- (c) During the month of January the Battalion controlled four round trip Task Convoys to An Hoa. The Battalion provided direct support for Operation Taylor Common, Linn River and the 26th Marines, transporting supplies and conducting troop deployments. The Battalion was visited by Gen. L. F. CHAPMAN JR., Commandant of the Marine Corps; Maj. Gen. C. A. YOUNGDALE, Assistant III MAF Commanding General; Maj. Gen. O. R. SIMPSON, Commanding General, 1st Marine Division; and Sergeant Major H. J. SWEET, Sergeant Major of the Marine Corps.
- (c) Civil Affairs provided 250 cans of food for cattle and pigs; held one (1) MedCap treating 76 people; showed two (2) PSYOP movies to 400 people and completed the pig farm project.
- (c) This Battalion travelled 66,998 miles, hauled 14,797 tons and carried 22,985 passengers during this period.
