



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PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

From 1 through 2 January 1969, 1st Battalion, 9th Marines was staged at Vandegrift Combat Base. On 2 January the battalion, additionally having operational control of one company of the 3d Battalion, 9th Marines, commenced operations northwest of Khe Sanh in Huong Ho province on Operation Dawson River West. This operation terminated on 12 January, and for the remainder of the month the battalion was tasked with the security of Vandegrift Combat Base, Co Lu, Hill 601, FSB Cates, FCB Shiloh and Hill 950.

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PART III

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS1. Combat Mission Assigned.

On 2 January 1969 to conduct an heliborne assault simultaneously into multiple landing zones, secured by recon teams, near the ~~Laotian~~ border, committing all available forces, and to conduct clearing operation to the east in cooperation and coordination with the 2d ARVN Regiment.

a. 9th Marines Operation Order 1-69, 30 December 1968.

- (1) At L-Hour on 2 January 1st Battalion, 9th Marines conduct a heliborne assault to assist in establishing FSB GRIGER, vicinity XD 745440.
- (2) Conduct a heliborne assaults into LZ BAGPIPE, vicinity XD 692445, LZ COPPER, vicinity XD 706440, and LZ SHENANDOAH, vicinity XD 688420. LZ GRAND, vicinity XD 686455 and LZ PUFF, vicinity XD 709428, are designated alternate LZ's.
- (3) Conduct detailed clearing operations to the east in cooperation and coordination with the 2d ARVN Regiment.

b. 1st Battalion, 9th Marines Operation Order 1-69, 1 January 1969.

- (1) At L-Hour secure FSB GRIGER with Company L, 3d Battalion, 9th Marines followed by heliborne assault with four 1/4 companies and command group into designated LZ's to seize, occupy and defend Regimental Objectives 2 and 3 and designated battalion objectives within assigned AO's.
- (2) Company A at L-Hour conduct a heliborne assault into LZ COPPER to seize, occupy and defend the most favorable terrain in vicinity of LZ. Secure LZ COPPER for administrative landing of Command Group and Company C. On order conduct detailed patrol activities orienting to the north and east. Provide Command Post security, and be prepared to provide a company minus as the battalion reserve on order.
- (3) Company B at L-Hour conduct heliborne assault into LZ BAGPIPE. On order, along route of advance, seize, occupy and defend battalion objective Bravo. On order conduct detailed search and clear operations along axis of advance BLUE.
- (4) Company C on order conduct heli-lift to LZ COPPER. Upon reorganization vicinity LZ COPPER conduct search/clear operations along route of advance, seize, occupy and defend battalion objective CHARLIE.
- (5) Company D on order conduct a heliborne assault into LZ SHENANDOAH. On order and along route of advance, attack, seize occupy and defend battalion objective DELTA. On order conduct detailed search and clear operations along axis of advance GREEN to include regimental objectives 2 and 3.

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS1. Combat Mission Assigned.

On 2 January 1969 to conduct an heliborne assault simultaneously into multiple landing zones, secured by recon teams, near the Laotian border, committing all available forces, and to conduct clearing operation to the east in cooperation and coordination with the 2d ARVN Regiment.

a. 9th Marines Operation Order 1-69, 30 December 1968.

- (1) At L-Hour on 2 January 1st Battalion, 9th Marines conduct a heliborne assault to assist in establishing FSB GRIGER, vicinity XD 745440.
- (2) Conduct a heliborne assaults into LZ BAGPIPE, vicinity XD 692445, LZ COPPER, vicinity XD 706440, and LZ SHENANDOAH, vicinity XD 688420. LZ GRAND, vicinity XD 686455 and LZ PUFF, vicinity XD 709428, are designated alternate LZ's.
- (3) Conduct detailed clearing operations to the east in cooperation and coordination with the 2d ARVN Regiment.

b. 1st Battalion, 9th Marines Operation Order 1-69, 1 January 1969.

