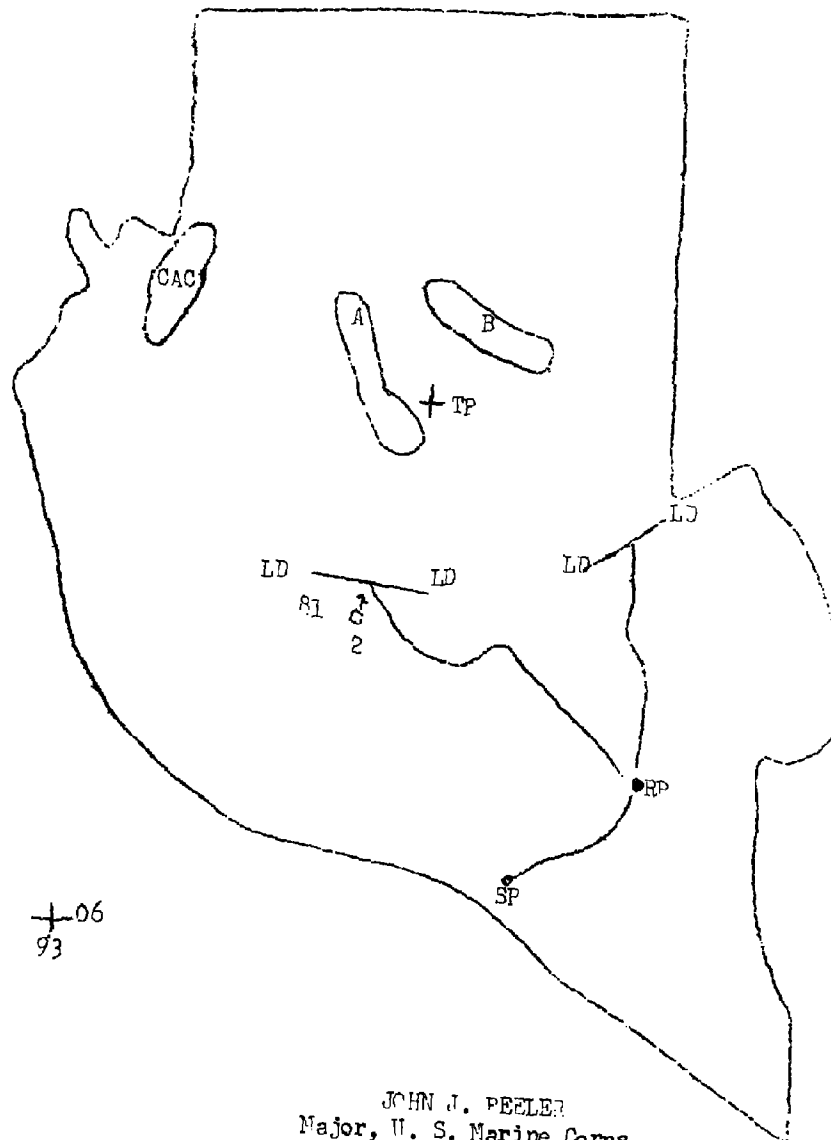

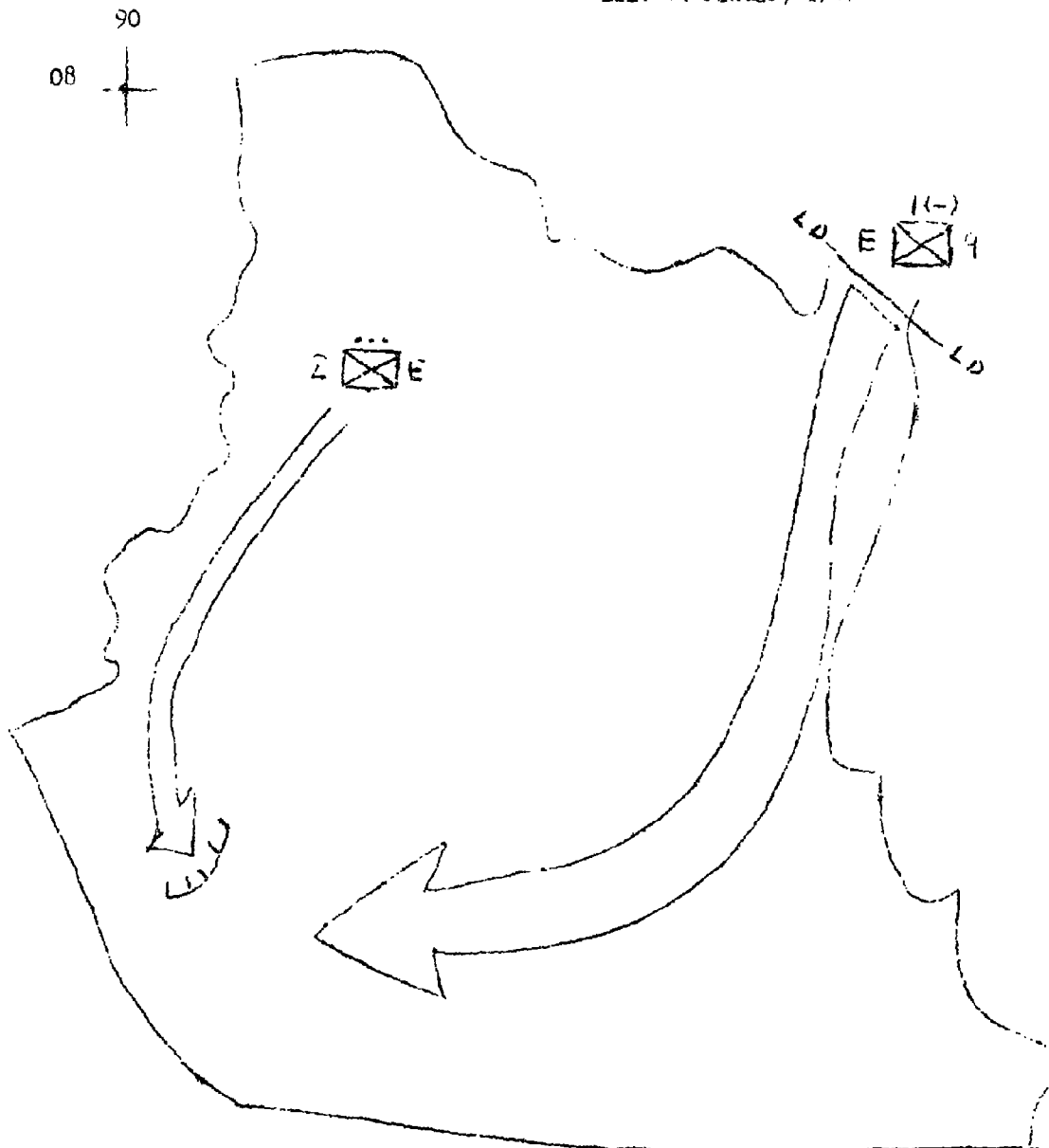

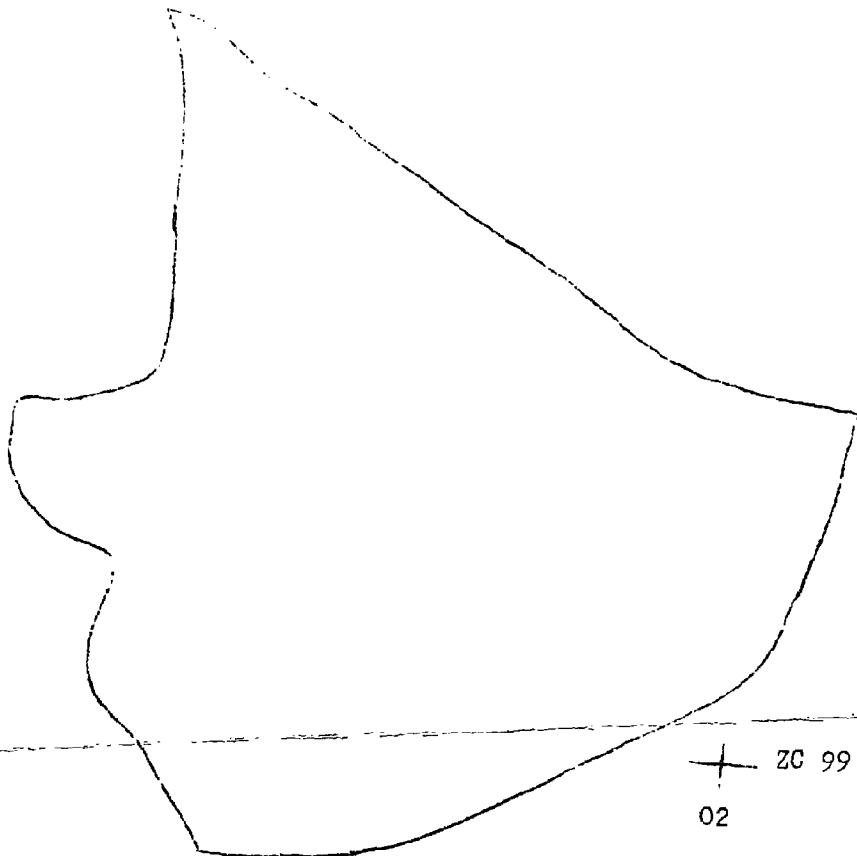

S-1 CHRONOLOGY

1. General. The personnel situation is outstanding in relation to overall figures. Present strengths exceed T/O authorizations in the enlisted category and will remain so even though the command anticipates 83 enlisted rotations during the coming month. Officer strengths are at manning level authorizations at the present time, however 3 losses during February will drop us below manning level.

(1) Of the battle casualties, all 7 were WIA's; 1 was transferred by service records, 2 remain hospitalized and 4 have returned to duty.

(2) Of the 23 non-hostile casualties, 4 were transferred by service record, 9 remain hospitalized and 10 have returned to duty.

(3) 3 Officers and 37 USMC enlisted (plus 1 USN enlisted) rotated to JCUS. Transfer percentage was 3%. In addition, 104 enlisted personnel were transferred intra-Division. The transfer percentage does not reflect these figures.

c. Replacement. This command joined 8 USMC officers and 330 USMC enlisted during the reporting period. 6 USN enlisted personnel were joined for duty.

d. Administration

(1) State of Morale. Morale remains outstanding.

(2) Significant Activities or Personnel Service. A special service film account was reestablished for this battalion and film distribution received. Nightly movies are now shown to the troops.

