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PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During June 1969 the 11th Marine Regiment continued to provide supporting fires for the 1st Marine Division (Rein) in defense of the Danang Vital Area and in other operations in Quang Nam Province. In addition, continued support was provided for Division Reconnaissance Teams, Combined Action Platoons, USA, CIDG, KMC and ARVN forces.

Significant events during the month included continued use of the "Lob Bomb" against 11th Marine units, predominantly in the An Hoa area. At 1000 on 15 June, and again at 2300 on 18 June, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines sustained what was suspected to be a 250 pound bomb "lobbed" into their area. During the night of 25 June an 8" round was "lobbed" into the same area from an estimated distance of 1000 meters. There were also two other suspected "Lob Bomb" incidents. At 2145 on 8 June several rounds landed in and around the positions of Batteries "A" and "B", 1st Battalion, 11th Marines. One of the rounds was a dud and was tentatively identified as a 75mm recoilless round. Another round of unknown caliber or type detonated in 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines position on the night of 16 June. There were no friendly casualties or damage as a result of any of these attacks.

At 0230 on the morning of 7 June an estimated 3 sapper platoons consisting of approximately 45 enemy troops attacked the position of the 2nd Platoon, 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery at An Hoa. A short, fierce fire fight resulted in driving off the enemy who left behind 7 KIA's and 2 POW's. There were no friendly casualties.

Though enemy activity has apparently decreased during the month, there has been an increase of mining and the use of surprise firing devices by the enemy, especially in the area supported by the 1st Battalion, 11th Marines as indicated by the following three incidents. On 11 June a surprise firing device exploded between the cab and the bed of a 2½ ton truck from Battery "A" as it was leaving the trash dump. The device apparently had been emplaced by one of the many Vietnamese civilians at the dump, and the incident resulted in one truck badly damaged and 2 Marines WIA, Med-evaced. On the same day a Battery "B" radioman tripped a surprise firing device fashioned from an M26 grenade and was severely wounded. On the afternoon of 17 June an unknown number of enemy ambushed a Battery "A" truck by command detonating two 105mm rounds which were buried in the shoulder of the road. Marines on road security spotted the enemy and drove them off. There were no friendly casualties, and only minor damage to the truck. Enemy casualties were unknown. Later examination showed that the wires leading to the mines were also booby trapped.

On 23 June, operational control of the 3rd Section, 1st Platoon, 1st Armored Amphibian Company was passed to 3rd Antrac Battalion. On 29 June

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at 0600, operational control of Headquarters Battery, 1st Field Artillery Group was passed to the 1st Marine Division for simultaneous passing to the 3d Marine Division.

Artillery fires accounted for 74 of the 1030 confirmed enemy killed within the Division Area of Operations. A total of 184,136 rounds were expended on 15,281 missions during June.

Significant missions: On 4 June at 2015, Battery "K", 4th Battalion, 13th Marines fired on 30 VC at grid AT 994482, resulting in 12 VC KIA reported by Recon Team (GREY PRINCE). On 14 June at 0315, Battery "F", 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines fired an unobserved mission on an intelligence target at grid AT 827483. At first light a patrol from 1st Battalion, 5th Marines found 10 enemy KIA resulting from the mission.

Operation PIPESTONE CANYON continued during the month of June. The operation is supported by 1st Battalion, 11th Marines in direct support of the 1st Marines. For details of Operation PIPESTONE CANYON see enclosure (1) to Appendix 5 to Annex C.

Improved Conventional Munitions (FIRECRACKER) continued to be employed throughout the 1st Marine Division TAOR. The Regiment fired 30 FIRECRACKER missions during the month accounting for 5 VC/NVA KIA and 5 confirmed WIA. All surveillances represent confirmed KIA's and do not include additional probable KIA's. Total FIRECRACKER expenditure for the month was 764 rounds.

Unannounced counter-rocket drills continued during the month. Chart operators, observation post personnel, fire direction center personnel and gun crews derived benefit from the drills.

