PART II

Narrative Summary

During February the Eleventh Marines continued to provide supporting fires for the defense of the Danang vital area and for search and destroy operations in the 1st Marine Division Tactical Area of Operations. Fire support was continued for reconnaissance teams, Combined Action Platoons, ROK and ARVN forces and elements of the U.S. Americal Division operating to the south of the 1st Marine Division.

During the TET offensive the Regiment fired two targets within a period of one hour on NVA units resulting in 240 NVA KIA. In all, Regimental artillery firing on enemy positions and routes of withdrawal during the TET offensive caused over 400 enemy KIA.

Forward observers were provided to Headquarters Battalion, 1st Marine Division, and liaison personnel were provided to I Corps Headquarters and

196th Light Infantry Brigade, U.S.A., during the period of the TET offensive.

On 2 February, during Operation HUE CITY, Batteries "A" and "W", 1st Battalion, 11th Marines, supporting recon insert "ANCIENT COWBOY", accounted for 250 VC KIA. The 1st Battalion, 11th Marines, reinforced by the 2nd Platoon, 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery, was credited with a total of 525 enemy KIA during Operation HUE CITY.

The 11th Marines assumed operational control of 2nd Battalion, 13th Marines; 6th Battalion, 33rd Artillery, U.S.A.; and Battery "C", 2nd Battalion, 320th Artillery, U.S.A. In conjunction with the Division's continued northward movement, Battery "F", 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines and Battery "B", 1st Battalion, 12th Marines displaced to the vicinity of PHU GIA (AU 8001).

A total of 30,996 missions were fired by the 11th Marines expending a total of 134,631 rounds. Elements of the Regiment supported Operations HUE CITY, HOUSTON and TAMPA.

Counter-rocket firing drills were continued this month on pre-cleared suspected positions. An average of eight chart drills were conducted unannounced each night by OP's in the Danang area to exercise the ability of the participating FDC's to quickly compute accurate grids of rocket firing positions. Eight 122mm rocket attacks against the Danang vital area were initiated by the enemy during the month. The average response time for counter-rocket fires was less than three minutes.

2. S-2 Intelligence

During the month of February the enemy increased his attacks against artillery positions. A total of 24 mortar, 2 rocket, 1 mine, 2 recoilless rifle/B-40, 2 grenade, 3 rocket/mortar, and 4 small arms firing were recorded during this period. The following significant incidents took place during the month:

010230H: Battery D, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines (ZC 076986) position was attacked by 81mm and 82mm mortar rounds. Fired counter-mortar with unknown results.

- 010230H: Battery L, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines (ZC 075986) received mortar fire periodically.
- 011330H: 1st Battalion, 11th Marines (YD 7515 to 7518) ammo resupply convoy escorted by tanks and ontos ran into several road blocks with no action taken. At 1530, 9 NVA snipers were encountered. Returned fire resulted in 8 NVA KIA (C) and 1 VC KIA (C). At 1650, convoy became heavily engaged with estimated 100 NVA. Artillery and gunships were used and the convoy arrived at Battery "B" position.
- 011346H: Battery D, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines received 5 rounds 82mm mortar.
- 011420H: Battery D, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines received 25 to 30 rounds of 82mm mortar. Fired counter-mortar with unknown results.
- 011810H: "C" Platoon, 1st Armored Amphibian Company (BT 108582) received 10 rounds of 82mm mortar from the south and 15 rounds of small arms fire. KMC artillery fired counter-mortar.
- 020855H: Battery D, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines received 15 rounds 82mm mortar. Fired counter-mortar with unknown results.
- 021100H: Battery D, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines received 8 rounds 82mm mortar.
- 021220H: Battery D, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines received 8 rounds 82mm mortar.
- 041400H: Battery B, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines (YD 744131) received 4-57mm recoilless rifle rounds. Patrol swept area with negative results.
- 051440H: Battery B, 1st Battalion, 12th Marines truck detonated mine (BT 067675). Truck was towed to CP and engineers sent to resweep the road.
- 060100H: Battery G, 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines (AT 923691) received approximately 25 rounds of 122mm rocket. Fired counter-rocket with unknown results.
- 060125H: Battery K, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines (AT 879579) received approximately 20 rounds of unknown caliber mortar from the south. Fired counter-mortar and incoming ceased.