(3) Promotions. One officer received promotion to 1stLt. A total of 357 enlisted personnel were promoted; 111 to Corporal, 236 to Lance Corporal and 10 to Private First Class.

e. Discipline, Law and Order. One Summary Court Martial and two Special Courts Martial were completed during the period. One General Court Martial is pending.

f. Mail. Mail service remains adequate but personnel hospitalized on the USS Repose are experiencing difficulty in receiving re-routed mail. Recommend postal regulations be modified to allow the packaging of mail of hospitalized Marines aboard the USS Repose for forwarding to Marine Liaison NCO, USS Repose (AH-10), FFO 96601 (Inter Area). Time delay would be three days maximum.

S-2 Chronology

1. General. During the period 1 January to 31 January 1967, the 2d Battalion, 9th Marines continued its mission as defense battalion of the PHU BAI Vital Area and conducted operations against local force guerrillas in the area of operations.

a. Area. The area as described in the December chronology encompasses over 160 square miles of land. Because of the recent addition of four combined action company positions, the actual area of intelligence interest now extends 27.5 miles along National Highway No. 1, 9 miles of which is beyond the TAOR.

b. Trafficability. Monsoon rains for the first 26 days of January made movement off National Highway No. 1 by vehicle almost impossible. Foot travel however was rarely hampered by the adverse conditions. VC travel into the mountainous regions in the southern part of operations was possibly hampered by the ~~difficult~~ conditions.

c. Weather. During the month of January continuous Monsoon rains combined with low temperatures hampered operations slightly. A weather summary for the period 1-31 January is as follows:

2. Enemy Situation. During this reporting period, Order of Battle listings were clarified and confirmed by captured documents and enemy personnel. Enemy activity was limited to that of sniping, mining and small unit contacts. Light contact was also established in areas peripheral to the TAOR.

a. Order of Battle. Enemy units within ~~striking~~ distance of the 2d Bn, 9th Marine's TAOR are as follows:

The C-113 and the C-117 Local Force companies operate just northeast of the 2/9 TAOR in Phu Thu district. During the month of January, no contact was made with these units. However, on 28 January, 2d platoon of Fox Company received 50 to 60 rds of sniper fire from probable elements of either the C-113 or C-117. Other contacts with probable elements of two companies were in the nature of sporadic probes and sniping incidents occurring along the northeastern and eastern parts of the Vital Area perimeter.

