) of the security for the joint radar station on Monkey Mountain at 031400H today.

(a) Company "A" occupies positions south of the CAU DO River from (BT 063695) to (BT 070700) to (BT 083697).

(b) Company "B" remains with the Battalion CP at (BT 024728) and has the responsibility for the Battalion CP and the northeast of the Battalion CP as far as NAI HIEN (BT 040748) and the area southeast of the Battalion CP as far as (BT 005709) and along the northern banks of the CAU DO River. Company "B" is also the Division Quick Reaction Company.

(c) Company "C" occupies positions south of the CAU DO River from (BT 035688) to (BT 044690) to (BT 053692). At 022030H last night a Marine from the 1st Platoon of Company "C" located in the vicinity of (BT 017684) shot himself in the right foot as a result of an accidental discharge. The wound was not serious. The wounded Marine was taken to the Battalion CP by vehicle at 022140H.

(d) Company "D" occupies positions in the vicinity of Marble Mountain from (BT 067706) to (BT 073709) to (BT 075710). Company "D" continues to provide one reinforced squad for security at the hospital site at (BT 061728). Company "D" also has one reinforced squad on Monkey Mountain at (BT 062853). At 030400H Company "D" sustained two WIAs as a result of a land mine explosion at (BT 087692). The Marines suffered multiple leg wounds and severe bleeding. The casualties were evacuated to C&C by helicopter. Their conditions were diagnosed as being good. At 031010H the 1st Platoon of Company "D" requested a fire mission on a suspected VC CP at (BT 087692). The mission was approved by the 1st Battalion Commander at 031015H and fired. Nine rounds of 81mm Mortar H.E. were fired. When the first round hit, a man was seen running from the position carrying a pair of binoculars. The F.O. with Company "D" reported that the fire for effect had excellent effect on the target. It appeared that any VC in the target area would have been wounded or killed.

(2) 2d Battalion. The 2d Battalion occupies defensive positions south of the CAU DO River. The 2d Battalion's left boundary was adjusted today and now extends to the VINH DIEN River (BT 025675). The right boundary was adjusted and now extends to the YEN River (AT 962686). Companies E, F, and G now occupy front line defensive positions while Company H provides security for the 213C ammunition dump (AT 988733) and railroad bridge and water point (AT 998707).

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(a) Company E rotated positions today with Company H. Company E front line positions extend from (AT 991676) to (BT 009676). At 022250H the 2d Platoon, which was providing security for the railroad bridge and water point (AT 998707), received three bursts of automatic weapons fire from PHONG LE BOC (AT 995709). There were no USMC casualties from the incoming fire. ARVN troops located at the bridge indicated at this time that the VC were holding a rally in PHONG LE BOC and using loudspeakers.

(b) Company F occupies front line defensive positions from (AT 977683) to (AT 988678). One squad continues to provide security for the 2d Battalion's medical station located at (AT 980686). At 022310H the security squad at the medical station received fifteen or twenty rounds of ineffective sniper fire in their positions. The snipers could not be pinpointed, therefore, fire was not returned. The company also heard voices at this time which the interpreter related as being VC saying "Marines get out", and also asking the Popular Forces to join the VC. The voices seemed to come from the CAM NE complex (AT 990690), but they could not be pinpointed.

(c) Company G adjusted their front line defensive positions today and now occupy positions from (AT 962686) to (AT 972682). Company B, 1st Battalion, 1st Marines relieved the 2d Platoon of the responsibility of the area west of the YEN River. The 2d Platoon was placed in Battalion reserve and located at (AT 974686). At 021915H the EOD team attached to Company G located and disarmed an M-16 "Bouncing Betty" mine at (AT 953672). An empty cannister was also found of type M-16 E3, lot number 48-3. At 022130H Company G CP and front lines forward of the CP received two bursts of automatic weapons fire and several sniper rounds. The fire came from CAM NE (4), (AT 969694) and from the western side of the YEN River. The fire was ineffective, and there were no USMC casualties.

(d) Company H now provides security for the FLSG ammunition dump (AT 988733) with two platoons. One reinforced platoon provides security for the railroad bridge and water point (AT 998707). At 021856H a reinforced squad was sent to (BT 008680) to set an ambush for the reported sixteen VCs going to that position. No contact was made.

(3) Fire Support. The 2dBn, 12Mar. fired five H&I missions last night expending ten rounds of 105mm HE. One adjusted mission was fired at a sniper position at (BT 083688). Fourteen rounds of 105mm HE were expended, but there were no observed casualties.

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(d) Company H conducted one patrol last night. This patrol departed from DUONG SON (2), (AT 983675) and moved south to YEN NE (1), (AT 988664). The patrol departed at 022400H and returned at 030540H. No contact was made.

c. Ambushes

(1) 1st Battalion. The 1st Battalion established four ambushes last night.

(a) Company "A" established an ambush at (BT 063678) between the hours of 022030H and 022130H without enemy contact.

(b) Company "C" established two ambushes last night. One ambush was established at (BT 039679) from 022030H to 030030. Company "C" established another ambush at (BT 024682) which stayed in position from 022300H to 030200H. Neither ambush had enemy contact.

(c) Company "D" established an ambush at (BT 088692) from 022400H to 030200H without enemy contact.

(2) 2d Battalion. The 2d Battalion sent out two ambushes last night.

(a) Company F established ambush at (AT 983662) from 022300H to 030730H. No contact was made.

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(c) Company "C" conducted one patrol during the last twenty-four hours. This patrol left the IP (BT 029691) at 022400H, covered the area in and around the hamlets of CO MAN (BT 028692) and LIEM LAC (2), (BT 025696) and returned to the IP at 030330H without enemy contact.

(d) Company "D" conducted one patrol during the last twenty-four hours which crossed the IP (BT 080695), at 022100H, covered the area of TRA LO (BT 084682) and TAN AN (BT 088689) and returned to the IP at 022400H without enemy contact.

At 030650H the patrol received small arms fire from LA BONG (2), (AT 067667). One man was WIA as a result of sniper fire. The casualty received a gunshot wound in the hand. The wound was not serious and no evacuation was required. Company G dispatched with two LVTs down the YEN River to link up with the patrol. The patrol then swept LA BONG (2), (AT 967667). No contact was made. The patrol then moved to the YEN River to embark the LVTs. From here the patrol planned to move north to LA BONG (3), (AT 963677), conduct a sweep, and then return to friendly front lines. However, the LVTs got stuck and could not proceed up the river. The patrol provided security for the LVTs until a retriever arrived. As a result the sweep of LA BONG (3) was not made and the patrol returned to Company G's positions, arriving at 031100H.

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(d) Company "D" had listening posts at (BT 065719) and (BT 082697). These ambushes stayed in position from 022000H to 030500H without enemy contact.

(2) 2d Battalion. The 2d Battalion sent out three listening posts last night.

(a) Company F had a listening post at (AT 993694) from 022300H to 030300H.

(b) Company G had a listening post at (AT 957684) from 022400H to 030700H.

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medical team from the 2d Battalion BAS treated forty-eight civilians in DUONG SON (1), (AT 997687) yesterday. Today a total of one hundred and sixty-three civilians were treated in CAM NE (2), (AT 990688). The battalion aid station treated fifty-two civilians today. The overall total was three hundred and sixty-nine civilians treated.

3. General Summary of Events. The Ninth Marines continue to occupy positions south of the Danang Airbase and south of the CAU DO River. Extensive patrols are conducted in this area, and ambushes, listening posts and scout-sniper teams are employed. One Marine was wounded in action today. There were no confirmed enemy casualties.

a. 1st Battalion. The 1st Battalion continues to occupy positions south of the Danang Airbase and south of the CAU DO River in the southeast portion of the Regimental TAOR with one reinforced squad on Monkey Mountain and one reinforced squad at hospital site at (BT 061728). During the last twenty-four hours the 1st Battalion conducted five patrols, established three ambushes and four listening posts and employed four scout-sniper teams.

b. 2d Battalion. The 2d Battalion continues to occupy defensive positions south of the CAU DO River in the southwest portion of the Regimental TAOR. One Company continues to provide security for the FLSG Ammunition Dump (AT 988733) and the railroad bridge and water point (AT 998707). Ten patrols, three ambushes, three scout-sniper teams and two listening posts were sent out during this period. Company "E" had one WIA last night while on patrol. The casualty received fragmentation wounds which were not serious.

(a) Company "E" sent out two patrols last night and three today. At 032020H a patrol was sent to MIEU DONG (2), (BT 021680). At 032000H the patrol arrived at the stream located at (BT 021679). The point element of the patrol crossed the stream and was heading north when a grenade exploded. When the grenade exploded the patrol also started receiving fire from MIEU DONG (2), (BT 021680) from an estimated seven weapons, two of which were automatic. The patrol had one WIA as a result of fragmentation from the grenade. The casualty was evacuated but his injuries were not serious. The point element which had crossed the stream, reported they had seen and fired on one individual. They felt the individual was hit but it could not be confirmed. The patrol returned at 040055H without further incident. The patrol found numerous pungee stakes along their route. At 032355H another patrol was sent from (BT 014677) north to QUANG CHAU (2), (BT 005687). The patrol moved from QUANG CHAU (2) back south to GIANG DONG (BT 005676) without making contact. The patrol returned at 040130H. Three patrols were sent out this afternoon. At 041300H a patrol departed and covered the area just south of GIANG DONG (BT 005676). This patrol is expected to return by 041600H. Another patrol was sent from DUONG SON (2), (AT 993677) south to (AT 994667), passing through DUONG SON (3), (AT 995670). 1. Reporting Unit. Ninth Marines
2. Period Covered. 041800H to 051800H September 1965
3. General Summary of Events. The Ninth Marines continue to occupy positions south of the Danang Airbase and south of the CAU DO River. Extensive patrols have been conducted in this area and listening posts, ambushes and scout-sniper teams have been employed. Three VC were captured during this period and three Marines were wounded in action.
 - a. 1st Battalion. The 1st Battalion continues to occupy positions south of the Danang Airbase and south of the CAU DO River in the southeast portion of the Regimental TAOR with one reinforced squad on Monkey Mountain at (BT 062853) and a reinforced squad at the hospital site at (BT 061728). During the last twenty-four hours the 1st Battalion dispatched five patrols, established four ambushes and five listening posts and employed three scout-sniper teams. The 1st Battalion captured three VC during this period. One Marine was wounded in action during the last twenty-four hours.
 - b. 2d Battalion. The 2d Battalion continues to occupy positions south of the CAU DO River in the southwest portion of the Regimental TAOR. The 2d Battalion continues to provide security for the FLSG Ammunition Dump (AT 988733) and railroad bridge and water point (AT 998707). Five patrols, one ambush, three listening posts and three scout-sniper teams were sent out during this period. At 050600H Company "F" moved out in mechanized column to establish a blocking position in the vicinity of (AT 995644). Company "F" executed a sweep of HA DONG (AT 997643). The sweep commenced at 050953H. At 050750H Company "F" had two WIA's as a result of harassing fire from (AT 997645). Both casualties had leg wounds and were evacuated by helicopter. No other contact was made during the morning's sweep operation of HA DONG (AT 997643).

4. Activitiesa. Operations

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(1) 1st Battalion. The 1st Battalion continues to occupy defensive positions south of the airbase and south of the CAU DO River. One reinforced squad occupies positions on Monkey Mountain at (BT 062853). One squad remains at the hospital site at (BT 061728). The 1st Battalion continues to furnish the Division Mobile Reserve Company.

(a) Company "A" continues to occupy positions south of the CAU DO River from (BT 063697) to (BT 065697) to (BT 070700). Last night at 042100H the 3d platoon of Company "A" received ten rounds of small arms fire from (BT 065695), approximately two hundred meters from their position at (BT 065697). Fire was returned with twenty rounds of small arms fire and three 40mm grenades. The enemy fire ceased immediately. No friendly casualties were sustained. Effect of the fire on the enemy position was unknown.

(b) Company "B" remains with the Battalion CP at (BT 024733) with the responsibility of conducting patrols in the area northeast of the Battalion CP as far as NAI HIEN (BT 040748) and the area southwest of the Battalion CP and along the northern bank of the CAU DO River. Company "B" is also the Division Mobile Reserve Company.

(c) Company "C" continues to occupy defensive positions south of the CAU DO River from (BT 035689) to (BT 045690) to (BT 053692). The Company CP is at (BT 045690). The 3d platoon of Company "C" captured three VC at 041715H in the vicinity of (BT 043675). The VC ran from an area where the 3d Platoon had received sixteen rounds of small arms fire earlier. The ARVN attached to the platoon questioned the VC and said they were VC arms carriers. The VC had rifle-butt bruises on their shoulders which indicated the VC had been firing a rifle. The VC were turned over to ITT at 041745H. At 051040H Company "C" received heavy sniper fire in the vicinity of (BT 042673). Ten VC were observed with one 3.5" Rocket Launcher. Fire was returned with small arms fire and the VC fled. Company "C" sustained one WIA as a result of the fire fight. No medical evacuation was needed.

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(d) Company "D" occupies defensive positions in vicinity of Marble Mountain with the Company CP at (BT 068706). Company "D" has one reinforced squad at the hospital site at (BT 061728) and one reinforced squad providing security for the joint radar station on Monkey Mountain at (BT 062853).

(2) 2d Battalion. The 2d Battalion occupies defensive positions south of the CAU DO River. Companies "E" and "G" occupy front line defensive positions while Company "F" established a blocking position in the vicinity of (AT 995644) in support of an ARVN operation to the south. Company "H" provides two platoons for security of the FLSC Ammunition Dump (AT 988733) and one platoon (reinforced) for security of engineer elements located in DUONG SON (1), (AT 997683).

(a) Company "E" continues to occupy front line defensive positions which were extended today in order to occupy the east (left) portion of the sector vacated by Company "F". Front line positions now extend from (AT 981678) to (BT 023684). At 042030H the 3d platoon, located in DUONG SON (2), (AT 994677) received a fragmentation grenade just forward of their positions at (AT 996674). The platoon also received small arms fire across their entire frontage. Several trip flares were also activated. Company "E" returned fire with small arms fire and 40mm grenades. The hostile fire came from a pagoda in DUONG SON (3), (AT 995672). Artillery illumination was requested and received. The illumination was on target, but no activity was observed. Company "E" dispatched a squad which moved into the area and checked out the pagoda. Nothing was found no further contact was made. There were no USMC casualties as a result of these activities.

(b) Company "F" occupied defensive positions from (AT 977683) to (AT 988678) until they were relieved by Company "E" early this morning. At 050600H Company "F" moved by infantry mechanized column to (AT 995644). At 050715H Company "F" commenced their sweep of HA DONG (AT 997643). At 050715H the Company had two WIA's as a result of sniper fire. The sniper fire came from (AT 997645). Both casualties had leg wounds and were evacuated by helicopter. At 050953H Company "F" completed their sweep and began consolidating positions. Company "F" will remain in blocking positions, maintain ground and air surveillance, and conduct patrols and ambushes in their assigned sector during the period 5-8 September 1965.

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(c) Company "G" continues to occupy front line defensive positions. Their front lines were adjusted today in order to occupy the West (right) portion of the sector vacated by Company "F". Front line positions now extend from (AT 962686) to (AT 982678). One squad now provides security for the 2d Battalion Medical Station and the HOA THAI Village Chief in the CAM NE Complex at (AT 980686).

(d) Company "H" continues to provide security for the FLSG ammunition dump (AT 988733) with two platoons. At 050615H the 2d platoon was relieved of the responsibility of providing security for the railroad bridge and water point (AT 998707) by a reinforced squad from H&S Company. The 2d platoon was placed in Battalion reserve and moved to DUONG SON (1), (AT 997687). The 2d Platoon also provides security for the engineer elements located in DUONG SON (1).

(3) Support Activities. Two F4B's made an airstrike at (AT 995640) at 050645H dropping twenty-four, 250lb bombs. One foot bridge was destroyed and one bunker was neutralized.

b. Patrols

(a) Company "B" conducted two patrols during the subject period. 2. Period Covered. 051800H to 061800H September 1965
3. General Summary of Events. The Ninth Marines continue to occupy positions south of the Danang Airbase and south of the CAU DO River. Enemy activity increased in the Regimental TAOR as the 1st and 2d Battalions killed six VC, wounded three and captured thirtytwo VCS. One VC was captured. There were six Marines wounded during this period. One Marine was killed.

a. 1st Battalion. The 1st Battalion continues to occupy positions south of the Danang Airbase and south of CAU DO River in the southeast portion of the Regimental TAOR. One reinforced squad remains on Monkey Mountain at (BT 062853). One reinforced squad provides security for MCB-9 at the hospital site at (BT 061728). During the last twenty-four hours the 1st Battalion conducted eight patrols, established three ambushes and three listening posts and employed three scout-sniper teams. During this reporting period the 1st Battalion captured thirty VCS, killed five VC and wounded three. Five Marines were wounded today. One VC was captured.

b. 2d Battalion. The 2d Battalion continues to occupy defensive positions south of the CAU DO River. The 2d Battalion continues to provide security for the FLSC ammunition dump (AT 988733) and railroad bridge and water point (AT 998707). Eleven patrols, two listening posts and three scout-sniper teams were sent out last night. At 052215H Company "E" had a non-battle casualty as a result of an accidental discharge. The casualty shot himself in the left foot. He was helicopter evacuated. Company "E" also had one WIA as a result of fragmentation from two grenades which were thrown into their position. The casualty was not wounded seriously and did not require evacuation. At 061150H a patrol from

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Company "G" returned fire on VC snipers killing one at (AT 976675). The body was recovered. The VC had one grenade, a cartridge belt, first aid packet, 7.62mm ammunition, cleaning gear, toothbrush, wallet, letters, raincoat, ditty bag and Ho Chi Mien sandals in his possession. The 1st Battalion is also responsible for furnishing the Division Mobile Reserve Company.

(a) Company "A" continues to occupy positions south from the CAU DO River (BT 063697) to (BT 055697) to (BT 070700). Last night at 052235H the company reported the apprehension of five VCS near (BT 073693).

(b) Company "B" remains the Battalion CP at (BT 024733) with the responsibility of conducting patrols in the area northeast of the Battalion CP as far as NAI HIEN (BT 040748) and to the southwest of the Battalion CP and along the north bank of the CAU DO River. Company "B" is the Division Mobile Reserve Company.

