S-1. CHRONOLOGY

1. General. The personnel situation suffered a serious set-back during operations conducted during the reporting period. The majority of the non-battle casualties depicted in paragraph 1b, below were for cellulitis and malaria. Incoming numbers of Corporals and below improved slightly but the battalion is still experiencing dire shortages of Staff NCO's in occupational field 03.

a. Strength. The average monthly strength for the period ending 31 October 1966 was as follows:

(1) Of the battle casualties, 7 were KIA, none were DOW and 35 WIAs; 7 were transferred by S/R, 11 returned to duty and 17 still remain hospitalized.

(2) Of the 205 non-battle casualties, 8 were transferred by S/R and 28 still remain hospitalized; of the remainder, 73 returned to duty and 86 are on no duty in the battalion rear.

(3) 2 USMC Officers and 20 enlisted (plus 0 USN Officers and 10 enlisted) rotated to CONUS - transferred percentage is 3%.

c. Replacements. This command joined 1 USMC Officer, 136 enlisted plus 0 USN Officers and 15 enlisted as replacements during the reporting period. There remains a shortage in all 03 ranks, an average of 20 per rifle company.

d. Administration

(1) State of Morale. The state of morale is outstanding.

(2) Significant Activities or Personnel Services. None. Operational commitments precluded Special Services activities and made it necessary to turn in 114 quotas for R&R.

(3) Promotions. There were 349 promotions during this reporting period, (2 to 1stLt, 1 to MSG, 2 to GySgt, 4 to SSgt, 94 to Cpl, 252 to LCpl and 17 to PFC)

e. Discipline, Law and Order. There are 4 Special Court-Martials pending. There were no Article 32 UTMJ Investigations conducted during the reporting period.

f. Mail. Mail service continues to be good.

S-2 CHRONOLOGY

1. General. On 1 October 1966, the 2d Battalion, 9th Marines deployed from Dong Ha to the vicinity of the Rock Pile (grid squares XD 9656, XD 9657, XD 9658 and XD 9558) to establish a blocking position. On 20 October 1966, the 2d Battalion, 9th Marines commenced search and destroy operations, as part of "Operation Prairie" and moved in a southwesterly direction. While deployed in the vicinity of Hill 492, (XD 923499) Companies E and F discovered what was described as an elaborate trail network (see Special Intelligence Report Appendix (2)) passing to the southwest of Hill 492 leading from the northeast to the southwest. The 2d Battalion, 9th Marines exploited this trail network resulting in one encounter with North Vietnamese Forces (NVA) (see paragraph 2 below).

a. Trafficability. The heavy October rains affected road and trail conditions immensely, limiting trafficability to that of foot and tracked vehicles. At times even tracked vehicles could not be moved.

b. Weather. The month of October brought about the advent of the Winter Monsoon season resulting in heavy rains and reduced visibility, which hampered air operations. A weather summary for the month of October is as follows:

2. Enemy Situation. During this reporting period, documents discovered in the vicinity of Hill 492 (XD 923499) identified a 71st Regiment, an enemy unit not carried on current Order of Battle listings, however, no other documents or reports confirmed that this enemy unit was actually operating in the area. Throughout the conduct of the battalion's operations during October, only two actual encounters with North Vietnamese (NVA)/ Viet Cong forces occurred. The first encounter occurred on 020915H when Company G, 2d Battalion, 9th Marines observed 15-20 North Vietnamese (NVA) soldiers enter a cave at coordinates XD 967564. 106mm RR fire, 81mm mortars, tanks and aircraft directed fire at the enemy location resulting in six NVA KIA (Confirmed) and four NVA KIA (Probable). The second encounter occurred on 261245H October in the vicinity of Hill 715 in grid square XD 9447 resulting in six North Vietnamese (NVA) soldiers KIA (Confirmed). The NVA soldiers appeared to be well fed and in excellent physical condition (muscular). They were clothed in khaki uniforms and sneakers and all carried packs (no helmets noted) and automatic type weapons. Since no unit designation nor rank was apparent, it was believed that this NVA force was a re-supply element due to the large amount of ordnance (hand grenades and small arms ammunition) and medical supplies that was being carried.

The 2d Battalion, 9th Marines did not encounter any identified enemy units during this reporting period thus the only known enemy forces carried on the Order of Battle listing remained as the 803d North Vietnamese

(NVA) Regiment and the 812th North Vietnamese (NVA) Regiment, both units components of the 324th Division. No actual encounters with these two regiments or elements thereof occurred.

