PART IINarrative Summary

During the month of June 1967, the major artillery effort was directed towards supporting fires for the defense of the Danang TAOR and support of operations in the surrounding areas. Additionally, supporting fires were provided for elements of the 1st Reconnaissance Battalion (Rein) inserted deep in the Viet Cong controlled territory, CIDG/Special Forces Camps and elements of the 2nd ARVN Division. Operations supported during the period include Operations UNION II, BUTLER, ARIZONA, ADAIR, BEACON TORCH, BROWN and CALHOUN.

The Headquarters 1st Field Artillery Group displaced to the 3rd Marine Division during the month of June, and chopped in OPCON to the 3rd Marine Division 11 June 1967.

2. Enemy, Weather, and Terrain

a. During the reporting period, three officers have been assigned as Regimental S-2. 1stLt TURNER was assigned duties as S-2 when Capt HANSON was hospitalized early in the month. Toward the end of the month Lt TURNER was reassigned to the AO section. 2ndLt ARAGON has presently been assigned the duties as Regimental S-2 officer.

b. The assignment of SSgt Chung To HA, ARVN interpreter to the Regiment, has improved collection capabilities and relations with the local Vietnamese. Two additional interpreters for assignment to Artillery Battalions are needed to fill the requirements of the Regiment.

c. Rotation of personnel to CONUS has resulted in a further shortage of Intelligence Chiefs. Three additional Intelligence Chiefs are needed to fill the requirements of this Regiment.

d. Liaison visits to the Regimental OPs have continued to improve the maintenance of equipment and security of the positions. Improvements have included the reinforcing of defensive bunkers, building better ammo bunkers, clearing vegetation around the perimeter and improving living conditions on OP Eagle. Maintenance on two BC Scopes has been performed during the reporting period.

e. Information received from an agent report indicated a possible rocket attack on the 3rd 8 inch Howitzer Battery (SP) Complex scheduled for 27 June 1967. Attempts were made to confirm the information resulting with a possibly true evaluation. The attack did not take place on the scheduled date, however several incidents of VC being observed and harrassing small arms fire were reported in this area. Though the date of the attack was reported to be on 27 June, it was not specified if it was Julian or Lunar Calendar. Lunar Calendar date of 27 June is on the 4th of July, Julian Calendar.

3. Organization and Operations. Units of the Regiment participated in seven (7) operations in the Danang area during the month of June 1967. These were:

a. Operation UNION II. A 5th Marine operation supported by 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines; 3rd Platoon, 3rd 155 Gun Battery; 2nd Platoon, 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery; Battery L, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines. For details see TABS (F), (H), (I), and (J).

b. Operation BUTLER. A 3rd Battalion, 7th Marines operation supported by Battery I, 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines; Battery M, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines; 3rd Platoon, 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery and 2nd Platoon, 3rd 155 Gun Battery. For details see TABS (G), (H), (I), and (J).

c. Operation ARIZONA. A 7th Marine operation supported by Battery I, 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines; Battery K, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines; 1st & 3d Platoon, 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery; detachment Searchlights, Headquarters Battery, 11th Marines; Battery G(-), 29th Artillery (SL); 2nd Platoon, 1st Armored Amphibian Company; Battery E, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines; Detachment Battery M, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines; Headquarters Battery, 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines. For details see TABS (G), (H), (I) and (K).

d. Operation ADAIR. A 5th Marines operation supported by Battery F(-) 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines; Battery W, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines; Battery L, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines; 1st and 3rd Platoon, 3rd 155 Gun Battery; 1st and 2nd Platoon, 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery. For details see TABS (F), (H), (I), and (J).

e. Operation BEACON TORCH. A 2nd Battalion, 3rd Marine operation supported by Battery W, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines; Battery L, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines; 2nd Platoon, 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery; 3rd Platoon, 3rd 155 Gun Battery and Detachment Battery M, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines. For details see TABS (F), (H), (I), and (J).

f. Operation CALHOUN. A 1st Marine Division operation supported by Command Group, Headquarters Battery, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines; Battery A, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines; Battery B, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines; 1st and 3rd Platoons, 3rd 155 Gun Battery; Command Group, Headquarters Battery, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines; Battery D, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines; Battery E, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines; Battery F, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines; Battery W, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines; Battery K, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines; Battery L, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines; Detachment Battery M, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines and 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery. For details see TABS (E), (F), (H) (I), and (J).

g. Operation BROWN. A 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines operation supported by Battery A, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines; Battery B, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines; Battery G, 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines; 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery; 2nd Platoon, 1st Armored Amphibian Co; Battery L, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines; Detachment Battery M, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines; 1st and 3rd Platoon, 3rd 155 Gun Battery (SP). For details see TABS (E), (G), (H), (I), and (J).

4. Training. The cross-training for Field Artillery Firing Batterymen (0811) between light and medium artillery battalions was continued. An increment of five (5) Marines were sent to the 12th Marine Regiment for a refresher training course on the Counter-Mortar Radar Sets MPQ-4 and the MFC-10. This course of instructions lasted some twenty (20) days and will continue on a monthly basis until all personnel in the occupational field 0842 have had the refresher training. Training emphasis during the month was placed on orientation and familiarization fire with the M-16 rifle. On 26 June one (1) officer, one (1) Staff NCO and four (4) enlisted attended a one day school on the M-16 rifle conducted by Ordnance Maintenance Company, 1st FSR. Officer and Staff NCO training was conducted on the M-16 rifle with emphasis on clearing stoppages.