(c) Company "C" continues to occupy defensive positions south of the CAU DO River from (BT 035689) to (BT 045690) to (BT 053692). The Company CP is located at (BT 045690). At 061000H the company surprised approximately twelve VC near (BT 044675) and (BT 038673). Company "C" reported killing one VC and wounding two. A platoon commander saw the dead VC and observed two other wounded VC being dragged away.

(a) Company "E" continues to occupy front line defensive positions from (AT 981678) to (BT 023684). The 3d platoon is in the vicinity of YEN NE (3); (AT 985678); 2d platoon in the vicinity of DUONG SON (2); (AT 993677); one squad from the 1st platoon is in the vicinity of GIANG DONG (BT 008677) and two squads from the 1st platoon are in the vicinity of LIEM LAC (1); (BT 024684). At 060320H the 3d platoon located in the vicinity of YEN NE (3); (AT 985678) had two grenades thrown near their right flank positions (AT 980680). There was one WIA as a result of fragments. The casualty was not seriously wounded and did not require evacuation. Company "E" returned fire with small arms, but there were no confirmed hits.

(b) Company "F" continues to occupy blocking positions in the vicinity of HA DONG (AT 996644). Front line positions extend from (AT 994644) to (BT 004647). At 051833H three rounds of sniper fire was received from (AT 991638). The sniper fire was ineffective and no fire was returned. Sporadic sniper fire was received throughout the remainder of the night from the vicinity of BICH NAM (1); (AT 996635). The sniper fire was ineffective so there were no USMC casualties.

(c) Company "G" continues to occupy front line defensive positions from (AT 962686) to (AT 982678). One squad provides security for the 2d Battalion Medical Station and the HOA THAI village chief in the CAM NE Complex at (AT 980686). At 051915H Company "G" received two rounds of sniper fire from (AT 997678). No fire was returned. At 060045H the 2d squad, 3d platoon located at (AT 980687) received an estimated one hundred rounds of small arms fire from (AT 981687). The small arms fire was preceded by a grenade explosion. The squad leader estimated there were six firing positions and four automatic weapons. The area was illuminated and fire was returned. The enemy fire then ceased. There were no USMC casualties.

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(d) Company "H" continues to provide security for the FLSG ammunition dump at (AT 988733) with two platoons. One platoon remains in Battalion Reserve and provides security for the Engineer elements located in DUONG SON (1), (AT 997687).

b. Patrols

(1) 1st Battalion. The 1st Battalion conducted eight patrols during the last twenty-four hours.

(a) Company "A" conducted two patrols. One patrol, Redwood Alpha Homer 5, departed the IP (BT 072699) at 051900H and patrolled southeast to (BT 070688), then to the north of XAUN TRA (BT 067694) and returned at 060100H to the IP. Company "A" (-) (Rein) is conducting a patrol today. The column on the right received sniper fire in grid square (BT 0766). The column on the left made contact with the VC at (BT 084674) at 061000H while moving along the east bank of CAM BIN River. They sustained three WIA's and reported wounding one VC who was evacuated. At 061030H Company "A" (-) (Rein) was ordered to move to (BT 063663) where Company "D", 3d Recon Battalion had sighted fifteen VC. Subsequently Company "A" (-) (Rein) has reported capturing thirty VCS killing four VC. Details of this action is not known at this time, One Marine was wounded.

(b) Company "B" conducted three patrols in the past twenty-four hours. Redwood Bravo Homer 19 departed the IP (BT 023732) at 052000H and moved North to BINH THUAN (BT 030751) and to CON HAB (BT 034756) and then south to (BT 038744) and returned to the IP at 052400H. Redwood Bravo Homer 23 departed the IP (BT 023732) at 052400H and moved south to (BT 005715) and covered the hamlet of BINH HOA (BT 027731) and returned to the IP at 060800H. There was no enemy contact. Redwood Bravo Homer 6A departed the IP (BT 023732) and followed the trace of (BT 022746), (BT 031749), (BT 030735) and (BT 020725) and returned to the IP at 061130H.

(c) Company "C" sent out two patrols. Redwood Charlie One A reinforced with LVTP-5's and tanks patrolled the hamlets of HOI AN (BT 058677) and KHAY TAY (1), (BT 049686) and returned to the IP at 061230H. Redwood

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Charlie Two A reinforced with tanks and LVTP-5's departed at 060900H and patrolled to THI AN (BT 040673) TU CAM (BT 043662), and KHAY TAY (2), (BT 050677) and returned to the IP at 061230H. This patrol surprised approximately twelve VC at 061000H between (BT 044675) and (BT 038673). The patrol pursued with the LVTP-5's. One VC was killed, two VC were wounded and three VC were captured. One Marine was wounded.

(2) 2d Battalion. The 2d Battalion conducted eleven patrols during this period.

(a) Company "E" conducted three patrols during this period. Last night a patrol was sent from DUONG SON (2), (AT 993676) south around DUONG SON (3), (AT 994670). This patrol departed at 052000H and returned at 060336H without making contact. Two patrols were conducted today. One patrol was sent from DUONG SON (2), (AT 993676) south to YEN NE (1), (AT 987665). This patrol departed at 060900H. At 060915H as the patrol neared check point #1, (AT 989670), farmers working in the nearby rice paddies broke and ran. The patrol continued along its route and returned at 061045H without further incident. The other patrol dispatched today departed from YEN NE (3), (AT 981680) and moved south to YEN NE (1), (AT 986664). This patrol departed at 060920H and returned at 061220H. At 061515H the patrol was taken under fire by an estimated squad of VC located in LA BONG (2), (BT 967667). A fire fight followed and one Marine was WIA. The casualty was evacuated by helicopter. The patrol was expected to return by 061700H.

3. General Summary of Events. The Ninth Marines continue to occupy positions south of the Danang Airbase and south of the CAU DO River. There were no friendly casualties during this period. One VC was killed.

a. 1st Battalion. The 1st Battalion continues to occupy positions south of the Danang Airbase and south of the CAU DO River in the southeast portion of the Regimental TACR. One reinforced squad provide security for MCB-9 at the hospital site at (BT 061728). One reinforced squad is on Monkey Mountain to provide security for joint radar site at (BT 062853). One squad provides security for the Battalion's supply point at (BT 071708). One squad provides security for the bridge at (BT 071700). In addition the 1st Battalion mans two OP's at (BT 075710) and at (BT 069705). During the past twenty-four hours the 1st Battalion conducted seven patrols, three listening posts and two ambushes. Comcoany "G" reinforced with five Amtracs, three tanks and two Ontos conducted a search and destroy operation today in the area of KHAI TAY (3), (BT 048639). There were no friendly casualties today in the 1st Battalion. There were no confirmed VC casualties.

b. 2d Battalion. The 2d Battalion continues to occupy defensive positions south of the CAU DO River and provide security for the FLSG ammunition dump (AT 988733) and railroad bridge and water point (AT 998707). Seven patrols, four ambushes, five listening posts and two scout-sniper teams were sent out during this period. At 070100H as the Echo Alpha One patrol was departing their ambush position (BT 024690), four or five sniper rounds were received from CO M.N (BT 026690). At 071220H a patrol from Company "F" received approximately twenty rounds of small arms fire from (AT 965640). The patrol returned fire and continued on their planned route. There were no USMC casualties.

(c) Company "G" continues to occupy front line defensive positions from (AT 962686) to (AT 982678). At 061910H a daylight patrol returning to Company "G" positions received one round of sniper fire at (AT 977673). The patrol saw one man run after the round was fired and opened fire on him. The man was hit and the patrol advanced to retrieve the body. The patrol, on reaching the man, administered first aid and was returning the man to friendly positions for medical evacuation when the man died. 3. General Summary of Events.

a. 1st Battalion. The 1st Battalion continues to occupy positions south of the Danang Airbase and south of the CAU DO River and provides security for the joint radar site on Monkey Mountain at (BT 002853) for the hospital site at (BT 061728), for the bridge and water point at (BT 071700), and for the Battalion supply point at (BT 071708). Two OP's are manned twenty-four hours a day at (BT 075710) and (BT 069705). In addition to aggressively conducting patrols, ambushes, listening posts and scout-sniper teams, The 1st Battalion is conducting Operation Golden Fleece in order to protect the villagers and to provide security for the rice harvest. As part of Operation Golden Fleece, the 1st Platoon Company "D" departed on a two day patrol today at 080600H. One Marine was wounded today. One enemy grenade and one AT mine was destroyed.

b. 2d Battalion. 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4. Activitiesa. Operations(1) 1st Battalion

(a) Company "A" continues to occupy positions from (BT 063697) to (BT 055697) to (BT 070700). Company "A" (-) reinforced with two M-50 Ontos, five tanks and five Amtracs departed on patrol this morning at 080600H. This patrol is part of Operation Golden Fleece the mission of which is to protect from the VC the villagers who are harvesting. At 080920H the patrol reported that approximately fifty civilians were massing in grid square (BT 0767). They were apparently protesting the patrol moving through the rice fields. The patrol avoided the crowd and continued along existing paths. At 081055H Company "A" (-) received small arms fire from (BT 084692). Three tanks and two rifle squads maneuvered to the enemy position, but the enemy broke contact. One Marine was wounded superficially. A Vietnamese civilian was wounded during this action and was helo evacuated to C&C. At 080730H the 2d platoon destroyed one Chi Com type frag grenade at (BT 081667) and at 080800H the 2d platoon destroyed what was reported to be an AT mine at (BT 080668).

(b) Company "B" remains at the Battalion CP at (BT 024733) with responsibility of conducting patrols in the area northeast of the Battalion CP to the vicinity of NAI HIEN (BT 040748) and southwest of the Battalion CP and along north bank of the CAU DO River. Company "B" is the Division Mobile Reserve Company.

(c) Company "C" continues to occupy positions from (BT 035689) to (BT 045690) to (BT 053692) and patrols aggressively in their sector. The Company CP is at (BT 045690).

(d) Company "D" occupies defensive positions in vicinity of Marble Mountain with the Company CP at (BT 068706). The Company has one reinforced squad providing security at the hospital site (BT 061728), one reinforced squad at the joint radar station on Monket Mountain at (BT 062853), one squad at the recently constructed bridge and water point at (BT 071700), and mans two OP's at (BT 075710) and (BT 069705).

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(2) 2d Battalion

(a) Company "E" continues to occupy front line positions. Front line positions were adjusted today and now extend from (AT 991677) to (BT 023684).

(b) Company "F" returned from HA DONG (AT 969664) today and now occupies front line positions in the vicinity of YEN NE (3), (AT 982678). At 072210H Company "F" received six 60mm mortar rounds from the vicinity of (BT 003634). Two Marines were WIA's as a result of fragmentation from the incoming mortar rounds. One WIA was from the 1st AmTrac Battalion and was evacuated by helicopter. The other casualty did not require evacuation. At 081300H Company "F" had another WIA from an anti-personnel mine at (AT 987664). The casualty received fragmentation wounds in both legs. His wounds were not serious, but he was evacuated by vehicle to the 2d Battalion BAS.

(c) Company "G" occupies front line positions from (AT 959683) to (AT 971684). At 072050H the 1st platoon at (AT 959683) received one round of sniper fire from the vicinity of (AT 957684). At 080015H the security squad located at the 2d Battalion Medical Station (AT 980687) received two rounds of small arms fire and a five round burst from an automatic weapon. The squad returned fire with fifteen to twenty small arms rounds and one fragmentation grenade. The sniper fire came from the vicinity of (AT 978687). At 081230H the Golf Papa 1 patrol received three rounds of small arms fire from (AT 973675). At 081230H small arms fire was received from LA SON (1), (AT 980660). The sniper fire was ineffective.

a. 1st Battalion. The 1st Battalion continues to occupy positions south of the Danang Airbase and south of the CAU DO River and provides security for the joint radar site on Monkey Mountain at (BT 002853) for the hospital site at (BT 061728) for the bridge and water point at (BT 071700), and for the Battalion supply point at (BT 071708). Two OP's are manned twenty-four hours a day at (BT 075710) and (BT 069705). In addition to aggressively conducting patrols ambushes, listening posts and scout-sniper teams, the 1st Battalion is conducting Operation Golden Fleece in order to protect the villagers and to provide security for the rice harvest. At 091600H Company "A" (Rein) began moving to (BT 079690) and (BT 099671) to find and engage a VC Battalion reported to be in that area. Four Marines and one ARVN soldier were wounded today. One ARVN soldier was killed today. One VC was killed.

b. 2d Battalion. The 2d Battalion continues to occupy positions south of the CAU DO River and provide security for the FLSG ammunition dump (AT 988733) and railroad bridge and water point (AT 998707). Four patrols, one ambush, six listening posts and two scout-sniper teams were sent out during this period. Company "E" conducted a search and clear operation in YEN NE (4), (AT 974677) and LA BONG (3), (AT 963677). This operation commenced this morning at 090625H when Company "E" crossed the LOD. By 091025H both Villages had been cleared and plans were made to go back through the villages to destroy VC trenches, fighting holes and emplacements. Two Marines were WIA as a result of this morning's operation. One WIA was a attachment from Engineers. Both casualties were evacuated by helicopter. The initial sweep resulted in twelve VCS.

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4. Activitiesa. Operations(1) 1st Battalion

(a) Company "A" continues to occupy positions from (BT 063697) to (BT 955697) to (BT 070700). As part of Operation "Golden Fleece", the Company is providing protection for the civilians harvesting rice in grid square (BT 0666) with mobile patrols. (b) Company "B" remains at the Battalion CP at (BT 024733) with the responsibility of conducting patrols in the area southwest of the Battalion and along the north bank of CAU DO River and northeast to vicinity of NAI HIEN (BT 040748). Company "B" is the Division Mobile Reserve. Company "B" has two platoons on alert to be employed by heli-lift if Company "A" (Rein) should become engaged during their present operation.

(c) Company "C" relieved Company "D" this afternoon of defensive positions in vicinity of Marble Mountain at 091600H. The Company CP will be at (BT 068706). The company will have one reinforced squad providing security for the radar site on Monkey Mountain (BT 062853), one reinforced squad providing security at the hospital site (BT 061728), one squad at the bridge and water point at (BT 071700) and will man two OP's at (BT 075710) and at (BT 069705).

(d) Company "D". The 1st platoon patrol about 081730H was entering the hamlet of KHUE DONG (1), (BT 057707), when the patrol received seventy rounds of small arms fire

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from (BT 057701). A squad was sent to clear the area from (BT 057710) to (BT 954710). b. 2d Battalion. The 2d Battalion continues to occupy positions south of the CAU DO River and provide security for the FLSG ammunition dump (AT 988733) and railroad bridge and water point (AT 998707). Seven patrols, three ambushes, four listening posts and three scout-sniper teams were sent out during this period. One platoon (reinforced) conducted a search and clear operation in QUA GIANG (2), (BT 003668). This operation commenced this morning at 100630H when the 3d platoon crossed the LOD. The sweep was completed at 100905H and resulted in one VCS captured. One Marine was WIA, one VC KIA and one VCC captured during this period.

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4. Activitiesa. Operations(1) 1st Battalion

(a) Yesterday at 091600H Company "A", reinforced with two platoons from Company "C", four tanks and four Ontos, attacked to the south to an area between (BT 083670) and (BT 085660) and the hamlet of CAU HA (2), (BT 086667). At 091710H, Company "A" received heavy small arms fire from the vicinity of (BT 080678) and at 091715H they began receiving heavy automatic and machine gun fire from (BT 080678) and incoming 81mm mortar fire and possibly larger caliber mortar or artillery fire. By 091720H the mortar fire ceased and the small arms fire subsided. The Company and attachments suffered three KIA's and eight WIA's. One machine gun was destroyed by mortar fire. Most of the casualties were sustained from the mortar barrage in the vicinity of (BT 080678). The Company "A" found large amounts of cut rice in the objective area but could not recover it. Two VC were killed and twenty-two were wounded. Seven VCS were turned over to ITT. At 091900H Company "A" began moving back to the LOD and were back to their positions at 092300H. Company "A" continues to occupy positions from (BT 063697) to (BT 995697) to (BT 070700). The Company continues to provide protection for the villagers during the rice harvest.

(b) Company "B". One reinforced platoon was heli-lifted from the Battalion CP to the vicinity of Marble Mountain at 091730H to be available as reinforcements for Companies "A" and "D". Two squads of the platoon remained at (BT 065695) to reinforce 1st platoon Company "A", and one reinforced squad was assigned to supplement the defense of the bridge and water point at (BT 071701). This platoon now remains in these positions.

(c) Company "C" continues to occupy defensive positions in the vicinity of Marble Mountain. The Company CP is located at (BT 068706). The Company provides one reinforced squad for security of the radar station on MON KY Mountain at (BT 062853), one reinforced squad at the hospital site at (BT 061728), one reinforced squad at the bridge and water point at (BT 071700) and mans two OP's at (BT 075710) and at (BT 069705). During last night's search and destroy operation, Company "C" provided two platoons to reinforce Company "A". Elements of Company "C" sustained two WIA's during the operation.

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(d) Company "D" occupies defensive positions from (BT 035689) to (BT 045690) to (BT 053692). The Company CP is at (BT 045690). During yesterday's search and destroy operation the company, less 3d platoon, which remained to hold the hamlet of MAN QUAN (1), (BT 033687) was the blocking force located in the vicinity of (BT 078670) and (BT 070666). At approximately 091700H the company reported receiving heavy volume of small arms fire from the vicinity of the hamlet of TRA KHE (3), (BT 070670). Company "D" and attachments sustained two WIA's.

(2) 2d Battalion

(a) Company "E" continues to occupy front line positions from (AT 990676) to (BT 026684). Blocking positions were established this morning in the vicinity of their front lines in support of the search and clear operation in QUA GIANG (2), (BT 003668).

(b) Company "F" continues to occupy front line positions from (AT 975663) to (AT 988678). At 091955H they received one round of sniper fire from YEN NE (4), (AT 977676).

(c) Company "G" continues to occupy front line positions from (AT 959683) to (AT 972684). The 3d platoon (reinforced) crossed the LOD at 100630H today in a search and clear operation of QUA GIANG (2), (BT 003668). The search and clear operation was completed at 100905H. There was no contact with the VC. Tunnels, fortifications and a limited number of pungee stakes were destroyed. No booby traps were discovered. The operation resulted in one VC (confirmed) captured. He was turned in to ITT. At 091910H Company "G" received four rounds of small arms fire from CAM NE (6), (AT 974685). The sniper fire was returned with small arms fire. There were no USMC casualties and no confirmed VC casualties.