3. Significant Events.

a. Trail Network... The discovery of the elaborate trail system as discussed in paragraph 1 and in Appendix 2 is significant in that it undoubtedly is utilized as a main thoroughfare for the movement of forces and supplies south from the DMZ.

b. VC Hospital Site. A 15-man enemy hospital site, complete with kitchen and housing facilities and protective shelters was discovered in the vicinity of grid square XD 9645. Significant was the fact that medical supplies, manufactured in the USSR and East Germany, were recovered from the site.

c. A cluster of 17 graves were discovered by Company H in the vicinity of grid square XD 9859 and opened for investigation. The graves contained bodies of dead NVA soldiers believed killed by air (TPQ) and artillery bombardment. These KIA will be reflected in paragraph 4 of this chronology.

8. Sources of Intelligence. For the most part Marines (ground forces) continued to be the primary source of intelligence gathering.

9. Surveillance Devices. Since the 2d Battalion, 9th Marines was committed to mobile operations during this reporting period, no electronic surveillance devices were utilized.

10. Psychological Warfare. No pay war efforts were attempted during the month of October.

11. Area of Intelligence Interest. Animal life in the area of operations that could hamper or impede tactical operations are as follows: gorillas, tigers, krait snakes, bamboo vipers and scorpions. Leeches are in abundance and a constant menace.

12. Comments and Conclusions. The following comments and conclusions are based on observations made while conducting operations in proximity to the major trail network discussed in paragraph 1 and Appendix 2 of this chronology.

a. At one point along the trail, an element of this battalion discovered a basket lying along the trail with fresh, dry rice strewn in the area. It is believed that this carrier had either overhead or observed the approach of the Marines and discarded his load and made a hasty retreat to possibly warn other enemy troops of the presence of Marines. This courier could possibly have been attempting to re-supply an enemy unit (squad or platoon-sized) located at a unknown position some where north along the trail.

b. Since the North Vietnamese soldiers (NVA) encountered (see paragraph 2) were so heavy laden with medical supplies and ordnance and heading in a southerly direction, it is believed that this element, though small in size (6 men) was a re-supply detail. Interesting to note was the fact that not one carried any identification papers, documents, unit designation nor rank insignia. All six men appeared to be well-fed,

muscular, well-clothed and in excellent health. Another conclusion that this party was a re-supply unit was the fact that one soldier was carrying three drums (round) of ammunition for a machine gun of which none of these six men were armed.

c. While in the vicinity of Hill 492 three separate containers of miscellaneous documents (2 small suit cases or valises and one saddle bag-type container) were discovered in thatched huts in the area. Since so many documents were recovered in the same area the conclusion can be drawn that Hill 492 could have been the collecting point of all papers and documents carried by individuals in the vicinity of Hill 492 or to the southwest to prevent capture by opposing forces.

d. There was no indication on the trail of any major unit traffic, as a large unit (company/battalion) would have chewed the trail up considerably as evidenced by the movement of this battalion. All movement along this trail by enemy forces most likely was of small units and conducted primarily during the dry season, since a small unit, not to exceed a platoon could have traversed the trail without too extensive damage.

e. Of all villages and way stations observed along the route, indications of recent occupancy were scarce. The areas, for the most part, were clean with no signs of ground trampling. This indicates that if the areas were utilized as rest areas, strict discipline was enforced. The only area discovered with positive signs of recent occupancy and which had been abandoned hurriedly was that of the hospital site (see paragraph 3b). At the hospital site, documents recovered indicated occupancy as early as two days prior to its discovery. Cartridge traps were also recovered indicating that the patients were given the tasks of making them to keep them occupied. No indication was found as to when, where or how the enemy forces vacated the site nor was the direction of movement indicated. Possibly the enemy melded deeper into the dense jungle, taking with them only what they could carry as evident by a large cache of abandoned medical supplies. A 120mm mortar ammunition box was also discovered at the hospital site which was utilized as a pig-pen watering trough. No indication of a mortar position was noted. Several 100 kilo rice bags and chicken nests discovered in the area gave the impression that the site had been a permanent installation.

f. Several way stations were discovered along the trail dispersed in such a manner that the conclusion can be drawn that the area could accommodate an enemy force of possibly two platoons though once again no signs of recent occupancy were noted.

g. In two of the village areas a large amount of corn cobs were noted which could possibly indicate an acute shortage of rice supply.

