## PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the period 1 January - 10 January 1967 this battalion conducted search and destroy operations, aggressive patrolling and established LP/OP and ambushes throughout the assigned TAOR. Emphasis was placed upon saturation patrolling along National Highway #1 and within the respective company sectors to counter and minimize enemy activity in these areas. Preparation for the deployment of the battalion to Okinawa for training and rehabilitation of weapons and equipment was conducted during this period. Second Battalion, Fourth Marines arrived in DaNang and on 6 January commenced in place relief of this battalion. The relief was effected on 7 January and responsibility for the TAOR relinquished to Second Battalion, Fourth Marines. The battalion commenced staging on 5 January in preparation for embarking aboard the USS Bexar APA 237 and USS Union AKA 106. Embarkation was completed and the battalion sailed from DaNang 100015H January 1967.

## PART III

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

## 1. FNF organization committed to combat.

## a. Combat mission assigned.

(1) Establish and maintain reconnaissance screen throughout assigned sector of TAOR.

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(d) Normal issue of all types of supply items was suspended on 29 December 1966, with the exception of priority items, in order to prepare all supply material and equipment for deployment.

# 1. Civil Affairs.

(1) Public Health. The public health program activities conducted during this period revolved around the Med Cap Program. A total of 1194 civilians received medical treatment and one received medical evacuation assistance.

(2) Public Welfare. Public Welfare activities included the distribution of 300 bars of soap, 95 pounds of food, and 125 pounds of clothing. A childrens party was held during which toys, candy and cookies were distributed to the children of the FF's of Company "B" CAC Platoons 1-1, 1-2, 1-3, 1-4, 1-5 and 3-2.

(3) Education. Eighty ammunition boxes and one wood work kit were delivered to Hoa Vinh Village to be utilized in the school improvement program.

(4) Other Activities. The Village Chief of Hoa Vinh held a dinner on 1 January which was attended by the Battalion Commander, Civil Affairs Officer and NCO and Sergeant Major. At this gathering local civil affairs programs and problems were discussed.

j. Administration. There were no administrative difficulties encountered during this period. Postal service remains excellent. Morale remains excellent. Preparations were made for the movement to Okinawa.

k. Personnel. During the period this battalion joined combat support and combat service support units for the purpose of forming BLT 3/9. Difficulties were encountered in obtaining the required personnel data, SRE's and embarkation rosters due to the dispersion of the attachments.

f. Command Relations. This battalion functioned under the OPCON of the 9th Marines and 1st Marine Division and under the ADCON of the 3d Marine Division during this period.

g. Equipment.

(1) Normal operations with the (6) 6 X 6 trucks were conducted during the reported period. Arrangements were made to continue the assignment of these trucks to the relieving unit.

(2) Special note of recognition should be given to the First Marine Division Motor Transportation Section for their outstanding coordination of assignment of all types of vehicles required for the relief of Third Battalion, Ninth Marines by Second Battalion, Fourth Marines. Through the outstanding efforts of 3d, 7th, 9th and 11th Motors, the move of Third Battalion, Ninth Marines out of the TAOR and the insertion of Second Battalion, Fourth Marines was accomplished exactly as scheduled. The drivers performed long hours in order to take advantage of good weather, and met every deadline as required. The efforts of Motor Transportation personnel involved was a primary factor in the smooth embarkation of BLT 3/9.

h. Logistics.

(1) Supply and Distribution.

(a) A concerted effort was made during this reporting period to insure that (5) days of Class I and V were on hand in all unit positions in order that the relieving unit could continue operations uninterrupted while assuming OPCON of the TAOR.

(b) All special "in-country" items including portable, camouflaged fighting hole covers were invoiced over to the relieving unit prior to our departure.

(c) All requisitions submitted to FLSC-A were cancelled on 26 December 1966 and resubmitted by the Supply Officer to 3d FSR on 5 January 1967.

d. Enemy situation. The incident rate remained constant with one notable exception. A squad patrol of Company "M" on 3 January at 0930H in the vicinity of (AT 834724) made contact with four Viet Cong in green uniforms who fled leaving behind two CHICOM carbines, 13 CHICOM grenades and 5 M-26 grenades and other miscellaneous equipment.

e. Scouts. The scouts were attached to each rifle company for operations until the 5th of January when they were withdrawn to prepare for embarkation.

f. Communications. During the period covered, the communications platoon continued to provide continuous communication within the Battalion TAOR. Preparations for embarkation were continuous; all communication equipment was FM'd, and records were brought up-to-date.

Upon arrival, the Second Battalion, Fourth Marines advance party was briefed by Third Battalion, Ninth Marine communications personnel on all communications requirements within the TAOR.

Three generators and 21 SIE's were signed over to 2/4.

Directives, SOP's and CEOIS were signed over to the 2/4 Communication Officer.

Personnel were assigned to all ships, to fulfill the communication requirements as needed.

Communication center personnel provided security for the confidential and crypto material. Also, communication center personnel were assigned as watch standers in the ship's radio center.

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The movement report for BLT 3/9 was submitted by the ship's Communication Officer. All messages, incoming and outgoing, were handled by 3/9 communication personnel.

