PART IINarrative Summary

During October the 11th Marines (-) (Rein) continued to provide supporting fires for the defense of the Danang vital area, and for search and destroy operations in the 1st Marine Division area of operations. Fire support was also provided for reconnaissance teams operating in enemy controlled territory, for ARVN forces and for the U.S. Americal Division operating to the South of the 1st Marine Division.

With regard to organization, the major event was the displacement of the 1st Battalion, Eleventh Marines, less Battery "C", north to QUANG TRI where it was chopped to the 3rd Marine Division and assigned the mission of direct support of the 1st Marine Regiment. The 2nd Battalion (-), 11th Marines displaced northward, in conjunction with the 5th Marine Regiment, from the QUESON VALLEY area to the area vacated by the 1st Battalion (-), and assumed OPCON of Battery "C", 1st Battalion, Eleventh Marines. Displacements were completed by 10 October.

Associated with the northward displacement of 2nd Battalion (-), 11th Marines was the severance of two 155mm howitzer elements (four weapons each) from Batteries "D" and "W". These were chopped to the Americal Division to assist in artillery support during the occupation of the QUESON VALLEY area by that command. One element was returned to the 1st Marine Division in the last days of the month and attached to Battery "W", 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines on Hill 55, grid AT 965619.

In October, Battery "L" (-), 4th Battalion, 11th Marines deployed by sea to the Division Temporary Area of Operations (north of HAI VAN PASS) to participate in operation KNOX. Three M109's of the battery were embarked in a LCU from the Amphibious Ready Group at TIEN SHA. The unit remained overnight in Danang Harbor aboard the USS HERMITAGE (LSD). On 23 October, the HERMITAGE moved north and offloaded the LCU which then landed Battery "L" (-) at grid ZD 179012 at 230800H. The beach had previously been reconnoitered by a team from the First Reconnaissance Battalion and the landing site was secured by a detachment from the 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines. Subsequent to operation KNOX, Battery "L" (-) occupied position at AT 833999 with the mission of general support of the 1st Marine Division and the primary task of providing fires in support of convoys operating on Route Number 1.

During the period, the 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery (SP) received six M-110 weapons replacing a like number of M-55's. The M-110's were declared fully operational on 24 October.

A total of 33,414 missions were fired by the 11th Marines, expending a total of 138,742 rounds of all types. Elements of the Regiment supported operations ONSLOW and KNOX. One of the most significant missions during the month involved firing for the emergency extraction of reconnaissance insert "TEXAS PETE". The 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery (SP), Battery "M", 4th Battalion, 11th Marines and Battery B, 8th Battalion, 4th U.S. Artillery fired 192 rounds in this action on 17 October and were given the primary credit for the extraction of the hard-pressed team with minimum loss of life.

The revised Counter Rocket plan instigated during September was exercised six to twelve times nightly on pre-cleared areas. Additionally, eight chart drills were conducted unannounced each night by the O.P.'s in our Southern area to test the abilities of the three participating FDC's to quickly compute accurate coordinates of rocket firing sites. No rocket attacks were initiated by the Communist insurgents during the month. Armed reconnaissance over flights continued over the rocket belt at the rate of three per day weather and aircraft availability permitting.

2. S-2 Intelligence

a. Throughout the past month, a study was conducted on the Battalion O.P.'s. The information derived from this study will be combined with a previous study of Regimental O.P.'s and integrated into a standing operating procedure for all O.P.'s in the Regiment.

b. Assistance was provided subordinate units to assist in the preparation for G-2 Intelligence Technical Inspection. The Regimental S-2 Section was inspected 31 October 1967; the results are unknown at this time.

c. The enemy conducted two mortar attacks on regimental units during the reporting period. At 061815H October 1967, 1st 155mm Howitzer Provisional Battery at Hill 63 received fifty rounds of unknown caliber mortar fire resulting in light damage. Battery L, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines received approximately sixty-one rounds of 81mm mortar fire from 260245H to 260300H October 1967, resulting in six USMC wounded in action, one of whom was med-evacuated.

3. Organization and Operations.

a. Units of the Regiment participated in two (2) operations in the Danang area during the month of October 1967. These were:

(1) Operation ONSLOW. 15 - 17 October 1967. APPENDIX 2 to TAB (C).

(2) Operation KNOX. 24 - 31 October 1967. APPENDIX 3 to TAB (C).

b. The 1st Battalion, Eleventh Marines (-), attached to the 12th Marine Regiment, participated in operations MEDINA (11 - 20 Oct), LIBERTY II (11 - 23 Oct) and OSCEOLA (20 Oct - indef).