h. Many large gourds of assorted, unidentified seed was found in one village area. These seeds could have been intended to supplement the current shortage of food stock. The actual identification and purpose of the seed could not be determined.

i. Along the trail many bare foot prints were noted which could possibly have indicated a shortage, to a degree, of shoes in the enemy ranks. Of those tennis-type shoes discovered, the soles did not appear as worn as did the tops. Since the shoes were worn and torn on the top of the toes, the conclusion can be drawn that these troops were used to shimmy up trees to a possible observation post. The soles of the shoes gave little signs of use.

j. Many fresh cut, green bamboo poles were scattered along the trail indicating new construction or reinforcement of portions of the trail was being contemplated. Many of the handrails appeared green and freshly cut. This construction indicates that the trail is used extensively by the enemy. Protective holes, all along the trail measured at an average of 2x4x5 feet in depth. Some of these holes appeared freshly dug while some had aged fronds others had fresh, green camouflage. Some of the holes contained bamboo sidings to prevent wash-outs or cave-ins.

k. At one point along the trail, in one of the villages, a rice bag containing a picture of two hands clasping (CARE) was found. This bag was found in an area previously occupied by enemy forces as indicated by documents and equipment discovered. The conclusion can be drawn of the possible subverting of AID supplies intended for Montagnard families.

S-3 CHRONOLOGY

1. General. During the past month the 2d Battalion, 9th Marines completed its move from Phu Bai to Dong Ha, participated in Operation Prairie and continued to train replacement personnel. At 0800 on 17 October operational control of the 2d Battalion, 9th Marines shifted from the 4th Marines to the 3d Marines. Administrative control remained with 9th Marines.
2. Movement to Dong Ha. On 1 October the 2d Battalion, 9th Marines completed its displacement when Company "F" and Command Group Bravo closed on the Dong Ha complex via Rough Rider convoy from Phu Bai.
3. Operation Prairie. On 1 October the battalion commenced motor convoys to the vicinity of the Rock Pile and relieved the 1st Battalion, 4th Marines for the responsibility of the area of operation in that vicinity. During the period 1-20 October the battalion conducted company and battalion minus size search and destroy operations in the Rock Pile area of operations. In addition to these operations the 2d Battalion, 9th Marines supported the 3d Battalion, 4th Marines by fire as it secured enemy objectives in the vicinity of Hill 484.

On 20 October Companies E and F with Command Group Alpha commenced a search and destroy operation to Hill 492 (XD 9249). After moving through jungle terrain for two days with negative enemy contact this battalion minus force was helilifted from the vicinity XD 9453 to Hill 492. As this operation was conducted Companies G and H with Command Group Bravo continued to conduct aggressive patrol and ambush activities in the vicinity of the Rock Pile.

On 24 October Companies G and H with Command Group Bravo were helilifted from the Rock Pile to Hill 492 after being relieved in place by elements of the 3d Battalion, 4th Marines. Once arriving on Hill 492 this force was immediately sent to the north to explore a well concealed trail believed to be a NVA aggress route into South Vietnam. The force returned on 25th of October and the entire battalion prepared to move south along the same trail.

On the 26th of October the battalion commenced a search and destroy operation south along this main NVA trail. The operation terminated at a Montagnard village on the Song Quang Tri (XD 9843) at 1700 on 29 October. Only one enemy contact was made during this period and this occurred on the 26th when an estimated NVA platoon was caught between F and G Companies (See S-2 Chronology).

The battalion moved east along National Route 9 to an ARVN outpost and were helilifted to Camp J. J. CARROLL (YD 0654) on 30 October. Once arriving at Camp CARROLL the 2d Battalion, 9th Marines prepared to relieve the 3d Battalion, 4th Marines of its area of operation and camp security on 2 November.

Since its arrival in RVN Operation Prairie afforded the first opportunity for the battalion to conduct offensive operations on a battalion level. In addition both the 106mm and 81mm mortar platoons were employed for the first time in general support of the battalion.

4. Training. Operation commitments precluded formal military training during October, however, replacement personnel did receive training required by higher directives prior to assignment within the battalion.