At the present time all communication personnel and equipment are aboard.

n. Weather. During this period rainfall was heavy as in December; however during embarkation of the BLT the rainfall decreased and the trafficability of the roads improved.

o. Fire Support. During the period of 1 through 7 January 1967, "F" Battery, 2/12, fired only H&I missions in support of 3d Battalion, 9th Marines. H&I fires averaged 16 concentrations per night with an expenditure of two rounds per concentration. On 8 January 1967, the battery moved to Museum pier and Bridge ramp pier for debarkation aboard APA 237, for movement to Okinawa as a part of BLT 3/9.

p. Air Support. During the period 1 January through 7 January 1967 the following missions were flown in support of 3d Battalion, 9th Marines.

- (1) 5 reconnaissance missions by UH-34's.
- (2) 4 resupply missions by UH-34's.
- (3) 2 medevac missions by UH-34's.

q. Chaplain. During the period Protestant services were held once with a total attendance of 167. The Chaplain visited the hospital twice during the period and the brig four times. On 7 January 1967 the Chaplain moved aboard the APA 237 for deployment to Okinawa.

S-3 will prepare a briefing for the relieving Advanced Party reporting to include an Intelligence briefing by the S-2. (Include KC Scouts use).

- (6) All Company Commander's and Section Heads will prepare and submit to the relieving counterparts a complete turn-over file consisting of all aspects of operations within their assigned areas of responsibility.
- (7) S-5 will insure an inventory of Civil Affairs commodities and building supplies is signed over to the relieving Civil Affairs Officer.
- (8) All units maintaining ammunition bunkers will insure that an accurate inventory of all types of ammunition on hand is compiled, and that the relieving units sign for all ammunition remaining in place. In the event a relieving unit commander refuses to sign for a part of the ammunition, that part will be returned to S-4. No ammunition will be left in fighting holes, nor will any individual Marines turn over ammunition to another Marine in the relieving units.

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- (9) S-4 is responsible for the instructions pertaining to staging of gear in case of inclement weather. Individual companies and sections will be responsible for maintaining twenty-four hour security over the units staged gear and will maintain continuous security throughout the movement phase.
- (10) In the event of inclement weather interfering with any phase of the move, a Frag Order will be issued to all units pertaining to the continuation of the movement phase.
- (11) In the event of a sudden operational commitment of all or part of the Battalion during the movement phase, a Frag Order will be issued including provisions set forth for the completion of the movement phase.
- (12) Command Relationship.
- (a) Commanding Officer 3d Battalion, 9th Marines assumes OPCON of all forces operating within the Battalion TAOR and retains that control pending arrival and emplacement of operating forces, command communications elements and attainment of responsibility. When preponderance of combat, communications and control elements of 2nd Battalion, 4th Marines are in position and when mutually agreeable to both the Commanding Officers of 3d Battalion, 9th Marines and 2nd Battalion, 4th Marines, the latter will assume responsibility for the TAOR.
- (13) Unit commanders and section heads will provide guides to facilitate the necessary relief.
- (14) Priority of movement to relieving units.

4. ADMINISTRATION AND LOGISTICS.

- a. General. The S-4 Officer, BLT 3/9, is responsible for the overall coordination of the staging and loading of all vehicles, equipment and troops on assigned shipping. The embarkation plan in support of Operation Plan 301-66 with required annexes shall be published in accordance with CO ltr 1/HLT/jlw 3060, of 11 December 1966.

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- b. Supply and Equipment to be Embarked. In accordance with CO ltr 4/MPG/rlb 4600 of 15 December 1966, all units of BLT 3/9 assigned. All T/E not available for deployment will be submitted on unit RUC account numbers to the BLT 3/9, S-4 for submission to 3d FSR on Okinawa. A maximum effort will be made to meet assigned T/E requirements.
- c. Palletizing and Staging.
- (1) Companies and sections in BLT 3/9 will palletize and stage gear in accordance with CO BLT 3/9, ltr 4/MPG/rlb 4600 of 19 December 1966. Staging areas in Battalion Command Post area will be designated by the BLT 3/9 Embarkation Officer.
  - (2) Attachments of BLT 3/9 will notify the BLT 3/9 Embarkations Officer of the number and type of pallets that require staging prior to loading. The BLT 3/9 Embarkation Officer will designate a staging area for attached units.
  - (3) Mobile loaded units - Units that are mobile loaded will marshall all vehicles in parent organization command post area, or similar areas within the 1st Division Command Post area. All mobile units will be notified of the marshalling areas as soon as they are determined.
  - (4) Assignment of final staging areas, loading points and troop embarkation points, will be in accordance with Embarkation Plan to Operation Plan 301-66, dtd 24 December 1966.
- d. Authorized Individual Baggage and Equipment for Embarkation. All units will be guided by reference (b) enclosure (3). Attached units who do not possess certain items of the prescribed uniforms will substitute like items as prescribed by parent units (i.e. Tanks: Tank helmets vice normal steel helmets).
- e. Transportation. All transportation requirements will be coordinated through the BLT 3/9, S-4 Officer. Transportation for staged equipment and embarking troops will be promulgated in the movement annex of Embarkation Plan to Operation Plan 301-66.

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- f. Salvage. In the event of any last minute deadlining of any mobile equipment to be embarked, the BLT 3/9, S-4 Officer will be notified immediately.
- g. Evacuation. Evacuation of any type will be taken by wheeled vehicle direct to 3rd Medical Battalion, or the Naval Support Activity, DANANG, which ever is closer at time of the incident.
- h. Services. The required services will be submitted to BLT 3/9 S-4 Officer as needed.