(d) Company "H" continues to provide security for the FLSG ammunition dump (AT 988733) with two platoons and the railroad bridge and water point (AT 998707) with one platoon (-). One squad provides security for the Engineer elements located in DUONG SON (1), (AT 997687). At 100200H a two man local security patrol was moving along a trail at (AT 998688) inside DUONG SON (1) when they met a VC moving along the trail in their direction. Immediate identification could not be made, therefore, the two Marines quickly deployed to either side of the trail. As the VC approached one Marine shouted "Halt". The VC responded by

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dropping to one knee and firing eight to ten rounds from his Chinese made light machine gun. One Marine received a gunshot wound in the shoulder. The Marines returned fire with some twenty rounds from an automatic rifle and killed the VC. The Marine WIA was evacuated by helicopter. A fire team patrol was dispatched to recover the VC body. The dead VC's weapon and cartridge belt were confiscated and returned to the 2d Battalion S-2. Local villagers claimed the VC body this morning.

(3) The 3d Battalion, 3d Marines began landing in the southern portion of the Regimental TAOR at 101515H and will take up blocking positions in support of an ARVN operation taking place to the south. No enemy contact.

(4) Fire Support. The 2d Battalion, 12th Marines fired one hundred and eleven H&I missions expending two hundred and twenty-two rounds of 105mm HE. The following missions were fired:

3. General Summary of Events.

a. 1st Battalion. Company "A" reinforced with two platoons of Company "C", five tanks, two ontos, and ten LVTP-5's and Company "D" reinforced with four LVTP-5's conducted a search and destroy operation in the southern portion of the Battalion TAOR. As a result of today's action 1st Battalion sustained three WIA. VC casualties were five WIA. The Battalion continues to occupy positions south of the Danang Airbase and south of the CAU DO River and provides security for the hospital site at (BT 061728), for the bridge and water point at (BT 071700), the radar station on MON KY Mountain at (BT 061728) and the Battalion supply point at (BT 071708). Two OP's are manned at (BT 075710) and (BT 069705).

b. 2d Battalion. The 2d Battalion continues to occupy positions south of the CAU DO River and provide security for the FLSC ammunition dump (AT 988733) and railroad bridge and water point (AT 998707). Nine combat patrols, eight Golden Fleece patrols, four ambushes, five listening posts and three scout-sniper teams were sent out during this period. Company "M", 3d Battalion, 4th Marines came under operational control of the 2d Battalion, 9th Marines today. A daylight patrol from Company "F" was hit this morning at (AT 974662). As a result one Marine was KIA and four Marines were WIA. At 101750H one man from the 81mm mortar platoon was killed as a result of an accidental discharge from a .45. caliber pistol. One VC was killed by the patrol from Company "F" this morning. (See late entry for details).

c. 3d Battalion, 3d Marines. Began landing at (AT 969619) at 101515H. All Companies were in position by 102058H. The Battalion received occasional sniper fire during the night. 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4. Activitiesa. Operations(1) 1st Battalion

(a) At 110800H Company "A" reinforced with two platoons of Company "C", five tanks, two ontos and ten LVTP-5's crossed the LOD (BT 083708) and moved in an armored column to (BT 100674). At 110935H the company received ten rounds of automatic weapons fire from the vicinity of (BT 087679). At 111120H Company "A" reported sustaining three WIA as a result of a booby-trapped gate in the vicinity of (BT 080680). At 111300H elements of Company "A" were in a fire fight at (BT 091669). Details of the engagement are not presently known. (See late Entries)

(b) Company "B" (-) provides security for the 1st Battalion CP (rear) at (BT 024733). The 1st platoon at (BT 068697) with responsibility for securing the surrounding area until relieved by Company "A". At 111000H the 1st platoon saw fifteen males in a rice paddy near AN TRA (2), (BT 084695). A patrol was sent to the area. As the patrol approached, the men ran towards a tree line. The men were told to halt, but continued to run. The patrol then opened fire. Five of the men were hit by the fire. The patrol came under small arms fire and could not retrieve the VC casualties.

(c) Company "C" provided two platoons to reinforce Company "A" in today's search and destroy operation. The company provides one reinforced squad for security of the radar site on MON KY Mountain (BT 062853), one reinforced squad at the hospital site at (BT 061728), one reinforced squad at bridge and water point at (BT 071700) and mans two OP's at (BT 075710) and at (BT 069705).

(d) At approximately 110830H Company "D" (-) reinforced with two tanks and four LVTP-5's moved to (BT 073669) and established a blocking position at this point. One platoon (rein) moved to vicinity of KHA TAY (3) and established a platoon patrol base at (BT 053667).

(2) 2d Battalion

(a) Company "E" continues to occupy front line positions from (AT 990676) to (BT 026684).

(b) Company "F" continues to occupy front line positions from (AT 975663) to (AT 988678). One squad provides security for the 2d Battalion medical station at (AT 980686). At 102340H the security squad at the medical station had four grenades thrown into their positions. Fire was returned with 40mm and small arms. One Marine was KIA and four Marines were WIA before contact was broken. The KIA and three of the WIA were evacuated by helicopter. The patrol returned at 111300H with a report of VC activity in the area of the patrol in a rice paddy. (See late entries)

(c) Company "G" continues to occupy front line positions from (AT 959683) to (AT 972684). At 101840H five or six rounds of small arms fire was received from CAM NE (6), (AT 974684). The harassing fire was ineffective and fire was not returned. At 102300H small arms fire was again received from CAM NE (6). At 102305H a scout-sniper team located at (AT 972686) spotted a man running across a rice paddy and opened fire on him. Soon thereafter the scout-sniper team was taken under fire and withdrew to their front line positions. There was no confirmation as to whether or not the man was hit.

(d) Company "H" continues to provide security for the FLSC ammunition dump (AT 988733) with two platoons and the railroad bridge and water point (AT 998707) with one platoon (-). One squad provides security for the Engineer elements located in DUONG SON (1), (AT 997667).

(3) 3d Battalion, 3d Marines. Began landing yesterday at 101515H at (AT 969619). All units were in position at 102058H. At 102105H one man was KIA by mine believed to be an artillery shell buried in the ground and booby trapped. At 102337H the Battalion received small arms fire. At 110110H Company "M" received four rounds of sniper fire and returned the fire. At 110540H mine exploded in the Battalion CP area at (AT 973620). One man was wounded by small arms fire at (BT 108660), and the other two men were wounded by fragments from a booby trap at (BT 084684). All three were wounded at approximately the same time, 111120H.

b. At approximately 110800H, as the patrol from Company F was evacuating friendly casualties, they spotted a VC in a rice field at (AT 983664). He was armed with a sub-machine gun. The patrol opened fire on the VC hitting him the leg and knocking him down. He got up and ran. The patrol, after chasing him some three hundred yards, again fired and shot him in the head. The VC weapon could not be found. He is believed to have discarded it during the chase. The body and ten papers were recovered.

a. 1st Battalion. At 120221H Company "A" received five 81mm mortar rounds at (BT 095673) which killed one Marine and wounded seven. One ARVN soldier was wounded. The Redwood Bravo patrol apprehended one VCC at (BT 090694) and one VCS at (BT 085700). At 121345H the 1st platoon Company "B" fired upon three VC at (BT 083677) killing one and wounding another. The wounded man was captured, but the third man got away. A Russian made weapon was captured during this engagement. At 121320H the 3d platoon Company "A" patrol detonated an anti personnel booby trap at (BT 095655). Two Marines were wounded and one ARVN soldier was wounded.

b. 2d Battalion. The 2d Battalion continues to occupy positions south of the CAU DO River and provides security for the FLSG ammunition dump (AT 988733) and railroad bridge and water point (AT 998707). Eight combat patrols, eight Golden Fleece patrols, and two scout-sniper teams were sent out during this period. Company "M", 3d Battalion, 4th Marines relieved Company "H" of the responsibility of the security for the FLSG ammunition dump and railroad bridge and water point today. Last night a patrol from Company F killed two VC and captured one in CAM NE (1), (AT 985693). Four VCS were brought in by a patrol from Company "F" this morning. At 112200H Redwood Bravo patrol captured one VC at (BT 090694). The man confesses to be a VC tax collector in the village of HOA HAI. At 120330H a VCS was apprehended at (BT 085700). Both men were turned over to ITT at 121030H. At 121345H, the 1st platoon fired at three VC at (BT 083677), killing one and wounding one. The third man escaped. The wounded man was apprehended along with one weapon.

(c) Company "C" provides one reinforced squad for the security of the radar site and water point on MON KY Mountain (BT 062853), one reinforced squad at the hospital site at (BT 061728) one reinforced squad at the bridge and water point at (BT 071700) and mans two OP's at (BT 075710) and at (BT 069705).

(d) Company "D" provides security for the rice harvest today. At 121200H the company moved its CP to (BT 048668). The 1st platoon is located at (BT 048668). The 2d platoon is located at (BT 045686). The 3d platoon is located at (BT 072669) vicinity of TRA KHE (3).

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(2) 2d Battalion

(a) Company "E" continues to occupy front line positions from (AT 990676) to (BT 026684). Echo Alpha 2 patrol which covered the area between NHON THO (1), (BT 002663) and YEN NE (1), (AT 988665) returned this morning with four VCS.

(b) Company "F" continues to occupy front line positions from (AT 975683) to (AT 988678). One squad provides security for the 2d Battalion Medical Station at (AT 980686). At 112154H small arms fire was received from YEN NE (3), (AT 981679). At 112306H Foxtrot Papa 2 patrol made contact with the VC in CAM NE (1), at (AT 985683). One VC was captured with two grenades and 30 caliber ammunition in his possession. Later a man carrying a weapon was challenged and when he attempted to fire, was shot by a Marine from a distance of about four feet. The point of the patrol was fired upon by an automatic weapon. The Marine on the point returned fire and hit a man at about ten meters distance. The patrol returned with the one VC captured. Company "F" then dispatched a second patrol to recover the VC bodies. This patrol departed at 120050H. They found the body of one VC which had been stripped of all gear. Foxtrot Papa 2 patrol reported that the two VC they fired on were killed.

(c) Company "G" continues to occupy front line positions from (AT 959683) to (AT 972684). At 120035H Golf Papa 1 patrol received four rounds of small arms fire at (AT 966664). They returned fire but the effect is unknown. There were no USMC casualties.

(d) Company "H" continued to provide security for the FLSG ammunition dump (AT 988733) and railroad bridge and water point (AT 998707) until this morning when they were relieved by Company "M", 3d Battalion, 4th Marines. At 112330H the 3d platoon, which was the security platoon for the railroad bridge and water point (AT 998707), received approximately fifteen rounds of small arms fire from the north, east and west of their positions. No fire was returned as the firing positions could not be pinpointed. There were no USMC casualties. At 112255H the security squad located in DUONG SON (1), (AT 997687) fired two rounds of 40mm and small arms at movement in the rice paddy to the east of DUONG SON (1). It is unknown if the fire was effective.

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(3) 3d Battalion, 3d Marines. Continued to occupy a blocking position on Hill 55, (AT 970621) and patrolled extensively in the southern portion of the Regimental TAO. Yesterday at 111911H Kilo Company patrol returned and reported their activities for the period 111330H to 111911H. The patrol received sniper fire from (AT 972636). Near (AT 970644) the patrol made contact with a Viet Cong unit which included a 60mm mortar crew. Two VC were killed (body count) and an additional eight were probably killed. The VC bodies were left where they fell. Two Marines were WIA. The report added that the remaining members of the VC mortar crew were observed fleeing with one 60mm mortar tube. As the patrol continued to friendly lines, it received small arms fire from a building in the vicinity of (AT 986629). The patrol returned fire with a machine gun. The building burned and there was a secondary explosion which silenced the enemy fire. This morning a platoon of Whiskey Battery, 1st Battalion, 12th Marines came under OPCON of the Ninth Marines and was attached to the 3d Battalion, 3d Marines. The mortar platoon began helilifting to the 3d Battalion positions at 121115H. At 120847H at (AT 963629) Company "I" captured two VCS after flushing them from a cave with signal, smoke grenades. At 120905 Company "M" patrol received small arms fire from (AT 957648). At 121031H one man from Company "I" patrol was wounded critically. He was shot in the head by small arms fire in the vicinity of (AT 988626) which came from the south of the BAU XAU River. 3d Battalion was given permission to cross the river if necessary.

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8. Plans

a. 1st Battalion. The 1st Battalion will continue to occupy positions south of the Danang Airbase and south of the CLU DO River. The Battalion will continue to provide security for the radar site on MON KY Mountain at (BT 061728), for the Battalion supply point at (BT 071708), for the bridge and water point at (BT 061728) and for the hospital site at (BT 061728). d. Headquarters, 9th Marines - 48 civilians received medical treatment at YEN BOC (AT 986703).

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

3. General Summary of Events

a., 1st Battalion. Companies "A" and "D" conducted a clearing operation in the area south of Marble Mountain today as part of Operation Rice Straw. There was no contact with VC forces during this period, but there was one VC initiated incident during the clearing operation. Over four hundred civilians, who had been picked up during the clearing operation, were taken to the collection point and screened by the village chief. One was identified as a VCC and fifteen are being held as VCS. Two Marines were WIA during the operation by a booby-trapped grenade.

b. 2d Battalion. The 2d Battalion conducted one company size operation today as Company "H" cleared and now holds LE SON (1), (AT 980660) and YEN NE (1), (AT 987664). All other units held their previous positions. There were five enemy initiated incidents during this period and one contact with a small enemy force. One VC was KIA and one VCS was apprehended during this period. USMC casualties were one KIA (Company "C", 3d Engineer Battalion), two WIA (non-evacuees) and one non-battle casualty (Company "C", 3d Engineer Battalion).

c. 3d Battalion, 3d Marines. Sniper fire was received throughout the day by the 3d Battalion patrols. There were two engagements with small enemy forces. One enemy grenade booby-trap was destroyed and a jar containing medical supplies was captured. Two Marines were wounded today, one critically.

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4. Activitiesa. Operations

(1) 1st Battalion. As part of Operation "Rice Straw" the 1st Battalion used Company "A" and Company "D" to clear the rice fields in the area south of Marble Mountain. By 131400H four hundred civilians had been taken to the civilian collection point at (BT 072698). The village chief identified four of these as VCS.

(a) Company "A" participated in clearing operation south of Marble Mountain. At 130835H, Company "A" deployed of the LOD (BT 060665) to (BT 097669) and moved north clearing the rice fields of civilians. The civilians were moved by LVT to the collection point. One hundred and fifty civilians were apprehended by Company "A". The LOA was reached at 131240H. Tonight the Company will occupy positions near TRA KHE (1), (BT 091671).

(b) Company "B" (-) provides security for the Battalion CP (rear) at (BT 024733). The 1st platoon, reinforced with two M-50 Ontos, occupied a blocking position at (BT 070701) in support of Companies "A" and "D" who were clearing the rice fields to the south,

(c) Company "C" provides one reinforced squad for the security of the radar site and water point on MON KY Mountain (BT 062853), one reinforced squad at the bridge and water point (BT 071700), one reinforced squad at the hospital site at (BT 061728) and mans two OP's at (BT 075710) and (BT 069705).

(d) Company "D" crossed the LOD (BT 060665) to (BT 097669) on the left flank and moved to the LOA (BT 051701) to (BT 065697) clearing the rice fields of civilians. Two hundred and fifty civilians were apprehended and taken to the collection point. At 131004H the Company sustained two WIA near (BT 077672) from a land mine. The LOA was reached at 131240H and the 1st and 3d platoons began clearing to the south moving to KHAI TAY (3), (BT 047667), where they will establish a company base camp tonight.

(2) 2d Battalion

(a) Company "E" continues to occupy front line positions from (AT 990676) to (BT 026684). At 122355H the Echo Alpha III ambush at (BT 003673) observed one man carrying a weapon. The patrol fired upon and hit the man. The

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patrol then advanced to retrieve the body. As they approached the body, they received fire from QUA GIANG (2), (BT 003669). The VC fire prevented the patrol from retrieving the body. They advanced close enough to observe the body and reported the man was dead. One Marine was WIA. His wound was minor, however, and did not require evacuation. At 130830H Echo Golden Fleece II patrol returned with one VCS.

(b) At 121947H Company "F" reported having established a perimeter defense around YEN NE (2), (AT 985683), having been relieved by Company "H" of their front line positions. This morning Company "F" moved back into their old positions from (AT 975683) to (AT 988678). One squad provides security for the 2d Battalion Aid Station at (AT 980686). At 130137H the 3d platoon (-) had a grenade thrown in their positions at (AT 985684). One Marine was WIA from fragmentations. His wound was minor and did not require evacuation. It could not be determined where the grenade was thrown from.

(c) Company "G" continues to occupy front line positions from (AT 961685) to (AT 973683). At 130230H Golf Papa II patrol received three rounds of small arms fire at (AT 977688). At 130308H ten additional rounds of small arms fire were received from the vicinity of LA BONG (2), (AT 968668). At 130250H Company "G" received small arms fire across their left flank positions (AT 972683). The fire came from the southeast from the vicinity of YEN NE (4), (AT 972677). There were no USMC casualties.

(d) Company "H". At 121947H the 2d Battalion reported that Company "H" had relieved Company "F" in position. This morning at 130700H, Company "H", departed these positions, crossed the LOD, and moved south to clear and hold LE SON (1), (AT 980660) and YEN NE (1), (AT 987664). At 130950H, one of the men of Company "C" 3d Engineer Battalion, who was in direct support of Company "H", was found at (AT 974654). He had been shot four times and died before he could be evacuated. His rifle and cartridge belt were not found. The details of this incident are not known at this time. Company "H" now occupies positions with two platoons in YEN NE (1), (AT 987664), and one platoon in LE SON (1), (AT 980660). One man from Company "C", 3d Engineer Battalion was injured by fragments at 131435H while blowing a tunnel at (AT 985665).