5. Visitors. During this period the battalion was visited by the following personnel:

6. Fire Support and Fire Support Coordination

a. During the period 1-31 October, while operating in the Operation Prairie area, 2d Battalion, 9th Marines was provided artillery support by the following units: "E" 2/12, direct support (14-31 Oct); "I" 3/12 reinforcing; "M" 4/12, general support; 2d Bn, 94th Arty, general support reinforcing. Utilization of artillery in support of operations consisted of 7 missions fired on targets of opportunity, 19 concentration-registrations, 57 prep fires, illumination missions and 827 H&I concentrations, expending a total of 5679 rounds.

b. During the period the 81mm mortar platoon fired 4501 rounds in support of operations, broken down as follows: 3791 HE, 560 WP and 150 illumination.

c. On 20 October "E" 2/12 displaced forward with 2 platoons to support the battalion's search and destroy operation from 20-29 October, where they fired 1 mission on a target of opportunity, 11 prep fire missions and numerous H&I's.

d. During the period 1-16 October while under OPCON 4th Marines, Fire Support Coordination Policies remained unchanged from the preceding period.

e. During the period 17-31 October while under OPCON 3rd Marines, Fire Support Coordination Policies were changed somewhat. The SAVAPLANE was dispensed with so that air and artillery coordination must be effected by aircraft checking in by radio before entering each TAOR. For artillery fire missions Battalion FSCC provides clearances for troop safety while Regimental FSCC provides clearance for aircraft safety, hence Regimental FSCC has final clearance on all missions.

- a. Med Evac Missions. A total of 62 separate med evac missions were flown to transport 201 NBC, 35 WIA and 7 KIA to rear areas. This required 8-UH-34's, 6-HU-1E's and 16-CH-46's.
- b. Logistics Missions. 272 helicopter trips moved 584,000 lbs.
- c. Trooplift Missions. 115 trips moved 1460 troops during the month.
- d. Observation/Reconnaissance Missions. 22 OE aircraft flew a total of 40 hours of observation for 2d Battalion, 9th Marines while 16 HU-1E aircraft carried the unit commander and his staff on 8 recon flights.
- e. Air Strikes. Two close air support missions were called. One was at the Rock Pile and ground controlled. The other occurred on the trail south and required the use of a TACA. An additional 993 targets were submitted for TPQ-10 radar control bombing. Approximately 450,000 pounds of GP ordnance was expended on these targets.

S-4 CHRONOLOGY

1. General. During the month of October the entire battalion was committed to the field with the exception of a small administrative group and most of the supply staff which remained in Dong Ha. The battalion was supported during this period by the Logistical Support Activity in Dong Ha. This unit provided excellent support for the battalion while it was operating in the field, resupply being effected entirely by helicopter lifts. During this 31 day period much valuable data was compiled concerning the overall logistical support required to supply a battalion on field operations.

2. Resupply. Over 584,000 lbs of Class I through V was delivered during the period covered. Two hundred and seventy two helicopter sorties of supplies were flown in and medical evacuations performed.

a. Class I.

- (1) "C" Rations - 6900 cases
- (2) Water - 6000 5 gallon cans

b. Class II. No record was kept of Class II expenditure but certain trends were noted. There was a great demand for articles of clothing such as utility trousers and cushion soled socks. This was due largely to the rugged terrain and inclement weather conditions. Certain items of 782 gear were in great demand such as head bands, canteens, canteen covers, rifle magazines, rifle slings, and entrenching tools. Battalion Supply experienced a critical shortage of these items which eventually led to pulling of 782 gear from the troops in the rear to support the troops in the field. There were many recurring demands for such items as compasses, watches, air mattresses which, were they available, would have greatly added to the comfort of the troops during the heavy rains.

c. Class III

- (1) During this period the battalion used 10 55 gallon drums of diesel and 12 55 gallon drums of gasoline to supply supporting tanks and ontos as well as the 10 organic M274A-1 mules which the battalion employed for 20 of the 31 days.

d. Class IV. Very little Class IV was utilized. 200 rolls of barbed wire were set in draws and various avenues of approach. 5,000 sand bags were utilized for fortifying bunkers and fighting holes. 81 mm mortars used the majority of these sand bags for their mortar pits.

e. Class V

- (1) Under 3,000 rounds of 7.62 ball and ~~linked~~ ammunition was expended. 60mm mortar expenditure was very limited also, under 200 rounds fired due primarily to unsatisfactory ammunition.

(2) 81mm mortars expended a total of 3791 HE rounds, 563 WP rounds, and 150 illumination rounds.

(3) 106 recoilless rifle expenditures were as follows:

HEAT 680 rounds, HEP-T 562 rounds, 50 cal. spotters 1753 rounds.