The Local Forces unit C-416 is located west of the TAOR and is believed to be operating out of the Royal Tombs area (YD7810). No contact has been made with confirmed or probable elements from this unit during January. One L-19 spotter plane received several rounds of sniper fire on 13 January from the Royal Tombs area. Although no other incidents have been reported in the western portion of the TAOR, it is believed that this area is heavily populated with VC by Reconnaissance patrols and special agent reports.

The C-118 Local Forces unit is reportedly located in the LOC BON District near Highway #1. This unit is designated company size. The location and size are doubtful since no contact has been made and no intelligence reports have indicated any large units in the LOC BON area. It is believed however that there may be a platoon size unit possibly supplying sentries at various check points for a known VC transiting route running along the DAI GIANG river to the area east of the 2/9 TAOR. These troops could also possibly be used for transporting rice to larger units in the mountains to the south.

The largest and most active unit within striking distance is the 804th Main Force Battalion located several thousand meters south of the TAOR. Reliable reports indicate one company of this unit operates on the southern edge of the TAOR. On 18 January, Force Recon engaged 20 VC on two separate occasions (40 total) confirming this company's position. Other reliable sources indicate part of this unit, consisting of approximately 60 VC, mortared the PHU BAI Vital Area on the early morning hours of 20 January. Numerous reports from villagers indicate elements of this battalion are deployed throughout the southern portion of the PHU LOC District.

All the units mentioned are confirmed VC units and are considered to have fair to good combat effectiveness. The Local Force units are well armed with individual S/A weapons as well as numerous automatic weapons and several 60mm mortars. The 804th Battalion elements are heavily armed with automatic weapons and 4-6 81mm mortars. At the present, it is the opinion of the S-2 that the mission of these units is to collect rice, harass the GVN and American troops in the area with continuous sniping and small unit contacts, and to continually probe defense areas in readiness for possible larger attacks in the coming weeks.

b. Significant Enemy Activity.

(1) Mortar Incident. On 20 January the PHU BAI perimeter received approximately 35 82mm mortar rounds. From crater analysis and subsequent discovery of the mortar positions, the VC were attempting to hit the airfield. Soft ground led to erratic rounds indicating lack of experience or poor ammunition. Later, CAC-A3 ambushed a Viet Cong from the 804th Bn who had taken part in the incident. He claimed to have killed over 100 Americans in the "victory" when in fact, two were killed. From documents and interrogation it is possible that the VC who mortared the PHU BAI Airfield came from the east to the mortar position south of the perimeter and returned either north or east.

(2) Infiltration Route. E Co in one small unit contact captured a VC who as part of a 60 man production group, had been wounded. He reported that rice was being picked up at Bach Thach (ZD038021) and taken to a base camp. The 60 man base camp was discovered and contained two pigs, one French automatic weapon, 17-31 bags of rice and living space for the sixty-man production group. It is believed that this base camp was one of a series strung out south into the mountains.

(3) Chieu Hoi. PHU LOC District reported 10 ralliers in January while 2nd Bn, 9th Marines had three. In addition, several reports indicate that as many as 33 others are willing to rally if safety for their families can be guaranteed. This significant increase can be attributed to the TET psychological warfare campaign and increase in contact by the Chieu Hoi personnel with the villagers.

(4) Captured Documents and Personnel. Several significant documents and information from one prisoner and three Chieu Hoi's confirmed and clarified enemy activity in the area of operations. Infiltration routes for rice supply and movement through the area were discovered from these sources.

7. Surveillance Devices. During this reporting period no surveillance device were utilized. The AB/TIS 21's are being repaired. Inclement weather and noise background prevented use of SID's, for most of the month; however they were used during a 4 day period of good weather, in addition a starlight scope was used periodically.

8. Psychological Warfare. During this period, Combined Action Companies Alpha and Hotel distributed 3 separate issues of a newspaper to each of its twelve villages, totalling 117,000 newspapers delivered. Following the mortaring of PHU BAI, 4 separate broadcasts were made to the people warning them not to let the VC in their hamlet and to inform village officials when they do. The response indicated that the broadcast had reached the people.

