PART II

Narrative Summary

During June, the 11th Marines continued to provide supporting fires to the 1st Marine Division in its defense of the DANANG vital area and in operations in QUANG NAM and the southern part of THUA THIEN Provinces continued for Division reconnaissance teams, Combined Action Platoons, USA, USN, CIDG, KMC and ARVN forces. Forward observers were again provided to accompany USMC, USA and ARVN convoys traveling within the Division area.

Artillery fires accounted for 358 of the 1,047 enemy killed within the Division area of operations. Of these, 151 KIA were the result of missions fired for Division reconnaissance teams operating in the southwestern part of the Division area.

Operation ALLENBROOK continued throughout the month of June with the 2nd Battalion, 13th Marines, in direct support of the 27th Marines maneuver forces. June also saw the continuation of Operation MAMELUKE THRUST; and within its confines, the deep penetration by the 26th Marines into THUONG DUC and the western end of Happy Valley. The 26th Marines maneuver forces received direct support from the 1st Battalion, 13th Marines. Heavy and medium regimental artillery provided general support to all operations.

Selected munitions (FIRECRACKER) continued to be employed throughout the 1st Marine Division TAOR. The Regiment fired 36 FIRECRACKER missions during the month accounting for 75 VC/NVA KIA. Total FIRECRACKER expenditure was 384 rounds 105mm, 433 rounds 155mm and 5 rounds 8" howitzer.

On 23 June, Battery K(Y), 4th Battalion, 11th Marines, and Provisional 155 Howitzer Battery, 11th Marines, fired a FIRECRACKER mission on 25 VC at grid AT 812499. The mission was observed by Recon Team (FAST DAY) and resulted in 9 VC KIA. On 25 June, Battery K(Y), 4th Battalion, 11th Marines; Battery I, 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines; Provisional 155 Howitzer Battery, 11th Marines; and Provisional 155 Howitzer-Battery, 12th Marines fired a FIRECRACKER mission on 100 VC at grid AT 964515. The mission was observed by Recon Team (PARALLEL BARS) and resulted in 26 VC KIA.

On the 16th of June a Provisional 155 Howitzer Battery, 11th Marines consisting of four 155mm howitzers (towed) and two 155mm guns was formed from the assets of the 11th Marines. The Provisional 155mm Howitzer Battery, positioned at AN HOA, increases the capability of general support artillery for heavy long ranges fires on enemy elements maneuvering in the southern portion of the Division TAOR.

During the month the 11th Marines expended a total of 156,498 rounds of shell HE while firing some 28,900 missions. Elements of the Regiment supported Operations HOUSTON, ALLENBROOK, MAMELUKE THRUST and SWIFT SABER.

Counter-rocket drills continued during the month. Chart drills were conducted unannounced each night to exercise the ability of participating FDC's to quickly compute accurate grids of rocket positions. In addition, counter-rocket fire drills were conducted nightly on possible rocket positions. The enemy initiated three rocket attacks during the month. The rocket attack targets included Marble Mountain Air Facility, Force Logistics Command and MCB-58. The average artillery reaction time for counter-rocket fires during these attacks was approximately three minutes.

2. Intelligence

During the month of June enemy attacks against artillery units decreased from the previous reporting period. A total of 13 mortar, 1 mine, and one small arms incident were recorded during the month. The following significant incidents took place during the month of June 1968:

- 071630H: G/3/11 (ZC 151541) received 4 to 5 rounds of 82mm mortar. Negative damage or casualties. Fired counter-mortar.
- 071730H: 3/11 (AT 966616) observed approximately 40 NVA (AT 990597) with weapons, two machine guns and heavy packs. Artillery was fired resulting in 15 NVA KIA. The enemy continued moving along treeline in open area despite incoming artillery.
- 072345H: Artillery fire base (ZC 151540) received 15 to 20 rounds of 82mm mortar and small arms fire from grids ZC 153537, ZC 148-549, ZC 157539, ZC 155538. Fired counter mortar.
- 080445H: Artillery fire base (ZC 151540) received 2 to 5 rounds mortar fire. Negative damage. Fired counter mortar.
- 081930H: G/3/11 and K/4/11 (ZC 151540), THUONG DUC fire base, received 5 to 10 rounds of 81mm mortar fire at east end of airstrip. Returned counter mortar fire.
- 100055H: 3/11 (Bill 55) received 11 rounds of 82mm mortar. Tower observed 3 tubes firing from AT 992602, AT 992606. Fired counter mortar.
- 151500H: A/1/13 (ZC 193559) received 30 rounds of 60mm mortar. Negative casualties or damage.
- 192345H: Provisional 155 Howitzer Battery, 11th Marines (AT 877476) received 5 rounds of unknown type mortar, believed to be 82mm. Negative casualties or damage. No action taken.

