## PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- (c) During the month of March, the Battalion controlled thirty-one round trip Task Convoys to An Hoa, averaging between twenty-five and thirty vehicles daily. The Battalion provided direct support for Operations Taylor Common, and Seventh and Twenty-sixth Marines, transporting supplies and conducting troop deployments. At 061400H March 1969 an M-54A2C detonated a land mine at BT066671, resulting in one (1) USMC KIA, two (2) USMC WIA and destruction of the vehicle.
- (c) Civil Affairs provided 200 cans of food for cattle and pigs; held one (1) Dent-MedCap treating 49 people; showed two (2) PSYOP movies to 200 people. Well project is 80% complete. On 9 March 1969, Mr. NGUYEN TI was elected as the new Hamlet Chief of Khanh Son.
- (c) This Battalion travelled 66,361 miles, hauled 8,521 tons and carried 14,008 passengers during this period.

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

- (c) 1 March-At 1400H, convoy received 2 sniper rounds at AT960584. No injuries or damage to vehicles.
- Transported elements of 2/7 from Hill 60 to the Rock Crusher and from Hill 22 to Hill 55.
- (c) 3 March-At AT905475, convoy received mortars, resulting in negative casualties and damage to vehicles.
- Transported 325 men, elements of 1/7, from Hill 55 to Hill 37 and from Hill 37 to Hill 55.
- (c) 6 March-At 1400 an M54A2C detonated a land mine at BT066671. Truck destroyed. One (1) USMC KIA and 2 USMC WIA.
- Transported 2/26 from Hill 60 to Liberty Bridge.
- (c) 9 March-Transported "A" 1/7 from Hill 37 to Rock Crusher.
- (c) 14 March-Transported 250 RF's from top of Hai Van Pass to AT927923 and AT935902.
- (c) 23 March-Transported 3/26 from Liberty Bridge to Hill 55.
- (c) 28 March-Transported MP's, PF's and elements of 3/1 into Dogpatch at AT9976 for Cordon and Search Operation.
- (c) 29 March-Transported "F" 2/26 from Rock Crusher to Hill 10.
- (c) 30 March-Transported elements of "E" and "H" 2/7 from Rock Crusher to Hill 10.