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(3) 3d Battalion, 3d Marines. Continues to occupy a blocking position around Hill 55 (AT 970621) and patrols the southern most portion of the Regimental TAO. The two 155mm HE rounds which were reported yesterday, were found at (AT 960624). They were buried in the ground about twelve inches apart and rigged as a booby trap. They were blown in place by Engineers. At 122144H an appendicitis victim was evacuated. At 130728H a Company "M" patrol was engaged with an unknown number of VC at (AT 958627). They maintained contact and were still receiving fire at 130732H at (AT 957623). At 130805H Company "M" received small arms fire from outside the TAO from (AT 953627). At 131000H, Company "K" found a CHI COM grenade at (AT 964612) rigged as a booby trap with a clear plastic, monofilament, fishing line for a trip wire. It was destroyed by Engineers. At 131105H, Company "I" patrol received small arms fire at (AT 971636) and sustained one WIA. The casualty was not serious. At 131235H, Company "L" received heavy small arms fire from (AT 995625) from an undetermined number of VC. They sustained one WIA at (AT 988625) who was in critical condition. At 131200H, Company "L" found a jar covered with plastic which contained medicine and fishing line. They also found two MS 39, spent cartridges which had been recently fired. Anti USMC propaganda leaflets have been found throughout the 3d Marine area which were not there yesterday.

At 140600H, the Battalion will depart their blocking position at HILL 55 (AT 970621) and will move north searching the southern portion of Regimental TACR as far north as grid line (T67). The rear guard will remain on HILL 55 until all heavy equipment has been helilifted out. When the Battalion reaches grid line

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(T65), they will move east to the railroad and then move north. They will be picked up by trucks and taken to new positions in the 3d Marine TACOR. OPCON 3/3 passes to 3d Marines when the 3d Battalion passes through the Ninth Marines lines.

2. Period Covered. 131800H to 141800H September 1965
3. General Summary of Events. The Ninth Marines occupy defensive positions in its TAOR and continues to conduct operations Golden Fleece and Rice Straw. The 2d Battalion now has cleared to Phase Line Orange and occupies positions on this Phase Line with three companies.

a. 1st Battalion. Continues to conduct operation Golden Fleece. There was one contact with a small enemy force during this period. There were no Marine casualties. One VCS was apprehended.

b. 2d Battalion. The 2d Battalion moved their front lines south to Phase Line Orange today as Companies "E" and "G" conducted clear and hold operations in their respective sectors. Company "E" cleared the villages of DUONG SON (3), (AT 994670) and QUA GIANG (2), (BT 002668) in their move south to Phase Line Orange. Company "G" cleared the villages of LA BONG (2), (AT 967667) and AN THAC (1), (AT 966664), in their move south. There was no resistance from the VC. The 2d Battalion had seven Marines WIA during this period. One VCS was apprehended and delivered to ITT. One Marine was KIA.

c. 3d Battalion. 3d Marines. Withdrew from blocking positions at Hill 55 (AT 970821) this morning and is returning by airlift to CHU LAI this afternoon. Two Marines were wounded this morning. The Battalion destroyed two caves and one booby-trap. Two VC were killed yesterday that were not previously reported.

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4. Activitiesa. Operations

(1) 1st Battalion. The 1st Battalion continued to occupy defensive positions and conducted aggressive patrols throughout the Battalion area. Companies "A" and "D" conducted Golden Fleece patrols.

(a) Company "A" remains in its Company defensive positions. The Company conducted squad size combat patrols in an area bounded by grid line (T69) and grid line (T67), the coast and the CAN BIEN River as part of operation Golden Fleece.

(b) Company "B" (-) remains at the Battalion CP (rear) conducting patrols in the area northeast of the Battalion CP (rear), to the vicinity of NAI HIEN (BT 040748) and southwest of the CP and along the north bank of the CAU DO River.

(c) Company "C" provides one reinforced squad for the security of the radar site and water point on MON KY Mountain at (BT 062853), one reinforced squad at the hospital site at (BT 061700), one reinforced squad at the bridge and water point at (BT 071700) and mans two CP's at (BT 075710) and at (BT 069705).

(d) At 140001H a patrol, Redwood Delta 13E, received small arms fire at (BT 032671) from approximately five VC snipers. The fire came from all directions. The squad returned fire and the snipers broke contact. A complete search of the area was made and one Vietnamese was found squatting in the corner of a unlighted house. The Vietnamese liaison trooper considered the man suspicious and he was apprehended. The company conducted Golden Fleece Operation providing protection for rice harvesters in paddies in the vicinity of the Company CP at (BT 045665).

(2) 2d Battalion

(a) Company "E" occupied front line positions from (AT 990676) to (BT 026684) until this morning. At 140638H Company "E" moved out and commenced clearing DUONG SON (3), (AT 994672). DUONG SON (3) was cleared by 140854H. QUA GIANG (2), (BT 003669), was also cleared as Company "E" moved south to the Battalion's south boundary. There was no contact with any VC in DUONG SON (3) and QUA GIANG (2). At

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141320H Company "E" completed clearing QUA GIANG (2) and commenced consolidating positions.

(b) Company "F" continued to occupy positions from (AT 976684) to (AT 988678) last night and this morning. This afternoon two platoons moved to the FLSG ammunition dump (AT 988733) and assumed responsibility of the security of this position in relief of Company "M", 3d Battalion, 4th Marines. One platoon remains in YEN NE (2), (AT 986684).

(c) Company "G" continued to occupy front line positions from (AT 961685) to (AT 973683) until this morning. At 140630H they crossed the LOD and moved south to conduct a clear and hold operation in the zone to the south through LA BONG (3), (AT 968668) and AN TRACH (1), (AT 965663) to Phase Line Orange. At 140850H Company "G" was in LA BONG (2), (AT 967668) and reported that Engineers had blown three bunkers, three caves, and one booby trap while there. At 141011H Company "G" commenced clearing AN TRACH (1), (AT 965663), and apprehended one VCS. No resistance had been encountered. The local villagers reported that the VC had moved south earlier this morning. The VCS was found asleep in a house at (AT 972667). He was delivered to ITT.

(d) Company "H" occupied positions in YEN NE (1), (AT 987665) with two platoons and LE SON (1), (AT 980660) with one platoon throughout the night. At 140350H Company "H" had one WIA at (AT 979659) as the result of a sniper round. The casualty had a gunshot wound in the left thigh and was evacuated by helicopter. The sniper round came from (AT 976657). The area was illuminated but no one could be spotted. At 140559H Company "H" departed and established blocking positions from (AT 973660) to (AT 976664) in support of Company "G"'s clear and hold operation. One squad established blocking positions in the vicinity of (AT 988666) in support of Company "E"'s clear and hold operation. At 140710H Company "H" sustained two WIA from metal pungee stakes at (AT 972659). One casualty was evacuated by vehicle to the BAS. The other casualty did not require evacuation.

(e) Company "M" 3/4 continued to provide security for the FLSG ammunition dump (AT 988733) and the railroad bridge and water point (AT 998707) until this afternoon when they were relieved by 2/9 units. Company "M" came under operational control of the 3d Marines this afternoon at 141600H.

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(3) 3d Battalion, 3d Marines. At 132030H it was reported that Company "M" at 131500H killed two VC in a fire fight at (AT 953643) when they engaged ten VC who had several automatic weapons. One additional VC killed is probable. At 140755H the 3d Battalion began moving north from Hill 55, clearing the area between the railroad tracks and the YEN River. At 140850H initial elements of the Battalion had advanced to grid line (T63) and reported no enemy contact. At 140900H they blew two caves at (AT 975639) and destroyed a beer can which had a booby-trapped grenade in it at (AT 956635). At 140904H one WIA was sustained from a pungee stake at (AT 957639). At 141014H the Battalion had advanced to grid line (T65). One Marine was WIA at 141043H by a booby-trap at (AT 968648). The helilift of heavy equipment was completed at 140950H. The platoon of 4.2" mortars were lifted to (AT 921736) and OPCON passed to 1st Battalion, 12th Marines at 141200H. At 141330H, the 3d Battalion arrived at the entrucking point (AT 998700) and began moving to the Danang Airbase. At 141500H they are scheduled to begin airlift to Chu Lai. OPCON 3d Battalion, 3d Marines, passes to 4th Marines at 142200H.

b. 2/9 - 73 civilians received medical treatment: 40 at the BAS and 33 at DUONG SON (1), (AT 997688).

c. 3/9 - A donation of 3,000 piasters, voluntarily raised by the Battalion, was made to the widow of a Vietnamese worker accidentally killed last week while working on the electrical lighting system for the airfield defense.

d. Headquarters, 9th Marines - MedCap supplies received this date are to be inventoried and delivered to the separate Battalion Aid Stations for distribution. 93 civilians received medical treatment at YEN BAC (AT 986703).

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11. Late Entries

a. At 141557H an Ontos hit a land mine at (AT 990663) and was turned over. One Marine was pinned underneath and KIA. Four Marines were WIA and evacuated by helicopter to C&C. One of the WIA was Captain C. D. DEAN, Commanding Officer of Company "E". He was not seriously wounded.

a. During the past twenty-four hours the 1st Battalion had two incidents involving the VC. Company "A" received twenty rounds of sniper fire from vicinity of (BT 083672). The company apprehended one VCS who was turned over to ITT. At approximately 1000H Company "D" fired upon six VC in a rice paddy vicinity of (BT 044657). There were no Marine casualties.

b. 2d Battalion. The company conducted Golden Fleece operations for security and protection of the harvesters in the rice paddies in the vicinity of the Company CP. A Golden Fleece patrol, reinforced with two tanks, spotted six VC wearing ponchos in a rice paddy at (BT 044657). One VC was armed with a carbine. The patrol fired upon the VC when they ran. The VC escaped and it is not known if any were wounded.

(2) 2d Battalion

(a) Company "E" upon completion of their clear and hold operation yesterday, established three platoon strong points in their assigned sector. The 1st platoon occupies positions in the vicinity of DUONG SON (2), (AT 993677), the 2d platoon in the vicinity of (AT 993663) and the 3d platoon in the vicinity of NHON THO (1), (BT 007660). At 150925H

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the body of the KIA, which was pinned beneath an Ontos yesterday afternoon, was evacuated. The delay was due to the fact that EOD personnel were required to free the body and daylight working conditions were desired. At 151310H Echo Papa I patrol made contact with an estimated VC platoon in the vicinity of (AT 988657). The VC were armed with automatic weapons and pinned down the patrol. One Marine was WIA and evacuated by helicopter. The 1st platoon, reinforced with two Ontos, moved to (AT 990653) to assist the patrol. At 151355H the 1st platoon had the VC platoon pinned down in the vicinity of (AT 995649). At 151410H an Ontos hit a mine at (AT 996654) and one Marine Lieutenant was WIA. His wounds were not serious and did not require evacuation. The Ontos had the right tread blown off which was the extent of its damage.

(b) Company "F" continues to provide security for the FLSG ammunition dump (AT 988733) with two platoons. One platoon (-) remains in YEN NE (2), (AT 986684) and one squad remains at the 2d Battalion's medical station in CAM NE (2), (AT 980687) for security. At 142020H the squad located at (AT 980687) tripped a booby trapped grenade and three men received minor fragmentation wounds. Two of the casualties were Marines and the other a writer from the New York Times. None required evacuation. At 142350H Foxtrot Papa II patrol made contact with three VC at (AT 974690). Fire was exchanged and one Marine received a minor fragmentation wound in the arm. As the patrol moved forward to check the area, they saw approximately twelve people running into CAM NE (1) village (AT 985693). The patrol was unable to locate any enemy casualties and continued on their planned route.

(c) Company "G" upon completion of their clear and hold operation yesterday, established positions from (AT 959658) to (AT 972655). One platoon is located in the vicinity of (AT 967661). 3. General Summary of Events. The Ninth Marines continue operation Golden Fleece and Rice Straw and patrol aggressively in their AOOR. War dog teams are now being employed by the 1st and 2d Battalions.

a. 1st Battalion. Continues to occupy positions south of the Danang Airbase and south of the C&S DO River. Operation Golden Fleece continues. There were two contacts with small enemy forces and one VC initiated incident. There was one KIA and ~~three~~ ^{one} WIA from 1st AmTrac Battalion, while supporting Company "C" this afternoon. One AmTrac was damaged seriously. ~~COMPANY B HAD THREE KIA~~ ^{ONE KIA}.

b. 2d Battalion. The 2d Battalion occupies positions in the southwest portion of the Regimental TAOR along Phase Line Orange and provides security for the FLSG ammunition dump (AT 988733) and the railroad bridge and water point (AT 998707). There were two contacts with small enemy forces during this period. Two VCS were apprehended and delivered to IPT during this period. There were no USMC battle casualties during this period. Two Marines from Company "B" administratively evacuated. One Marine had an infection from a pungee stake wound in the hand and the other had a high temperature.

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4. Activitiesa. Operations

(1) 1st Battalion. The 1st Battalion continues to occupy positions south of the Danang Airbase and south of the CAU DO River. At 161400H, Company "C" (Rein) began an operation to locate and destroy mines that have been reported in TRA KHE (2), (BT 075680). Operation Golden Fleece is continuing. Companies "C" and "D" are now employing war dog teams on patrols and operations.

(a) Company "A" (-) now located at (BT 067714), is responsible for the Battalion security. The 1st platoon, now located at (BT 023733), is responsible for the patrolling and security of the Battalion TAOR north of the CAU DO River.

(b) Company "B", located in the vicinity of TRA KHE (1), (BT 088672), has been patrolling in an area generally east of grid line (B06) and north of grid line (T66).

(c) At 151920H 1st platoon, Company "C", reported receiving fifteen rounds of small arms fire and three rounds of what was possibly 60mm mortar fire from (BT 042704). The small arms fire was thought to have come from three or four positions. Fire was returned silencing the enemy fire. At 160900H the Redwood Charlie 164 patrol reported receiving small arms fire from the vicinity of (BT 057711). The patrol returned fire and the VC broke contact. The Company is now employing a war dog team on its patrols and operations. The use of these teams is of great benefit. As a result of information received today at 161000H it was planned that the 1st platoon, Company "C", reinforced with an Engineer team, two IWP-5's, two Ontos and the 3d platoon of Company "B" would conduct a search and destroy mission in TRA KHE (2), (BT 075680) to locate and destroy mines reported to be stored in that area. At approximately 161500H an Amtrac struck a mine at (BT 065670) and one KIA and three WIA were sustained. Because of this, it was decided to postpone the mission until tomorrow when mine clearing teams could be employed to better advantage. Original intelligence information indicated the mines had not been laid because the villagers had asked the VC not to lay them during the harvest. This now appears not to be the case.

(d) Company "D". The company presently occupies defensive positions in the vicinity of KHAM TAY (3), (BT 048667) and TU CAU (1), (BT 036667). The company is conducting Golden Fleece Operations in the rice paddies in the vicinity of the CP. Company "D" is now employing a war dog team.

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(2) 2d Battalion

(a) Company "E" continues to occupy positions in their assigned sector with three platoon strong points. The 1st platoon occupies positions in the vicinity of DUONG SON (2), (AT 993677), and the 2d platoon in the vicinity of (AT 993663) and the 3d platoon in the vicinity of NHON THO (1), (BT 007660). At 160325H the Echo Alpha 1 ambush returned with one VCS. The VCS was apprehended in the vicinity of (BT 009673) and was delivered to IFT this morning.

(b) Company "F" continues to provide security for the FLSG ammunition dump (AT 988733) with two platoons. One platoon (-) remains in YEN NE (2), (AT 986684) and one squad remains at the 2d Battalion's medical station in CAM NE (2), (AT 980687) for security. Two war dog teams are being utilized by Company "F" patrols in the CAM NE Complex (AT 990690),

(c) Company "G" continues to occupy front line positions from (AT 959658) to (AT 972655). One platoon is located in the vicinity of (AT 967661). A river check point is established at (AT 959658).

(d) Company "H" continues to occupy front line positions. The 1st platoon occupies positions in YEN NE (1), (AT 987664), the 2d platoon in the vicinity of (AT 982658). At 151820H the 2d platoon received sniper fire from south of LE SON (2), (AT 979650). The platoon spotted six VC who got up and ran to LE SON (3), (AT 976647) when the 2d platoon moved out in pursuit. The 2d platoon pursued the VC to LE SON (3), but the VC ran south to THAI CAM (1), (AT 977643), and the platoon did not pursue further. The 2d platoon apprehended one VCS in LE SON (3), (AT 976647) wearing civilian clothing with black pajamas underneath. The 2d platoon then returned to its previous position. At 152130H they received an additional twenty-five rounds of harassing fire from (AT 975650). There were no USMC casualties. At 152220H the 3d platoon suspected movement forward of their positions and requested illumination over the area. The illumination was received and on target, but nothing could be seen.

1. Reporting Unit. Ninth Marines2. Period Covered. 161800H to 171800H3. General Summary of Events. The Regiment continues to occupy positions south of the Danang Airbase and south of the CAU DO River and aggressively patrols the Regimental TAOR.

a. 1st Battalion. Continued to conduct operation Golden Fleece. Two platoons conducted a search and destroy operation near TRA KHE (2), (BT 075680). There were two contacts with small enemy forces. The Battalion wounded one VC, killed three, and recovered two enemy weapons and five enemy hand grenades. One VCS was apprehended.

b. 2d Battalion. The 2d Battalion occupies positions in the southwest portion of the Regimental TAOR along Phase Line Orange and provides security for the FLSG ammunition dump (AT 988733) and the railroad bridge and water point (AT 998707). There was one contact with a small enemy force and one VC initiated incident during this period. Two VC were KIA. There were no USMC casualties during this period.

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4. Activities

a. Operations

(1) 1st Battalion. The 1st Battalion continues to occupy positions south of the Danang Airbase and south of the CAU DO River. Operation Golden Fleece is continuing. Companies "C" and "D" are now employing war dog teams on patrols and operations.

(a) Company A (-) is responsible for Battalion CP security. The 1st Platoon, located at (BT 023733), conducted combat patrols in Battalion TAOR north of the CAU DO River.

(b) At 162000H Company "B" reported receiving three rounds small arms fire at (BT 091669). The fire came from approximately one hundred and fifty meters south of the company perimeter. The company returned fire and the sniper fire ceased. This morning at 170840H, the 3d Platoon, Company "B" reinforced with an Engineer team, two tanks and two LVTs, commenced its search and destroy operation in vicinity of TRA KHE (2), (BT 075680). At 171110H the platoon reached the IOA without making enemy contact. At approximately 171130H the 1st platoon, Company "B" and 1st Platoon, Company "C", re-entered the sector previously cleared to re-search the area. At 171133H the Bravo Homer 17 patrol received small arms fire in the vicinity of (BT 073669). The patrol returned fire wounding at least one VC. The VC broke contact and the patrol pursued, following a bloody trail. The patrol was unable to catch the VC. At 171205H the 2d Platoon encountered three VC at (BT 090662) and fired on them at a range of fifteen meters. The VC were killed and the platoon recovered the following equipment: one 7.62mm rifle, one sub-machine gun, five hand grenades, one cartridge belt with ammo, and medical supplies.