9. Comments and Conclusions

The intelligence gained from the villagers seems to be increasing in amount and reliability. This would indicate that the VC are losing their tight hold on the people. Sabotage, assassinations, and mining decreased sharply indicating the possibility that the VC cannot support their effort. Indications are strong that attempts will be made on bridges and isolated units during the TET period to demonstrate the inability of CNV Forces to control main routes and outposts.

S-3 CHRONOLOGY

1. General. During the past month the 2nd Battalion, 9th Marines continued its mission of the PHU BAI Vital Area Defense Battalion; maintaining observation posts on Hills 230 and 180; providing a reinforced platoon as Sparrow Hawk reaction force; coordinating the Vital Area Defense Perimeter; and conducting offensive operations ranging from squad to company size. Extensive platoon patrol base activities were conducted throughout the TAOR.
2. Company "E", 2nd Bn. 9th Mar. Company E provided security for the defense perimeter and conducted platoon patrol base activities on a rotating basis during the first part of this month. On January 13 Company "E" conducted a 5-day search and destroy operation (OpO 2-67) along the southern edge of the TAOR. On 20 January the company was relieved on the perimeter and assumed the responsibility for the observation posts on Hills 180 and 230 and continued platoon patrol base activities for the remainder of the month.
3. Company "F", 2nd Bn. 9th Mar. During the early part of January Company "F" provided security for the defense perimeter, provided observation posts on Hills 180 and 230, and conducted rotating platoon patrol base activities. On 19 January the company commenced a 4-day search and destroy operation in the southeastern portion of the TAOR (OpO 3-67). Contact was made with the enemy on 21 January resulting in the discovery of a VC way station/base camp and one VC captured (See S-2 Chron). Upon the termination of this operation Company "F" provided one platoon for security of surveyors working out of the Colco Beach area and also provided several squads to augment patrol activity in several of the combined action platoons. On 31 January Company "F" commenced a search and destroy operation in the Southeastern portion of the TAOR (OpO 5-67).
4. Company "G", 2nd Bn. 9th Mar. During the first of the month Company "G" provided one platoon as security for survey operations in the HAI VAN Pass area, conducted platoon patrol base activities, and provided the Sparrow Hawk reaction force. On 10 January Company "G", reinforced with a section 81mm mortars, conducted a search and destroy operation to provide security for Vietnamese nationals desiring to vacate XOM CONG QUAN hamlet (OpO 1-67). The operation resulted in approximately 200 persons returning to the hamlet and 30 homes being dismantled and moved. The operation was successful in demonstrating to the local villagers that our forces could and would provide security from the VC and assist them in relocating to a secured area. During the latter part of the month Company "G" provided platoon patrol base activity and security for the defense perimeter.
5. Company "H", 2nd Bn. 9th Mar. Company "H" (-) returned to PHU BAI on 3 January after providing security for a tugboat which was beached during December. On 7 January Company "H" participated in a parade held in HUE. For the remainder of the month Company "H" provided security for the defense perimeter and provided the Sparrow Hawk reaction force. On 30 January one platoon replaced a Company "F" platoon as security for surveyors working out at Colco Beach.

6. Company "G", 2nd Bn. 26th Mar. During the first part of the month Co G/2/26 maintained their position in the PHU LOC area, conducting patrols and ambushes, and providing a reaction force for CAC units in the area. On 20 January operational control of Co. G/2/26 shifted to the 26th Marines.

7. H&S Company, 2nd Bn. 9th Mar. During the month H&S Co. provided daylight security for Seabees working in the rock quarry and night time security for two check points on HWY #1. On several occasions H&S personnel were used for security on the defense perimeter. The Company provided the base defense reaction force.

8. Combined Action Companies. CAC A and H conducted the bulk of the small unit ambushes during the month. The Combined Action Companies conducted 310 patrols and 307 ambushes, made 8 contacts with enemy forces and accounted for 7 VC/KIA (Conf) and 3 ralliers.

9. Close Combat

a. Patrol breakdown. During the month 387 squad size ambushes and 783 squad size patrols were conducted in the PHU BAI TAOR. A total of 14 platoons patrol base activities were conducted. Platoons average 8 days in the field on these patrol bases.

b. Sparrow Hawk. During the month Sparrow Hawk was committed on two occasions; on 14 January to provide security for a downed helicopter and on 26 January to reinforce recon units in contact with the enemy.