- (1) At L-Hour secure FSB GRIGER with Company I, 3d Battalion, 9th Marines followed by heliborne assault with four 1/9 companies and command group into designated LZ's to seize, occupy and defend Regimental Objectives 2 and 3 and designated battalion objectives within assigned AO's.
- (2) Company A at L-Hour conduct a heliborne assault into LZ COPPER to seize, occupy and defend the most favorable terrain in vicinity of LZ. Secure LZ COPPER for administrative landing of Command Group and Company C. On order conduct detailed patrol activities orienting to the north and east. Provide Command Post security, and be prepared to provide a company, minus as the battalion reserve on order.
- (3) Company B at L-Hour conduct heliborne assault into LZ BAGPIPE. On order, along route of advance, seize, occupy and defend battalion objective Bravo. On order conduct detailed search and clear operations along axis of advance BLUE.
- (4) Company C on order conduct heli-lift to LZ COPPER. Upon reorganization vicinity LZ COPPER conduct search/clear operations along route of advance, seize, occupy and defend battalion objective CHARLIE.
- (5) Company D on order conduct a heliborne assault into LZ SHENANDOAH. On order and along route of advance, attack, seize occupy and defend battalion objective DELTA. On order conduct detailed search and clear operations along axis of advance GRIGER to include regimental objectives 2 and 3.

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(6) Company L at L-Hour conduct heliborne assault into FSB GEIGER and provide security as required for fire support elements at FSB GEIGER. Conduct local search/clear operations as practicable in vicinity of GEIGER.

c. 1st Battalion, 9th Marines Frag Order 1-69, 2 January 1969.

- (1) Company C assume the mission of Company B. Move to battalion objective D then along axis GREEN.
- (2) Company D assume the mission of Company L as fire support base security.
- (3) Company L move to objective CH'ELIE, then assume the mission of Company C along axis R'D.

d. 1st Battalion, 9th Marines Frag Order 2-69, 4 January 1969.

- (1) Companies will establish combat operating bases at their current positions due to impending bad weather in the next 48 to 72 hours.

e. 1st Battalion, 9th Marines Frag Order 3-69, 7 January 1969.

- (1) On 8 January the Command Group and two companies will move to FSB GEIGER. The companies will then move into their new AO's.
- (2) Company I move from current position to a new AO and conduct search and destroy operations within it, including regimental objectives 2 and 3.
- (3) Company B conduct search and destroy operations within new AO orienting movement to the north and east. AO as follows: commencing at artillery fan at XD 675476 southeast along the stream to the trail junction at XD 725465, then along the trail north to XD 748471, then northwest to the stream at XD 740487, along the stream to XD 705494, then west to the artillery fan.
- (4) Company C be prepared to make covered movement to FSB GEIGER and then move to assigned AO generally southeast of GEIGER. Upon arrival at GEIGER move to assigned AO generally northeast of GEIGER.

f. 9th Marines Frag Order 1-69, 9 January 1969.

- (1) 1st Battalion, 9th Marines seize, occupy and defend Hill 557, vicinity XD 769413 with one company. Be prepared to receive one section of 106mm and a 107mm mortar battery.

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g. 9th Marines Warning Order, 11 January 1969.

(1) 1st Battalion, 9th Marines relieve 2d Battalion, 9th Marines of security responsibilities for FSB CATTES, Hill 691 and Hill 950. Minimum forces for Hill 691 and FSB CATTES is a reinforced company and for Hill 950 a reinforced platoon.

h. 1st Battalion, 9th Marines Warning Order, 11 January 1969.

(1) Company B be prepared earliest 13 January to conduct a covered helilift to FSB CATTES and Hill 691, (XD 927412) to relieve and assume responsibility for those positions. Perimeter security at CATTES will be a company minus one platoon, reinforced with a section of 81's, the platoon will assume the security of Hill 691, reinforced with a section of 106rr.

i. 1st Battalion, 9th Marines Warning Order, 12 January 1969.

