

PART II

Narrative Summary

During April the Eleventh Marines continued to provide supporting fires for the defense of the Danang vital area and for search and destroy operations in the 1st Marine Division Tactical Area of Operations. Fire support was continued for reconnaissance teams, combined action platoons, USN, USA, CIDG, KMC and ARVN forces. Forward observers were again provided to support USMC, USA and ARVN convoys while traveling within the Division Area.

Artillery fires accounted for 489 of the 1st Marine Division's 1100 plus KIA's. The majority of the kills (377) were the result of missions fired for recon inserts operating to the south and southwest of Danang. This was the first full month for the employment of selected munitions (FIRECRACKER). On 7 April, 1st Platoon, 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery expended three rounds of "FIRECRACKER" on 80 VC resulting in "outstanding area coverage, 51 VC KIA". On 28 April, Battery I, 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines and Battery K, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines fired a coordinated illumination and shell "FIRECRACKER" mission on VC crossing a river and accounted for 62 enemy KIA. The Regiment fired a total of 75 missions for the month utilizing selected munitions (FIRECRACKER) accounting for 316 VC/NVA KIA. Each artillery unit with a selected munitions capability had fired at least one "FIRECRACKER" mission by the end of April. Total "FIRECRACKER" expenditure consisted of 554 rounds 105mm, 502 rounds 155mm, and 40 rounds 8" howitzer.

A total of 31,237 missions were fired by the 11th Marines expending a total of 152,669 rounds. Elements of the Regiment supported Operations HOUSTON, JASPER SQUARE, BAXTER GARDEN and BALLARD VALLEY.

Counter-rocket drills continued during the month. An average of eight chart drills were conducted unannounced each night by OP's in the Danang

area to exercise the ability of participating FDC's to quickly compute accurate grids of rocket positions. In addition, counter-rocket firing drills were conducted four times nightly on possible rocket positions. The enemy initiated one small rocket attack during the month. Four (4) rockets were launched from the Korean Marine Corps area of operations and impacted in the vicinity of Hill 55. No casualties or damages were sustained.

2. Intelligence

During the month of April the frequency of attacks against artillery positions decreased. A total of 6 mortar and 1 rocket firing were recorded. The following significant incidents took place during the month.

021436H:: 2nd Platoon, 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery (late report) 310730H (ZD 012025) received 8-9 rounds of 82mm mortar resulting in three (3) USMC WIA. Counter mortar plan was fired.

030120H:: 1st Armored Amphibian Company (BT 108582) received 50-100 mortar rounds followed by a ground attack.

030120H:: 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines (AT 969620) received approximately 10 rounds of 82mm mortar and 4 rounds of 122mm rocket. Fired counter mortar/rocket fire.

040137H:: 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery patrol (ZD 012025) received 19 rounds HE and 1 round WP mortar from grid ZD 016013. Returned counter mortar fire.

4. Training.

a. Forward observer training of non-artillery personnel was again conducted this month. As part of a continuous program, instruction was provided to personnel from the 2nd Combined Action Group on two occasions. Instruction was also presented to personnel from the 1st Reconnaissance Battalion and the Division Scout Sniper School. A total of 179 students received two hours of classroom instruction and from four to six hours of practical instruction.

b. Two personnel attended a class on the AN/MP Q-10 radar generator (PU 669) hosted by the 12th Marine Regiment at Dong Ha, Republic of Vietnam.

c. Two officers and twenty-four enlisted personnel attended division level schools in-country and one officer and fourteen enlisted attended schools out of country.

d. Sixteen personnel from the Regiment received instruction on 1st and 2nd echelon maintenance procedures for multifuel vehicles.

e. A legal assistance team from the 1st Marine Division Legal Section presented instruction to the officers from 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines. Instruction included duties of the trial and defense counsel, duties of the president of a court-martial and JAG investigations.

f. Fourteen officers and staff NCO's from Regimental Headquarters attended a class on Personal Response presented by 1st Marine Division G-5 section.

5. Logistics

During the reporting period, assistance was rendered in obtaining augmentation of two (2) Tractor Trailers for 4th Battalion, 11th Marines for the purpose of resupply of ammunition; sixty (60) Tractor Trailers for 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines for ammunition resupply, and three (3) Low Beds for movement of TD-15's and EIMCO Tractors within the Regiment.

Preliminary Command Material Management Inspections of the 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery; 1st Battalion, 11th Marines; 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines; 1st 155mm Gun Battery; and 1st Field Artillery Group were conducted in preparation of like inspections by the 1st Marine Division.

On 28 April 1968, embarkation was arranged for the airlift of two (2) 105mm howitzers with equipment and personnel to Kham Duc for support of 5th Special Forces Operations in the Ngok Tavak area.

During the month, four (4) 155mm howitzer (SP) M109's were modified under the SEA M109 modification program. This gives the Regiment a total of twelve (12) modified M109's with four (4) still to receive the package.

Under the R&E program six (6) 105mm howitzers and one (1) M51VTR were received by units of the Regiment.

No major logistical problems were experienced during the reporting period. In addition to the above, logistical requests were minimal and rendered where applicable.

6. Civic Action

During the month, the people of DaSon began a general sanitation and cleaning program. Under the guidance of the hamlet chief the people have taken the initiative to clean up their yards. The sanitation program started with the distribution of 100 fly catchers. A hand water pump was requisitioned from III MAF. The PF's placed the water pump over the main well in DaSon. With this added advantage, the people are able to pump a large volume of water for their own usage. A culvert system is in the process of being constructed by the well in order to drain excess water away from the public wash rack.

MedCaps, on a regular basis, are beginning to attract more and more interest from the hamlet population.

It has been determined that soil bricks are the best solution for the fence around the school yard. The materials are being requisitioned for this project.

The hamlet chief complained about the ARVN Engineers on route 542, stopping the people of DaSon from traveling on this road leading through their compound. A solution to this problem is being sought.

7. Aerial Observation

The 11th Marine Regiment Aerial Observer unit flew 67 missions for a total of 83.7 hours. The unit was supported by aircraft from the following units:

The unit encountered five ground fire incidents with aircraft taking hits on two occasions.

8. Northern Sector Defense Command is a rear area defense organization commanded by the Commanding Officer, 11th Marines. During the month of April 1968, Condition YELLOW was executed once, Condition GREY, Modified twice and Condition WHITE twenty-seven times.

One night reaction drill was held in the Northern Sector Defense Command with satisfactory results.

There were two detainees reported during the month. There were 241 night recon, ambushes, combat, LP and security patrols and 96 day combat and recon patrols conducted in the Northern Sector Defense Command.

There were 13 incidents of contact with the enemy in the Northern Sector Defense Command, resulting in 2 USMC WIA and 1 USA WIA.

There were four non-battle casualties in the Sector; 1 USMC killed and 2 USMC wounded as a result of two patrols from 1st FSR/FLC firing on one another, and 1 U.S. civilian wounded when he failed to stop his vehicle on command and was shot by a PF from CAP 2-7-4.

There was one enemy cache found with 1 sleeping bag, 1 mosquito net, one pair surgical scissors, 2 spools recording tape and 1 pressure type fuze device.