10. Training. Operational commitments reduced formal military training that normally would have been accomplished. During January 1000 troops completed 9 hours of instruction on the M-16 rifle and fired the weapon for familiarization. Division Land Mine, Boobytrap and Demolition school was attended by 99 troops from this battalion. Representatives from the rifle companies and S-2 received instruction and practical application experience with the Starlite Scope, infra-red sniper scope, and seismic intrusion device. Officers and Staff NCO school was conducted weekly. Subjects include Bee Hive ammunition; fire support coordination procedures; Rules of Engagement; Vietnamese religion, customs and TET; and History of Vietnam from 1945 to present. 135 replacement personnel FAM fired their individual weapons for battle sights and received training in accordance with DivO 1510.3A. Company training was conducted in the following subject areas:

Utilization of artillery in support of operations for the month consisted of 2 missions fired on targets of opportunity, 5 recon by fire, 5 illumination missions, 19 training missions, 101 defensive target adjustments, and 694 H&I concentrations. These fires resulted in the expenditure of 104 HQ smoke, 366 WP, 83 illumination, and 2,325 HE rds.
- c. During the period 1-31 January 1967 the 81mm mortar platoon fired 1,518 rounds in support of operations which included 1,185 HE-M, 204 WP, and 129 illumination.
- d. Training conducted during the period consisted of classes in observed fire procedure for approximately 20 recon personnel and 80 Combined Action Company personnel. In addition, retraining of organic artillery personnel in new observed fire procedure was conducted.
- e. Fire support coordination policies remained basically unchanged with the exception of a change in saveplane procedures. Responsibility for obtaining artillery saveplane was changed from the FDC to the Battalion FSCC, thus reducing considerably the time required for clearance.

11. Special Reaction Squads. During the month of January each of the companies formed a special squad to be used to meet the demanding operational commitments. During the latter part of the month these squads were used to conduct patrols and ambushes in conjunction with Combined Action Platoons. These squads were formed in order to keep from breaking up the tactical integrity of the rifle platoons and at the same time provide a squad that could react immediately to operational commitments. They proved to be extremely valuable for reinforcing other units on short notice.

12. Air Support

a. Med Evac Missions. Ten Medevac missions were flown in support of the battalion during the month of January, evacuating 18 USMC casualties (7 WIA, 11 Non-battle casualties) to "A" Medical Battalion, and 4 Vietnamese civilians. evacuated to HUE hospital facilities. Twelve UH-34 helicopters were used along with gunship escort. Nine Medevac missions were flown in the PHU BAI area, and one in support of Sparrow Hawk in the Chinook Area. Response time was excellent in spite of inclement weather.

b. Logistical Missions. Seventeen logistics missions were flown in support of 2/9 during January. A total of 50,180 lbs of supplies were lifted utilizing 19 UH-34's and 18 CH-46's. All missions were flown in the PHU BAI area in support of units on Hills 130 and 230, platoon patrol bases, company operations in the southern part of the TAOR, and units involved in security operations for survey teams. Material lifted included C-rations, ammunition, lubricants, clothing, and mule mounted 160mm recoilless rifles. As in Dec 1966 inclement weather had adverse effect on some of the missions.

c. Troop Lift Missions. Nine troop lift missions were flown in support of 2nd Battalion, 9th Marines during January utilizing 14 CH-46's and 6 UH-34's. A total of 744 combat troops were moved; largely in the PHU BAI area. Sparrow Hawk was lifted twice into the Chinook Operating area.

d. Close Air Support Missions. None.

e. Recon/Observation Missions. 2nd Battalion, 9th Marines used 8 UH1E helicopters on 8 missions around the PHU BAI TAOR. A total of 34 people participated in these recon flights. Ten air observer missions were flown from 2/9 units in the PHU BAI area.

S-4 CHRONOLOGY

1. General. The overall logistical situation of this battalion was considered marginal at the end of the month. There were critical problem areas in Supply, Ordnance, Motor Transport, and Comm-Electronics.

a. Supply. During the month the supply situation improved. Items received were body-armor upper, tropical boots, air mattresses, blankets, cots, rifles, bayonets and scabbards. The battalion still lacks a PU482 (20kw) generator. Critical shortages which exist are watches, compasses, rifle cleaning gear, H-138 hand sets and short antenna bases for radio. AN/PRC25, .45 cal. pistols, constant velocity (CV) joints, concertina wire, and jungle boots.

b. Ordnance. The battalion armorer continued to encounter difficulties in obtaining repair parts and replacements for the flamethrower compressor, 3.5" rocket launcher, M-60 machine gun, and M79.

c. Motor Transport. Presently 85% of the deadlined M422A-1 mites are due to CV joints; the remainder are brakes. The M274A-1 mule deadline rate is caused mostly by R&R engines.

d. Comm-Elect. The H-138 handsets for the PRC-25's continued to be a critical problem. At the end of the period there were 28 PRC-25's deadlined, 24 for handsets and 4 for electrical repair at 3d echelon.

e. Supporting Units

(1) FLSU provided the bulk of the logistical support for the battalion.