(4) Ontos expenditures consisted of:

HEAT 121 rounds, HEP-T 173 rounds.

(5) Tanks expended the following:

WP 18 rounds, HEAT 118 rounds, cannister 42 rounds.

Most of the above ammunition was expended for H&I fires.

During the period covered the battalions mules proved themselves invaluable in aiding the companies to haul gear from the LZ to their areas. They moved even under the most adverse road conditions. Helicopter resupply was excellent, however, poor weather conditions toward the end of the month, and the lack of LZ's greatly reduced their effectiveness in the highly mountainous terrain.

The helicopter support teams sent from LSA in Dong Ha did excellent jobs in controlling the LZ and aiding in the resupply lifts. The engineers attached to the battalion during the operation should be commended for their outstanding work. Four engineers were attached initially remaining with the battalion until the 23rd of the month when an additional 8 engineers joined the battalion. During the time they were attached to the battalion they utilized 400 lbs. of demolitions blasting LZ's out of the thick jungle canopy for emergency med evacs and resupply sorties. They destroyed several enemy installations and fortified positions denying their further use to the Viet Cong.

Several items were note worthy during the operation. The heavy rains and subsequent dampness took its toll on much of our 782 gear, leather boots and holsters. There was a constant need of lube oil for weapons to prevent the ever present problem of rust and corrosion. Some incidents of jungle boots losing heels or soles was noted. These boots were relatively new.

Some personal observations noted were that each battalion operating in a mountainous tropical region with a thick jungle canopy should be supplied with (2) double edged axes, toggle ropes, machetes and light weight gloves like those used for rappelling to prevent cuts and abrasions from the vegetation in the area and thus greatly reduce infection. Flash lights with red lenses, fully waterproofed, are essential to black out operations and an ample supply should be carried to the field. Sundry packs were a great morale boost to the troops providing the minimum necessities such as toilet accessories and the additional packages such as candy and tobacco. It was necessary to order "C" rations specifically requesting heat with them if so desired. While the battalion was operating it was an unnecessary inconvenience to order heat separately for each case of

"C" rations. Each box of "C" rations should be supplied with heat. There were no malfunctions of any of the battalions T/O weapons. The wooden stocks began to swell a bit on the M-14 rifles but this was only a minor problem and easily remedied.

Due to the tremendous drain on battalion supply during this period the overall logistical situation is fair to poor. Many of the Class II items mentioned above as critical in the field are no longer in stock in the rear.

Motor Transport has six mules (M274A-1) deadlined for engine failures. Two M-422A-1 mites are deadlined for a throwout bearing and transmission. During the next few weeks the battalion plans to devote its maintenance effort to the vehicles which were committed to the field.

3. Camp Development. N/A

4. Operations. The battalion was in the field during the month of October after the move was completed to Dong Ha. On the 1st of the month the battalion moved to Dong Ha was completed with movement of the last rifle company from Phu Bai utilizing 15 trucks and carrying 200 troops. The second troop movement on the 1st of the month was completed from Dong Ha to the Rock Pile in which 920 troops were convoyed in 30 trucks. Total truck committment for the movement mentioned above was 45 trucks carrying 1070 troops and equipment. There were 3 movements by helicopter moving 1460 troops.

COMMUNICATION CHRONOLOGY

1. General. The Communications Platoon furnished radio, wire, and message center services to the battalion during the month of October 1966. Maintenance support was given the battalion, rifle companies, tanks, mortars and artillery liaison team in the field.
2. Support. The companies of this battalion and two command groups were supported during operations in the field. The 4th Marine Regiment was supported with two message center men. The 3rd Anti-tank Battalion was supported with the loan of a radio set AN/PRC-25.
3. Rough Riders. Communications for convoy control and a FAC team from Dong Ha to the dismount point (Rock Pile) were furnished during the month.
4. VIP Communications. Communications and transportation were furnished for Secretary of Defense, CNO, Commanding General 3rd MAF, Command General 3rd Marine Division during their visits to the Dong Ha area.
5. Prairie. During the initial phase of operations this month at the Rock Pile, there were no major communication problems. It is noted however that the battalion was on high ground, creating an ideal communications situation. The 3rd Marine Regiment installed a radio relay shot (AN/TRC-27) on top of the Rock Pile and telephone communication was established from the Rock Pile to most units as far south as Da Nang. The wire from the top of the Rock Pile (radio relay shot) to a switch board was laid by helicopter. The laying of the wire in this manner proved to be efficient.