4. Training

a. Forward Observer training of non-artillery personnel continued throughout the month for units of the 1st Marine Division. A total of 32 students were trained, each receiving two hours of classroom instruction and four hours of practical application in adjusting artillery fires.

b. 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines provided an instruction team at CHU LAI to train Republic of Korea crews in the use of the 107mm Howtar.

c. A 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines instruction team conducted training for the CIDG/Special forces at TIEN PHOUUC in the utilization of the 107mm Howtar.

d. Headquarters Electronic Command Maintenance and Engineering, U.S. Army, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey provided a training team for operational and organization training on the AN/TMS-3 sound ranging set. Thirty students, including fifteen from the 3rd Marine Division were trained by the unit in a one week course conducted at the 11th Marines Command post.

e. Training with the M-16 rifle received added emphasis in view of the imminent distribution of that weapon to artillery elements. Units were instructed to complete training of all personnel by 14 November.

5. Logistics. Significant logistic effort during this period was support for: 1st Battalion (-), 11th Marines move to QUANG TRI; Battery "H" (-), 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines move to and from grid AT 8399; Battery "L" (-), 4th Battalion, 11th Marines move by land and sea to vicinity grid ZD 1901; resupply of 105mm Howitzer ammunition to 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines; return of 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines units at TIEN PHOUUC and QUESON, to 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines CP area; and retrograde of ammunition (105mm How, 155mm How, and 155mm Gun) from QUESON. Critical shortages of 105mm ammunition occurred during this period; continues to

exist. Shortage of N-335 (PD fuzes) continues, necessitating use of N-278 (MTS2) as substitute. Repair parts for artillery weapons and motor vehicles continue to be in short supply. Heavy flooding causing bridge and road wash-out, emphasizes the necessity of maximum on-position ammunition storage.

6. Civic Action. During the month of October, MEDCAP was conducted on twenty days and a total of 1,285 people were treated.

The archway entrance to the DA SON school yard, school benches, and school tables were built. Plans for a fence around the school yard is under study for possible submission during the month of November and plans for a guest house have been submitted.

The program of daily delivery of garbage from the 11th Marines messhall to DA SON Hamlet was initiated during this month and will continue.

7. Aerial Observation. The 11th Marine Regiment Aerial Observer Unit flew 100 missions for a total of 148.7 hours. The unit was supported with aircraft from the following units:

- a. 01-C Detachment of H&MS-16 based at Marble Mountain Air Facility (01-C and 01-G).
- b. VMO-2 Squadron based at Marble Mountain Air Facility (UH1-E).
- c. VMO-6 Squadron based at PHU BAI (UH1-E).
- d. 3rd Platoon, 220th Aviation Company, U.S. Army based at Marble Mountain Air Facility (01-D).

The Aerial Observers participated in Operations ONSLOW and KNOX and encountered eight ground fire incidents with one aircraft hit.

8. Northern Sector Defense Command

The Commanding Officer, 11th Marines serves also as the Commander Northern Sector Defense Command. The Command coordinates and controls rear area defense of an assigned sector to the west and north of Danang.

During the month of October there was a minor boundary change in Subsector "C" to expand the patrolling area. An alert condition was executed once and two night reaction drills were held in the Northern Sector Defense Command with satisfactory results. There were two detainees picked up during the month and turned over to the III MAF brig.

With regard to Combined Action Platoons, there was the addition of CAP Foxtrot-2 located at AT 975793. The designation for CAP E-1 was changed to F-5, CAP E-2 changed to Q-4, and CAP E-3 changed to Q-6.

There were 451 night recons, ambushes, security patrols, LP's and 54 daytime patrols run during October. There were 16 incidents of sniper fire or contact with the enemy in the NSDC area. There were two bear traps and one Chicom mine found.

9. Psychological Operations

The 11th Marines are assigned the responsibility for the overall coordination of psychological operations within Subsector "B" of the Northern Sector Defense Command. Battalions of the 11th Marines conduct psychological operations in coordination with infantry commanders and report all results through these channels. Units performing psychological operations in Subsector "B" are Headquarters Battalion; Headquarters Battery, 11th Marines; 11th Motor Transport Battalion; 1st Reconnaissance Battalion; 1st Medical Battalion and 1st Dental Company. Although not located in Subsector "B", the latter reports to the 11th Marines for administrative reporting purposes. The object of psychological operations by these units is pacification, improving health and sanitation and strengthening the Vietnamese loyalty to the Government of Vietnam. A resume of operations conducted in Subsector "B" during the reporting period is as follows:

TOTAL: Showed a total of 24 hours of movies to 4400 people, the themes being education and entertainment.

Handed out 3225 TUDO newspapers; 1150 reward leaflets and 2400 health leaflets of various types.
