PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During April 1969, the 11th Marine Regiment continued to provide supporting fires for the 1st Marine Division in the defense of the Danang Vital Area and in other operations in Quang Nam Province. In addition, continued support was provided for Division Reconnaissance Teams, Combined Action Platoons, USA, USN, CIDG, KMC and ARVN forces.

On the 27th, ASP #1 exploded as a result of fire in the dump. Due to numerous large explosions First Armored Amphibian Company, plus all equipment, was evacuated from their CP to OP Hawk. First Armored Amphibian Company and the 4th Battalion, 11th Marines CP received blast and shrapnel damage to outside structures. Most of the damage was repaired; however, assistance was required to rebuild SEA huts and two Butler buildings that were destroyed by concussion and extensive blast damage. 1st 175mm Gun Battery received light to heavy damage to the buildings in their battery area. Equipment incurred minor damage.

On 5 April at 1300, Battery A, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines fired on a suspected enemy position, grid BT 025593, resulting in 14 KIA; the mission was observed by an observer from 3rd Battalion, 1st Marines. On 11 April at 1340, Battery A, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines fired on enemy on the run, grid BT 025592, resulting in 17 KIA; the mission was observed by an observer from 3rd Battalion, 1st Marines. On 21 April at 1920, Battery E, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines; Battery K, 4th Battalion, 13th Marines and 1st Platoon, 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery fired on suspected 150 VC, grid AT 814531, resulting in 40 KIA; the mission was observed by an observer from 11th Marines (SALUTATION 83) and recon team (YEARBOOK). On 21 April at 2010 and 2350, 2nd Platoon, 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery; Battery K, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines and Battery I, 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines fired on 100 VC, grids AT 810525, AT 805507, AT 840523 and AT 823547 resulting in 50 KIA; the missions were observed by an observer from 1st Battalion, 7th Marines. On 27 April at 1340, Platoon A, 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery fired on 15 VC, grid AT 825333 resulting in 14 KIA; the mission was observed by recon team (LUNCHMEAT).

Artillery fires accounted for 280 of the 1026 enemy killed within the Division Area of Operations. A total of 151,697 rounds were expended on 17,350 missions during the month.

Operation Muskogee Meadow commenced on 7 April and terminated at 2400 on 20 April. The operation was supported by 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines in direct support of the 5th Marines. For details of Operation Muskogee Meadow see enclosure (1) of APPENDIX 5 to ANNEX C.

Operation Oklahoma Hills continued through April. The operation is supported by 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines in direct support of the 7th Marines. For details of Operation Oklahoma Hills see enclosure (1) of APPENDIX 6 to ANNEX C.

Improved conventional munitions (FIRECRACKER) continued to be employed throughout the 1st Marine Division TACR. The Regiment fired 10 FIRECRACKER missions during the month accounting for 33 VC/NVA KIA. All surveillances represent confirmed KIA's and do not include additional probable KIA's. Total FIRECRACKER expenditure for the month was 198 rounds.

On 17 April at 0950 Battery F, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines fired a FIRECRACKER mission on 10 VC, grid AT 815472, resulting in 12 KIA. The mission was observed by recon team (NAILBRUSH). On 17 April at 1035 Battery K, 4th Battalion, 13th Marines fired a FIRECRACKER mission on 22 NVA, grid AT 809475, resulting in 20 KIA; this mission was observed by recon team (NAILBRUSH).

Unannounced counter-rocket drills continued during the month. Chart operators, observation post personnel, fire direction centers and gun crews derived benefit from the drills.

The enemy initiated four rocket attacks during the month. The targets included the Danang Air Base, MAG 11, ASP #1, MVSG 17, 1st MAW Ammo dump, Bridge Ramp and Marble Mountain Air Facility. The average artillery reaction time for counter-rocket fire during these attacks was approximately three minutes.

2. Intelligence

a. During the month of April enemy attacks against artillery units decreased from the previous reporting period. A total of 14 small arms fire incidents, nine mortar incidents, two rocket attacks and one grenade incident were recorded for the month.

b. The following significant incidents took place during the month of April 1969:

- (1) 312120H K/4/11 (AT 798553) received 21 mortar rounds.
- (2) 012220H 3/11 (AT 975615) received approximately 30 mortar rounds.
- (3) 012227H 2/11 (An Hoa) received 14 mortar rounds.
- (4) 032150H 3/11 (AT 973689) received unknown type and caliber of explosive.
- (5) 041135H 2/11 (AN HOA) received one 140mm rocket round.
- (6) 132055H 2/11 (AN HOA) received two 82mm mortar rounds.
- (7) 142250H K/4/11 (Hill 65) received 16 82mm mortar rounds.
- (8) 142340H I/3/11 (AT 883579) received unknown number of mortar rounds.

3. Organization and Operations. Units of the Regiment participated in two operations in the Danang area during the month of April 1969. These were:

- a. Operation MUSKOGEE MEADOW, 7-20 Apr 1969. APPENDIX 5 to ANNEX C.
- b. Operation OKLAHOMA HILLS, 1-30 Apr 1969. APPENDIX 6 to ANNEX C.

4. Training

a. Forward observer training for non-artillery personnel was again conducted this month. Recipients of this training were personnel from the Division Scout Sniper School, Combined Action Group and 1st Reconnaissance Battalion. A total of 198 students received two hours of classroom instruction and from four to six hours of practical application.

b. Five officers and 17 enlisted Marines attended in-country Division level schools and one officer and eight enlisted Marines attended out-of-country schools.

- c. An embarkation class was held for Headquarters Battery, 11th Marines.