(1) Company C be prepared on order, earliest 13 January, to change one platoon to Company B to assume physical responsibility of Hill 950, XD 845455.

j. 9th Marines Frag Order 2-69, 14 January 1969.

(1) 1st Battalion, 9th Marines continue security mission for FSB CATTES, and Hills 691 and 950. Provide Bald Eagle/Sparrow Hawk unit, assume responsibility for security of VCB, Ca Tu, and Signal Hill, and assume command of the 1st and 2d platoons, Company E, 2d Battalion, 9th Marines for security of Signal Hill.

k. 9th Marines Directive, 14 January 1969.

(1) 1st Battalion, 9th Marines to assume command of 3d Platoon, Company K, 3d Battalion, 9th Marines on Hill 950.

l. 9th Marines Directive, 16 January 1969.

(1) Company F, 2d Battalion, 9th Marines chores to 1st Battalion, 9th Marines.

m. 9th Marines Directive, 16 January 1969.

(1) 1st Battalion, 9th Marines chores 2d platoon; Company F, 2d Battalion, 9th Marines back to 2d Battalion, 9th Marines.

n. 9th Marines Directive, 18 January 1969.

(1) Company E, 2d Battalion, 9th Marines chores to 1st Battalion, 9th Marines.

(1) Company F establish a Combat Operating Base vicinity XD 966500 and conduct search and destroy operations within the 8000 meter artillery fan from Co. 1 Lu.

p. 9th Marines Directive, 20 January 1969.

(1) 1st Battalion, 9th Marines is relieved of Sparrow Hawk/Bald Eagle requirement effective 210600H January 1969.

q. 9th Marines Directive, 21 January 1969.

(1) 1st Battalion, 9th Marines chores open of Company F, 2d Battalion, 9th Marines.

r. 9th Marines Directive, 22 January 1969.

(1) Companies B and C (-) and 2d platoon of Company D chores to 4th Marines.

s. 9th Marines Directive, 24 January 1969.

(1) Effective 0600H 25 January Company D chores to 4th Marines.

t. 9th Marines Directive, 30 January 1969.

(1) Effective immediately Company A chores to 9th Marines.

2. Operation.

02 JAN At 1230H at XD 692442 Company B found a fighting position large enough for three persons and automatic weapons, and destroyed it. At 1325H Company A found a land mine buried in the middle off a road at XD 715439 and marked it. At 1400H at XD 706439 Company A found some gravel mines. One man stepped on one and set it off but was not injured. At 1400H an UH-1E gunship received several bursts of automatic weapons fire from XD 768428, and returned fire with rockets and 7.62. It reported a secondary explosion and sighted 1 confirmed KI. The gunship continued to receive fire. An AC controlled fixed wing air strikes and adjusted artillery on the grid. At 1400H at XD 709427 Company I found four bunkers (4'x4'x4') and a circle of dirt 5' across with a mound in the center, thought to be a mortar position or gun emplacement, and all thought to be 6 months old.

03 JAN At 0800H at XD 682419 Company C found a trail and communications wire running north and south, and the trail appeared to have been used 10 to 15 days previously. At 0800H at XD 701431 Company L found a trail running north and south six months old and not recently used. There was communication wire on both sides of the trail. At 0930H at XD 682432 Company B found 4 incoming holes (3'x9'x5') with coverings, one horse-

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shoe type living quarters (4x3 meters), 1 trench (4x1x1½ meters) one 12.7mm anti-aircraft position, and 200 rounds of 12.7mm ammunition. At 1415H at XD 6.7411 Company C found 15 bunkers, of dimensions between 4'x6'x4' and 8'x12'x4' which were 6-10 meters off.