(c) At 161640H two personnel of Company "C" who were on sentry duty observed a Vietnamese male in the vicinity of (BT 066712). The Marines apprehended the man and asked him for his identification. The man broke away but was quickly apprehended. He attempted to escape a second time and was in the process of running away when a Marine shot the man in the left leg. (The sentries have been instructed to shoot at the leg of people who attempt to escape). The village chief said the man was a deaf-mute with low mentality. He was taken to the BAS and later taken to a local civilian hospital. This morning the 1st Platoon, Company "C" was the blocking force

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for 3d Platoon, Company "B", search and destroy mission. At approximately 171130H, together with the 3d Platoon, Company "B", the 1st Platoon commenced to re-search the area previously cleared. Upon completion of the search, the 1st Platoon, Company "C", will return to the Company CP.

(d) Company D. The company presently occupies positions in the vicinity of TU CAU (1), (BT 036667), and KHAM TAY (3), (BT 048667). At 161945H a Delta Company patrol apprehended a man at (BT 068681) who yelled "Americans no good". The man appeared slightly deranged or under the influence of drugs. He claimed to be a doctor. He was turned over to NLT.

(2) 2d Battalion

(a) Company "E" continues to occupy positions in their assigned sector with three platoon strong points. The 1st Platoon occupies positions in the vicinity of DUONG SON (2) (AT 993677), the 2d Platoon in the vicinity of (AT 993663) and the 3d Platoon in the vicinity of NHON THO (1), (BT 007660). At 162110H the Echo Alpha 3 ambush located at (BT 003658) received two rounds of small arms fire from (BT 002658). The sniper fire was ineffective and no fire was returned.

(b) Company "F" continues to provide security for the FLSG ammunition dump (AT 988733) with two platoons. One platoon (-) remains in YEN NE (2), (AT 986684), and one squad remains at the 2d Battalion's medical station in CAM NE (2), (AT 980687), for security.

(d) Company "H" continues to occupy front line positions. a. The Regimental CA Officer accompanied the American Consul through a tour of Cam Ne and discussions with the village chief and several villagers. The CO of 2/9 and 3/9 were present. A meeting with the District Chief was held thereafter to discuss the area.

A reaction force was dispatched from Company "G" to sweep NO NAME Village. The Company then contacted HOA VANG Headquarters to determine if there were Popular Force units operating in this area. The Company was advised that Popular Force troops were in this area. Company "G" then contacted the Popular Force troops by radio and requested permission to fire artillery. Permission was granted and one round of artillery was fired. The Popular Forces then asked for a cease fire so they could check and make sure they had no troops in the area. By this time the Marine reaction force was too close to the village for further artillery fire so the artillery mission was called off. The reaction force then moved into NO NAME Village. As they moved in heavy automatic weapons fire and small arms fire was received from (AT 961677). Liaison was then made with adjacent Marine units in this area for permission to fire artillery on this position. Permission was granted and artillery commenced firing. At 181340H one Marine was WIA at (AT 963677). The casualty had a gunshot wound in the head and was reported in serious condition. He was evacuated by helicopter. (See late entries).

a. 1st Battalion. During the past twenty-four hours there were two incidents initiated by the VC and two contacts with small enemy forces. The Battalion sustained one WIA while killing two VC and recovering one rifle, three magazines and one grenade.

(a) Company "A". The 1st Battalion, Company "A", patrols and provides security for the Battalion rear area north of the CAU DO River. Company "A" (-) provides security for the Battalion CP (rear).

(b) Company "B". At 180925H a man from 3d Engineer Battalion who is attached to Company "B" was attacked by a water buffalo and goared in the hand. He was evacuated for medical treatment.

(c) Company "C". At 171910H the squad at the bridge at (BT 071701) saw approximately twenty-five rounds fired in XUAN TRA (BT 086898). A squad went to the village to investigate and learned that the fire was apparently directed at the village chiefs house which is fifty meters north of the bridge. At 172055H two rounds of mortar fire were received near the bridge (BT 071701). Flashes were seen eight hundred meters to the southwest. A counter mortar mission was fired by the 81mm mortar platoon at (BT 063703). Five rounds were expended. The results were not observed.

a. 1st Battalion. The 1st Battalion occupies positions and patrols the southeast portion of the Regimental T.O.R. A patrol apprehended three VCS, who had no valid ID cards. The VCS were turned over to ITT. There were no Marine casualties during this period.

b. 2d Battalion. The 2d Battalion occupies positions south of the CAU BO River along Phase Line Orange and provides security for the FLSG ammunition dump (AT 988733) and the railroad bridge and water point (AT 998707). 3. General Summary of Events. Operation Golden Fleece and Rice Straw continue. Company "D", 3d Recon Battalion was dropped from direct support of the Ninth Marines at 201200H.

a. 1st Battalion. The 1st Battalion occupies positions and patrols the southeast portion of the Regimental TAOR. There were two contacts with small enemy units during this period. Two VCS were apprehended. One of the VCS was wounded. There was one Marine WIA.

b. 2d Battalion. The 2d Battalion continues to occupy positions south of the CAU DO River in the southwest portion of the Regimental TAOR and provides security for the FLSG ammunition dump (AT 988733) and the railroad bridge and water point (AT 998707). Companies "E" and "G" continued their search and clear operations today with Company "G" sweeping north along the YEN River to the vicinity of (AT 964689) and Company "E" sweeping south along Highway 1 through NHON THO (2), (BT 017657). There were two VC initiated incidents and one contact with a small enemy force during this period. Seven VCS were apprehended, one VC WIA (confirmed) and one VC KIA. (a) Company "A" (-) continues to provide security for the battalion CP at (BT 067714). The 1st platoon provides security for the Battalion CP (rear) and patrols the area around the CP (rear). The 2d platoon occupies positions at (BT 082698).

(b) Company "B" (-) occupies positions at (BT 088672). One platoon is located at (BT 072669).

(c) Company "C", located at (BT 067714), provides one reinforced squad for the security of the radar site on MON KY Mountain at (BT 062853), one reinforced platoon at the bridge and the water point at (BT 071700) and mans two CP's at (BT 075710) and at (BT 069705). The company was relieved at 201200H of security responsibility for the hospital site at (BT 061728). At 200800H the 1st platoon, reinforced with two LVTP-5's, commenced a combat patrol which went to KHUE DONG (1), (BT 056707) and HAI AN (BT 055713). The patrol returned at 201300H without having made any enemy contact.

(d) Company "D" occupies platoon positions at (BT 035667) at (BT 046669) and at (BT 055703). At 200300H a listening post located at (BT 044660) heard voices to the front of their positions. Four rounds of 81mm mortar illumination were fired revealing four people. They fired, wounding one VCS. The VCS was evacuated by LVTP-5. At 200909H a scout-sniper team located at (BT 064652) observed four armed VC to the front of their position. Before the scout-sniper team could open fire a Vietnamese woman, who had discovered the team's position warned the VC. The VC ran away and the Marines pursued by fire wounding two. The woman was apprehended and turned over to IFF. The team mounted on two tanks physically pursued the VC. There were no VC apprehended. As part of operation Golden Fleece, the company has saturated its assigned portion of the Battalion's TACOR with daylight and night combat patrols, ambushes and scout-sniper teams. There have been indications from the villagers that Operation Golden Fleece has bolstered their confidence in the Marines ability to protect them during harvest. The rice farmers say that

the VC are waiting for the harvest to be completed before attempting to impose its rice tax. The villagers have expressed their desire that the Marines continue their protection. Due to rain, use of the war dog team assigned to the company has been limited.

(2) 2d Battalion

(a) Company "E" occupied positions in the vicinity of MIEU DONG (1), (BT 016677) throughout the night. At 192230H the Echo Papa 1 patrol received two rounds of small arms fire in the vicinity of (BT 024677). At 200645H Company "E" crossed the LOD in a search and clear operation to the south. At 200745H the Company had advanced to the vicinity of (BT 016670) and apprehended two VCS. At 200100H the sweep of QUA GIANG (1), (BT 017665), was completed and the company commenced the sweep of NHON THO (2), (BT 017656). At 201058H an estimated squad size VC unit opened fire with small arms at (BT 013657). Company "E" returned fire and one VC was killed. One U.S. .30 caliber carbine, one fragmentation grenade and ten rounds of .30 caliber ammunition were recovered. The VC unit fled and the 2d platoon pursued. At 201245H the 2d platoon spotted the VC group across the river from (BT 007649) and opened fire, knocking down one VC. A retrieving party, dispatched to the scene, found the body had been retrieved prior to their arrival. At 201500H Company "E" had advanced to Phase Line Orange and were consolidating positions in the vicinity of NHON THO (2), (BT 017655).

(b) Company "F" continues to provide security for the FLSG ammunition dump (AT 988733) with two platoons. One platoon (-) remains in YEN NE (2), (AT 986684) and one squad remains at the 2d Battalion's Medical Station in CAM NE (2), (AT 980687), for security. One squad provides security for the railroad bridge and water point (AT 998707).

(c) Company "G" occupied positions in the vicinity of (AT 968669) throughout the night. At 191956H approximately twenty-five rounds of small arms fire was received from NO NAME Village (AT 968678). At 200747H they commenced their sweep to the north. At 201020H the company was at (AT 966671) and sweeping LA BONG (1), (AT 967670). The company reported that no contact had been made with the VC. A detailed search of eighty houses had been accomplished, one hundred and sixty holes filled, seven caves and twenty-five holes blown, seventy families interrogated, two booby-trapped gates destroyed and one

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hundred and twenty-six meters of trench line discovered. At 201105H Golf Papa 1 patrol found two VCS hiding in a house at (AT 969655). One VCS had a pack. Neither had identification. The two VCS were delivered to ITT. At 201500H Company "G" was in the process of searching and clearing LA BONG (3), (AT 963677).

(d) Company "H" continues to occupy front line positions. The 1st platoon occupies positions in the vicinity of YEN NE (1), (AT 990663). The 2d platoon remains in the vicinity of (AT 973655), and the 3d platoon occupies positions in the vicinity of NHON THO (1), (BT 005660).

3. General Summary of Events. The Ninth Marines continue operation Rice straw and Golden Fleece. The 3d Battalion began its relief of 2d Battalion today. The relief will be completed at 241800H September. Information was received from G-3 that authorization has been granted for the Ninth Marines to extend its TAOR to the south. The 1st Battalion now plans to operate to Phase Line Orange by patrols.
 - a. 1st Battalion. The 1st Battalion occupies positions in and patrols the southeastern portion of the Regimental TAOR. There was one contact with a small enemy force. Marines killed three VC. Two Chicom carbines and one Thompson sub-machine gun were captured. There were no Marine casualties.
 - b. 2d Battalion. The 2d Battalion continues to occupy positions south of the CAU DO River in the southwest portion of the Regimental TAOR and provides security for the FLSG ammunition dump (AT 988733) and the railroad bridge and water point (AT 998707). Company "G" continued with their search and clear operation today by sweeping CAM NE (3), (AT 963684), YEN NE (4), (AT 973677) and ~~NO NAME~~ Village (AT 968678). There was one VC initiated incident during this period involving harassing fire. There were no USMC casualties and no confirmed VC casualties during this period. c. 3/9 - The Battalion Surgeon escorted the Battalion Surgeon of 2/9 to the Hoa Vang Dispensary and introduced him to the Vietnamese Medical workers of the area. In addition, liaison was made with the camp officials at the Buddhist Refugee Camp in Hoa Cuong (BT 033755).

11. Late Entries

a. At 221600H ARVN forces from Hoa Vang, with the assistance of one platoon from Company "F", commenced a search of the area from (AT 997708) to (AT 983705) and then south to the CAU DO River.

3. General Summary of Events

a. 1st Battalion. The 1st Battalion occupies positions in and ~~patrols~~ the southeast portion of the Regimental TAOR. The battalion maintains continuous patrols and ambushes around the rice fields in its area to prevent VC from harvesting the rice. This morning at 230635H three companies of the 1st Battalion along with one platoon of Company "D", 3d Reconnaissance Battalion, and Company "B"(-), 3d Tank Battalion commenced a search and clear operation east of the VINH DIEN River and south of (T65) grid line. Three VC were killed, two grenades were captured, and ten VCS were apprehended during the operation.

b. 2d Battalion. The 2d Battalion continues to occupy positions south of the CAU DO River in the southwest portion of the Regimental TAOR and provides security for the FLSG ammunition dump (AT 988733) and the railroad bridge and water point (AT 998707). There was one VC initiated incident during this period involving harassing fire. A patrol from Company "E" was fired upon by ARVN troops last night, and five Marines were WIA. Two of the casualties were evacuated. None of the casualties were wounded seriously.

c. 3d Battalion. Two thirds of the 3d Battalion has relieved a like number of personnel of the 2d Battalion in the southwest portion of the Regimental TAOR. The relief will be completed tomorrow.

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4. Activitiesa. Operations

(1) 1st Battalion. The 1st Battalion conducted a search and clear operation in southwest portion of its TAOR.

(a) Company "A" was the battalion reserve for today's search and clear operation. It maintained two platoons on a ten minute alert to move to the collection point at (BT 043686) for employment by the Battalion Commander. One reinforced squad is at the old French bunker at (BT 083697).

(b) Company "B" (-) (Rein) moved this morning under cover of darkness to the LOD crossing same at 230635H. At 230830H the company killed three VC in the vicinity of (BT 039652). Five VC were seen recovering two bodies and the VC weapons. Marines were unable to kill the five VC, but recovered one VC body and three grenades. Upon completion of the operation the company will return to its CP location at (BT 073665).

(c) Company "C" was the blocking force for the 1st Battalion's search and clear operation. Last night the company marched from (BT 067714) to its blocking position in the vicinity of MAN QUAN (1), (BT 036687), and MAN QUAN (2), (BT 045685). The company also provided one platoon for the security of the civilian collection point at (BT 043686). The company continues to be responsible for security of the bridge and water point at (BT 072702) and for the joint radar site at (BT 062853). The company also mans two OP's at (BT 055703) and at (BT 075710).

(d) Company "D" (-) reinforced this morning under the cover of the darkness moved from its positions at (BT 035667), (BT 046669) and (BT 055703) to the LOD crossing same at approximately 230630H. At 230840H the company destroyed two booby-trapped punji pits at (BT 039652). The company employed its war dog team in today's operation. Upon completion of the operation the company will return to its CP location at (BT 043667) and conduct Golden Fleece patrols.

(2) 2d Battalion.

(a) Company "E" continues to occupy front line positions. The company headquarters and 1st platoon occupy positions in the vicinity of MIEU DONG (1), (BT 015677). The 2d platoon occupies positions in the vicinity of BO MUNG (1), (BT 028657). At 222030H Company E observed an empty convoy moving north on route #1. At 222130H Company E observed a convoy of trucks with lights on moving through Company E position heading south on route #1. The convoy

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was broken into small groups. At 222200H the Echo Papa 3 patrol, while moving west of Highway 1, heard voices in the northern part of BO MUNG (2), (BT 028652). The patrol moved up to investigate. The patrol leader observed a stopped ARVN truck and ARVN troops outside of the truck. The ARVN troops immediately opened fire on the USMC patrol with small arms and automatic weapons fire. The patrol returned the fire until the patrol leader stopped the firing. The patrol started to withdraw and the ARVN troops threw several grenades, wounding five Marines. The ARVN troops then jumped in the truck and left. While the firing was going on at BO MUNG (2), the remainder of the ARVN convoy stopped at BO MUNG (1), (BT 025654) and fired into Company "E"'s positions and threw more grenades. Two Marine WIA were evacuated by helicopter. The other three WIA had minor wounds and were not evacuated.

(b) Company "F" continues to provide security for the FLSG ammunition dump (AT 988733) with two platoons. One platoon (-) remains in YEN NE (2), (AT 986684) and one squad remains at the 2d Battalion's medical station in CAM NE (2), (AT 980687) for security. One squad provides security for the railroad bridge and water point (AT 998707). At 222000H the 1st platoon returned to the ammunition dump after assisting ARVN forces from Hoa Vang conduct a search of the area from (AT 997708) to (AT 985705) and then south to the CAU DO River. During this operation a total of twelve VCS were apprehended, all of whom were turned over to Hoa Vang Headquarters.

(c) Company "G" occupies front line positions with two platoons in the vicinity of AN TRACH (2), (AT 986654). One platoon occupies positions in the vicinity of LA BONG (2), (AT 970668).

(d) Company "H" continues to occupy front line positions. The 1st platoon occupies positions in the vicinity of YEN NE (1), (AT 990663). The 2d platoon remains in the vicinity of (AT 973655) and the 3d platoon occupies positions in the vicinity of NHON THO (1), (BT 005660). At 222020H twelve rounds of small arms fire were received from (AT 991656). Small arms fire was returned and the VC fire ceased. Illumination was requested and received. No one was spotted. There were no USMC casualties.

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4. Activitiesa. Operations

(1) 1st Battalion. Operation Golden Fleece continued and eight VCS and seven suspicious characters were apprehended as a result of the battalion's operation. Four Marines were wounded while on a road reconnaissance.

(a) Company "A" (-) continues to provide security for the Battalion CP at (BT 067714). One reinforced squad occupies the old French bunker at (BT 083697). Company "A" has continuously patrolled the area west of the CAN BIEH River and north of (T70) grid line. As part of Operation Golden Fleece, the company provides protection for designated rice paddies in the vicinity of the French bunker. A patrol from 2d platoon on a road reconnaissance inadvertently triggered a concussion grenade that was strung across a fence at (BT 072680). Four Marines (two from Company "A" and two from Engineers) were wounded.

(b) Company "B" continues to occupy positions in their assigned sector with strong points at (BT 088672) and at (BT 072669). A patrol was sent out this morning at 240800H to follow up information received by the battalion intelligence officer in regards to a supposed rice cache in the vicinity of grid square (BT 0867). The patrol found no rice cache. However, the patrol did check out a leprosyarium at (BT 099664) and found five wounded Vietnamese and thirteen non-patients. The Hoa Long village chief, who accompanied the patrol cleared three of the eighteen men. Eight of the remaining fifteen were declared VCS by the village chief and taken to ITT. The remaining seven were classified as suspicious persons and turned over to the Hoa Vang District Headquarters.