During the later phase of this month's operations conditions changed and numerous problems arose. The battalion moved into mountainous terrain covered with a tropical rain forest. The only communications was radio and this proved to be difficult. Due to the low canopy tape antennas were all that could be used on the march. To reach the 3rd Marine Regiment it required using a relay station atop the Rock Pile. However, communications were maintained during the entire operation.
6. Losses. The communications platoon experienced the destruction (by gunfire) of one radio set AN/PRC-25, one hand set, and a tape antenna. This was lost by "F" Company in a fire fight on the 27th of October. There were several other hand sets and tape antennas lost due to the monsoons and low hanging canopy.
7. Difficulties. Extremely mountainous terrain, wet weather, (monsoons) and operating in a tropical rain forest, caused difficulties in the communications and maintenance of equipment; ie, tape antennas came apart at the rivets and the tape antenna bases split at the seams. This was apparently due to the low canopy constantly tearing at the whole assembly. The handsets H-138 were a constant source of trouble due mostly to their inability to withstand moisture. Even water proofed in a plastic bag they proved unable to withstand day to day use under these conditions. Another problem noted was water under the audio connectors on the handsets. This caused a constant keying of the set and was at times both difficult in its use and in trying to locate the set being keyed. Unsatisfactory equipment reports are pending on the items mentioned in this paragraph.

MEDICAL CHRONOLOGY

1. General. During the month of October, the BAS and personnel held military sick call for 1,442 Marines and have seen and treated 47 Vietnamese civilians.

2. Sanitation

a. Routine sanitation inspections of the rear battalion area was conducted on a weekly basis with reports submitted to the Commanding Officer.

b. In the forward area, head and latrine facilities consisted of slit trenches built up with ammunition boxes and urinals were constructed from ammunition tubes. These were burned and sprayed with insecticide on a daily basis. Centralized pits were utilized for the burning of trash. Repellents were used by personnel for protection against mosquitoes and other insects. Rat traps were available for rodents. There were two snakes killed in the forward area. One was sent to E-Medical in Dong Ha and identified as a banded krait. The other was of the Bamboo variety. There were no incidents of snake bite. There were several scorpions and centipedes found, but only two centipede stings were sustained by Marine personnel. These stings were of a minor nature and the patients were treated symptomatically. A fogging machine was located in the forward area for use in the control of mosquitoes. Insecticide used was concentrated malathion. The machine was virtually of no use however. It was only operable on three occasions and then for only short periods of time. Continued maintenance of urinals and heads, plus daily burnings of trash ensured a clean and sanitary camp. It is suggested that a machine with less mechanical failure be provided in semi-permanent forward areas for use in the control of mosquitoes and other insects.

3. Diseases, Injuries and Treatments in General

a. Approximately 75% of patients treated at routine sick call was performed in the field at the forward area.

b. There were 205 non-battle medical evacuations during the month. Nearly 80% non-battle med-evacs were bacterial type infections of upper and lower extremities and were caused by staphylococcal and streptococcal organisms after the individual had sustained a break in the skin. Almost all foot infections were caused by wet boots rubbing the skin raw. Those of the upper extremities were caused primarily by minor lacerations from elephant grass. Cellulitis occurred in many instances. An average of five days of treatment in the rear using procaine penicillin, hot soaks, bacitracin and neomycin ointment and immobilization was necessary to correct these problems. Due to severe field conditions, proper treatment could not be rendered in the forward area.

CONFIDENTIAL

c. There were several cases of fevers of undetermined origin in the field. The duration of these fevers was 24-36 hours. Treatment consisted primarily of ASA and forced fluids with quick response from the patients. Personnel with high temperatures not responding to ASA and fluids were given cold water sponges and sometimes complete cold water submersion to reduce the temperature. This was successful in all cases.

d. Twenty-two cases of confirmed malaria were reported during the month. The falciparum strain is primarily that contracted in the Republic of Vietnam. The enforcement of weekly and sometimes bi-weekly Primaquine and Chloroquine tablets as a prophylaxis against malaria plus liberal applications of insecticide greatly decreased the incident rate. The battalion had been taken bi-weekly dosages of the Primaquine and Chloroquine tablets for six weeks, then after the second week in the forward area, the dosage was decreased to once per week on the advice of medical officers from the Preventive Medicine Unit in Da Nang. Results of two tablets per week versus one were not controlled and no conclusion can be offered as to the two tablets per week effectiveness.

e. There was an extremely low incident rate of upper respiratory tract infections even though adverse weather conditions were present at all times. No definite conclusion can be drawn.