5. Logistics. The primary logistical effort this month was directed toward assisting 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines in movement of weapons and supplies to Que Son, Tien Phuoc, and Tam Ky. 11th Marines Headquarters Battery has continued to receive supplies for 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines and assist in getting these supplies to the units.

A shortage of Rectifier fans and obturator spindle assemblies has caused an excessive number of 155 Howitzers (SP) to be inoperative. Shortage of recoil mechanisms has caused a problem with 155 Howitzers (TD).

6. Civic Action.

a. During the month of June, MEDCAPS were continued in the hamlet of Da Son plus efforts in the area of Psychological Operations, such as movies, posters and leaflets. Support of this type has been furnished by the 244th Psychological Operations Company.

b. Work is continuing on the construction of the two (2) room classroom addition to the school in Da Son, work completed on classrooms was a roof completed and building painted. There have been a total of twenty-two benches completed and painted to date.

c. English classes were started on 13 June for children and adults. Children attend from 1400-1600, and adults from 1900-2100 daily except Sundays. Daily average attendance is 15 children and 40 adults.

d. The Aid Station in the hamlet of Da Son was thoroughly cleaned, sprayed and reopened and a total of 473 Vietnamese have been treated.

7. Aerial Observation. During the month of June 1967, the AO section flew 20 missions for a total of 44.5 hours. Aviation support was provided by the 1st Platoon, 220th Aviation Company, U.S.A. and Marine Detachment H and MS 16 both based at Marble Mountain Air Facility, RVN, and the 20th Tactical Air Support Squadron, U.S.A.F. based at the Danang main airfield, RVN. Aircrafts utilized were the O1-C and O1-D. The Marine Detachment H and MS 16 had only one (1) aircraft available. The following is a breakdown of missions flown:

The air observation section was manned by two (2) officers during June. Artillery Air Observers are utilized as members of the Division G-2 observer section which necessitates their fulfilling infantry units and intelligence gathering requirements primarily, working in artillery registrations as low priority operations when commitments permits.

8. Northern Sector Defense Command

The Northern Sector Defense Command controls and coordinates over 211 organizations for defense and area damage control of all tenant units in the Northern Sector.

The concept for the Defense of the Northern Sector, Division Rear Area is based upon the establishment of three mutually supporting Sub-sectors with Sub-Sector Commanders responsible to the Commander, Northern Sector for coordination of all ground defense and damage control measures within assigned boundaries. Commanding Officers of organizations and units located

in each sub-sector are responsible for local security of their installations.

Strike Forces are available, on call, in each sub-sector as a reserve for employment by the Commander, Northern Sector, Division Rear Area.

Specific events which occurred within the Northern Sector Defense Command, Area of Responsibility, from 1 June 1967 to 30 June 1967.

- 010230H: The 1st Engineer defensive position AT 938753 fired approximately 15 rounds, 7.62mm, after receiving approximately 5 rounds small arms fire from unknown number of VC. Marines saw one VC fall over backward during the firefight. Area was checked at first light; however, no body or blood trails were discovered.
- 051320H: Provisional Strike Force Platoon, Contingency K-1, conducted a sweep commencing at 1330H of area East NS GL 94, North EW GL 74, West NS GL 95, South EW GL 76. Inconclusive results.
- 080500H: The 116th ARVN Brigade Company, AT 975768, along with PF's and police forces conducted a sweep starting at 080500H in areas AT 968799 to AT 975780. Apprehended four draft dodgers.
- 100315H: Headquarters Battalion, 1st FSR reported that approximately six (6) VC attacked a VN guard shack in the village of Namo, AT 934831, with grenades and small arms fire. Approximately 600 rounds of small arms fire were exchanged resulting in no casualties.
- 190130H: CAC-E-3 patrol received approximately 30 rounds of small arms fire and two grenades from 2 or 3 VC, grid AT 962776. Patrol returned 80 rounds 5.56mm. CAC-E-3 compound, AT 964775, received approximately 50 rounds small arms fire. Marines returned 30 rounds 5.56mm. Searched area with inconclusive results.
- 211540H: 11th MT Bn reported they observed a plane go down. The pilot ejected and drifted towards grid AT 939775. Pilots were rescued.
- 232000H: Commenced drill for Strike Force Company in Sub-sector B. At 232108H, drill was secured and all units checked out of net.
- 282240H: CAC-E-2 patrol LP, AT 925814, received 3-5 rounds small arms fire. Observed one VC and returned 150 rounds 5.56mm. VC fired 40-60 more rounds small arms fire. CAC-E-2 personnel again returned fire, 1-M-79mm round and 100 5.56mm. Searched area and found one VC KIA with French Submachine gun # 374083 and three (3) ChiCom grenades, and one (1) Russian First Aid Kit.

- 291530H: Change of Command ceremonies were conducted for the CO, 11th Marines, who is also the Commander, Northern Sector Defense Command.
- 292025H: Marines from Headquarters Battalion discovered a ChiCom Rifle 7.62mm buried in mud of a stream at AT 968767. Marine was driving vehicle that overheated, stopped at stream to get water for radiator when he discovered the weapon.
