

Part II

Narrative Summary

(c) During the month of June, the Battalion controlled thirty (30), round trip, task convoys to An Hoa. These convoys averaged between twenty-five and thirty-five trucks. The Battalion conducted convoys in support of the First, Fifth, Seventh, and Twenty-Sixth Marine Regiments as well as First Bridge Company. In addition, the Battalion hauled companies of the First and Fifth Marines to and from the "Stack Arms" R&R Center. Several convoys supported Operation Pipestone Canyon. The Battalion also provided M16A1 (HUSKY) Marginal Terrain Vehicle to First Battalion Fifth Marines and Third Battalion Fifth Marines during the reporting period.

(c) Civil Affairs provided two-hundred (200) barrels of waste food to the people of Khanh Son (for feeding Pigs). Thirty-three (33) Vietnamese were treated at the Battalion Aid Station and four (4) were given dental care during the month of June. Two (2) trailerloads of scrap lumber and tin were distributed to the villagers through the Hamlet Chief. Two (2) psyops movies were shown during the month to approximately two-hundred (200) people.

(c) The Battalion travelled 123,872 miles, hauled 16,592 tons and carried 33,404 passengers during the reporting period.

- 12 June - Conducted two ten truck convoys in support of Second Battalion Twenty-Sixth Marines hauling troops and supplies to the Bridge Ramp.