04 JA at 0910H at XD 6.7409 Company C, while digging in an area for possible caches, found one NVA body, badly deteriorated, and searched it for documents with no positive results. At 1000H at XD 6.72434 Company I sighted 2 NVA in trees, and called on artillery mission on the grid with unknown results. At 0730H at XD 723444 Company A found one A-frame bunker 12'x3'x4' with 3' of dirt and destroyed it after checking it out with negative results. At 1130H at XD 6.7412 Company C found what was believed to be an NVA training area, because it discovered a torn Chinese communist grenade, 3.8 rifle and AK-47 tracers. Company C also found a souvenir cup with a name and a picture of an anti-aircraft gun shooting down a U.S. plane. The cup had "U.S. BATT" engraved on it and the date 8-4-68. At 1130H a patrol at XD 6.76435 found a trail 2' wide and 1-1½ months old, running north and south. At 1100H at XD 706410 Company A found 3 bunkers 5'x5'x4' with 1' of dirt covering. The bunkers had 2 entrances. At 1100H at XD 722434 Company A found 2 bomblets, 3" - 3½" in diameter, 6" - 10" long with 5 fins on the tail and a 1cm switch on the head. At 1300H at XD 6.6409 Company C found one H-2 carbine, 3 NVA gas masks, 7 B-tools, various medicines, old 7.62mm gear and 3 NVA bodies. These were found in a 3 bunker complex, and each bunker had a metal sign on it. First sign: H-2 carb-NVA, VP 6.7-3. Second sign: U, 2.16 Pham. V. Lao. Third sign U, 2.16, PHAM. V. SINH. The bodies were badly deteriorated. Micrograph sheets believed to be from the Cho Lon area, were also found.

05 JA At 0400H at XD 6.75450 Company I heard movement 15-20 meters in front of line, had took the movement under fire with small arms and 1 round of 60mm H.D., but with negative results. At 0930H at XD 6.7421 Company I found a trail 3' wide, 4 months old and not recently used. At 1600H from XD 6.7434 to XD 6.65025 Company I found a trail 2' wide and 6 months old running in a southeast direction and communications wire running from XD 6.7434 to XD 6.6427 with a cut for field telephone. Metted down elephant grass, about 3 days old, believed to be a sleeping area for a small CO, an NVA pack possibly used to carry warheads, and some empty C-ration cans were also discovered. At XD 6.65425 an arrow, pointing south, on a tree, and a machine gun tree (C CO) pointing south, were found. At 2300H at XD 6.75554 Company I sighted 3 anti-aircraft positions fire at. A fire mission was called in producing 15-20 secondary explosions. The explosions were larger than several 250 lbs. bombs.

06 JA At 1000H at XD 6.7410 Company C found 4 metal signs; 1st sign: 7, 2nd sign: 8, 3d sign: TRAN XUAN KHAN, CHINE SY KA VIE TAG, VIET NAM, THAI SINH, VI SINH 6-6-68

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4th sign: LE VIET THUC
 TRUNG Q TRUONG
 XANH DAY BINH
 TIEP HC
 H&V BAC HxS 6-6-68, 3T

Signs 3 and 4 were found on graves, one body in each grave, at least 6 feet long, thought to be officers and possibly Chinese Communist. They had large daisy insignias on their collars and belts, and the graves were fenced off by bamboo at 1210H. At XD 746444 Company D found a jacket of the type used by helicopter flight crews. At 1245H at XD 681427 Company L found 4 incoming holes, 4-6 months old and 3'x3'x6', and a sleeping area and metted down elephant grass. At 1415H at XD ~~748448~~ Company D found a trail running north and south 3-4 weeks old. At 1420H at XD 685419 Company L found a well used trail running on a 300 degree azimuth, and varying in width from 2'-3'. At 1630H at XD 689410 Company C found 1 officer's insignia of unknown rank and nationality, a radio accessory bag with 1 whir and 2 tape antenna bases, a handset, earphones, an NVI battery, a gas mask, 2 E-tools and some type of medical wrapping, all NVI. At 1715H at XD 745431 and XD 737425 respectively Company D sighted 3 and then 20 NVA in the open, and called a fire mission on the treeline into which they ran, with good coverage but with unknown results. Company D also fired .50 cal machineguns on the target, and at the end of the mission the company saw 2 more NVI, possibly carrying a mortar, Artillery shot again with indirect fire with unknown results. At 1745H at XD 688410, XD 688416, and XD 686406 Company C saw movement and took a total of about 250 small arms in a three sided probe. Fire was returned with 81mm, small arms, artillery and 60mm with negative results.