(c) Company "C" located at (BT 067714) provides one reinforced squad at the joint radar site on MON KY Mountain (BT 062853) and one reinforced platoon at the bridge and water point (BT 072702). The company also manstwo OP's at (BT 075710) and at (BT 069705).

(d) Company "D" occupies front line positions at (BT 034679) and at (BT 047670) with the company CP at (BT 047670). From these bases the company has conducted extensive patrols in conjunction with operation Golden Fleece.

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(2) 2d Battalion. The 2d Battalion occupied positions south of the CAU DO River in the southwest portion of the Regimental TAOR and provided security for the FLSG ammunition dump (AT 988733) and the railroad bridge and water point (AT 998707). until 240906H this morning. At this time the 2d battalion assumed the responsibility of the perimeter defense of the Danang Airbase. There were two USMC initiated incidents last night involving suspected VC movement in the vicinity of USMC positions. In both instances, small arms were fired in the direction of the suspected movement. There were no USMC casualties and no confirmed VC casualties.

(b) Company "F" provided security for the FLSG ammunition dump (AT 988733) with two platoons. b. Headquarters Company. Forty-six persons were given medical treatment at BINH THAI (BT 013722).

11. Psychological Warfare. A US Army psy-war team supported the 1st Battalion's Golden Fleece operation yesterday. The village chief spoke to all the villagers at the collection point at MAN QUAN (BT 045685) and explained to them the GVN policy for the area. In addition, there were films, taped speeches and the distribution of magazines, all of which explained the GVN program for national reconstruction. The villagers were interested and visably impressed. It seemed to be their first contact with the government in a long time.

12. Late Entries.

a. The 3d Battalion reported at 241625H that the HPI patrol was attacked by eight VC with automatic weapons. The VC fired at the patrol five times between the hours 241200H and 241330H, withdrawing each time to attack again from another direction. Fire came from trench lines in LE SON (3), (AT 973646), and THAI CAM (1), (AT 977643). After the VC broke contact, Company K began destroying the enemy positions. One Marine was wounded. It is not known if any of the VC were wounded or killed.

b. Medical supplies and other contraband has been seized at the check point on highway one. The details of what has been seized is not presently known, but will be reported later by spot report.

A tank hit a mine, but, sustained no damage. There were no Marine casualties.

b. 3d Battalion. The 3d Battalion continues to occupy positions south of the CAU DO River in the southwest portion of the Regimental TAO and provides security for the FLSG ammunition dump at (AT 988733) and the railroad bridge and water point at (AT 998707). 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4. Activitiesa. Operations

(1) 1st Battalion. The 1st Battalion continues operation Golden Fleece to protect the villagers during the harvest and to prevent the VC from imposing a rice tax in the area held by the Marines.

(a) Company "A" (-) continues to provide security for the Battalion CP at (BT 067714). One reinforced squad occupies the old French bunker at (BT 083697). The company continuously patrols the area west of the CAN BIEN River and north of (T70). In conjunction with Operation Golden Fleece, Company "A" provides protection for rice farmers working in the vicinity of the French bunker (BT 083697).

(b) Company "B" continues to occupy positions in their assigned sector with strong points at (BT 072669), (BT 072669). The company conducts Golden Fleece patrols in the vicinity of (BT 088672). Company "B" (-) cleared the hamlet of VIEM DONG (BT 103657) this morning. The company was supported by eight tanks. The Company (-) departed the assembly area (BT 094670) at 250330H and moved south and west to position west of VIEM DONG (BT 094657) from where they began clearing the hamlet. Meanwhile, the tanks had moved by a different axis of advance to blocking positions at (BT 098658). The infantry clearing the hamlet came under fire from an estimated eight VC who were at (BT 094655). The tanks, who could observe the VC, fired two rounds of WP and two rounds of HE. The VC fire was suppressed, and they escaped being partially screened by the smoke. Two of the VC may have been hit. Thirteen VCS were apprehended during the operation and one VCS was wounded when he jumped out of the bushes at (BT 105648). The wounded VCS was evacuated. The operation was concluded and the Company back at its positions by 251200H.

(c) Company "C" located at (BT 067714) provides one reinforced squad for the security of the joint radar site on MON KY Mountain (BT 062853) and one reinforced platoon for the security of the bridge and water point at (BT 075710). The company also mans OP's at (BT 065710) and (BT 069705).

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(2) 2d Battalion. The 2d Battalion occupied positions south of the CAU DO River in the southwest portion of the Regimental TAOR and provided security for the FLSG ammunition dump (AT 988733) and the railroad bridge and water point (AT 998707) until 240906H this morning. In addition, there were films, taped speeches and the distribution of magazines, all of which explained the GVN program for national reconstruction. The villagers were interested and visibly impressed. It seemed to be their first contact with the government in a long time.

12. Late Entries.

a. The 3d Battalion reported at 241625H that the HPL patrol was attacked by eight VC with automatic weapons. The VC fired at the patrol five times between the hours 241200H and 241330H, withdrawing each time to attack again from another direction. Fire came from trench lines in LE SON (3), (AT 973646), and THAI CAM (1), (AT 977643). After the VC broke contact, Company K began destroying the enemy positions. One Marine was wounded. It is not known if any of the VC were wounded or killed.

b. Medical supplies and other contraband has been seized at the check point on highway one. The details of what has been seized is not presently known, but will be reported later by spot report.

1. Reporting Unit. Ninth Marines2. Period Covered. 251800H to 261800H September 1965

3. General Summary of Events. The Ninth Marines continue operations Rice Strait and Golden Fleece. Positions are occupied generally along Phase Line Orange and patrols and ambushes are established and scout-sniper teams are employed throughout the Regimental TAOR.

a. 1st Battalion. Continues to occupy positions in the southeast portion of the Regimental TAOR and continues operation Golden Fleece. Fifteen VCS were picked up during this period. Two Marines were WIA, one seriously.

b. 3d Battalion. The 3d Battalion continues to occupy positions south of the CAU DO River in the southwest portion of the Regimental TAOR. Sporadic small arms fire was received along the Battalion's front throughout the night. A Platoon searched and cleared LE SON (3), (AT 978650), today. There was one VC initiated incident and two contacts with small enemy forces during this period. There five Marines WIA today. One VC was killed and three VCS were apprehended. This afternoon an AO spotted a boat on the YEN River carrying illegal rice. The Third Battalion diverted two squads to block the river up stream and down stream, and then helo-lifted two squads from Company M to where the boat was spotted. The boat was not on the river, but it was found moored and nearby a rice cache was found. The rice could not be recovered then, so the 3d Battalion decided to establish ambushes near the house to trap any persons who might attempt to recover the rice tonight.

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4. Activitiesa. Operations

(1) 1st Battalion. Operation Golden Fleece continues in the 1st Battalion's TAOR to protect the rice farmers during the harvest and to prevent the VC from imposing a rice tax in the area held by Marines.

(a) Company "A" (-) continues to provide security for the Battalion CP at (BT 067714). One reinforced squad occupies positions at the French bunker near (BT 083697). The company continuously patrols the area west of the CAN BIEN River and north of grid line (T 70). As part of Operation Golden Fleece, Company "A" provides protection for harvesters working in the vicinity of the French bunker (BT 083697). At 261230H, a combat patrol from Company A, reinforced with a team of engineers, departed the company area and began clearing mines in the area between (BT 069692) and (BT 058689).

This morning at 260600H the company, reinforced with six tanks, cleared VIEM DONG (BT 103657). With tanks occupying blocking positions to the east of the hamlet at (BT 099658), the company searched and cleared the hamlet, moving from positions to the west of VIEM DONG through the hamlet to the east. During the operation fourteen VCS were apprehended. The VCS were turned over to ITT. The operation was concluded at 260915H and the company returned to its position at (BT 088672).

(c) Company "C" located at (BT 067714) provides one reinforced squad for the security of the joint radar station on MON KY Mountain (BT 062853) and one reinforced platoon for the security of the bridge and water point at (BT 075710). The company also mans CP's at (BT 075710) and at (BT 069705).

(d) Company "D" occupies positions at (BT 034679) and at (BT 047670). The company CP is located at (BT 047670). Yesterday at 250430H, a patrol apprehended one VCS at (BT 041651). This incident was reported to G-3 in a Spot Report at 252200H. Today the company conducted Golden Fleece patrols in its assigned sector of the Battalion's TAOR.

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(2) 3d Battalion

One squad (rein) provides security for the railroad bridge and water point (AT 998707).

(d) Company "M" continues to occupy positions from (AT 971655) to (AT 966668) to (AT 974665). A platoon search and clear operation was conducted in CAM NE (3), (AT 965686). There was no enemy contact and no evidence of recent enemy activity in the hamlet. Mike Alpha a squad (-) patrol, received fire from approximately six VC near (AT 968653) at 252030H. One of the VC had an automatic weapon. The patrol returned the fire and pursued the VC in a running fire-fight until 260030H until the VC broke contact and escaped into a tree line. 3. General Summary of Events. The Ninth Marines continue operation Golden Fleece and Rice Straw. The Regiment occupies positions generally along Phase Line Orange.

a. 1st Battalion. There was one contact with a small enemy force and an ambush killed three VC. A VC bunker, believed to have VC and a 57mm recoilless rocket inside, was destroyed by artillery fire. The battalion conducted ten patrols and established four ambushes and six listening posts last night. Three scout-sniper teams were employed.

b. 3d Battalion. The 3d Battalion continues to occupy positions south of the CAU DO River in the southwest portion of the Regimental TAOR. 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4. Activitiesa. Operations

(1) 1st Battalion. The 3d Platoon, Company "A", commenced a three day combat patrol. The 2d Platoon, Company "D", ambushed a VC patrol this morning. The ambush, by body count, killed three VC. An artillery fire mission was fired this afternoon on a VC bunker. The target was destroyed and a secondary explosion was observed.

(a) Company "A" continues to provide security for the Battalion CP at (BT 067714). One reinforced squad occupies positions near the French bunker at (BT 083697). The company continuously patrols the area west of the CAN BIEN River and north of grid line (T 70). As part of operation Golden Fleece, the 3d Platoon, Company "A", commenced a three day combat patrol this morning at 270700H. The patrol will work between the VIHN DIEN River and the CAN BIEN River north of the (T 68) grid line.

(b) Company "B" continues to occupy front line positions in their assigned portion of the Battalion's TAOR with strong points at (BT 072669) and (BT 088672). From these positions the company conducted five squad size combat patrols during this reporting period. This morning at 271030H, the 2d Platoon, reinforced with two tanks from Company "B", 3d Tank Battalion, made a reconnaissance of the area bounded by coordinates (BT 103649) to (BT 097630) to (BT 119630). The tanks destroyed numerous helicopter, punji stakes which were in the area.

(c) Company "C", located at (BT 067714), provides one reinforced platoon for the security of the bridge and water point at (BT 075710) and a reinforced squad for the security of the joint radar site on MON KY Mountain (BT 062853). The company also man's OP's at (BT 075710) and at (BT 069705).

(d) Company "D" occupies front line positions at (BT 034670) and at (BT 047670). The company CP is located at (BT 047670). This morning, two squads of the 3d Platoon, reinforced with three tanks from Company "B", 3d Tank Battalion moved to the vicinity of (BT 065631) where a tank received a 57 mm RR round yesterday. The armored patrol received small arms fire and was grenaded at (BT 066631). The infantry element advanced and continued to receive small arms fire. Two VC were spotted and the platoon commander estimated another ten VC to be in the area. The patrol then broke contact and returned to the company CP to pick up the Forward Observer. With six additional tanks, the patrol returned to the vicinity of (BT 065632). The FO called an artillery fire mission on a bunker, containing the 57 mm RR and five armed VC. The mission was on target and destroyed the bunker. A secondary explosion was observed. The bunker was believed to be an ammunition dump.

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At 271007H a squad from the 2d Platoon ambushed three VC on a trail at (BT 048678). The three VC were killed and their bodies were recovered. A number of grenades, three cartridge belts, and a map were recovered.

(2) 3d Battalion.

(a) Company "I" continues to occupy positions from (BT 031656) to (BT 016655). Company "I" mans a check point on Highway 1 in MIEU DONG at (BT 017678). Yesterday, the check point confiscated twenty pounds of rice and twenty-five gallons of fuel oil. Seven VCS were apprehended. The VCS and contraband were turned over to Hoa Vang District Headquarters.

(b) Company "K" continues to occupy positions from (AT 973655) to (BT 005658). At 270600H one Marine was found dead at (AT 992664). He was apparently killed by a booby-trap, possibly a grenade. It is believed he was killed at 270410H, at which time an artillery mission was being fired. The man was first missed at 270410H and a search was begun. He was not found until daylight.

(c) Company "L" continues to provide security for the FLSG ammunition dump (AT 988733) with two platoons. The 3d platoon (-) remains at YEN NE (3), (AT 985682), as Battalion CP security and one squad remains at CAM NE (2), (AT 982687) for security. One squad (rein) provides security for the railroad bridge and water point (AT 998707). At 262115H, the 2d squad, 3d platoon, which is at the school house in CAM NE (2), (AT 980687) received fire from their west. The VC fired about 150 rounds from automatic weapons. The fire was returned and one VC was wounded. An attempt by several Marines to recover the VC body failed when they were taken under heavy fire. 81mm mortars were used to illuminate the area. The squad observed the enemy drag the VC body away. There were no Marine casualties. From 262240H to 262315H the school house at (AT 981687) was again taken under fire by automatic and semi-automatic fire from the north east, north and north west. Approximately 400 rounds were fired by the VC. One brick building from which a VC was firing was destroyed by a 3.5" rocket and the VC was presunable killed. A VC detonated a claymore mine and was knocked into a hole. The grenadier fired two 40mm grenades into the hole probably killing the VC. One Marine was slightly wounded by bullet debris.

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At 270830H the village chief of CAM NE (2), (AT 980688), reported a VC platoon in the vicinity of (AT 980687) in tunnels. The 3d platoon was dispatched to the area but was unable to find any VC. The platoon searched the hamlet and found medical supplies in plastic bags and various documents. Two VCS were apprehended. The search was concluded at 271400H and the 3d platoon returned to the Battalion (Fwd) CP.

(d) Company "M" continues to occupy positions from (AT 975664) to (AT 964668) to (AT 964665) to (AT 970654). The squad from Company "M" that was helo-lifted yesterday to LA BONG (3), (AT 964677), and found a cache of seventy-five shocks of rice at a boat landing at (AT 962677); returned at 261830H to the company area. A squad combat patrol was sent back to LA BONG (3), (AT 964677) to establish an ambush near the rice cache to prevent its recovery. 2. Period Covered. 271800H to 281800H to September 1965
3. General Summary of Events. The Viet Cong suffered significant losses today in the Ninth Marines TAOR as Operation Golden Fleece and Rice Straw continue. There has been a significant increase in the number and size contacts with enemy forces during this period.

a. 1st Battalion. Acting on intelligence information received yesterday from an eleven year old boy (See Ninth Marines Intelligence Summary #81, of 272400H September 1965), Company "D", 1st Battalion, laid out an ambush near THAI AN (2), (BT 033675), and killed two VC and captured one. Two patrols made contact with small enemy forces. The 1st Battalion killed a total of five VC, captured three VC, wounded two VC (not captured) and apprehended one VCS.

b. 3d Battalion. The 3d Battalion received small arms fire in their front line positions throughout the night. There were three contacts with small enemy forces and two contacts with platoon size forces during this period. Company "M" made contact with an estimated twenty VC at 281210H near (LT 964649). Company "M" attempted to envelope the enemy and fired 39 rounds of 81 mm mortar HE. The 3d Battalion killed one VC, and estimated they wounded another five during this period. Two VCS were apprehended on the CLU DO River after one was seen throwing a white bag and a carbine in the river. Another two VCS were apprehended at Highway 1 check point.

A Chi Com rifle, one Chi Com grenade, and document were captured. Five pounds of rice, three boxes of tobacco, five gallons of gasoline were confiscated this period. Boat was captured.

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4. Activitiesa. Operations(1) 1st Battalion

(a) Company "A" (-) continues to provide security for the Battalion CP at (BT 067714) and is the Battalion reserve. The 3d Platoon is into the second day of its three day combat patrol in area bounded by the CAN BIEN River, the VINH DIEN River, and grid line (T67).

(b) Company "B" continues to occupy front line positions in their assigned portion of the Battalion's TAOR with strong points at (BT 072669) and (BT 088672). This morning at 280830H a combat patrol, Bravo Homer 28x, spotted four VC armed with one carbine and grenades at (BT 103649). The squad opened fire upon the four. The squad was then fired upon by two more VC who were in the same area. The squad returned fire. Three of the VC were killed, and two were wounded. Two Marines sustained minor wounds. One Chi Com rifle was captured. Three of the VC, two of whom were wounded, managed to escape.

(c) Company "C", located at (BT 067714), provides one reinforced platoon for the security of the bridge and water point at (BT 075710) and now maintains one reinforced squad at the French bunker at (BT 083697). Today at 281000H, a squad from the 106 RR Platoon, H&S Company, relieved Company "C" of responsibility for the radar site on MON KY Mountain at (BT 062853). At 280900H, the squad at the French bunker discovered a man hidden in a hole in the front yard of a house in the hamlet of ANTRA (2), (BT 088687). The squad was investigating c-ration boxes found in the yard. The man would not come out of the hole, and was wounded in the arm when bayonettes were used to ferret him out. The man in the hole and the man who lived in the house were apprehended. The man in the house was released after being identified by the Village Chief. The other VCS was taken to ITT.

(d) Company "D" occupies front line positions at (BT 034670) and at (BT 047670). The company CP is located at (BT 047670). This morning at 280430H, the 2d Platoon, Company "D", acting upon intelligence received from a Vietnamese boy captured during an operation yesterday, set out three ambushes in the vicinity of THI AN (2), (BT 033675). At 280700, the ambush at (BT 033674) spotted three VC. The Marines opened fire killing two and capturing one. While returning to the CP, two VCS were found hiding in a house in the area where the ambushes were set.

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The two dead VC, along with one captured VC and the two apprehended VCS, were taken to the water point at (BT 075710). The village chief identified the two dead VC and the three captured as VC. The three were turned over to ITT. One Chi Com grenade and assorted papers were taken from the VC.