- 210005H: E/2/13 received approximately 150 rounds of small arms fire from grid BT 010634. Returned 81mm mortar fire and small arms fire ceased.
- 211930H: Provisional 155 Howitzer Battery, 11th Marines (AT 877476) received 2 rounds of 82mm mortar five meters from the Fire Direction Center. Crater analysis indicated rounds fired from an azimuth of 1400 mils. Returned fire with 50 rounds of 155mm HE. Results unknown.
- 221530H: K/4/11 M54 truck destroyed by command detonated mine at grid AT 815541.
- 221840H: 11th Marines AO observed 5 VC moving east on trail vicinity grid BT 0059. Enemy taken under fire with M-60 and M-79. VC returned small arms fire.
- 240150H: Provisional 155 Howitzer Battery, 11th Marines, AT 877476 received 9 rounds of 82mm mortar. Rounds believed to be fired from grids AT 848493 and AT 878485. Fired counter mortar fire, results unknown.
- 290030H: I/3/11, grid AT 883579 received 6 mortar rounds, believed to be 82mm. All rounds landed outside wire. Fired counter mortar.
- 290050H: 3/11 GP, grid AT 968616 received 2 mortar rounds outside wire. The OP was alerted to watch for flashes.
- 290105H: K/4/11, grid AT 879578 received 8 rounds of 82mm mortar. Fired counter mortar.
- 290405H: K/4/11, grid AT 879578 received 3 rounds of 60mm mortar. Fired counter mortar.

3. Organization and Operations. Units of the Regiment participated in four (4) operations in the DANANG area during the month of June 1968.

- a. Operation HOUSTON. 1-30 Jun 1968. APPENDIX 2 to ANNEX (C).
- b. Operation ALLENBROOK. 1-30 Jun 1968. APPENDIX 3 to ANNEX (C).
- c. Operation MAMELUKE THRUST. 1-30 Jun 1968. APPENDIX 4 to ANNEX (C).
- d. Operation SWIFT SABER. 6-13 Jun 1968. APPENDIX 5 to ANNEX (C).

4. Training

a. Forward observer training of non-artillery personnel was again conducted this month. Recipients of this training were personnel from the 2nd Combined Action Group, 1st Reconnaissance Battalion and the Division Scout Sniper School. A total of 167 students each received two hours of classroom instructions and from four to six hours of practical instructions.

b. Two officers and twenty-three enlisted Marines attended in-country Division level schools and four officers and twenty-four enlisted Marines attended schools out of country.

c. Twenty-six enlisted Marines were interviewed by a data collection team from Headquarters Marine Corps to collect data on cross-cultural interaction to increase effectiveness of current Republic of Vietnam oriented counterinsurgency training.

d. On 8 June, the 11th Marine Regiment established an ARVN Cannoneer Training Program. Approximately 100 ARVN soldiers have been provided this on-the-job training, qualifying them as 105mm/155mm howitzer (towed) cannoneers.

5. Logistics

During the reporting period the Regiment borrowed ninety-five (95) tractor trailers, three (3) M54 trucks, and three (3) M35 trucks from Division to transport 1,235 tons of ammunition in support of the 11th Marines operational commitments.

A major logistics effort concerned the resupply of the THUONG DUC fire base. During the month, units of the Regiment furnished vehicles to transport 325 tons of ammunition and approximately fifty (50) tons of miscellaneous supplies to THUONG DUC.

