NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- (c) During the month of May, the Battalion controlled thirty-one round trip task convoys to An Hoa, averaging between twenty-five and thirty-five vehicles daily. The Battalion also provided direct support for the Seventh Marine Regiment. In addition, the Battalion conducted convoys in general support of the First, Fifth, Seventh and Twenty-sixth Marine Regiments. Several of these convoys supported Operations Oklahoma Hills and Pipestone Canyon. The Battalion also provided M-116A1 (Huskies) in direct support of First Battalion, Fifth Marines, and Third Battalion, Fifth Marines.
- (c) Civic Action provided 50 barrels of waste food for the pig farm project. The Battalion Aid Station treated 48 Vietnamese civilians and arranged for dental care for 14 civilians. Four PSYOPS movies were shown to approximately 500 villagers. Two trailer loads of scrap building materials were provided for two families whose homes were destroyed by fire during the Post TET Offensive.
- (c) The Battalion travelled 94,260 miles, hauled 17,169 tons of cargo and carried 27,024 passengers.

- 25 May-Conducted a 16 truck convoy in support of 3/5 on Operation Pipestone Canyon.
- 26 May-Conducted a 20 truck convoy in support of 1/26 on Operation Pipestone Canyon.
- 31 May-Conducted a 26 truck convoy in support of the First Marine Regiment on Operation Pipestone Canyon.
-Conducted a 16 truck convoy in support of First Bridge Company, hauling bridging trailers to Lang-Co Bridge.