- 060235H: Battery W, 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines received 5 to 6 rounds of rockets from southeast. Counter-rocket fired with unknown results.
- 060304H: Battery B, 1st Battalion, 12th Marines received approximately 15 rounds of unknown caliber of mortars 300 meters outside perimeter wire while firing counter-rocket mission.
- 060730H: Battery L, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines (ZC 079986) received unknown number of 82mm mortar rounds at 3 separate times. Fired counter-mortar with unknown results.
- 061015H: Battery D, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines received 2 rounds of 82mm mortar. Fired counter-mortar at suspected position with unknown results.
- 061230H: Battery D, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines received 2 rounds of 82mm mortar. Fired counter-mortar with unknown results.
- 061405H: Battery K, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines (AT 879578) received 40 to 60 rounds of 60mm mortar. Fired counter-mortar with unknown results.
- 062325H: Battery B, 1st Battalion, 12th Marines reported 12 rounds of 60mm mortar landed outside perimeter. Fired counter-mortar with unknown results.
- 070244H: OP Condor (AT 942742) was attacked by unknown number of enemy with grenades, RPG-2, small arms. Returned fire and searched area. Sweep of area revealed 1 VC KIA, 2 large blood trails, 1 AK-47, 1 B-40 with 1 rocket, 1 pair large wire cutters, 9 hand grenades and 1 Timex watch.
- 071400H: Headquarters, 1st Battalion, 11th Marine 18 vehicle convoy going from NAM HOA ROCK CRUSHER to PHU BAI was ambushed at YD 746166 by a Company size unit. A reaction force was sent from the 5th Marine Regiment and the enemy withdrew at approximately 1830. All but three vehicles of the convoy were destroyed. Upon continuing to PHU BAI the reaction force lost one vehicle due to a mine at grid YD 777202.
- 080130H: Battery B, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines received 40 to 60 rounds 60mm mortar. Fired counter-mortar with unknown results.

- 102345H: Battery D, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines received approximately 30 rounds of 82mm mortar. Fired counter-mortar with unknown results.
- 102350H: Battery L, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines received unknown number and caliber mortar rounds. Fired counter-mortar with unknown results.
- 110143H: Battery D, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines received 5 rounds 82mm mortar. Fired counter-mortar with unknown results.
- 111700H: Battery K, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines ammunition convoy received 1 round small arms fire through open cab window of truck vicinity grid AT 960584.
- 131500H: Headquarters, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines patrol fired on 5 VC with small arms and artillery as the VC withdrew vicinity ZD 036015 resulting in 2 VC KIA.
- 142030H: Battery A, 2nd Battalion, 320th Artillery (USA) (ZC 050965) received 20 mixed rounds of 82mm mortar, recoilless rifle, and rockets. Returned fire resulted in a secondary explosion.
- 142045H: Battery L, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines received 12 rounds recoilless rifle and B-40. Returned fire with unknown results.
- 150146H: 1st Field Artillery Group received 2 rounds 82mm mortar. Observed flashes vicinity grid YD 886123 and fired twin 40's. Mortar firing stopped.
- 150930H: 1st Field Artillery Group reported 2 rounds of 82mm mortar landed vicinity of cantonement 5 (YD 878137). Returned fire with negative results.
- 151145H: Battery B, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines received 3 rounds 82mm mortar. Fired counter-mortar with unknown results.
- 161405H: Headquarters, 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines vehicle enroute to Hill 55 received 1 round small arms fire from east side of road vicinity grid AT 983629.
- 180500H: 1st Field Artillery Group reported unknown number of rockets and mortar rounds landed in area. Fired counter-rocket/mortar.

- 180510H: 1st 155mm Gun Battery (YD 8915) received approximately 60 rounds of rocket/mortar and unknown number of automatic weapons fire in area of base. Returned fire with unknown results.
- 222105H: Battery B, 1st Battalion, 12th Marines (AT 963633) received 1 grenade in area.
- 240138H: Provisional Battery (AT 876472) received approximately 50 mortar rounds just inside of perimeter wire with negative damage. Fired counter-mortar.
- 242130H: Headquarters, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines received several rounds small arms.

3. Organization and Operations. Units of the Regiment participated in three (3) operations in the Danang and Phu Bai areas during the month of February 1968.

- a. Operation HUE CITY. 1 - 29 February 1968. APPENDIX 2 to TAB (C).
- b. Operation HOUSTON. 26 - 29 February 1968. APPENDIX 3 to TAB (C).
- c. Operation TAMPA. 27 - 29 February 1968. APPENDIX 4 To TAB (C).

4. Training

a. Forward observer training of non-artillery personnel was again conducted this month. For the first time, students from the 2nd Combined Action Group Training Course were instructed in observed fire procedures. Instruction was also provided on two occasions for personnel from the 1st Reconnaissance Battalion. A total of 116 students each received two hours of classroom instruction and from four to six hours of practical instruction.

b. Three officers attended a two week course of instruction on "Landing Force Planning" in Okinawa held by a Mobile Training team from COMPHIB-TRAPAC.

c. A class on the AN/PPS-6 radar set was held for six members of Regiment. Instruction covered operations and maintenance.

d. First Battalion, Eleventh Marines and the First Field Artillery Group received two weeks of instruction and are now operational with the Field Artillery Digital Automatic Computer (FADAC).