(2) EOD support came directly from FLSU in the PHU BAI area.

(3) Engineer support came directly from division engineers. All work requests were channeled through the division engineers.

(4) Truck support was provided by 3d and 9th motors and was coordinated directly by the Division Motor Transport Officer. The battalion utilized an average of five (5) trucks daily to function smoothly.

(5) Helicopter support was received from MAG-16 and coordinated through the battalion air officer for logistical lifts.

(6) Seabees provided construction type support for the whole PHU BAI area and were laying an extensive water pipe line through the battalion area at the end of the reporting period.

2. Camp Development. Since the last reporting period Division Engineers have begun repairing roads that were washed away during the rainy seasons. Also, food was being placed in the battalion contonement area. Truck support for household runs improved, due mainly to a slight decrease in commitments of Division Motor Transport.

3. Operations. During the reporting period the battalion participated in no major operations.

COMMUNICATION - CHRONOLOGY

A. General. The Communication platoon furnished wire, message center, radio and repair and maintenance service for the battalion during the month of January. The battalion was committed all this month as the PHU BAI Vital Area Defense Battalion. In addition to the support provided for company-size operations and Sparrow Hawk, the constant shifting of units in perimeter security positions required the installation and removal of numerous wire systems.

B. Support. The Battalion supported the Combined Action Companies with the loan of eight AN/PRC-10 Radio Sets, three TA-312/PT Telephones, two TA-1/PT Telephones, and three RC-292 Antennas. Combined Action Companies were also supported with 24 batteries BA-386/U and 24 batteries BA-30/U. The 3d Marine Division was supported with the loan of a duplicating machine, two message men, and two wiremen on a daily basis, and the loan of one radio vehicle AN/MRC-109. The 4th Battalion, 12th Marines was supported with the loan of four poles, telescopic. The 3d Reconnaissance Battalion was supported with the loan of two hundred fifty feet of Romex Cable. An instructor was provided for classes on the M-16 rifle. Golf Company was supported with the loan of an Antenna RC-292. The repair section supported the 81mm mortar platoon by repairing night lighting devices. Three Companies were supported by forward air control teams during the entire month, and a forward air control team supported Sparrow Hawk on two occasions.

C. Telephonic Communication. The maintenance of the wire installation to include the replacement of all inner command post overheaded lines by buried 25 pair cable (Waterproof) was completed this month. Construction points and test center have been completed. The battalion is now utilizing five switchboards (SB-22/PT), three operators and a three man trouble shooting team. The trouble shooting team is used for the shifting of the units on the perimeter. The wire section has employed one man with each letter company on the perimeter for internal wire work.

D. Training. The Communication platoon has furnished men and equipment for instruction and familiarization firing on the rifle range, both with the M-16 and the M-14. Personnel have also attended and support was given to the Division Mine Warfare School. The platoon has furnished instructors and equipment, and provided instruction, on the use, care and operation of the radio set AN/PRC-25 for the Sparrow Hawk units. Training included nine hours of M-16 rifle, two hours of Rules of Engagement and twenty hours of general military subjects per man. The platoon provided one Staff Non-Commissioned Officer to attend Crypto Security School out of country. The platoon maintained two message center men on a watch schedule at the 3d Marine Division message center for practical application in on-line operations and message handling.

E. Operations. The Battalion conducted four company size operations during the month of January. At platoon patrol bases communications and propagation logs are being maintained for research purposes. A relay site on Hill 180 is resupplied, equipped, and manned by this unit. All rifle companies, relay sites, and 81mm mortar units are being supplied with shackle sheets, repair parts, and batteries by couriers from the message center section.

