. > NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the period 1-2 July 1967, this battalion continued in the defense of the Bong Ha Combat Base. From 2-9 July 1967 this battalion participated in a search and destroy operation in conjunction with Operation BUFFALO. On 9 July 1967 this battalion established a new CP at the Cam Lo Base Camp (YD 142614), relieving 2dBn, 9th Marines of this AO. Emphasis was placed on aggressive patrolling within the respective company sectors to counter and minimize enemy activity in these areas. The battalion established outposts and ambushes throughout the assigned TAOR.

From 14-16 July 1967 the battalion employed as a blocking force in conjunction with Operation HICKCRY II. During the remainder of the period the battalion was utilized in the support of Operation KING FISHER. All of the operations were in the Quan Cam Lo District and Quan Gio Linh District, Quang Tri Province, Republic of Vietnam.

- (f) Visibility. Vis bility was unlimited for ground troops. Fog and haze was virtually nonexistant.



q. Chaplain. During the month of July twelve protestant services were held with a total of 305 attending. The chaplain rade 18 visits to the dispensity, Circumstances did not permit the holding of memorial services. The applain continued to conduct troop indoctrination lectures on the religions of Viet Nam. With an attendence of 351, counseled 42 personnel, wrote 65 letters, conducted 1 Holy Unctions, and took care of 6 Red Cross cases. During the period Catholic services were held by Father Richard and Father Kiley, chaplins of 9th Marine Regiment and 11th Engineers, respectively. Both chaplains participated in Operation BUFFALO, and were in direct support of Operation HICKORY II and KING FISHER. 4 boxes of children's clothes were received from Episcopal Piocese of Massachuettes, these were turned over to S-5 for distribution.

r. Medical.

- (1) The medical status of the Battalion is presently satisfactory.

- (2) Two TOT's and 41 fire missions were fired with an expenditure of 6971 HE, 37 MP, and 1196 illumination rounds. Co L FO called in mission on an FVA truck convoy at YD 130787. Echo Battery, 2d Battalion, 12th Marines fired until Charlie Battery, 1st Battalion, 40th rtillery, USA, took over the mission. A surveillance of two secondary explosions was given. The FO for Co C, 1st Battalion, 9th Marines called a mission on NVA troops at YD 123725. Echo Battery fired the mission which resulted in a surveillance of 75 NVA KIA's. 
a. Weather/istronomical Data.

- (1) Temperature. The temperature for the period 02-10 July 1967 ranged from a low of 70 degrees to a high of 95 degrees farenheit.
 - (2) Precipitation. Negative.
 - (3) Winds. "ands from the southwest at 3-5 knots.
 - (4) Cloud Cover. The clouds were at 10,000 feet and scattered.
- (5) Visibility. The visibility was excellent and haze was virtually non-existant. Dust clouds on the trace produced by helicopters presented some problem in the LEZ area.
- (6) Light Data. An average of 13 daylight hours per day during the operation was emporienced.

(7) Effect on Enemy Operations. Weather conditions afforded the enemy good visibility. Parefore, helicopters and fixed wing aircraft were easily observed, and routes of approach could be observed at a great distance.





(8) Effect on Accomplishment of Own Mission. Weather was favorable for air operations, particularly close for support and helicopter operations. The nights were clear and therefore night illumination from the moon or pyrotectics was received at a maximum. The heat during the day hampered long range patrolling and movement.

b. Terrain.

- (1) Con Thien The Artillery/TSMC Outpost located at YD 115701 is the highest point in the area of operation.
- (2) Trace The man made trace between Con Thien (YD 115701) and Gio Linh (YD 213732) is a cleared area approximately 500 meters wide.
- (3) Road The north to south road (YD 137708) to (YD 135725) is easily recognized in the area and is accurately drawn on the map (mang Tri, Sheet 6442 IV, Sories L7014).
- (4) Mariet The destroyed market area (YD 135725) is randomly scattered but can be recognized easily.
- c. Observation and Fields of Fire. The open fields offer ercellent observation and fields of fire. Observation and fields of fire from one field to another is harmoned by hedgerows thus limiting said field of fire to 60 to 75 meters.
- d. Cover and Concealment. Concealment ranges from excellent in the thick hedge flows to extre ely poor in the open fields. Concealment is excellent for small groups of personnel. Large groups of personnel can be afforded cover if deployed properly. Hedge rows have old fighting holes and a few destroyed bunkers that provide good cover. Many terraced rice fields have ditches that were dug to provide dramage and dirt for dike construction. Remnance of homes also provide cover for smipers.
- e. Obstacles. The major obstacle for foot troops and track vehiclar movement was thick hedgerows consisting of brushwood, undergrowth, bamboo, and elephant grass. Hever-the-less, troops and track did move without great difficulty.
- f. Avenues of 'pproach Any part of the area can be easily approach-ed and there are no particular points of channelization.
- g. Landing Zones. IL3's are plentiful. Any number of helicopters can land on the trace bet cen Con Thien and Gio Linh. The open fields afford areas for two to five helicopters.
- h. Iffect on Themy Operations. North of the trace the terrain favors the enemy with relation to ambushes and fighting positions, however any massive enemy movement could easily be seen by aerial recommaissance. We ter can be obtained from the tributaries of the Ben Hai and the Ben Hai itself, also artesian wells at YD 128738 and the lake at YD 141730 are excellent water points.