06 JAN At 1600H at XD 384420 Company L found 30-40 huts, and encountered one NVA, who ran into the woods. The area was reconned by fire and checked out, and fresh sneaker tracks were found. The individual was then pursued, and several 3' bridges with rails, markings on trees, and fighting holes were found.

07 JAN At 0925H at XD 745431 Company D found 1 enemy fighting hole, 1 year old of dimensions 2'x2'x3'. At 1100H at XD 688413 Company L found 2 well camouflaged bunkers, recently used (6'x6'x10') and the remains of an NVA pack and an AK-47 stock, possibly hit by artillery, living on top of a bunker. At 1130H at XD 694418 Company L found 11 huts (6'x8') made of bamboo, 2-3 months old. A very old trail was also found at the grid running in a northwest direction. At 1200H at 688413 Company L found a hut - bunker complex with 10 - 15 bunkers more than the combined hut - bunkers, used within the previous 24 hours. The biggest hut was 35' - 40' long. Company L also found 250' of communications wire that led to a bunker containing rolls of 200 - 300 meters of red, black and blue wire, medical supplies, battle dressings, bottles of aspirin and other medicine, 5 picks, 4-5 blankets, 2 E-tools, 3 batteries, 2 helmets, various pots and pans, plastic coverings, cans of powdered milk and a plastic hat. One NVA, dead for 1-5 days and possibly killed by

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artillery, and one .38 cal pistol, very old and rusty, were also found. At 1000H at XD 687404 Company C found a blood stained rock, 1-2 days old. At 1330H at XD 743425 Company D found enemy tennis shoe tracks made by 2-4 persons less than 2 days previously. At 1500H at XD 684621 Company L found 2 trees with writing cut into the bark. At 2025H at XD 745440 Company D sighted traces from an apparent anti-aircraft position. At 2211H at XD 688409 Company C and movement outside the lines, threw an M-26 and fired a claymore, and received a satchel charge. An artillery illumination mission was shot, a squad checked out the area, and a 60mm and a 82mm mission were fired, with negative results.

08 JAN At 2115H at XD 746436 Company D observed 4 enemy personnel approaching its position, threw 2 M-26 grenades and checked out the area with negative results.

09 JAN At 1700H at XD 723424 Company F found 24 bunkers covered with heavy logs and 3' of dirt (dimensions 8'x16'x4') and one anti-aircraft position with 12.7 ammunition cans and shells lying around the gun position. Three possible 82mm positions were also found at the grid. At 0820H at XD 763461 Company L found 1 bunker (4'x6'x3') 3 to 6 months old. At 1015H at XD 772422 Company C found many devices that appeared to be anti-personnel mines or early warning devices, and skirted them. At 1000H at XD 773455 Company L found an NV base camp with an hospital, bunker complex and trench line. The bunkers were 10'x5'x4', and capable of housing 5-6 persons. Some had false bottoms. Beside the bunkers were found six 60mm mortar rounds, ten 60mm fuses, 1 chinese communist grenade, 1 stretcher (U.S. type), 260 60mm empty containers, 228 rounds of .50 cal, 5 warhead carrying pouches (believed for 122mm rockets), 1 dry cell used for rockets, 2 electrical fuses (used one back of rockets), 4 AK-47 rounds, 1 carrying case for 82mm mortar, 3 cannisters used for carrying 122mm rockets and one of a 130mm rocket, 2 bamboo food baskets, 3 NV pick axes, 2 U. S. mail bag, 1 pair NV trousers, 1 plastic U.S. type 5 gallon container, part of a C-ration box (dated October 1967) an SP box (dated March 1967), empty C-ration cans, writing on 3 trees and an leather, a 1.5cc vial of sterile water, 1 bottle of red pills, U.S. foot powder and shaving cream and one 82mm mortar fuze.