F. Difficulties: Lack of component parts in the supply system have been the main difficulty during this period. Elements, both transmit and receive, for the handset H-138 appear to be non-existent. Twenty percent of the radio sets, AN/PBC-25 are deadlined for lack of the handset H-138.

MEDICAL CHRONOLOGY

1. General:

a. During the month of January, the BAS personnel held military sick call for 1,331 Marines.

b. MEDCAP was held in the village of LOC BON on 28 January 1967. There were 50 Vietnamese Civilians seen and treated. BAS will hold MEDCAP at LOC BON weekly, while in this area. Recommendations were made to promote better sanitation in this village.

2. Sanitation:

a. Routine sanitation inspections of the PHU BAI area were conducted on a daily basis.

b. Urine soakage pits have been relocated and new tubes installed. ~~On order~~ on order have not been received at this time, however, they will be installed as soon as they are available.

3. Disease, Injuries, Treatments in General:

a. The BAS continues to maintain a 6-10 bed ward for minor illnesses and injuries. This ward enables the BAS to render more effective treatment. Personnel requiring more extensive care are referred for admissions to A-Medical Company for hospitalization and treatment and for possible further evacuation.

b. Most of all patients treated at the BAS during the month of January were of a routine nature. There were no new cases of Malaria, and the battalion remains on a once-weekly Primaquine and Chloroquine tablet as a preventive against Malaria; plus utilization of insect repellent and mosquito netting.

c. Silicone Foot Ointment, for the prevention of wet foot injuries has been provided for battalion use. Effectiveness of this ointment cannot be determined at this time due to the short period of use, however it is expected, if used properly, it will reduce wet foot injuries to a great extent.

4. Casualties and Hospitalization:

a. There were 50 personnel from the battalion hospitalized during the month of January; 20 were referred admissions to Medical Companies and 30 were BAS admissions. Of these patients hospitalized, 1 was Mastoiditis, 1 MNT Disease, 8 dermatologic conditions, 8 respiratory infections, 2 fever origin unknown, 9 non-battle injuries, 7 Medical Observation, 2 Gunshot wounds, 3 Shrapnel wound, 1 Heat stroke, 1 Neuropsychiatric Problem, 1 Hemorrhoids, 2 Fractures, 1 Hyperventilation syndrome, 1 Burn, 1 Surgical Observation, and 1 Stomach Cramps.

5. Training:

a. Informal ~~training~~ were held in the BAS by the battalion Surgeon

on emergency medical treatment of casualties! A lecture was given on wet foot injuries by Dr. Gross, "A" Company, 3rd Medical Battalion. The venereal disease and personal hygiene lectures were conducted by BAS personnel.

6. Health and Service records:

a. Routine maintenance health and service records was accomplished during the month. Approximately 450 immunizations were administered.

7. Compliment of BAS:

a. At the close of the month, the BAS had a compliment of 50 hospital corpsmen. Of these, 5 were SNCO's. There were 6 hospital corpsmen joined during the month. 5 were transferred by PSC orders.

8. Conclusion:

a. No major problems developed during the month of January. There were approximately 50 cases of abrasions, Feet, which responded well to treatment.

CHAPLAIN CHRONOLOGY

1. In the primary duty area the chaplain held 28 Protestant Divine Worship Services and 80 Marines received Communion. The average Sunday attendance in the 2/9 Chapel was 40. (This includes both morning and evening services).
2. Each morning at 0730 a Devotional Service was held. On Monday, Wednesday and Friday at 1900 the Chaplain conducted a Bible Study Class. We completed the Book of Mark and have now turned to the Book of John. The response of both Officers and men to the Bible Study Class has been very good.
3. The Chaplain has given four lectures to portions of the Battalion on the Religions and Customs of the Vietnamese people. An additional lecture was given to the Officers and SNCO's. Counseling has been conducted throughout the month with the Chaplain seeing on the average of four marines per day.
4. The Chaplain covered the CAC units for religious services and looked into the areas that might be in need of a civic action type project. In the early part of the month the chaplain went with a volley ball team to HUE, to participate in a Vietnamese sponsored athletic event.
5. One of the special projects during the month of January was that of giving the protestant layleaders the opportunity to gain experience for their work by having them conduct the Sunday Evening services.
6. The Catholic personnel have services provided by the Division Chaplain. Mass is held each day at 1700. LDS and Jewish personnel were given the opportunity to attend special retreats during the month.