i. Effect on Accomplishment of Own Mission. Terrain is favorable for major helicopter operations. Tracked vehicles can easily move, and in some areas wheel vehicles on be used; particularly the USAC mule. Troop movement is hampered when hedgerows produce difficulty in maintaining contact.


J. Enemy Situation.

- (1) Composition. From identification cards captured the enemy is believed to be from the 7th and 8th Battalians, 90th Regiment, 324B Division of the North Vietnamese Army. One NVA prisoner interrogated is believed to be from the 34th Independent B ttalian.
- (2) Strength and Combat Efficiency. The 90th Regiment, 324B Division has a strength of 2,400 personnel. The 90th Regiment's weapons consist of 82mm mortars, 60mm nortars, 75mm RR's, 12.7 AANG's, LMG's, HMG's and are believed to be readily available from units north of the Ben Hai. Combat efficiency of energy forces is assumed to be excellent.

k. Enemy Activity.

- (1) The one yand equipment. The enemy soldier was the NVA regular with average height of 5'4" and average weight of 120 pounds. The enemy had brush haircuts. The enemy wore green uniforms similar to USMC. Their boots are canvas with rubber cleated soles. A few jungle covers were discovered, but the most predominate covers were made of strips of bamboo, paper, plastic and camouflage type is terral. These covers are obviously designed to look like the USMC helmet. There is a possibility the NVA were wearing flak jackets obtained from USIC dead. The enemy was well equipped with web gear, all of which was in excellent condition. This gear consisted of cartridge belts, ammo pouches and Grenade pouches.
- (2) Energy We pens. The enemy was equipped with "K-47's, SKS's type 55, RPD's, RPG-2's, RPG-7's, 92mm mortars, 60mm mortars, assorted artillery, new ChiCom grenades, US anti-tank mines, and Russian claymores.
- (3) Energy Positions. The enemy dug bunkers with tops reinforced with logs 3" to 6" in diameter and 1' to 2' hard clay. Bunkers were flush to the ground. Most bunkers were connected by a trench line. Three circular positions, 4' deep and 8' in diameter, were found at YD 125728. These positions believed to be used as either mortar positions or AA positions. The three circular positions were located within benanna trees and were well comouflaged from ground level. Over 200 12.7mm shells were found in one hole.






- 7. <u>Mission</u>. 3d Battalion, 9th Marines (-)(Reinf) effect relief of 1st Battalion, 9th Marines and conducted search and destroy operations in assigned area, to locate and capture or destroy enemy forces, supplies and equipment.
- 8. Concept of operation. 3d Battalion, 9th Marines (-)(Reinf), commencing H-hour on 3 July 1967, attacked north along assigned axis, to exploit contact developed by 1st Battalion, 9th Marines on 2 July 1967. See reference (e).