4. Medical Evacuations

a. There was no problem in the evacuation of patients from a semi-permanent area where a fixed landing zone was in effect. However, on two separate occasions while in dense jungle terrain, the evacuation of patients was impossible for a period of 24 hrs. This was due to inclement weather conditions, plus engineering problems imposed by dense jungle growth before an adequate landing zone could be established. On 26 October when several casualties were inflicted during enemy action, the terrain was such that several hours lapsed before the patients could be transported to a helicopter landing zone. Engineers then had to clear the area with demolitions to permit helicopters to hover, pick up, and evacuate the wounded. Weather conditions were such that almost 24 hours transpired between the time of action and actual evacuation. The efforts extended by the Marines, plus that of the Navy hospital corpsmen attending the patients was commendable.

5. Casualties and Hospitalization

a. There were 70 Marines hospitalized during the month of October, 8 Marines were killed during the month - 7 were a result of direct enemy action and one a result of a short 81mm round. There were 43 WIA's during the month. Of those patients hospitalized, 34 were WIA's, 22 a result of malaria, 2 dental conditions, 1 immersion foot, 1 strain, 1 herniorraphy, and 9 viral syndromes. Injuries sustained by the KIA's were multiple and of such nature that medical aid was of no avail.

CONFIDENTIAL

6. Effects of Field Rations

a. There were no ill effects from prolonged usage of C-rations in the field. Two days of no rations due to inclement weather preventing resupply by helicopters produced no ill effects or Hypoglycemic collapse.

7. Hygiene and Medical Discussions

a. Due to battalion size operational conditions, only informal discussions on personal hygiene and battle-field first aid was accomplished within the company areas.

8. Health and Service Records

a. Routine maintenance of health and service records was accomplished at the rear area. Approximately 150 immunizations were administered. Due to operational conditions, routine physical examinations were deferred.

9. Compliment of BAS

a. At the close of the month, the BAS had a compliment of 54 corpsmen. Of these, 7 are P.O.'s. There are 32 corpsmen attached to line companies. Eleven corpsmen were joined for duty and 10 were transferred by PCS orders.

10. Conclusion and Recommendations

a. During the month of October, the BAS personnel were split into two groups. Six corpsmen were with the forward elements. This number is considered to be sufficient for field needs. The other hospital corpsmen were in the rear area handling mostly administrative matters. They also were utilized as replacements for company corpsmen that were wounded and required medical evacuation. The medical officer was present in the field for a period of six days. Due to limited supplies and equipment available in the field however and since most medical evacuations are accomplished in a short period of time, it is felt that medical officers can be better utilized in rear areas where the patients are evacuated to.

b. It was noted during the 31 day period that many personnel required temporary fillings and sometimes medical evacuation to correct severe dental conditions. It is felt that if all personnel had been properly screened prior to departure from CONUS, these problems would not have existed. A more strict screening of troops being sent to the Republic of Vietnam should be initiated by all CONUS commands. The existing dental facilities in most locales in Vietnam are not adequate to handle the number of cases existing.

c. Approximately 50 new personnel were joined in the battalion just prior to a forced march. Six were classified as heat casualties the first day. Perhaps it would help these personnel if short periods of strenuous activities were initiated on their arrival in Vietnam to acclimate them to the weather and conditions to be found in this country.

d. All the patients evacuated from the jungle were helilifted by the helicopters hovering and using slings. Further injuries could definitely have been caused to three of the patients by this type evacuation. There was no alternative at that time however, due to existing conditions. It is felt however, that if Stokes stretchers could have been provided, less chance of further injury to certain type patients would result.

CHAPLAIN CHRONOLOGY

1. General. During the month of October the Chaplain held 32 Protestant Divine Services. Since the Battalion was in the field and on the move during most of the time covered by this report, the services were held in a variety of locations. A total in excess of 930 Marines attended the worship services. Communion was observed and received by 260 men.

One of the unforgettable events to take place was a baptismal service in which five men were baptized. Since the battalion was then located at the Rock Pile it was necessary to take a rifle platoon to the nearest mountain stream to provide security for the service. The men were baptized by immersion and each will receive a certificate from the Chaplain. The Chaplain seeks to affiliate each man with a church back in the USA.