5. Logistics

a. During the month of April, the Regiment continued participation in Operation OKLAHOMA HILLS and conducted routine operations in the Danang-An Hoa areas.

b. On 12 April the 3rd 155mm Gun Battery was redesignated as the 3rd 175mm Gun Battery. The Division Commander fired the first round followed by the Assistant Chief of Staff (G-4).

c. On 27 April ASP-1 was accidentally ignited and during the following 14 hours exploding munitions rocked the DaNang Vital Area. The cantonment complex at Hill 34 was severely damaged. The 1st Battalion, the 4th Battalion and the 1st 175mm Gun Battery areas all experienced 50% structural damage, but sustained no casualties even though the areas were littered with unexploded ordnance. Repairs were locally initiated and all essential functions continued unhampered.

d. In support of Divisional operations, the Regiment was augmented with 31 Tractor-Trailers and moved over 330 tons of ordnance to forward areas. Additionally, 12 Low-Boy tractor-trailers were provided and moved heavy equipment to and from various positions.

e. The Regiment commenced build-up to 12 Days of Ammunition "on position" on the 30th to alleviate the critical storage space problem due to the ASP-1 disaster.

6. Civic Action Report for Headquarters Battery, 11th Marines

A total of 1146 Vietnamese civilians were treated by MedCap personnel from this unit at the Da Son Hamlet Clinic. Four were referred to the USOM Hospital in Danang for further treatment. Two children began rabies treatment. 22 civilians received dental treatment. 105 pounds of soap (bar type) were distributed during MedCaps. The MedCaps are conducted five times weekly. Daily liaison visits are made with the Hamlet Chief. Material to repair the Hamlet Elementary School damaged by blasts from the ASP-1 explosion has been requested.

7. Air Observation

The 11th Marines AO Unit flew 77 sorties during the month of April in support of the 11th Marines and other 1st Marine Division units, for a total of 227.8 hours of aircraft time and 125.8 hours of AO on-station time.

During the month of April, the 11th Marine Regimental AO Unit was supported by light observation helicopters attached from 198th Light Infantry Brigade, the 11th Light Infantry Brigade and the 123rd Aviation Battalion, Americal Division, USA. In addition, the AO Unit received support from the 1st Platoon, 21st Reconnaissance Airplane Company, which is based at Marble Mountain Air Facility.

Vietnamese language films were shown on five nights during April. Average attendance was 150 Vietnamese. Approximately 1300 leaflets and newspapers were distributed to the local Vietnamese.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR KEEPING JOURNAL

1. Heading:

a. Unit or Section:

- (1) Enter designation of unit if this is a unit journal for regiment, air group, or smaller unit.
- (2) Enter designation of section if this is a section journal maintained by a general staff section.

b. Place: Enter coordinates or name of locality.

c. From: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is opened.

d. To: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is closed.

2. Body:

a. Time In:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time information is received within unit. In most instances this would be TOR at unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time information is received within section.

b. Time Out:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time outgoing information is delivered to addressee. In most instances this would be TOD by unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time outgoing message is delivered to originator's communication center for transmittal, or time information is transmitted by releasing section.

c. Serial No.: Number each entry consecutively as information is received by keeper of journal.

d. DTG: Enter date/time group of radio message.

e. Incidents, Messages, Orders:

(1) Important incidents, messages and orders are recorded as they are made known.

(2) Although brief, entries must include all vital elements of information, such as what, where, when, how, and who.

(3) Original entries should not be altered, but should be supplemented or corrected by later entries when necessary.

(4) A synopsis of written or oral messages is entered in the journal, leaving the full account for the journal file and other supporting documents.

(5) Oral messages are reduced to writing and processed like written messages.

f. Action Taken: This column is used to indicate administrative action taken, such as, routing to cognizant unit staff officer(s), dissemination of pertinent information and/or filing of message. Some of the more common symbols used to indicate action taken are: "M", posted on situation map; "S", circulated to unit staff; "T", information disseminated to troops or subordinate units; "F", filed in journal file.

3. Ending:

a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."

b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

4. Journal File:

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR KEEPING JOURNAL

1. Heading:*a. Unit or Section:*

- (1) Enter designation of unit if this is a unit journal for regiment, air group, or smaller unit.
- (2) Enter designation of section if this is a section journal maintained by a general staff section.

b. Place: Enter coordinates or name of locality.*c. From:* Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is opened.*d. To:* Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is closed.**2. Body:***a. Time In:*

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time information is received within unit. In most instances this would be TOR at unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time information is received within section.

b. Time Out:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time outgoing information is delivered to addressee. In most instances this would be TOD by unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time outgoing message is delivered to originator's communication center for transmittal, or time information is transmitted by releasing section.

c. Serial No.: Number each entry consecutively as information is received by keeper of journal.*d. DTG:* Enter date/time group of radio message.*e. Incidents, Messages, Orders:*

(1) Important incidents, messages and orders are recorded as they are made known.

(2) Although brief, entries must include all vital elements of information, such as what, where, when, how, and who.

(3) Original entries should not be altered, but should be supplemented or corrected by later entries when necessary.

(4) A synopsis of written or oral messages is entered in the journal, leaving the full account for the journal file and other supporting documents.

(5) Oral messages are reduced to writing and processed like written messages.

f. Action Taken: This column is used to indicate administrative action taken, such as, routing to cognizant unit staff officer(s), dissemination of pertinent information and/or filing of message. Some of the more common symbols used to indicate action taken are: "M", posted on situation map; "S", circulated to unit staff; "T", information disseminated to troops or subordinate units; "F", filed in journal file.

3. Ending:

a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."

b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

4. Journal File:

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.