9. Execution.

- a. Upon notification at approximately 021500 July 1967 of the requirement to reliforce 1st Battalion, 9th Morines elements in heavy contact, Co, K and the Command Group moved to helo-zone, Dong Ha for shuttle helolift to the trace east of Con Thien at YD 130706. Co. L followed being lifted from the field from vicinity YD 213536 Co. I moved by road from vicinity YD 303562 to the helo-zone, Dong Ha to complete the lift. 3d Battalion, 9th Marines units commenced lift at 021630 and completed same at 021900 except for 1st Platoon, Co. I which arrived 030000. At 021830 the CP received two volleys of incoming 105mm artillery from un'onown source to the north. Co. K contacted Co. A, 1st Battalion, 9th Marines at 021930 killing one and capturing one NVA soldier who had been wounded. Co. K returned with all Co. A .personnel and the POW at 022130. Co. I contacted Co. C, 1st Battalion, 9th Marines at 022045. During this period medevec's were being accomplished and completed by 02224. 3d Battalion, 9th Marines was assigned OPCON of A and C Co, 1st Battalion, 9th Marmes. During the course of the night all 3d Batt.lion, 9th Marines units continued to recrive sporadic incoming artillery and morter rounds. At 022300 all units were consolidated in vicinity of YD 151707 and night defensive fires were established. H&I fires continued throughout the night.
- b. During 3 July all efforts were concentrated on finding MIA's from 1/9 ZOA while avaiting 1/3 to link up for an attack to the north. Att 030730 saturation by air in 40A to the north commenced and secured et 030820. Air strikes accounted for 1 confirmed NV' KIA and numerous probables et YD 145748. Throughout the entire day 3/9 units continued probing for 1/9 IIA's and were constantly subjected to sniper, RPG and small arms fire from concealed positions. Co. K found 2 NVA KIA's at 031353. Co. L found and destroyed 1 RPG round employed as an AT mine. During the remainder of the afternoon and evening all 3/9 units continued to receive sporedic artillery and mortar fire. At 031935, 1/3 effected link-up with 3/9. Night defensive positions were established.



c. At 040700, 3/9 and 1/3 units jumped off in the attach to the north. At 0 76915 Co T . Rec contact with an ostil ated TV company at YD 127718. Co L on the right flank of Co K, also made contact with an unknown sized IV unit. Co I and L received inco ing 50mm morter rounds with each unit taking 1 TIA fro Programtation. Co K moved forward and established contact with the 'V' forces. Co K and L were taken under heavy automatic, semi-auto. Etic and 60mm mortar fire. 4t 040925 the 3d Platoon Commander Co I, was tilled in the fire fight. At 040945 three RPG rounds were fired at the tenes attached to Co K which were providing suppressive fire for the evacuation of Co K casualties. The tanks fired at the R.G. position with consister rounds and no more RPG's were fired from that position. At 0 1015 a Co L tenk was hit with an RPG round, disabled, and evacuated from the battle area. At 0410/3 Co C, 1/9 reported 11 WIM's * from artillery Translation, including the Company Contender. By 041050 all medev os were evecu ted by Aslicopter. Incmy tire from bunkers and tranchlians, including all types of weapons increased and by 041045 further movement forward was cassed as Co K had sustained 12 KIA's and 17 VIA's. The decision was made to pull to K and L back 200 meters to the vicinity of the east-west road, YD 129717, so that the area of contact could be saturated with artillery and air strikes. The withdrive was accomplished by 0.1150. During this period 3/9 CP group was taken under fire by rockets and artillery from the west of Con Thien for a period of 35 minutes. From 041200 to 041600 heavy air and artillery strikes were called in the area of original contact. Tanks attached to Co K fired on targets of opportunity accounting for 5 MVA KIA's. It 041630 Co K with 2 platoons from Co I and tanks attached, jumped off in the attack to sweep the area of previous contact and to recover Marine KIA's. The sweep was accomplished by 1830 with Co I elements suffering 2 KI/'s and 4 WIA's from enemy small arms fire from the right flank. One of the KIA's was the Company Con andar Coi The 3/9 S-3 wes ssigned command of Co I with the S-3A taking the responsibility of the S-3. By 042000 all units had returned to the vicinity of

d. At 0505 5 antillery began prep fire on areas YD 142720, YD 145728, and YD 145712. At 050630 artillery ceased and air began their prep of the same area. It 050730 all air prep of the area ceased. Co I, L, and K jumped off at 050715. At this time Co A and C, 1/9 were combined under the Couranding Officer of Co A. Co I, at 050825, reported crossing the road and uncovering 5 AT mines. It 050856, both Companies I and K reached the LOA. 050919 Co L reported finding 15 of 1/9 NTA's helfway to the LOA (YD 135725). Within the next hour Co L uncovered a minefield with 20 assorted mines, 1-250# bomb, and 2-500# bombs all set for electrical detrotation. All ordnance was blown in place with C-4. At 051000 Co I set out OP's approximately 75 meters from their position. Negative contact resulted. S-2 captured one crypto authentication table at an 81mm position.