(2) 3d Battalion

(a) Company "I" continues to occupy positions from (BT 031656) to (BT 016655). Company "I" mans the check point on Highway 1 at MIEU DONG (1), (BT 017677). The following contraband was confiscated today; five lbs of rice, three boxes of tobacco, five gallons of gasoline and two civilians without ID. The goods and people were taken to Hoa Vang Hqs. A squad size patrol, India Papa One, received automatic and semi-automatic fire from an estimated five VC at (BT 018663) at 272020H. The patrol immediately returned a heavy volume of fire and the VC broke contact and escaped in a tree line. The patrol searched the area from which the VC had been firing and found no indication of VC casualties. The India L3 patrol received fire from (BT 028659) at 272215. An estimated three VC, using carbines, were taken under fire and one was knocked down. The other two VC pulled him into a covered position and made their escape. The patrol followed the VC but lost them in a dense tree line. At 281027H, three carbine rounds were fired from a blue bus traveling north on Highway #1 at (BT 023659).

(b) Company "K" continues to occupy positions from (AT 973655) to (BT 005658). Splashing was heard in a rice paddy at (AT 972663) at 272100H and five sniper rounds were received. The area was illuminated and two men were sent to investigate. Nothing was found. At 272010 ten sniper rounds were received from (AT 995660). At 272030 a grenade was thrown from (AT 993663), but no casualties were received. 81 mm mortars illuminated the area and a figure was seen running 30 small arms rounds and one M79 round were fired before the figure ducked into the tree line. Using the TPS-21, movement was observed at 272130H near (AT 993664). Several 50 cal spotter-tracer rounds and two M79 rounds, were fired in the area. At 280050H 50 rounds of automatic carbine fire, including tracers, were received from (AT 992668). 81 mm mortars were used to illuminate the area, but no VC were seen. At 281200H a VN woman wandered into the 1st Platoon CP (BT 003658) with a shrapnel wound in her shoulder. She was evacuated to Hoa Vang District Headquarters. It is not known how she was wounded.

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(c) Company "L" continues to provide security for the FLSG ammunition dump (LT 988733) with two platoons. The 3d Platoon (-) remains at YEN NE (3), (LT 985632), as the Battalion CP security, and one squad remains at CAM NE (2), (LT 982687) for security. One squad (rein) provides security for the railroad bridge and water point (LT 998707). At 272345H the railroad bridge security squad observed four men carrying weapons at (LT 998707). The Marines and ARVN took them under fire. The four men crawled into a rice paddy and disappeared, apparently receiving no casualties. The ARVN searched the area and found no VC or blood. A squad size patrol, Lima Papa Red, encountered an estimated force of 25 VC at 272308H near (LT 987708). The VC were using both automatic and semi-automatic weapons. One VC was wounded, but the Marines couldn't recover the body because of the size and fire power of the enemy force. At 272310 the VC broke contact and melted into the jungle. The patrol was not able to follow the VC trail and so continued on their patrol route. The 3d platoon with one squad of ARVN and two dog teams began a search operation of the area in the vicinity of (LT 977688) this morning at 280500H. A report received yesterday indicated a VC platoon was in the area hiding in tunnels. The Platoon has not made any contact. At 281445H at the railroad bridge, (LT 995705), two VN in a 10ft x 3ft boat were observed trying to evade a Marine patrol by hiding in the bushes along the river. A fire team of the 2d Squad, 2d platoon was dispatched to apprehend the two VN. Upon seeing the Marines coming the VN threw a white bag and a carbine into the river. The boat is now tied up at the bridge (LT 997708) and the VN are being evacuated. The boat contained two fish nets, a basket of fish and two oars. Marines are diving for the carbine and white bag.

(d) Company "M" continues to occupy positions from (LT 975664) to (LT 964668) to (LT 964665) to (LT 970654). A squad size patrol, Mike Papa 1, was engaged in a fire fight at 272335H near (LT 974675) with five VC who were carrying at least one automatic weapon. Contact was broken by the VC and the Marines conducted an area search for the VC but were unable to locate them. The patrol continued along its designated route. At 281210, between LE SON (4), (LT 965647), and LE SON (3), (LT 974647), a four man scout-sniper team, covered by one squad, was moving into position at (LT 964641) when they were taken under fire by an estimated 20 VC. The remainder of the 2d platoon enveloped the enemy and 39 rds of HE, 81 mm mortars were called in on the VC. The VC sustained an estimated 3 wounded and one KIA (body count). Three Marines were wounded. At 281430H one of the 81 mm mortars HE rounds fell short at (LT 969655). Four civilians were wounded by it and a corpsman was sent to take care of them.

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b. Patrols

8. Plans

a. 1st Battalion. At 290630H tomorrow morning, 3d Engineers, reinforced with one squad from Company "A", will clear the coast highway of obstacles. At 291030H, the 1st platoon, Company "A", reinforced with three Tanks and two Ontos, will depart the Battalion CP (BT 072708) and move south on the coast highway to TRA KHE (1), (BT 088675), in an armored column. The Hoa Long Village Chief will take two civilian busses with the column to collect rice on the return trip.

b. 3d Battalion. The 592d Company (-) CP will be positioned in the CAM NE Village Complex (AT 980690) in order to support the 3d platoon, Company "L", patrol routes; provide security for the villagers of CAM NE; and provide a focal point for the Civil Affairs conducted in the CAM NE area. The location of the CP will be closely coordinated with Mr. LUONG, the CAM NE District Chief, and the 3d Battalion Civil Affairs Team.

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(2) An extensive ambush system will be established surrounding the Battalion (Fwd) CP (AT 985682) for the next several nights. This step is a measure to curtail the heavy VC activity in that area for the past week.

(3) Beginning at 300800H, a search and clear operation will be conducted in coordination with 1/1, along the YEN River. A strip 100 meters by 4 000 meters along the river will be searched by a platoon, paying particular attention to tunnels along the river's edge. The operation will start from (AT 959658) and move north, 1000 meters each day.

(4) Twelve patrols, five ambushes, three listening posts and three scout-sniper teams are planned during the next twenty-four hours.

10. Civil Affairs

a. Headquarters, 9th Marines - 5,000 pounds of bulgar wheat and 120 gallons of cooking oil were distributed to the battalion CA Officer.

b. Mr. Dave Reid, head of Public Health Department of USOM, the Senior Medical Officer of 1stMarDiv and the Senior Medical Officer of 3d MarDiv met with the CA Officers and Medical Officers of 9th Marines, 1/9, 2/9 and 3/9 to discuss the turnover of sick calls and aid stations to Vietnamese public health officials in pacified areas.

c. The Regimental and Division CA Officers met with the Hoa Vang District Chief and discussed the Province pacification plan for 9 villages south of the CAU DO River in Hoa Vang District. Plans were made for the Province Chief of Land Service and Province Chief of Reconstruction Service to meet with the Hoa Vang District Chief, the Division CA Officer, and the 9th Marines CA Officer and tour the 9 villages including CM NE area tomorrow.

d. 1/9 - The Martin Clemens patrol operating in the village of Hoa Plung (grid squares 0475 and 0570) distributed GVN pamphlets and newsletters. The village chief accompanied the patrol and met with the people of the hamlets of BA TUNG (1), (BT 055706) and KHUE DONG (1), (BT 056705). Over 1000 agricultural pamphlets were also given out.

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The 1/9 Battalion Surgeon inspected the market place at Hoa Long (BT 073704) with the village chief and advised him on sanitary measures.

The school at Hoa Long (BT 073704) was given a new black board and a set of maps for the students use by 1/9.

118 children and adults were treated at the Sacred Heart Orphanage (BT 054752). 500 bars of soap were provided to the Nuns for the children of the orphanage and 152 bars of soap were distributed by the medical teams and the village chief at SON THUY (BT 070710).

e. 3/9 - The newly appointed assistant village chief for Hoa Thai village (including CAM NE) was introduced by the village chief to members of 3/9 and the village chief and his assistant spent the evening in the 3/9 CP and accompanied an ARVN search and sweep mission in CAM NE (6) (AT 975685).

63 villagers were treated by Lima Company at the aid station in CAM NE (6), (AT 975685).

A 12 year old girl was evacuated by helicopter to C&C from An Trach (2), (AT 973655) with a serious cut in the abdomen accidentally self-inflicted.

44 villagers were treated by forward and rear CP BAS.

11. Late Entries

a. At 281215H a reinforced squad from 3d platoon, Company "D", encountered two VC at (BT 053645). Automatic and semi-automatic weapons fire was received. The squad pursued the VC to the VIEN DIEN River. The squad continued to patrol and at 281345H received sniper fire from (BT 059643). There were no Marine casualties.

b. At 281730H the 3d Battalion reported that the 20 VC engaging Mike Company broke contact at 281500H. The 3d Platoon conducted a search of the area of the contact and found only numerous blood stains in the vicinity of (AT 975646). During the fire fight, one VC in a tree was shot in the abdomen and fell from the tree landing on his head.

c. The 3d Platoon, Lima Company, found approximately one hundred and fifty tunnels in CAM NE (2), (AT 975686). Some of these were blown by the platoon; the rest will be filled in by the villagers.

3. General Summary of Events.

a. 1st Battalion. Had no contact with enemy forces as they continue to occupy and patrol the southeast portion of the Regimental TAOR. One 81mm booby trap was destroyed and three VCS were apprehended today.

b. 3d Battalion. Bore the brunt of increased attacks by the VC in the southwest portion of the Regimental TAOR. Two small enemy forces, one platoon size force, and one large VC force were encountered during this period. It is estimated seven VC were killed and ten wounded in a fire fight at the railroad bridge last night. Four VC were killed (body count) by a patrol. Fifteen uniforms, two banners and two urns of rice were destroyed. One Marine was KIA and three WIA during this period.

c. Results of Actions

An 81mm mortar round booby-trapped was destroyed. Fifteen uniforms, two banners and two urns of rice were destroyed.

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4. Activitiesa. Operations(1) 1st Battalion

(a) Company "A" (-) continues to provide security for the Battalion CP at (BT 067714) and is the Battalion reserve. The 3d Platoon is into the third day of its three day combat patrol in an area bounded by the CAN BIEN River, the VIHN DIEN River, and grid line (T67). This morning at approximately 290630H one squad, reinforced by engineers, commenced to clear the coastal route from TRA (BT 080697) to TRA KHE (BT 088672). They uncovered a booty-trapped 81 mm mortar shell at (BT 089687). The Engineer team blew it in place. This morning at 291030H, the 1st Platoon reinforced with three tanks, and two ontos, departed the Battalion CP (BT 067714) to re-supply Company "B".

(b) Company "B" continues to occupy front line position in their assigned portion of the Battalion's TAOR with strong points at (BT 072669) and at (BT 088672). This morning, a patrol was sent north along the coastal road to approximately grid line (T68) to clear the route for the armored convoy which traveled the route to TRA KHE (1), (BT 088672). The 2d Platoon, Company "B", will return with the convoy to the Battalion CP.

(c) Company "C" located at (BT 067714) provides one reinforced platoon for the security of the bridge and water points at (BT 071702) and one reinforced squad at the French bunker at (BT 083697).

(d) Company "D" occupies front line positions at (BT 047670) and at (BT 034670). The company CP is located at (BT 047670). This morning at 291100H, the 3d Platoon apprehended three VCS in the vicinity of (BT 062648). The men had ID cards and were carrying hollowed bamboo logs which are used for signalling. The VCS were turned over to ITT.

(2) 3d Battalion

(a) Company "I" continues to occupy positions from (BT 031656) to (BT 016600). Company "I" mans the check point on Highway 1 at MIEU DONG (1), (BT 017677). The 2d Platoon (rein) conducted a search and clear operation of grid squares (BT 0166) and (BT 0165) beginning at 290800H. No enemy contact was reported.

At approximately 291315H, the India Papa 2 Alpha squad patrol received heavy small arms fire from VC, and sustained one WIA and one KIA. The 3d Battalion reported the location of the patrol as (BT 023650), but the patrol was evidently lost because an AO in the area could see the patrol in the vicinity of (BT 000630). The AO could also see a large VC force closing

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in on the patrol. The AO called a fire mission on twelve VC in trenches at (AT 994630). Sixty rounds of 105mm HE were expended on the target at 291330H. The VC disbursed and the AO reported that they probably had casualties. Two squads and an FO were sent to reinforce the patrol. At 291625H, two F4 fighter aircraft were scrambled and delivered twelve bombs and twenty eight Zuni rockets on targets at (AT 993630). The target area was well covered and four buildings were left burning. The airstrike was controlled by the AO. At 291735H twelve more rounds of 105mm HE were expended on the target, directed by the Company I FO which arrived in the area with the relief force at 291730H.

(b) Company K continues to occupy positions from (AT 973655) to (BT 005658). At 282100H, three VC fired fifteen automatic and semiautomatic carbine rounds from (BT 010660). The fire was returned by Marines at (BT 006660) and fifty more rounds were fired by the VC, thirty of which were tracer. No casualties were sustained and no VC casualties were observed. Thirty-five rice harvesters were observed working in rice paddies at 281900H near (BT 006664). Ten of these seemed to be working extremely slow and paying unusual attention to the company lines. By 282000H all but the ten suspicious persons had left. Visual contact was lost with them because of ensuing darkness. One fragmentation grenade was received at (BT 008659) from an unknown source.

(c) Company L continues to provide security for the FLSG ammunition dump (AT 988733) with two platoons. The 3d platoon (-) remains at YEN NE (3), (AT 985682), as the Battalion CP security, and one squad remains at CAM NE (2), (AT 982687), for security. One squad (rein) provides security for the bridge and water point (AT 998707). At 281940H the ARVN security detachment at the south end of the CAU DO River railroad bridge (AT 998707), opened fire with small arms on six to eight people approaching the bridge from the west. The ARVN unit and a Marine (rein) fire team, at the same position, were immediately taken under small arms fire, both automatic and semiautomatic, from an estimated thirty VC. The VC fire from the east, south and west, about 200 meters from the south end of the bridge. The fire was returned by the whole squad (rein) and the ARVN unit at the bridge, using small arms, with white phosphorous and heat rounds from a 3.5" rocket launcher and 60mm mortar illumination. In about five minutes the VC fire ceased and a fire team search party was sent to retrieve the seven VC bodies visible about 200 meters to the south. The search party was immediately taken under VC fire and was forced to return under cover of friendly return fire. A second search party was dispatched about 30 minutes after the first with the same results.

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At 282130H a 3d search party was sent out but was called back because of a friendly HE mortar mission. 81 mm mortar and artillery illumination was extensively used during the fire fight. A search of the area south of the bridge was made this morning, but the bodies had been removed. At 291025H near (AT 998706), the river check point at (AT 998707) with one Vietnamese male who was carrying a white bag, presumably full of rice which was accidentally dumped into the river when the boat overturned and the bag could not be recovered. At 290055H, two VC were seen near the FLSG ammunition dump (AT 985728). They were challenged, an illumination flare was ignited and six rounds were expended by the Marines. The VC escaped.

(d) Company "M" continues to occupy positions from (AT 975664) to (AT 964668) to (AT 964665) to (AT 970654). Mike Fox, a squad size patrol, received five rounds of semi-automatic carbine fire from (AT 969648) at 290700H. The VC were enveloped by a fire team and withdrew toward (AT 968646). The same patrol located a building at (AT 969641) at 290840H in which they found fifteen uniforms of an unspecified type, two banners upon which chinese characters were painted and two urns of rice. One of the urns was booby-trapped and injured one Marine when he moved the urn. The rice was destroyed. The uniforms and banner are being retrieved. Patrol Mike Fox encountered six or eight VC at (AT 969652) from 291100H to 291230H and a fire fight ensued. The VC had two automatic weapons and six or eight carbines. The patrol, by firing and maneuvering, forced the enemy to withdraw toward (AT 967637). The Marines pursued for 500 to 600 meters and contact was lost. The patrol sustained two WIA and killed four VC, body count.

b. Patrols

a. 1/9 - The Martin Clemens patrol in its 2d day of operation continued through the hamlets of BINH-KY (2), (BT 059699), KHUE DONG (BT 056706) and HAI AN (BT 055713) with the village chief of HOA PLUNG accompanying the patrol and distributing GVN pamphlets and agricultural matter. Medical personnel with the patrol treated 31 civilians. 213 bars of soap were distributed.

b. 3/9 - A civilian medical representative from District Hdqrs assisted in the treatment of civilians at CAM NE (6), (AT 981688). 47 people were treated. The village Chief of HOA PHUOC has given a list of 22 hardcore VC in his area. He states that these people work in the area during the day and hold ID cards that appear authentic.

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The list includes persons in the hamlet of QUU GIANG (BT 015665) NHON THO (1), (BT 004657) and TAN HANH (BT 000655). This list was verified by the Village Chief of QUU GIANG, Mr. HUYNH and the info was turned over to the S-2. 107 civilians were treated by company corpsman in 3/9 areas and at the BLS.

11. Late Entries. At 291800H Senator 2 reported that the following contraband was confiscated at the Highway 1 check point in MIEU DONG (BT 017687); two cans of fish sauce, three five gallon cans of gas, and twenty 1.5v batteries. Three suspicious persons were apprehended and sent to HOA VANG District Headquarters.

3. General Summary of Events

a. 1st Battalion. The 1st Battalion continues to occupy and defend the southeast portion of the Regimental TAOR with extensive patrols in the assigned areas. The 1st Battalion apprehended four VCS during this reporting period. There were no friendly KIA's or WIA's during the subject period.

b. 3d Battalion. The 3d Battalion continues to occupy positions along Phase Line Orange. Operation MUSKRAT was begun and moved north 600 meters the first day. A search and clear operation was conducted through LE SON (3). Three small enemy forces were encountered resulting in one Marine WIA and two VC WIA's. Five VCS was apprehended. 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4. Activitiesa. Operations(1) 1st Battalion

(a) Company "A" remains in Battalion reserve with the 2d and 3d Platoon at the Battalion CP site providing perimeter security while the 1st Platoon is temporarily in position with Company "B" at (BT 092668) as a temporary replacement for the 2d Platoon of Company "B" which is being transferred. The 3d Platoon of Company "A" acted as a blocking force for an ARVN search and destroy sweep this morning. The platoon was in position along the eastern bank of the VINH DIEN River in grid square (BT 0368) by 300600H. At 301000H while performing its blocking mission the 3d Platoon checked personnel in MAN QUAN (1), (BT 031688) for ID cards. Two VCS were apprehended due to the fact that they had faulty ID cards. The VCS were turned over to the 1st Battalion S-2 office and later taken to ITT.

