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PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During February 1969, the 11th Marines continued to provide supporting fires for the 1st Marine Division in the defense of the Danang Vital Area and in operations in the Quang Nam and Southern Thua Thien Provinces. In addition continued support was provided to Division Reconnaissance Teams, Combined Action Platoons, USA, USN, CIDG, KMC and ARVN forces.

In the early morning hours of 23 February, the enemy Post-TET offensive commenced and continued for the remainder of the month with heavy contact decreasing as the month drew to a close. From 230030 until 230730 Platoon A, 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery and Platoon A, 3rd 155 Gun Battery at An Hoa came under heavy rocket attacks. No injuries were reported but there was heavy damage to living quarters and working areas. At 230200 the 2nd Platoon (-), A Company, Provisional Battalion, 1st Marine Division, including members of Headquarters Battery, 11th Marines was ordered to retake Hill 247 which overlooks the Division Command Post and had been overrun by VC/NVA Forces. After three assaults the Hill was retaken. One SNCO from Headquarters Battery, 11th Marines was killed while leading the assault. At 230230, Battery B, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines and Battery H, 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines came under heavy mortar attacks followed by sapper attack. At the Battery B position, the enemy suffered 10 KIA and 3 wounded who were captured. Battery H killed 22 enemy and captured 1 while losing 4 KIA and 15 WIA. During the night and early hours of 22/23 February OP Condor and OP Eagle were probed but successfully resisted attempts to penetrate their positions, killing at least 2 of the attacking force.

Artillery fires accounted for 264 of the 1079 enemy killed within the Division Area of Operations. A total of 189,793 rounds were expended on 24,269 missions during the month.

Operation Taylor Common continued during the month of February. The operation is supported by the 1st Field Artillery Group in general support of Task Force Yankee. Operation Linn River was terminated on 7 February. The operation was supported by the 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines in direct support of the 7th Marines. For details of Operation Linn River see enclosure (1) of appendix (6) to annex (c).

Improved conventional munitions (FIRECRACKER) continued to be employed throughout the 1st Marine Division TAOR. The Regiment fired 15 FIRECRACKER missions during the month accounting for 40 VC/NVA KIA. All surveillances represent confirmed KIA's and do not include additional probable KIA's. Total FIRECRACKER expenditures for the month were 916 rounds.

On 3 February at 1630, Battery C, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines fired a FIRECRACKER mission on VC in the open at Grid AT 983600, resulting in 12 KIA. The mission was observed by an observer with the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines. On 16 February at 1820, Battery I, 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines fired on 30 VC at grid AT 961569, resulting in 10 KIA. The mission was observed by an observer

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with the 1st Battalion, 7th Marines. On 26 February at 1400, Battery C, 1st Battalion, 13th Marines fired a FIRECRACKER mission on a VC position at grid AT 831547, resulting in 10 KIA. The mission was observed by an observer from the 3rd Battalion, 26th Marines.

Counter-rocket drills continued during the month. Chart drills were conducted unannounced each night and counter-rocket drills were conducted nightly on possible rocket positions.

The enemy initiated ten rocket attacks during the month. The targets included the Danang Air Base, Deep Water Pier, Force Logistics Command, 26th Marines CP, ARVN Ammunition Supply Point and the Danang Bridge Ramp. The average artillery reaction time for counter-rocket fire during these attacks was approximately three minutes.

2. Intelligence

a. During the month of February enemy attacks against artillery units increased from the previous reporting period. A total of 35 small arms fire incidents, 28 mortar attacks, 9 rocket attacks, 6 grenade incidents, 2 recoilless rifle attacks, 2 mine incidents and 1 sapper attack were recorded during the month.

b. The following significant incidents took place during the month of February 1969:

- (1) 090920H 11th Marines (AT 957784) truck received dud Chicom grenade.
- (2) 141730H 11th Marines AO (AT 984543) received small arms fire.
- (3) ~~11th~~ 11th Marines AO (AT 954627) received small arms fire.
- (4) 230200H OP Crowsnest (BT 058708) received small arms fire.
- (5) 230730H 1st FAG (AT 866471) received 15 rounds of mortar fire.
- (6) 230930H Headquarters 1/13 (AT 948755) received 1 rocket round. Surrounding units received 4 additional rounds.