551030 Co. L captured 43 rounds of 82mm with a large amount of increments and cleaning goar at YD 131723. 051121 Co. I captured a 60 mm mortar complete with base plate and bipod assembly at YD 130726. At the same time Co. L received 4 rounds 120mm rockets from a position 4000 meters nortwest of them. Again at 051156 / nore 120mm rockets were fired. Co. L reported the enemy position at YD 147734 and called ertillery. 051225 Co. I reported capturing 1 7.62 light machinegun w/bipod at YD 132725. The gun w s drum cannister fed with leaf sights. Co. I discovered five fresh shallow graves, with grave markers each containing one body. Co. I found two bunkers connected with trenchline heavily reinforced and covered with natural camouflage. In the bunkers were 43 82mm rounds attached to poles for corrying. 15 AT mines were uncovered. All lines and ordnance were blown in place with C-4. 051300 3/9 had recovered 47 1/9 ITA's. Co. I sent a notebook and Laotian currency (YD 132725), to 3/9 CP. Commending Officer, 9th Harine Regiment arrived at CP at 051515 and departed at 051405. 051410 3/9 CP received incoming 120mm rootets. Counter battery was called and enemy fire ceased. Co. 4 1/9 confirmed 3 NVA KIA at 051500. Co. L confirmed 2 NV KIA's by artiller at 051607. At this time Co. A reported one additional NVA KI'. All 3/9 units prepared night defensive positions.

e. 060840 Co. A, 1/9 and a unit from 3d Reconnaissance Battalion established a patrol base at YD 125727. At 061110 3/9 CP received 4 rounds of incoming artillery. This artillery was countered with artillery and the enemy positions were silenced. Co. L received 12 incoming artillery rounds. At 061320, 3/9 CP displaced to YD 128713. During the period 061645 - 061735 3/9 units less Co. A were subjected to a continuous proposition from three seperate ortillery batteries and one rocket battery. 500 to 600 rounds impacted in the area occupied by the forward companies and the Battalion CP, 150 meters to their rear. Co. A 1/9 was held in its position 1200 meters to the north west (YD 123725). All units prepared for a ground attack. Commencing 061700 enemy movement was observed to the north and northwest of 3/9's position. At this time all fires were being directed at the enemy artillery positions. 4.2 howitzer, 81 and 60mm mortar and tank fire was brought to bear on the advancing enew. A large enemy unit of some 400 men in approach march formation was observed moving toward the 3/9 positions under the artillery prep from the northwest obviously unaware of the Co. A position. Co. A took the end y flank underfire with machine gum, N-79, rifle and 60mm mortar fire at a range of 150 meters. The energy then closed on all sides and remained in heavy contact with Co. A until 062200. Artillery was called in to box the Co. A position and fired continuously until the heavy contact ended. From 062200 to 070530 Co. 4 received sporatic small arms and 60mm mortar fire. Co. I, K and L brought fire to bear on the advancing enemy 061715. The enemy unsuccessfully concentrated his effort on destroying the tonks located with the front line companies with RPG is. Ground contact at the 3/9 position ended 062130. Sporadic small arms and morter fire was received throughout the night. Flare ships, Huey gunships, fixed ving and all eveilable artillery was brought to bear on the enemy





throughout the engagement. 070530 Co. A with all consulties returned to the 3/9 perimeter without serious incident. Immediately after Co. A cleared the night position, a thirty minute enemy artillery preparation fell within their old lines. An immediate search of the battle field in encess of fifty meters in front of Co. A's position was precluded due to enemy observation, sniper, mortar and pre registered artillery fire throughout the area and to urgency of moving the Co. A casualties to the only secure LZ south of the Battalion CP along the trace. The results of the nights activity were:

f. 070620. Energy artillery started and lasted for approximately 20 minutes. At 070730 Co. A and recommaissance unit returned to 3/9 CP. At 070915 Co. L reported receiving 50 rounds energy artillery. Co. L FO spotted 2 MVA KIA confirmed. Co. L reported 4 MIA's. 071030 Co. L observed an MVA truck convoy (YD 130787) moving east to west. 071100 Co. L and AO sported truck convoy and NVA troops in masses. 105mm artillery was called in boxing in the convoy. At this point 175mm artillery was called along with TPQ 10's to cover YD 133755. Artillery lifted and air strikes and Huey gunships were called in. Results were 20 NVA confirmed and 50 probable. Artillery continued to fire after air had departed. This fire mission lasted until 071915. Co. I captured an unidentified barrell and receiver group. All gear was turned over to S-2 for identification. 3/9 units prepared night defense positions.

g. 080800 artillery prep fire were called in on area of planned activities in the vicinity of YD 125723. 081040 Co. I and L units reached the area where Co. A, 1/9 and reconniassance units had been engaged in heavy contact on the preceding day. 3/9 established a two company perimeter (YD 125724). All USMC gear was recovered and NVA packs and booby traps were uncovered by S-2 scouts. Two reconnaissance teams departed the perimeter to conduct reconnaissance mission in the area. One pith helmot, assorted NVA 782 gear, and several CHICOM grenades were captured by team two. Team one returned with three Russian claynores, 5-82mm rounds, and 3 boxes of 82mm igniters from YD 131723. NVA gear captured includes:

081300 all units were ordered to return to the CP. All displacements were completed by 081345. All 3/9 units were ordered to displace to southern side of trace. The move was completed at 08'655. 081630 3/9 CP was established at YD 132701. All units consolidated and formed a defensive perimeter.

h. 090800 3/9 chopped OPCON of 1/9 and 2/9 units and began move to Cam Lo Operating Base. 091100 Co. K reached Cam Lo. Co. L and the Command Group then proceeded to pick up point YD 120688. 091800 units departed pick up point and proceeded to new CP area. 3/9 relieved 2/9 of their TAOR and proceeded to establish the CF and night defensive positions.



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

11. Commanders Analysis.

- a. Initially, this baltalion received the mission of reinforcing Co's A. B. C. and elements of Co D. 1/9 engaged in heavy contact in the vicinity of the "Market" (YD 1372) north of the trace running from Cont Thien to Gio Linh. 3/9 was instructed to assume operational control of all units on the battlefield upon link-up. In view of the fact that this contact had started more than four hours prior the time 3/9 received its ission, the Commending Officer with a ten man command group elected to 1 and with the assault company by helicopter. Themy mortars and artiller in the LZ harrassed but did not slow the landing. By using the trace as an L's succeding wav s were landed 500 to 1,000 meters laterally from the initial touch down. Sporadic small arms and it fire was delivered upon the Marines as they crossed the trace. Satisfactory communications were established within 15 minutes. 3/9 assumed OpCon of 1/9 units at this time. A link-up with the elements of Co D and tanks was effected within 15 minutes. 1/9 casualties were shifted to a safe area and evacuations started. Co & moved to link with Co & and found to A was 350 degree defensive perimeter with moderate to helvy contact. Her were receiving small arms, mortar and artillery fire. The enemy live was neutrolized and Co K was assisted in moving the casualties to the LZ for evocuation. Co I linked with Co C and the remaining non of Co B and the wounded were evacuated. The KIA of Co B were not recovered at this time. Co B and D personnel were moved to Con Thien this evening. Co A and C were consolidated within the 3/9 positions.
- b. During the following three days enemy contact varied from light to very heavy as the area was being searched for life's from Co B, 1/9. The every had all areas of previous contact registered with artillery and mortar fire.
- c. Enroughout the eight days 3/9 was in the field during Operation BUFF^LO daily contact was established by each unit of the battalion. On 4 July, while on the move with 2 companies abreast, a sizeable enemy force in defensive positions was encountered. Igain contact was at extremely close range and the enemy attempted to encircle the flank of the attacking unit. He used the same basic tactic when the 3/9 defensive positions were attacked during the period of 6-7 July.
- d. After personally viewing the battlefield and the disposition of the friend [KI 's and the enemy bodies found, the following conclusions were drawn:
- (1) Co A was well desposed and in a tactical position to engage the every at all times. Shortly after Co B was attacked by the PV force Co A boome engaged and, although well disposed, suffered casualties to the export they were unable to fight and move simultaneously. However, Co A was still in a good defensive position, still fighting and had in-inflicted heavy casualties upon the enemy when link-up was accomplished.








- (2) The other route of advance we along a trail running generally south to north from the trace to the "larket" on an old cart road 8 to 12 feet wide. In many areas the trail is cut and worm three to four feet below ground level. Practically the enture trail is bordered on both sides by a bamboo and thorn bush hedge which is virtually impassible to foot troops except for cuts and breaks in the hedge at irregular intervals. It appears as though the the as in a column along the trail stretched fro 500 meters north of the trace to the vicinity of the "Market" then they were engaged by the enemy. Practically all of the Co. B KI 's recovered were in the trail. The few not physically in the trail were within 15 meters of the trail. After engaging the Co., with small arts, the enemy utilized grenades and preregistered mortar fire. Most Exrines in the trail could not get out except through the few openings in the hedge row which were obviously covered by fire. From the sigh number of small craters made by grenades it appeared as though the enty pinned the Co, down in the trail and lobbed grenades over the hedge row.
- e. The IVA forces appear to be fully aware of the Marine tradition to relove all wounded and dead from the battle field. Evacuation efforts were covered by enemy artillery, mortar and small arms fire. Further if our aid station or La could be located they were subjected to heavy artillery fire.
- f. Enert tactics from previous contact in the operating area were reaffirmed during Operation BUFFALO. It is apparent that the NV desires to writ until conditions are to his advantage before initiating action. Te have constantly showed a reluctance to engage major units that are becaucily disposed with a good front and solid flank security. However by using the tactics of extreme close initial contact coupled with his demonstrated ability to rapidly manuever; he will strike any unit regardless of size deployed in a column or linear formation locking dept. or flank security.
- g. Due to the fact that the entire area north of the trace from Con Thien east almost to Gio Linh is a series of trenches, fighting holes and hedgerous affording excellent cover and concealment, units on the move rost likely will not observe enemy forces prior to a meeting engagement or, if the unit does not have proper security and the ability to repidly manuever, and ambush.
- h. Hove ent throughout the area of operation in all tactical formations is ossible. Such movement is not easy and is slow but can be accomblished. Then entering extremely heavy brush over a large area units can still move deployed in 3 parallel columns. This affords security to the flanks and permits further maneuver in the event of enemy contact.