5. Logistics. Units of the 2nd Battalion, 13th Marines reported OPCON/ADCON to this Regiment. Logistical assistance required was minimal and rendered where applicable. There were no major problems experienced during the reporting period.

6. Civic Action. Regimental Headquarters Battery conducted Medcaps and emergency medical aid in the hamlet of Da Son. Medcaps were re-established on a six times per week basis. Emergency medical care was maintained on an on-call status. Because of the tactical situation, construction on the fence around the school yard and the guest house was not started. However, the hamlet chief has the supplies to construct the guest house.

3rd 8" Howitzer Battery continued ^{its} ~~the~~ civic action program in Hoa Vinh and Hoa Thanh villages.

4th Battalion, 11th Marines conducted Medcaps in Phu Hoa and made initial liaison with Duong Phuoc village. A truck load of lumber was provided to rebuild two houses burned by a parachute flare.

7. Aerial Observation. The 11th Marine Regiment Aerial Observer unit flew 64 missions for a total of 83.8 hours. The unit was supported with aircraft from the following units:

a. VMO-2 Squadron, MAG-16, USMC, based at Marble Mountain Air Facility (UH 1-E).

b. 20th Tactical Air Support Squadron, USAF, based at Danang Air Base (O1-E and O2-A).

c. Aviation Section, Headquarters Battery, 3rd Battalion, 82nd Artillery, USA.

The unit encountered three ground fire incidents with aircraft taking no hits.

8. Northern Sector Defense Command

Northern Sector Defense Command is a rear area defense organization commanded by Commanding Officer, 11th Marines. During the month of February, condition YELLOW was executed six (6) times and condition GRAY MODIFIED was executed twenty-three (23) times due to intelligence reports of increased enemy activities and enemy attacks within the Northern Sector Defense Command AOR.

One night Reaction Drill was held in the Northern Sector Defense Command with unsatisfactory results. There were 35 detainees reported being picked up during the month of February, one was classified as POW by 5th CIT. There were 243 night Recon, ambush, combat LP and security patrols and 82 day time patrols conducted in the Northern Sector Defense Command. There were 37 incidents or contacts with the enemy in the Northern Sector Defense Command. There were 8 WIA and 1 KIA, which break down to 3 USMC WIA, 3 USN WIA, and 2 USA WIA and 1 USA KIA. There were two VC KIA and one VC captured in the Northern Sector Defense Command.

9. Psychological Operations. During the month of February, the 11th Marines performed the following Psyops in the Danang rear area:

a. Distribution of leaflets

(1) Health - 7,300

(2) Reward - 7,000

b. Movies

(1) 4½ hours of entertainment and education movies. Attendance was 450 people.

Psyops performed by the Battalions and independent batteries are reported through the infantry TAOR commanders and not through the 11th Marine Regiment.

The second echelon repair parts shortages exists mainly in the direct exchange program. The fill rate on direct exchange parts currently runs at approximately 50%. If the part has to be repaired, the turnover time is from two (2) to four (4) weeks.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR KEEPING JOURNAL

1. Heading:

- a. Unit or Section:
 - (1) Enter designation of unit if this is a unit journal for regiment, air group, or smaller unit.
 - (2) Enter designation of section if this is a section journal maintained by a general staff section.
- b. Place: Enter coordinates or name of locality.
- c. From: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is opened.
- d. To: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is closed.

2. Body:

- a. Time In:
 - (1) Unit Journal. Enter time information is received within unit. In most instances this would be TOR at unit communication center.
 - (2) Section Journal. Enter time information is received within section.
- b. Time Out:
 - (1) Unit Journal. Enter time outgoing information is delivered to addressee. In most instances this would be TOD by unit communication center.
 - (2) Section Journal. Enter time outgoing message is delivered to originator's communication center for transmittal, or time information is transmitted by releasing section.
- c. Serial No.: Number each entry consecutively as information is received by keeper of journal.
- d. DTG: Enter date/time group of radio message.
- e. Incidents, Messages, Orders:
 - (1) Important incidents, messages and orders are recorded as they are made known.
 - (2) Although brief, entries must include all vital elements of information, such as what, where, when, how, and who.
 - (3) Original entries should not be altered, but should be supplemented or corrected by later entries when necessary.
 - (4) A synopsis of written or oral messages is entered in the journal, leaving the full account for the journal file and other supporting documents.
 - (5) Oral messages are reduced to writing and processed like written messages.
- f. Action Taken: This column is used to indicate administrative action taken, such as, routing to cognizant unit staff officer(s), dissemination of pertinent information and/or filing of message. Some of the more common symbols used to indicate action taken are: "M", posted on situation map; "S", circulated to unit staff; "T", information disseminated to troops or subordinate units; "F", filed in journal file.

3. Ending:

- a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."
- b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

4. Journal File:

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.
