NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- (c) During the month of November, the Battalion controlled sixteen round trip task convoys to An Hoa. The Battalion was in direct support of Operation Meade River, transporting troops and supplies to pre-planned positions. The Battalion sustained two WIA's (MINOR). The Battalion was visited by Lt. Gen. H. NICKERSON, Assistant Chief of Staff Manpower, Headquarters Marine Corps; Maj. Gen. C. A. YOUNGDALE, 1st Marine Division Commander; Brig. Gen. R. T. DWYER, Assistant Division Commander; Brig. Gen. R. B. CARNEY Jr., Assistant 3rd Marine Division Commander; Brig. Gen. J. A. FEELEY, Commanding General FLC; Col. J. E. WILSON Jr., 1st Marine Division G-4, and Col. J. L. SCHWARTZ, Division Supply Officer.
- (c) At 200900H November 1968, an M-54A2C truck cargo detonated an estimated 80lb. box mine at BT039627 (VIC). One USMC KIA, six USMC WIA (EVAC), thirteen USMC WIA (MINOR); truck destroyed.
- (c) Civil Affairs treated; 256 Vietnamese civilians at the Battalion Aid Station and Med Cap.
- (c) This Battalion travelled 74,397 miles, hauled 10,589 tons and carried 22,122 passengers during this period.