- i. This Battalion encountered no evidence of the NV- using gas or vearing Marine flak jackets and helmets. In fact the Co. B 1/9 KIA's recovered after 3 d ys on the battle field still had their individual equipment less some weapons, most of which were evacuated with the wounded on 2 July.
- j. In order to maintain control and keep aware of the tactical situation in this close quarter combat, the command group remained no more than 150 meters from the lead companies. This has some disadventages in that the command group is subjected to small arms fire that passes through the brush and morters and artillery that are fired long at the lead companies. However, if the commander is ever to use an OP or personally observe and influence the action when his units are in contact it is imperative that he be near his lead unit.
- k. Due to heavy H&I's, TPQ's and the lack of water in the area around the "Tirket," it appears as though the enemy only moves into this area wich he has a mission. However adequate water and harbor sites are available in vicinity of GS YD 1373 and in the DMZ.
- 1. The terrain in the area of contact consisted of terraced farming squares bordered by hedgerows with fighting holes and trenches in each hedge row. Most of the trenches appear to have been dug as a part of the overrall agricultural project years ago. Trenches on either side of the bamboo line prevents the bamboo from spreading throughout the field. The squares appear to have been made dependent upon the sloes of the ground. Each square is bordered by a hedge row to prevent errosion and a drop or rise depending upon the ground level of the next plot. This area has not been farmed in some years. Consequently the farm plots are over grown with grass, brush and banana trees.
- m. ridge line extends from "Market" westerly for almost 3500 meters. This ridge affords excellent long range observation south to Con Thien, Dong Ha and much of the terrain in between. It also affords observation north up to a range of 14000 meters. Novement out of the DMZ south to the reverse slope of this ridge is possible without being observed from Con Thien. This ridge complex is critical both to the enemy and friendly units. The easist approach from the south to the ridge complex is along the high ground running northeast for 2000 meters from Con Thien and east along the ridge complex itself. Movement from the east is under observation from the ridge in the vicinity of the "Market. Movement from the trace north towards the "Market is under energy observation.

12. Reconsendations.

a. That operations conducted in the BUFFALO operation area be of battalion and at a minimum regardless of previous enemy sightings and contacts.







A Battalion of 4 companies reinforced with tracked vehicles can conduct operations including reconnaissance in force in this area. It the same time in the event of a major encounter a unit of this size on remain self supporting in heavy contact for two or three days until necessary reinforcements could be employed.

- b. That the tactical formation affording the required security during movement be no less than three parallel columns separated by approximately fifty meters.
- c. That extensive use of artillery and hir be employed in all suspected areas prior to entry with ground forces. If supporting arms are not available at the time desired; delay movement.
- extensively when operating in this area in a general support role. The RPG has been found to be relatively inaccurate at ranges greater than 150 meters. By careful employment of infantry forces the effects of the RPG can be minimized. The tanks supporting 3/9 were fired at daily with RPG's and only one was hit. That tank left the battlefield under it's own nover.



- a. Artillery. Wiskey Battery, 2nd Battalion, 12th Marines was in direct sup ort of this battalion from 14 July to 16 July 1967. The battery fired 13 missions for the FO's for India and Lima Companies. These missions included 7 on likely enemy positions and venues of approach to the flanks and 6 defensive registrations. 25 Hal's per night were fired on targets' derived from the bottolion S-2 and targets suggested by the FO's. Negative surveillance was given on all missions.

a. Weather.