(b) Company "B" continues to occupy and defend front line positions in their assigned portion of the Battalion's TAOR with its own 1st Platoon and the 1st platoon of Company "A" at (BT 092668) with the Company CP and the 3d Platoon at (BT 072669). This morning at 300500H, the 1st Platoon of Company "B" dispatched a squad size combat patrol designated Redwood Bravo Homer 30 Alpha. At 300830H, in the vicinity of (BT 093644) this patrol made contact with four armed VC. The VC ran and the patrol immediately opened fire on them. A stray round went into a building wounding an elderly Vietnamese female in the calf. The woman was evacuated by helicopter. No friendly casualties were sustained. No VC casualties were observed.

(c) Company "C" at 300800H commenced on position relief of Company "D" of front line positions in the western portion of the Battalion's TAOR at (BT 048668), (BT 060662) and (BT 062648). By 301100H the 1st Platoon and 2d Platoon of Company "C" had relieved the 1st and 2d Platoons of Company "D" respectively. The 1st Platoon of Company "C" is now at (BT 060662) and the 2d Platoon is at (BT 048668) with the Company CP. At 301418 the 3d Platoon of Company "C" effected relief of the 3d Platoon of Company "D" at (BT 072669).

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(d) Company "D". At 300615H the 1st Squad of the 2d Platoon of Company "D" while on a combat patrol, entered a building in the vicinity of (BT 041662) and a Vietnamese male ran out. The man was told to halt but he continued to run. The patrol opened fire on him but missed. The man escaped without injuries. One other man who was in the same building was apprehended and was later cleared by the ARVN with the patrol and released. The same patrol, on their return route, checked a young Vietnamese male for identification at (BT 036649). This man did not have proper identification and was turned over to the 1st Battalion S-2 Office and later taken to ITT. At 300730H a patrol dispatched by the 2d Platoon of Company "D" was operating in the vicinity of (BT 046654). A young Vietnamese male spotted the patrol approaching and immediately halted and threw up his hands. The patrol apprehended the man and searched him. He failed to have proper identification and was turned over to the 1st Battalion S-2 Office. He was later turned over to ITT. At 300800H an on position relief of Company "D" by Company "C" commenced. By 301100H the 1st and 2d Platoon of Company "D" had been relieved by the 1st and 2d Platoon of Company "C" respectively. The 1st and 2d Platoon of Company "D" moved back to occupy positions at the 1st Battalion's CP site at (BT 067713). By 301418H the 3d Platoon of Company "D" had been relieved by the 3d Platoon of Company "C". The 3d Platoon of Company "D" moved back to the Battalion CP site. At 301600H one reinforced squad from the 1st Platoon of Company "D" occupied positions at the French bunker at (BT 081696) and one reinforced squad of the 1st Platoon occupied positions at the bridge and water point at (BT 071701). Elements of Company "D" will also occupy OP's at (BT 068711) and (BT 075710).

(2) 3d Battalion

(a) Company "I" shifted their lines this morning to occupy positions from (BT 034654) to (BT 999663). The report submitted yesterday concerning the enemy contact in grid square (BT 0063) had some errors due to inadequate communication. The following reports is completed and accurate. At about 291150 the squad size patrol India Papa 2 encountered a group of five or six VC and began pursuing them. At about 291350 the VC formed a horseshoe, with reinforcement from (BT 006638) to (BT 000629) to (BT 995632) and pinned down the Marine squad at (BT 001633). The patrol sustained one KIA and one WIA at this period. A helicopter in the area was unable to evacuate the KIA or WIA because of enemy fire.

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At 291230H a reinforced squad was sent out to find the patrol because radio contact had been lost and the patrol was over due. The reinforcements received extensive sniper fire at (BT 002635) and had sustained several heat casualties in their haste to aid the pinned down squad. The reinforcements covered the withdrawal of the patrol. The patrol and reinforcements united, an air strike was directed by the AO that was on station. Two F4's dropped twelve bombs and twenty four Zuni rockets on target at (AT 998636) and (AT 998630). Twelve rounds, 105mm were fired into the same area. At 291815H helo evacuation was made for the three casualties. A third Marine was wounded during the fire fight. The force being low on water and ammo and their number cut to only 20 effectives because of heat casualties, began moving back towards their Company area at 291845H. They received sniper fire at (BT 001640). Artillery fire was called in at (BT 001634) to (BT 008643). The Marine force returned to the Company area at 292100H.

(b) Company "K" shifted their front lines at 300800H this morning and now occupy positions from (AT 999663) to (AT 972660). At 292145H one VC was seen approaching an ambush site at (AT 974655). The ambush opened fire with forty-seven small arms rounds. The VC was seen falling and moaned and then stopped moaning. Two other VC returned fire and the patrol could not recover the body. A search was conducted at first light and blood stains were found. At first light a search and clear mission was conducted in LE SON (3), (AT 978647), by this Company. A psy-war team in an aircraft told the villagers to move to LE SON (2), (AT 973653) before the search and clear operation was conducted. Some fire was received and about ten tunnels were blown. The operation was completed by 291045H and the villagers moved back to LE SON (3). The 1st platoon, Company "M", conducted the actual sweep of LE SON (3). The 1st platoon, Company "K" surrounded the hamlet as a blocking force prior to first light and passed out propaganda leaflets as the villagers moved to LE SON (2). At 301220H one mighty-mite and trailer with three Marines was travelling along the road at (BT 002662) when about ten VC fired and threw two grenades at the vehicle. One grenade landed in the trailer, wounding one Marine. The VC were taken under fire and two were knocked down by rounds and presumably wounded. The VC escaped.

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(c) Company "L" continues to provide security for the FLSG ammunition dump (AT 988733) with two platoons. The 3d platoon (-) remains at YEN NE (3), (AT 985682), as the battalion (Fwd) CP security, and one squad remains at CAM NE (2), (AT 982687) for security. One squad (rein) provides security for the bridge and water point (AT 998707). At 292125H, in the vicinity of (AT 981687), six rounds were received by the 3d platoon. Two grenades, and small arms fire was returned and the enemy broke contact. No casualties were received and no VC were wounded. From 292200H to 292400H the school house at (AT 981687) received approximately forty rounds of enemy fire, mostly from semi-automatic weapons. A burst of six or seven rounds came from what appeared to be a grease gun. Each time fire was received, the 2d squad, 3d squad, returned fire and conducted a quick area search. At first light a thorough search was conducted, but no indications of VC wounded were found. While the 2d squad, 2d platoon, was conducting a routine search of a bus, at the railroad bridge (AT 998707); a VCS was apprehended for lack of proper identification at 300710H.

(d) Company "M" continues to occupy positions from (AT 975664) to (AT 964668) to (AT 964655) to (AT 970654) with the 1st and 3d platoons (rein). The 2d platoon is conducting operation MUSKRAT and will occupy positions in the vicinity of (AT 967668) during the night and continue their mission in the morning. The 1st platoon participated in the search and destroy operation of LE SON (3), (AT 975645), under operational control of Company "K". Operation MUSKRAT disclosed a camouflaged hole five feet deep and five feet on each side at (AT 960658). The hole was blown. c. 2d Battalion Fifty-one civilians were treated at the HO. TIEN Buddhist Refugee Camp at (BT 033755) and 100 lbs. of corn meal was given to the assistant camp chief and it was distributed to the camp.

d. 3d Battalion Forty-two villagers were treated at the school house in CAM NE (6), (AT 975685). Eighty-five civilians were treated in company areas and in the B.S. During the operation in LE SON (3), (At 977646) two hundred and four

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persons reported to the civilian collection point. Fifteen cases of rations were distributed to these persons, who were all women and old men, and medical aid was given to fifty of them.

11. Late Entries.

a. At 301715H, the 3d Battalion reported that Company K destroyed four holes in LE SON (3), (LT 977646), today. In the vicinity of (LT 978639) two men who seemed to be carrying rifles were spotted running across a rice paddy. Three rounds were fired at the men. It appeared the men were hit, but they escaped. Two women without identification who were giving the ARVN a hard time, were apprehended as VCS.

3. General Summary of Events. The Ninth Marines conducted twenty-six patrols. Eight of these were day patrols. Ten ambushes and six listening posts were established during the night. Five scout-sniper teams were employed.

a. 1st Battalion. During the last twenty-four hours, the 1st Battalion conducted twelve patrols, established four ambushes and two listening posts, and employed one scout-sniper team. The 1st Battalion killed four VC (body count) wounded four VC, and captured one VCS. Enemy equipment captured was one carbine rifle, one cartridge belt, one medical kit, and five Chinese Communist grenades. The 1st Battalion sustained four casualties during this reporting period.

b. 3d Battalion. The 3d Battalion conducted two day patrols and twelve night patrols, all of which were squad size. Six ambushes, four listening posts, and four scout-sniper teams were established last night. Operation Muskrat continued on schedule without enemy contact. A search and clear operation was conducted in LE SON(4) this morning. Three small, enemy forces were encountered during this period resulting in one Marine killed and one Marine wounded. Enemy casualties were undetermined. The CO, 3d Battalion was wounded by a mine along with one other Marine.

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4. Activitiesa. Operations(1) 3d Battalion

(a) Company "I". Yesterday the Highway 1 check point at MIEU DONG (BT 017677) confiscated eleven gallons of gasoline, thirty gallons of fish sause, 100,000 units of penicillin, twenty atropine syrettes, five boxes of sulphur, five boxes of aspirin and 500 pounds of corn. Four VCS were apprehended. The goods and personnel were turned over to HOA VANG District Headquarters. India Papa Charlie, a squad size patrol, received one grenade, semi-automatic fire and automatic fire from (BT 028658) at 302330H. The patrol returned fire with small arms, three M-79 rounds and three 3.5" rocket rounds while assualting the enemy who withdrew. One KIA and one WIA were sustained. Both were helo-evacuated. Again at 302335H the patrol received automatic and semi-automatic carbine fire from (BT 024657). The Marines returned fire and illuminated the area; the VC broke contact and fled. Enemy casualties from the two actions could not be determined. India Papa Alpha, a squad size patrol, fought an estimated six VC at 010100H near (BT 033646). Half of the enemy had automatic weapons; the remainder fired semi-automatic weapons. A fire team enveloped the enemy force and received fire from another enemy force of four VC from (BT 034640). The VC fire was returned and the VC broke contact. A quick area search was conducted which showed no indication of VC wounded. Prior to enemy withdrawal, drums were heard in the area and ceased as the enemy withdrew. A small child was brought into the 2d platoons area, (BT 002661), with a bullet wound in the leg at 010726H. The origin of the wound is unknown. The child was helo-evecuated to the DA NANG Hospital.

(b) Company "K". Movement was observed in the vicinity of (LT 994650) by the AN/TPS-21 radar at 302100H. Several 50 cal. spotter rounds were used to mark the target and fire was delivered by a fire team at the suspected target. 81 mm mortar illumination was used, and one man was seen crouching in the rice paddy. Two rounds were received by the Marines and the VC withdrew with no apparent casualties. At first light this morning the 3d platoon surrounded LE SON (4) (LT 962647). The 3d platoon, Company "H", under operational control of Company "K", conducted a search and clear operation on LE SON (4) beginning at 010800H. A psy-war team in an aircraft used a loud speaker to tell the villagers to move to the civilian collection point at (LT 970655) prior to the operation.

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Three sniper rounds were fired at the helicopter from inside the hamlet. Approximately 850 pounds of unhusked rice were discovered in three fifty-five gallon drums in the hamlet. Ten fighting holes, five feet by three feet, and six twenty-five foot trenches were destroyed with twenty-five pounds of TNT and three WP grenades. One fifty foot trench and one 100 foot trench and eight fighting holes were destroyed at (AT 963647) with twenty-five pounds of TNT, five WP grenades and one fragmentation grenade.

(c) Company "L". At 302325, three or four VC were spotted advancing on the school house (AT 981687), from the north and northwest. Ten rounds small arms fire was received. Five 81 mm mortars illumination rounds and four hand grenades were returned. The enemy withdrew. Patrol Papa 300 apprehended one VCS at 011225H near (AT 982683) who appeared very nervous and had no identification.

(d) Company "M" 2d Platoon on operation Muskrat, remained last night at (AT 967668). At 301950H approximately forty rounds of semi-automatic carbine fire was received from (AT 960650) to (AT 968654). One M-79 round and twenty small arms rounds were returned and the sniping ceased. Mike Papa 30A received approximately ten rounds of enemy fire two semi-automatic and one automatic weapon at 010230H from (AT 962654). The patrol did not return fire and continued on patrol route searching for VC and finding none. Operation Muskrat continued moving north at 010800H. Two spider holes were found near (AT 965666) and were destroyed. At (AT 966667) five fighting holes, three feet by five feet, one of which was booby-trapped by a hand grenade, were destroyed and two gates were blown. At (AT 965672) a tunnel network and several holes and trenches were destroyed with fifty pounds of TNT.

(2) 1st Battalion

(a) Company "A" remains in Battalion reserve at (BT 068715). Company "L" also provides security for the Battalion CP. The 1st Platoon returned to the Company CP after being relieved by the 2d Platoon of Company "B".

(b) Company "B". At 010200H the 2d Platoon of Company "B" commenced a platoon size combat patrol which was to cover grid square (BT 1163) and (BT 1064). This patrol dropped off an ambush in the vicinity of (BT 118634) and the patrol continued along the route. At 010730H the ambush spotted armed VC coming out of a village. The ambush opened fire killing four of the VC. The bodies were left in the village. One VCS was apprehended in the village where the VC came from, and was turned over to ITT. Hearing the fire fight, the patrol doubled back and made contact with what the Company Commander estimated to be two VC Companies. One hard Corps Company, dressed in helmets, cartridge belts and packs, and one local guerilla Company. They were armed with four or five automatic weapons, an undetermined number of carbines and many grenades. When the VC spotted the patrol they set in a one-hundred eighty degree perimeter and commenced firing. The patrol returned fire with small arms semi-automatic and automatic weapons. The VC broke contact. As a result of the fire fight one Marine was wounded in the chest, and three V were wounded. There were no confirmed VC KIA. The Marine WIA was evacuated by helicopter and was in critical condition. The patrol returned to the Company CP.

(c) Company "C". At 011200H in the vicinity of (BT 054644) a patrol from Company "C" set off a booby trapped grenade attached to a gate. Three Marines were wounded by schrapnel. The wounded Marines were taken back to the Platoon Patrol Base and evacuated by LVT. The wounds were not considered to be serious.

(d) Company "D". At 010245H the 1st squad, 1st Platoon, Company "D", reported that the AN/TPS-21 in position at the water point at (BT 701071) picked up three people one hundred yards out moving towards their positions. They requested 81 mm mortar illumination and eleven rounds were fired.

8. Plans

a. 1st Battalion. The 1st Battalion will continue to occupy its portion of the regimental T4OR with extensive patrols in the assigned areas. During the next twenty-four hours the 1st Battalion plans to conduct thirteen patrols, establish three ambushes and two scout-sniper teams. Added emphasis will be placed on the civil affairs program and Golden Fleece operation.

b. 3d Battalion. The 3d Battalion will continue to occupy positions along Phase Line Orange. Operation Muskrat will continue as scheduled and a clear and search operation will be conducted in the hamlets at (LT 969648) and (LT 966647) tomorrow. Fourteen patrols, six ambushes, four listening posts and four scout-sniper teams are planned for tomorrow.

10. Civil Affairs

a. Hqs, 9thMar - 3000 lbs of corn meal, 22 soccer balls, 3 boxes of vitamins, 11 boxes of soap, 75 bottles of milk of magnesia and 200 dolls were received from Division CM Officer for distribution.

b. 1/9 - The Battalion CM Officer presented another blackboard to the Village Chief for use of the HOA LANG School (BT 073704). The school teacher and children installed the board. The project for the school latrine is now underway with materials being furnished by MCB-9 and the villagers accomplishing the labor under supervision of 1/9 personnel. The aid station of the Sacred Heart Orphanage (BT 054752) treated 40 civilians and Company "C" treated 10 children at KAI TAY (BT 047667).

c. 2/9 - 55 villagers were treated by a medical team at HOA TIEN (BT 033755).

d. 3/9 - 240 civilians were fed at the civilian collecting point established at LE SON (LT 977646) during a search and clear mission. 42 civilians were treated at CM NE (6), (LT 975685); 37 at MIEU DONG (1), (BT 018680); 11 at THAN BIN (BT 002722); 6 at AN TRACH (LT 967665); and 25 at the BAS for a total of 121 civilians.

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11. Late Entries

a. 1st Battalion. At 011400H a patrol dispatched by the 2d Platoon of Company "C" discovered a man digging a hole at (BT 048671). The man attempted to run and was told to halt but failed to do so. The patrol shot and killed the man. One VCS was apprehended at the same spot. The body of the dead man and the VCS were evacuated to the water point (BT 071701) where the body was buried. The VCS was later taken to ITT. Military uniforms were found in the hole with diary and pictures in one of the pockets. These items were turned over to the 1st Battalion S-2 Office.

b. 3d Battalion.

(1) During the search and clear operation of LE SON (4), (AT 959656), punji traps, booby traps and a six foot tunnel at (AT 959654) were discovered. All were destroyed.

(2) On operation Muskrat, four fighting holes were found near (AT 967669) and destroyed. A tunnel, of as yet undermined extent, was found in the same vicinity. At (AT 968670) five holes, six feet by four feet by three, with air holes, were found and destroyed. The 2d Platoon, Company "M", has set up a 360 degree defense at (AT 967671).

(3) At 011415H, the CO, 3d Battalion, and a recon party of fourteen men were checking out the railroad bridge at (AT 991642). Lt Colonel R. J. TUNNEL stepped on a mine on the railroad embankment on the north side of the bridge. As a covering force was withdrawing from the south end of the bridge another mine was detonated, resulting in another WIA. Sniper fire from the east and west side of the railroad bridge was suppressed by a HU-IE. Lt Colonel TUNNEL'S leg was traumatically amputated by the mine explosion. The mines were estimated to be one pound of TNT, detonated by pressure. Major R. E. EIDSON assumed command at 011415H. A vietnamese woman was brought to the Company "M" CP (AT 972667) at 011605H with wounds that required helo-evacuation. She was taken to the DA NANG Hospital at 011406H. The nature of the wound has not been reported.

(4) The check point on Highway 1 at MIEU DONG (BT 017677) apprehended one female VCS and two boxes of batteries today. The woman and the batteries were taken to HOA VIANG District Headquarters.

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
