PART II

Narrative Summary

During November the Eleventh Marines (-) (Rein) continued to provide supporting fires for the defense of the Danang vital area and for search and destroy operations in the 1st Marine Division Tactical Area of Operations. Fire support was continued for reconnaissance teams operating in enemy controlled territory, for ARVN forces and for the U.S. Americal Division operating to the South of the 1st Marine Division. A total of 29,997 missions were fired by the Eleventh Marines expending 123,131 rounds. Elements of the Regiment supported Operations KNOX, ESSEX and FOSTER.

On 26 November, the Regiment detached two batteries (C/1/11 and W/2/11) for duty with the Special Landing Force. The batteries were attached to the Third Battalion, First Marines and embarked in the Amphibious Ready Group of the Seventh Fleet.

One new position area was established during November. A detachment of two LVTH-6's from the 1st Armored Amphibian Company, two 60 inch Searchlights from Headquarters Battery, Eleventh Marines, and one AN/MSS-3 XENON Searchlight from Battery G (-) 29th Artillery were positioned on Hill 47 (AT 967704). The new position provides excellent surveillance of the rocket belt and the SONG CAU DO River and allows the LVTH-6's to participate in nightly counter rocket drills. Observation Post HAWK was also relocated on Hill 47.

Counter Rocket firing drills were continued six to twelve times nightly on pre-cleared areas. No rocket attacks were executed by the Communist insurgents during the month. Armed reconnaissance overflights continued over the rocket belt at the rate of three per day, weather and aircraft availability permitting. Additionally, eight unannounced chart drills were conducted each night by the O.P's in the Southern part of the TAOR to test the abilities of the three participating FDC's to quickly compute accurate coordinates of rocket firing positions.

2nd Battalion, Eleventh Marines, 4th Battalion, Eleventh Marines and Battery B, 8th Battalion, 4th Artillery received and were trained in the use of the FADAC Gun Computer.

## 2. S-2 Intelligence

a. Further liaison with subordinate units continued throughout the month of November to assist in the preparation for a current series of G-2 Intelligence Technical Inspections. The Regimental S-2 Section was inspected on 31 October 1967 and received a satisfactory rating as did Third Battalion, 11th Marines which was inspected on 11 November 1967. A Photographic Intelligence Report listing suspected enemy locations within the 1st Marine Division TAOR was compiled and distributed to subordinate units for use in targeting for harassing and interdiction fires.

b. The enemy conducted one mortar attack on an artillery position area during the reporting period. At 020210H November 1967, I/3/11 and K/4/11 received approximately 30 rounds of 81mm mortar resulting in negative casualties. At 021800H November 1967, a D/2/11 truck hit a mine resulting in the wounding of six Marines and the disabling of one 2 $\frac{1}{2}$  ton truck. At 081000H, November 1967, a L/4/11 truck received sniper fire resulting in one Marine killed in action. At 161620H, November 1967, a D/2/11 truck convoy hit a mine resulting in one Marine killed in action, one 6X6 destroyed, one 6X6 damaged, one M422 damaged, and one 105mm howitzer destroyed. At 252030H, November 1967, the 11th Marines C.P. perimeter was probed by three persons, 20 rounds of small arms were fired with negative results.

## 3. Organization and Operations.

a. Units of the Regiment participated in three (3) operations in the Danang area during the month of November 1967. These were:

- (1) Operation KNOX. 1 - 4 November 1967. APPENDIX 2 to TAB (C).
- (2) Operation ESSEX. 6 - 17 November 1967. APPENDIX 3 to TAB (C).
- (3) Operation FOSTER. 13 - 30 November 1967. APPENDIX 4 to TAB (C).

b. The 1st Battalion, Eleventh Marines (-), attached to the 12th Marine Regiment, participated in Operations LANCASTER and KENTUCKY.

## 4. Training

a. Forward Observer training of non-artillery personnel was conducted weekly throughout the month for units of the 1st Marine Division. A total of 80 students were trained, each receiving at least two hours of classroom instructions and four hours of practical application in adjusting artillery fire.

b. A training team from Headquarters, Electronic Command Maintenance and Engineering, U.S. Army, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey continued a training course on the AN/TMS-3 Sound Ranging Set. Thirty students, including fifteen from the 3rd Marine Division, completed the training program which emphasized field operations.

c. Instruction was given to Officers and Staff NCO's of the Regiment on the Starlight Scope. Five Starlight Scopes were received and distributed to units within the Regiment.

d. M-16 rifles were issued to the units of the command after intensified training had been completed. Familiarization firing was accomplished after issue.

e. III MAF provided a training team to instruct on employment of the FADAC Gun Computer. By the close of the period, training had been completed and FADACS were operational in the 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines and in Battery B, 8th Battalion, 4th U.S. Artillery. FADAC training was in progress at the 4th Battalion, 11th Marines at the conclusion of the month.

5. Logistics. Critical shortage of 105mm HE ammunition and PD fuzes were alleviated during the period. A shortage of White and Green Bag 8" Howitzer powder exists, though not critical at this time. Repair parts for the 155mm Howitzer (SF) and motor vehicles continue to be in short supply causing excessive deadlining. Twenty-two M54's were replaced by M54A2c's. Significant logistical efforts were: preparation of Battery C, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines and Mortar Battery, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines for assignment to the Special Landing Force; issue of M-16's to all Regimental units; ammunition resupply for 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines; and movement of 1st Battalion, 11th Marines material from storage to its present position in QUANG TRI Province.

6. Civic Action.

a. During November, 1,726 civilian patients were treated in the course of 24 visits of the Medical Civic Action Team.

b. A plan for the construction of a guest house in the hamlet of DA SON neared completion in November and construction was scheduled to start in December.

c. 124 school kits and 8 truck loads of dunnage recovered from the port of DANANG were delivered to the village of DA SON for use of the villagers.

7. Aerial Observation. The 11th Marine Regiment Aerial Observer unit flew 56 missions for a total of 104.5 hours. The unit was supported with aircraft from the following units:

- a. O1-C Detachment of H&MS-16 based at Marble Mountain Air Facility (O1-C and O1-G).
- b. VMO-2 Squadron, MAG-16 based at Marble Mountain Air Facility (UH1-E).
- c. 3rd Platoon, 220th Aviation Company, U.S. Army, based at Marble Mountain Air Facility (O1-D).

The aerial observers flew in support of Operations KNOX, ESSEX, and FOSTER and encountered nine ground fire incidents with two aircraft hits.

#### 8. Northern Sector Defense Command

NSDC is a rear area defense organization commanded by C.O., Eleventh Marines. During the month of November, alert CONDITION GREY was executed twice due to intelligence reports of increased enemy activity and possible enemy attack within the Northern Sector Defense Command area. One night reaction drill was held in the Northern Sector Defense Command with satisfactory results. There were no detainees reported being picked up during

the month of November.

There were 425 night recons, ambushes, security patrols, LP's and 73 day time patrols conducted during November. There were 20 incidents of sniper fire or contact with the enemy in the Northern Sector Defense Command area.

9. Psychological Operations. The 11th Marine Regiment has been relieved of the PsyOps responsibility for units in the Northern Defense Sector. The Regiment has retained the PsyOps responsibility for the hamlet of DA SON. As in the past, all PsyOps conducted by subordinate battalions and batteries were administered through TAOR Commanders. During the month of November in the hamlet of DA SON (AT 960765) personnel of the 11th Marines showed a total of 10 hours of movies to over 800 people. They handed out 2,000 health leaflets, 2,000 TU DO newspapers and 300 reward leaflets. Distribution of leaflets was conducted under the auspices of the MEDCAP program.