- (1) Temperature. The temperature average for the period 140900 161559 was a high of 94 degrees fahrenheit and a low of 69 degrees fahrenheit. The relative humidity was 80 %.
- (2) Precipitation. The precipitation for this period consisted of very light springles, but no heavy measurable amounts were recorded.
 - (3) Winds. The winds were variable at a speed of 6-15 knots.
- (4) Cloud Coverage. The clouds were scrttered at a height of 10,000 feet. During the periods of light precipitation, the clouds were still of considerable height and scattered.
- (5) Visibility. The visibility averaged 15 miles, and fog and haze were virtually non-existent.

- (7) Effect on Themy Operations. Weather conditions afforded the enemy good visibility over HLZ's and routes of approach. The lunar illumination afforded the enemy enough visibility for extensive night movement.
- (8) Effect of Accomplishment of Our Mission. Weather was favorable for air operations, writicularly close air support and helicopter operations. The nights were gonerally clear, and therefore, lunar illumination and pyrotectics could be utilized to a maximum. The heat hampered long range patrolling during the mid-day, but early norming and late afternoons afforded more confortable temperatures for movement.

b. Terrain.

(1) Critical Terrein Fe tures. The Song Cam Lo runs from west to east in the general vicinity YD 1259 to YD 1760, south of this particular TAOR.

- (2) MSR. This road, the main supply route; extends from Can Lo to Con Thien. The road is cleared approximately 200 meters on each side, and this feature or easily be seen from area of operation.
- (3) Will 30 and 31. These 2 hills, located vicinity YD 1461 and 1561 respectfully, are the location of USMC installations.
- (4) Observation and Fields of Fire. The vegetation ranged from short grasses in dry rice addies to brushwood with a height of 8 feet. The dry rice paddies afforded relatively good observation and fields of fire. The brushwood afforded approximately 10 meters of observation and restricted fields of fire.
- (5) Concealment and Cover. Concealment ranges from poor in the rice paddy areas to good in the brushwood areas. The low rolling hills and rice paddy dikes afford fair cover from ground fire, but the cover is poor for mortar and artillery fire.
- (6) Obstacles. If jor obstacles to foot and track vehicles are the brushwood areas and trick vegetation along stream beds. Movement of troops is possible but generally very difficult. The stream beds are either dry or have very little water, however, the steep banks of the stream beds constitute a major obstacle to track rehicles.
- (7) Avenues of pproach. my part of the area can be approached from any direction. The tank trails in the area affords easy and rapid movement.
- (8) Landing Mones. The HLZ's are not plentiful and multi-landing in a small creatist not probable. The terrain affords randowly located PLZ's which could be used for resupply and nedevac purposes. The MSR affords unlimited HLZ's for any operations.
- (9) If fect on Themy Operations. Small groups of enemy personnel could move with little difficulty without being observed. Large units would not have adequate conce limit and cover for massive movement without detection during daylight hours.
- (10) Effect on complishment of Own Mission. Terrain is favorable for blocking forces. We ter is available from stream (YD 123626) south to the Sung Cam Lo. Large scale helicopter operations can be conducted from the ISR. Foot and track wehicles can move but with some difficulty.

c. Enemy Situation.

(1) Composition. The suspected enemy in our area of operation was reported by agents and no physical contact or sighting was made. In agent reported 1 VC name Coroce battalion (unknown name) appeared at YD 165635. They later moved to YD 167645 and YD 172643 to dig foxholes.

Another report stated one VC main force company appeared at YD 162653 and moved to about YD 156644 for rest. The company then moved to YD 147645 and disappeared. Both reports had an F-6 rating.

- (2) Strength. From agent reports the VC main Force battalion is completely formed with weapons. The troops were wearing light blue uniforms and some women were with the battalion. The VC main force company was armed with 82mm force; machine guns, BAR's and individual weapons.
- (3) Enemy Activity. There have been reports of AP and AT mines in the area. AP mines have been reported along the streams located from YD 153676 to YD 188675 and from YD 155657 to YD 184666. Command detonated claymores have also been reported in the area. 9 T mines were discovered along the MSR in grid square YD 1365.
- 7. Mission. 3d Bottalion, 9th Marines continue defense of C M LO and establish minimum of two company sized blocks to support scheme of maneuver.
- 8. Concept of Operation. 3d Battalion, 9th Marines establish blocks with two companies, one to each side of Route #561, in the vicinity of the 625 East-West grid line; coodinate block established by two Cam Lo RF companies in vicinity YD 1060.