09 JAN At 1230H at XD 774459 Company L found seven 60mm (U.S. type) rounds, still in the cannisters and taped to a stick. At 1520H at XD 708477 Company B found a trench 2'x3'x3', 6 - 10 consumed long range rations, empty C-ration cans and a trail running southeast. At 1400H at XD 725413 Company F found 3 bunkers, 2 rocket cannisters (3' 6" long and 5" in diameter), 7 nose fuze cans and carrying cases, and communications wire, all very old. At 1630H at XD 708477 Company B found a .50 cal position and AK-47 casings.

10 JAN At 0830H at XD 764463 Company L found 20 82mm mortar rounds, 3 bunkers (7'x5'x5'), 42 fuses, 6 cans of increments in 2 metal carrying cases; the find was 6-12 months old. At 1000H at XD 769455 Company L found a trail running north, 1 hut, 75 fighting holes, a caved in bunker and empty C-ration cans; the find was about 9 months old. At 1100H at XD 739416 Company F sighted 4 persons and pursued with 2 squads with negative results. At 1145H at XD 712474 Company F found 2 .50 cal positions and 2 6-10 man bunkers reinforced with logs.

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14 JAN At 2340H at YD 017458 Company F saw one character through a starlight scope, about 250 meters away and in a no fire zone.

15 JAN At 2015H at YD 005467 Company F heard suspected AK-47 fire from in front of the lines, and heard a few round of 45 cal. pistol fire returned from inside the VC3 perimeter over their heads.

16 JAN at 1950H at YD 004268 Company F saw movement, apparently a man, on their lines, and threw a grenade with negative results. At 2025H at YD 996492 Company D reported approximately 5 rounds being fired from within the VC3 perimeter over the heads of those on lines.

A platoon also swept through the area with negative results. At 1145H 9 Broschou hoisted to Company C at Ga Lu.

31 JAN At 1400H five Monteburards (a man, woman, 2 boys and a girl) surrendered to Company A at FSB SELLCH (YD 107267). The man later disclosed that his home was a three hour walk from S SELLCH in the vicinity of the YD 1223 grid. He said that he left for other members of his family and wanted to return for them with security, and that there were eight other families who wanted to come in because of fear of artillery and air strikes. The man also said that a village with 20 to 30 guerrillas, armed by the NVA with AK-47 rifles, grenades and claymores, is situated at the YD 1326 grid. Finally, the man said that there are no NVA forces in the area.





11. Intelligence.

The 1st Battalion, 9th Marines took part in Operation Dawson over West from 02 Jan 69 to 12 Jan 69.

During the 10 days of the operation the temperature varied from a high of 84 to a low of 59. The first 7 days of the operation were cold and windy, but this factor did not hinder the battalion in accomplishing its mission. In the last 3 days of the operation there was a complete change to warm and calm weather.

Action contact was made only once with an estimated 8 to 10 NVA. The enemy was found loading boxes on their shoulders. Contact was broken by the friendly elements. On other occasions small groups of enemy were sighted. Taking into view the very light contact and scattered sightings of enemy it is concluded that the enemy did not intend to use this area for any more than a route of travel. Evidence from bunker complexes discovered points to the fact that the enemy was firmly entrenched in this AO until late July. The rolling hills and tall elephant grass throughout the area was a concealment factor for the enemy. Overland movement was reported as excellent due to good trails allowing rapid movement.

For the remainder of the month the companies of the 1st Battalion, 9th Marines were given the task of guarding various fire support bases. There were two incidents of contacts turning themselves into this battalion. On the 30th of January, 9 Br. surrendered to Company C at the Ca Lu Base. Also on the 31st January, 5 Br. (1 man, woman, 2 boys, and girl) surrendered to Company A at FSB SHILOH (AB 107267).


