NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- (c) During the month of April, the Battalion controlled thirty round trip task convoys to An Hoa, averaging between twenty-five and thirty vehicles daily. The Battalion provided direct support for the first and twenty-sixth Marine Regiments, transporting supplies and conducting troop movements. At 011600H Apr 1969, an M-54A2C detonated a 40lb. box mine at (AT945582) resulting in 1 USMC WIA (E) and destruction of the vehicle.
- (c) Civil Affairs provided 200 cans of food for feeding of cattle and pigs; showed eight PSYOPS movies to approximately 500 villagers. Approximately 60 people from the hamlet of Khanh Son were treated at the BAS. During the month, well project is 80% complete; medical building project is 95% complete.
- (c) The Battalion travelled 71,156 miles, hauled 9,324 tons and carried 21,228 passengers.

1 Apr 69-1600 an M-54A2C detonated a 40lb. mine at (AT945582) resulting in 1 USMC WIA (E) and destruction of the truck.