9. Execution.

- a. Prior to 1-lour on 14 July 1967, Co I and L departed Cam Lo perimeter to establish blocking positions approximately 1000 meters to the north. At 0845, Co L w s is their blocking position with their flanks extending, from YD 135625 to YD 144625. It 1045, Co I reported their blocking position established from YD 124626 to YD 129626. It 1130 two local Regional Forces from Cam Lo District reported their blocking positions established from YD 105602 to YD 110603. At 1200 the RF unit spotted 7 VC at YD 125604 and fired shall arms and 50mm morter fire with negative results. No further contact throughout the day or night. The RF unit was relieved nightly at 1800 by CAC-1 reinforced with a squad from Co I and a sniper team.
- . b. On 15 July 1967 all 3d Batvalion, 9th Marines units remained in their same blocking positions of 14 July, and no enemy contact developed. RF companies resured their block at 150000.
- c. Blocking nost tions for 3d Battalion, 9th Marines unrts were withdrawn by 161125 July 1967 with negative enemy contact throughout the operation. Operation, TICKORY II terminated at 161559H July 1967.

5. Supporting Arus.

a. Artillery. During the period of Operation CIBERRON, an average of 29 H&I fires per night and 3 rounds per mission were fired in support of Third Battalion, Minth Marines. 14,000 rounds of HE, 132 rounds of WP, and 24 rounds of illumination were fired in direct support of this battalion.

b. Air Support. During Operation CIMERON, air support was requested for direct support of this battalion. Of the 79 missions requested, 78 were received providing this battalion with excellent air support. A detailed breakdown by type of aircraft is as follows:

b. Terrain. Terrain is of two different areas. The terrain north of the Cam Lo River and that area near the DMZ is characterized by plains leading to low mountains with elevations ranging from 50 to 300 meters with the exception of Dong Ha Mountain which is the commanding terrain feature at YD 019593. The hills become increasingly rugged toward the west with short ridges randomly orientated in an easterly direction. The most prevelant vegetation in this area is dense undergrow forest, particularly along the larger stream valleys. Brushwood is interspersed between the forests. This undergrowth is passable with difficulty by foot troops and impassable by conventional vehicles except along trails and roads. Tanks can slowly clear paths through the shallow root vegetation in the rolling plains.





The brushwood areas consist of moderate growth and does not exceed 3 meters in height. In the terrain south of Dong Ha the plains are low rolling with elevation between 10 and 58 meters. The vegetation is prodominantly brushwood averaging in height of four feet. Vegetation along the streams is particularly dense with a height of 4 meters.

Significant Events. During the period 1-7 June this battalton remained in the Operation HICKORY 1 area. See reference (j). 1 June contact was made with an estimated reinforced company in the vicinity of Hill 94 (YD 089652). The enemy was well covered in bunkers and concealed in brushwood and hervy undergrowth. The enemy was in a security position for Hill 94, Their defenses were disposed to cover the corridor running from north to south. The position was reduced by attacking through heavy brush from east to west. During the period 13-20 June 1967, a search and destroy mission was conducted, north of Con Thien. See reference (a). In excess of 500 bunker complexes were detected and destroyed. Positions were predominately covered bunkers, 6x4x4 feet with three layers of logs and packed dirt for the top. The majority of these bunkers were in some military tactical position, either 360's, 180's, or "L" shaped. Many of these bunkers were connected by trenches and mortar positions were within the trenches. All mortar positions were directed toward Con Thien. On 28 June 1967 the 3d Battalion, 9th Marines conducted a search and destroy operation in connection with 2d ARVN Regiment and three RF companies from Quang Tri Province in the area east of Route #1 between Dong Ha and Quang Tri with negligable contact. A VC rice catche in excess of 5 tons was captured.

7. Mission. See references (b) through (h).

- 8. Concept of Operation. 3d Battalion, 9th Marines (-)(Reinf) conducted deliberate search and destroy operations in assigned operating areas to locate and capture and destroy enemy forces, supplies and equipment. See references (b) through (h).
- 9, Execution. During the period 1-9 June 1967, this battalion continued in the defense of Camp J. J. CARROLL and the CUA VALLEY area (YD 095515). Emphases was placed on aggressive patrolling within the respective company sectors to counter and minimize enemy activity in these areas. The battalion established outposts and ambushes throughout the assigned TAOR.

On 10 June 1967, this battalion completed the move into Dong Ha Combat Base and Ws assigned the basic mission of base reaction force and Sparrov Hawk. The battalion CP area was established at (YD 241592). Che company was chopped Opcon to the 12th Marines for the defense of Clo Linh.

From 1-7 June, 13-20 June and 28 June, the battalion participated in search and destroy operations in conjunction with Operation CIMARRON in the Quan (am Lo District and Quan Gio Linh District, Quang Tri Province- RVN.
