Part II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

(a) During the month of September, thirty-three (33) convoys were run to An Hoa in support of the Fifth Marine Regiment. There were also twelve (12) R&R runs to the Stack Arms R&R Center. The units transported to the R&R site were from the First, Fifth and Seventh Marine Regiments. In addition to the An Hoa Convoys and R&R runs, convoys were conducted to provide logistical support and replacement troops to Division Infantry Units. The Battalion's M-116A1 Marginal Terrain Vehicles were being used in logistical support roles at the Danang Barrier and the Fifth, Seventh and Twenty-Sixth Marine Regiments. On 11 September, a Change of Command Ceremony was held. Maj. M. J. ZACHODNI accepted the Command of 11th Motor Transport Battalion from LtCol. J. A. KINNIBURGH. On 18 September 1969, LtCol. W. R. KEPHART reported aboard, assumed command and informally relieved Maj. M. J. ZACHODNI as the Commanding Officer.

(b) Civil Affairs provided two-hundred (200) barrels of pig food to the Khanh-Son Hamlet for the feeding of pigs. Approximately twenty-seven (27) Vietnamese were treated at the Battalion Aid Station. In addition, six (6) dental cases were treated. MedCaps were conducted at the Khanh-Son Hamlet. Approximately four-hundred-fifty (450) Vietnamese were treated by the 11th Motor Transport Battalion MedCap Team. Lt. W. D. BAILEY also made several emergency calls to villagers unable to be treated at the Battalion Aid Station. On 25 September, candy and chewing gum were distributed to the children of Khanh-Son in accordance with the celebrating of "Children's Day" throughout the Danang area.

(c) During September, 11th Motor Transport Battalion vehicles traveled 119,297 miles, carried 15,458 tons of cargo and hauled 26,120 troops.

- 17 Sep Conducted a thirteen (13) truck convoy hauling Third Battalion First Marine troops from the Stack Arms R&R Center to Hill 37.
- 18 Sep LtCol. W. R. KEPHART assumed command of the Battalion informally relieving Maj. M. J. ZACHODNI as the Commanding Officer.
- 20 Sep Conducted a ten (10) truck convoy carrying troops from Third Battalion First Marines to the Stack Arms R&R Center.
