NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During 1 April to 14 April the Battalion was in "stand-down" in preparation for redeployment to Camp Pendleton, California.
2. The Battalion's vehicles traveled 8,567 miles, hauled 279 tons and transported 1,199 passengers during 1 April to 14 April 1971.
3. The Battalion continued to conduct an active and effective Civil Affairs Program. The Battalion continues to support the projects indicated by the following data:
 - a. Approximately sixty (60) cans of waste food products were delivered to the hamlet of Khan Son for swine consumption. Forty-two (42) villagers received treatment at the Battalion Aid Station. On 9 April 1971, the Battalion donated \$500.00 to the Protestant Children Orphanage at China Beach and \$200.00 to World Division Incorporated.
4. On 14 April 1971, the 11th Motor Transport Battalion executed a convoy to Deep Water Pier, which consisted on Company "C" reinforced, with elements from Company "A", Company "B", Transport Company, and Headquarters and Service Company, for a total of ninety-two (92) vehicles staged at POE for redeployment to Camp Pendleton, California.