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- (7) 230945H 2/11 (AT 864471) received 1 122mm rocket round.
- (8) 231550H F/2/11 (ZC 047417) received incoming mortar rounds.
- (9) 231615H OP Eagle (AT 932761) engaged enemy force of unknown size.
- (10) 230030 - 230730H 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery and 3rd 155 Gun Battery at An Hoa received enemy rockets at 0030, 0700 and 0730. No MedEvacs were required. Living and working buildings were destroyed.
- (11) 230155H K/4/11 was attacked with mortars followed by a ground attack. Friendly casualties were 2 KIA and 8 WIA. Two M-109's were damaged by RPG fire. Six NVA/VC were found the following morning.
- (12) 230205H H/3/11 was attacked by an estimated 30 enemy sappers. The position perimeter was penetrated and the FDC bunker destroyed. The attack resulted in 4 friendly KIA and 15 WIA. The enemy losses were 22 VC/NVA KIA and 1 VC/NVA POW.
- (13) 230230H Enemy attacked the ammunition dump at An Hoa, resulting in 33,000 artillery rounds destroyed.
- (14) 230230H 1st FAG "B" tower burned due to explosion of ammo dump; 3 friendly WIA.
- (15) 230230H B/1/11 received incoming mortars, followed by enemy ground attack, penetrating B/1/11 position, resulting in 10 NVA KIA and 3 wounded and captured. Two Bravo Battery personnel suffered minor wounds.

- (17) 241055H 1st FAG (ZC 117420) received 15 82mm mortar rounds.

3. Organization and Operations. Units of the Regiment participated in two operations in the Danang area during the month of February 1969. These were:

- a. Operation TAYLOR COMMON, 1-28 Feb 1969. APPENDIX 5 to ANNEX C
- b. Operation LINN RIVER, 1-7 Feb 1969, APPENDIX 6 to ANNEX C.

4. Training

a. Forward observer training of non-artillery personnel was again conducted this month. Recipients of this training were personnel from the 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th Combined Action Groups, 1st Reconnaissance Battalion and the Division Scout Sniper School. A total of 287 students received two hours of classroom instruction and from four to six hours of practical application.

b. During the month 32 enlisted Marines attended a three day period of instruction on the TD-18 at the 1st Engineer Battalion.

c. Two officers and 61 enlisted Marines attended in-country Division level schools and two officers and nine enlisted Marines attended out-of-country schools.

5. Logistics

a. During the period 1-28 February this Regiment was augmented with 47 Tractor-Trailers for the transportation of artillery ammunition. In addition, augmentation was received for movement of eight TD-18/EMCO Tractors within Battalion areas and/or to and from Force Service Regiment.

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b. 24 155mm self propelled M109 guns were received on 10 February 1969. Acceptance checks and calibration were accomplished and the guns placed in operation. Weapon distribution was as follows: 18 for 4th Battalion, 11th Marines and 6 for Kilo Battery, 4th Battalion, 13th Marines.

c. The operators/maintenance course of instruction conducted by 1st Engineer Battalion on the TD-18 Tractor was completed and tractors were placed in an operational status. On 20 February four TD-18 Tractors were released to 1st Marine Division for an operational commitment.

6. Civic Action Report for Headquarters Battery, 11th Marines

Due to the tactical situation in Da Son Hamlet, only 16 MEDCAPS were held during February. A total of 364 patients were treated and four were referred to the USOM Hospital for further treatment. TET gifts were presented to 324 elementary school students of Da Son on 10 February. Funds to purchase the gifts were donated by members of Headquarters Battery, 11th Marines. Solatium Payments totalling 4500VN\$ were paid to two families as a result of injuries caused by vehicles of this Command. Approximately 800 pounds of leftover food were delivered to the Da Son pig project.

7. Air Observation

The 11th Marines AO Unit flew 139 sorties during the month of February in support of the 11th Marines and other 1st Marine Division units, for a total of 314.0 hours of aircraft time with 254.7 hours of AO on-station time.

During the month of February, the 11th Marines Regimental AO Unit was partially supported by aircraft from VMO-2 and MAG-16, which are based at Marble Mountain Air Facility. The unit also had light observation helicopters attached from the 11th Light Infantry Brigade, 196th Light Infantry Brigade, and 198th Light Infantry Brigade, Americal Division, USA. In addition, the AO Unit received support from the 21st Reconnaissance Airplane Company.