On 16 June 1968, Mortar Battery, 1st Battalion, 13th Marines deployed to the DANANG area. Vehicle augmentation was provided by Division to move this unit to its initial firing position.

Other units of the Regiment have continued to provide motor transport support to the 1st Battalion, 13th Marines which does not have its required allowance of vehicles due to combat losses in KHE SANH.

Two (2) 155mm howitzers (SP) M109 had the SEA modification package installed thus completing the program for the Regiment.

Other logistical problems occurring during the month were minor and assistance was rendered where appropriate.

6. Civic Action

MedCaps and emergency medical aid are provided by the Regimental Headquarters Battery in the hamlet of DA SON. Emergency medical care is maintained on an on-call status. MedCap teams visit the hamlet six times a week.

Plywood has been requisitioned for remodelling of the dispensary. Further remodelling of the MedCap unit building has been undertaken to improve the working conditions and appearance of the building.

The retaining wall for the school in DA SON has been completed. The hamlet is now interested in building a fence completely around the school, meeting house and MedCap building. This project will be undertaken as soon as clay bricks can be obtained for this project.

Twenty-five boxes of soap were requisitioned and delivered to DA SON's MedCap unit in order to assist their program. Other medical supplies such as merthiolate spray, bufferine, and congesprine were requisitioned directly from Division G-5.

Two truck-loads of dunnage were taken to the PF compound in DA SON on the 20th of June.

Surveyed cement, available for Civic Action projects, has been requisitioned from Naval Support Activity, DANANG.

7. Air Observation

The 11th Marines Air Observer section personnel flew 62 missions for a total of 78.6 hours. The unit was supported by aircraft from HML-167 Squadron, MAG-16, USMC, based at Marble Mountain Air Facility.

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The unit encountered 2 ground fire incidents with the aircraft taking hits each time. One air observer was WIA (Evac).

8. Northern Sector Defense Command

Northern Sector Defense Command is a rear area defense organization commanded by the Commanding Officer, 11th Marines. During the month of

June, Alert Condition III was executed once, Condition IV, 29 times and Subsector "A" set Condition III on two occasions.

One night-reaction drill was held in the Northern Sector Defense Command with satisfactory results.

There were 283 night recon, ambushes, combat, LP's and security patrols and 142 day combat and recon patrols conducted in the Northern Sector Defense Command

There were no detainees reported during the month. There were 9 incidents of contact with the enemy within the Northern Sector Defense Command resulting in 1 USMC KIA, 1 USMC WIA and 1 USA WIA.

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INSTRUCTIONS FOR KEEPING JOURNAL

1. Heading:

a. Unit or Section:

- (1) Enter designation of unit if this is a unit journal for regiment, air group, or smaller unit.
- (2) Enter designation of section if this is a section journal maintained by a general staff section.

b. Place: Enter coordinates or name of locality.

c. From: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is opened.

d. To: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is closed.

2. Body:

a. Time In:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time information is received within unit. In most instances this would be TOR at unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time information is received within section.

b. Time Out:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time outgoing information is delivered to addressee. In most instances this would be TOD by unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time outgoing message is delivered to originator's communication center for transmittal, or time information is transmitted by releasing section.

c. Serial No.: Number each entry consecutively as information is received by keeper of journal.

d. DTG: Enter date/time group of radio message.

e. Incidents, Messages, Orders:

(1) Important incidents, messages and orders are recorded as they are made known.

(2) Although brief, entries must include all vital elements of information, such as what, where, when, how, and who.

(3) Original entries should not be altered, but should be supplemented or corrected by later entries when necessary.

(4) A synopsis of written or oral messages is entered in the journal, leaving the full account for the journal file and other supporting documents.

(5) Oral messages are reduced to writing and processed like written messages.

f. Action Taken: This column is used to indicate administrative action taken, such as, routing to cognizant unit staff officer(s), dissemination of pertinent information and/or filing of message. Some of the more common symbols used to indicate action taken are: "M", posted on situation map; "S", circulated to unit staff; "T", information disseminated to troops or subordinate units; "F", filed in journal file.

3. Ending:

a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."

b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

4. Journal File:

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.