Layleader response has been good in each company and the program is beginning to take shape. Four layleader services were held with a total of 68 men present. Back with the rear unit in Dong Ha a Bible Study Class was held three nights a week with a total of 54 men becoming involved.

The Chaplain distributed religious literature and rosaries to the men and received confirmation from "The Upper Room" publishing house that we can receive all the religious literature we desire at no charge. This is made possible through the donations of the folks back home.

The spiritual attitude of the men of 2/9 was exceptionally high and the Chaplain had many opportunities to counsel with the Marines in the field. At least 75 personal interviews were held.

Catholic services were provided by the Regimental Chaplain who came out to the battalions positions when weather conditions permitted. Because monsoon weather conditions prevented the helo's from flying the Catholic padre was unable to make it as often as we would have desired him to visit.

When the battalion moved out the Chaplain and his assistant were along for the operation, and it proved to be a valuable experience. It gave added opportunity to assist the men of 2/9. Following the contact with the enemy the Chaplain held prayers for the dead and comfort to the wounded. Our wounded men gave evidence of great faith and courage through the night - as they were unable to be evacuated until the following day.

During the month the Chaplain made a trip to the USS Repose to visit the wounded. Most of the men were getting along well and it is encouraging to note that one Marine who had tripped a mine, would be able to keep both legs. The Chaplains aboard the USS Repose do a great job.

Memorial Services have been arranged for all who were killed during this 31 day period.

Ten more state flags were received to be used at a future time when the battalion becomes more permanent.

SPECIAL INTELLIGENCE REPORT (TRAIL NETWORK)

1. On 18 October 1966, while deployed in the vicinity of Hill 492, coordinates XD 923499, Companies E and F of this battalion discovered what was described as a well-used, well-constructed trail. The trail was explored and one Montagnard village was discovered at coordinates XD 912504. There were no signs of recent occupancy.
2. On 20 October 1966, the 2d Battalion, 9th Marines commenced a search and destroy operation with the mission of exploiting the trail to the South. Once on the main trail it was discovered that the trail could be negotiated without too much difficulty.
3. The trail was from two to three feet in width and in more difficult areas, such as high, steep banks, steps had been cut and reinforced to sustained wear. Several areas had built-up side walls to prevent erosion. In some of the steeper-more difficult areas to negotiate, handrails, constructed of bamboo poles were erected to waist high along the outer edges in order to render aid and support to the user.
4. Throughout the entire length of the trail, from coordinates XD 905023 to coordinates XD 984438, individual protective shelters (holes 2x4x5 ft in depth) were prepared at from 30 to 50 meters apart. None of these shelters were camouflaged however, several did contain reinforced timbers to prevent wash-outs or cave-ins. Interesting to note, the entire trail is concealed by jungle canopy.
5. Of all villages discovered all appeared to have been constructed by Montagnard primitive means. Each structure appeared to be of one family size, however, 6 to 8 men could comfortably sleep in each. Examination of all villages gave no indication of enemy use as each area was spotless. No recent digging (for burial or refuse), no unusual tramping of the surrounding grounds were apparent.
6. The Viet Cong Hospital discovered at XD 962453, appeared to be a 15-man unit and documents found in the structure indicated that troops had been there on or about 27 October. The cluster of huts and lean-to's in the same location gave the indication that one platoon plus Command Group and hospital personnel could be accommodated. All of these structures were destroyed, and all medical supplies were confiscated for technical evaluation.
7. All helicopter landing zones (HLZ) were either man-made or natural terrain features. The HLZ at coordinates XD 934482 (for example) was cut into the dense jungle by USMC engineers.
8. Miscellaneous
 - a. Survival. All along the trail grapefruit, berries, bananas and several other edible type plants were observed. Fresh water is plentiful throughout the area.

b. Enemy. Companies F and G encounter on 261245H which netted six NVA KIA (body count) was significant in that the NVA KIA's appeared to be well trained and well fed soldiers. The bodies were chesty looking and very muscular. The NVA were dressed in khaki uniforms, sneakers and all wore red colored swim-type shorts. None wore helmets. Interesting to note - no documents, unit insignia, rank insignia nor distinguishing marks were observed on any of the bodies. The soldiers appeared to be a re-supply party as indicated by the amount and type of material carried. One NVA soldier was carrying 36 stick-type Chi Com hand grenades, 3 KAB machinegun magazines and several other small arms type ammunition. A second NVA soldier was carrying a large bag of medical supplies plus other miscellaneous items.