Missions flown by the 11th Marine Regiment are as follows:

Mission 6 - Which is an artillery spot mission flown in an OV-10 from VMO-2 based at Marble Mountain Air Facility, further defined as 6B for the morning, 6C for the afternoon, and 6D for evening.

Mission 6 Augment - Which is flown 3 times daily from the 11th Marine Regimental CP and supported by the above listed Army Aviation units.

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21st RAC Mission - Which is flown daily from Marble Mountain Air Facility as a visual reconnaissance mission. Aircraft from the 21st Airplane Reconnaissance Company support this mission.

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8. Northern Sector Defense Command

Northern Sector Defense Command is a rear area defense organization commanded by the Commanding Officer, 11th Marines. During the month of February, Condition 3M was set 21 times, and Condition 2 was set 7 times.

There were 63 daytime recon patrols and 36 daytime combat patrols. There were 9 nighttime recon patrols, 101 nighttime combat patrols and 88 night ambushes. The total patrols for the month of February was 297.

9. Psychological Operations

500 pictures of President THIEU and 400 copies of the III MAF Vietnamese language newspapers were distributed to the people of Da Son. No movies were shown because of the tactical situation and non-availability of equipment.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR KEEPING JOURNAL

1. Heading:

a. Unit or Section:

- (1) Enter designation of unit if this is a unit journal for regiment, air group, or smaller unit.
- (2) Enter designation of section if this is a section journal maintained by a general staff section.

b. Place: Enter coordinates or name of locality.

c. From: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is opened.

d. To: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is closed.

2. Body:

a. Time In:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time information is received within unit. In most instances this would be TOR at unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time information is received within section.

b. Time Out:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time outgoing information is delivered to addressee. In most instances this would be TOD by unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time outgoing message is delivered to originator's communication center for transmittal, or time information is transmitted by releasing section.

c. Serial No.: Number each entry consecutively as information is received by keeper of journal.

d. DTG: Enter date/time group of radio message.

e. Incidents, Messages, Orders:

(1) Important incidents, messages and orders are recorded as they are made known.

(2) Although brief, entries must include all vital elements of information, such as what, where, when, how, and who.

(3) Original entries should not be altered, but should be supplemented or corrected by later entries when necessary.

(4) A synopsis of written or oral messages is entered in the journal, leaving the full account for the journal file and other supporting documents.

(5) Oral messages are reduced to writing and processed like written messages.

f. Action Taken: This column is used to indicate administrative action taken, such as, routing to cognizant unit staff officer(s), dissemination of pertinent information and/or filing of message. Some of the more common symbols used to indicate action taken are: "M", posted on situation map; "S", circulated to unit staff; "T", information disseminated to troops or subordinate units; "F", filed in journal file.

3. Ending:

a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."

b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

4. Journal File:

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.

1. Heading:**a. Unit or Section:**

- (1) Enter designation of unit if this is a unit journal for regiment, air group, or smaller unit.
- (2) Enter designation of section if this is a section journal maintained by a general staff section.

b. Place: Enter coordinates or name of locality.**c. From:** Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is opened.**d. To:** Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is closed.**2. Body:****a. Time In:**

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time information is received within unit. In most instances this would be TOR at unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time information is received within section.

b. Time Out:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time outgoing information is delivered to addressee. In most instances this would be TOD by unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time outgoing message is delivered to originator's communication center for transmittal, or time information is transmitted by releasing section.

c. Serial No.: Number each entry consecutively as information is received by keeper of journal.**d. DTG:** Enter date/time group of radio message.**e. Incidents, Messages, Orders:**

(1) Important incidents, messages and orders are recorded as they are made known.

(2) Although brief, entries must include all vital elements of information, such as what, where, when, how, and who.

(3) Original entries should not be altered, but should be supplemented or corrected by later entries when necessary.

(4) A synopsis of written or oral messages is entered in the journal, leaving the full account for the journal file and other supporting documents.

(5) Oral messages are reduced to writing and processed like written messages.

f. Action Taken: This column is used to indicate administrative action taken, such as, routing to cognizant unit staff officer(s), dissemination of pertinent information and/or filing of message. Some of the more common symbols used to indicate action taken are: "M", posted on situation map; "S", circulated to unit staff; "T", information disseminated to troops or subordinate units; "F", filed in journal file.

3. Ending:

a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."

b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

4. Journal File:

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.
