PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the period of 1-31 December 1968, the 3d Battalion 9th Marines participated in operations in the QUAN BA LONG and QUAN TRIU PHONG Districts located within the 3d Marine Division's area of operations.

On 1 December 1968 the 3d Battalion 9th Marines was located on and around FSB TON T VERN and still engaged in Operation DAWSON RIVER AFTON, which began during the month of November. During this operation the Battalion's mission was to conduct detailed search and clear operations and to seek out, capture or kill the enemy, capture his supply facilities and destroy his positions and emplacements. This operation turned out to be of long duration, ending on 25 December 1968. By the end of the operation the Battalion had swept to the eastern boundary of the QUAN BA LONG District and it was in this area that the Battalion suffered two friendly KIAs and two WIA. Results of Operation DAWSON RIVER AFTON were impressive, with many enemy

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bunkers, compounds, and structures destroyed. In addition, were (22) 122mm rockets, (2) B-40 rockets, (1) 75mm recoilless rifle, 10 sub-machine guns, 82 individual weapons and 16,883 rounds of small arms ammunition captured. There were 20 enemy KIA (confirmed) listed for this operation.

On 26 December 1968 the 3d Battalion, 9th Marines was relocated to the Rehabilitation Center on the Cua Viet River, for two days of rest and recuperation.

On 28 December 1968 the 3d Battalion, 9th Marines returned to VCB and from there, were helilifted to the western portion of the QUAN TRIEU PHONG District, to begin Operation DAWSON RIVER. This operation did not have very lucrative results. Search and clear operations were conducted in the area immediately surrounding FSB HOLCOMB in the D-5 area with no contact made and the operation was secured on 31 December 1968.

- f. Command relations coordination and assistance from supporting units was excellent at all levels
- g. Equipment During this period there were no serious problems with equipment. Normal Marine Corps issue was sufficient in all respects.
- h. Logistics Support received during this period was quite adequate to support operations.
- j. Administration The administrative details were handled without difficulties during this period
- k. Personnel Replacement personnel were available in sufficient numbers during this period and the Battalion strength was maintained at a satisfactory level.

1. Intelligence

(1) Weather

(a) Temperature- The average high for the month of December was 62-87 degrees fahrenheit. The mean minimum temperature ranged between 60-65 degrees fahrenheit.

(b) Winds- Winds during the month of December were mostly from the east-northeast at an average of 7-12 knots per hour, with occasional gusts up to 25 knots per hour.

(c) Precipitation- The precipitation was greatest toward the end of the month. The accumulated amount of rainfall during the month was 6-7 inches

(d) Humidity- The relative humidity averaged 84%

(e) Cloudiness- Cloudiness increased toward the end of the month and clouds were broken to scattered at 3000 to 4000 feet. The sun shown through 6 out of 10 days.

(f) Visibility- Visibility averaged 4-6 miles and was limited to 1-3 miles in the early morning and late afternoon.

(2) Terrain

(a) Observation- Observation was limited at times by the thick undergrowth and forest. Fields of fire had to be cleared and were also limited by the trees and brush.

(b) Cover- Cover was good in that the trees, bomb craters, ridges and mountain tops themselves provided some degree of protection. Concealment was good in the forest areas and was aided by the use of camouflaged utilities.

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(c) Obstacles- There were no manmade obstacles but natural obstacles included steep hills, thickly forested terrain and occasionally a river or stream.

(f) Terrain- The key terrain includes many high ridges and peaks. The most prominent features were Hill 512, the Dong Co Tien mountain range, the Dong Ha Ri mountain range; Hills # 742, 636, 848, 386, 344, and 218. In addition, there was FSR DAVIS at YD 249291.

(g) Avenues of Approach included the numerous fingers and ridges, a well developed trail system, stream beds and numerous draws.

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Enemy

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(a) Enemy activity- The enemy still seemed to be avoiding contact with allied units. On 11 November 1968 when we first began this operation Kilo Company had contact with approximately six (6) NVA and received S/A and mortar fire. Upon moving to the area around HLZ D VIS we again encountered an estimated two squads of NVA on 8 December 1968. We continued to sight small groups of NVA until the termination of the operation several times attempting to engage them in a fire fight, but each time the NVA broke the contact.

m. Communications The Radio Section has continued to provide communications for the Battalion as well as to higher Headquarters, utilizing both covered and uncovered circuits. Telephone communications are established in the Battalion Rear and to VCB. The message Center at the Battalion Rear received 465 messages and had 10 outgoing during the month of December. Transmitter and receiver elements for the 4-189 handset and modules for the AN/PRC-25 are still in critical shortage.

n. Fire Support

(1) The 2nd Battalion, 12 Marines fired in support of the Battalion during this reporting period.