The enemy initiated 11 rocket attacks on the Danang Vital Area and An Hoa Combat Base during the month. The targets included the Danang Air Base, Force Logistics Command, III MAF Headquarters, Camp Tien-Sha, Naval Support Activity, Deep Water Pier, Hill 55 and the Northern Artillery Cantonment. The average artillery reaction time for counter-rocket fires during these attacks was approximately three minutes.

2. Intelligence

a. During the month of June 1969, there was an increase in the number of rocket attacks against the Danang Vital Area and An Hoa. There was also an increase in booby trap and mining incidents. A total of 4 small arms fire, 3 actual and 2 suspected catapulted bombs, 3 booby trap and one mining incident, and 11 rocket attacks were reported for the month.

b. The following significant events took place during the month of June 1969:

- (1) 070126H: FLC sustained an attack of 5 140mm rockets.
- (2) 070230H: 2nd Platoon, 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery at An Hoa sustained an attack by approximately 45 sappers.
- (3) 070251H: III MAF Headquarters received 5 122mm rockets.
- (4) 070400H: Danang Air Base received 7 122mm rockets.
- (5) 070442H: Danang Air Base received 5 140mm rockets.
- (6) 071020H: 2/11 at An Hoa received approximately 6 140mm rockets.

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(7) 082145H: 1/11 on Operation Pipestone Canyon received several 75mm recoilless rounds. Rounds suspected to have been "lobbed".

(8) 101025H: 2/11 at An Hoa received 3 140mm rockets.

(9) 111100H: A surprise firing device exploded on a B/1/11 truck.

(10) 111827H: FLC and Northern Artillery Cantonment received 5 122mm rockets.

(11) 120100H: OP Crow's Nest received small arms fire.

(12) 130246H: Camp Tien Sha and Naval Support Activity received 7 122mm rockets.

(13) 142313H: K/4/11 at Hill 65 received small arms fire.

(14) 150022H: Deep Water Pier received 7 122mm rockets.

(15) 151000H: 2/11 at An Hoa received a "Lob Bomb" suspected to be a 250 pound bomb.

(16) 162250H: 3/11 at Hill 55 received 2 140mm rockets.

(17) 162330H: OP Crow's Nest received approximately 50 rounds of small arms fire and one fragmentation grenade.

(18) 171520H: VC attempted ambush of A/1/11 M35 truck. Ambush initiated by command detonating two 105mm rounds buried in shoulder of the road.

(19) 182003H: L/4/11 at Hill 55 received 3 2.75 HVAR rockets, which were fired by the enemy using direct fire.

(20) 182300H: 2/11 at An Hoa received a catapulted round, suspected to be a 250 pound bomb.

(21) 230415H: E/2/11 received one hand grenade approximately 50 meters in front of CP # 1.

(22) 252315H: 2/11 at An Hoa received an 8" round catapulted from an estimated 1000 meters away.

3. Organization and Operations. Units of the Regiment participated in Operation PIPESTONE CANYON from 1-30 June 1969. For details see APPENDIX 5 to ANNEX C.

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4. Training

a. Forward observer training for non-artillery personnel was again conducted this month. Recipients of this training were personnel from Force Logistics Command, 2nd Combined Action Group, Division Scout Sniper School and 1st Reconnaissance Battalion. A total of 286 students received two to three hours of classroom instruction and from four to six hours of practical application.

b. One officer and 14 enlisted Marines attended in-country Division level schools and 5 officers and nine enlisted Marines attended out-of-country schools.

5. Logistics

a. During the month of June, participation in Operation Pipestone Canyon continued.

b. Supporting operational firing commitments, the Regiment was augmented with 71 Tractor-Trailers for the movement of over 320 tons of 105mm and 155mm ammunition. This ammunition was delivered to battery positions in the southwestern portion of the Division TACR. In addition, 5 Low-Boys were provided to move tracked vehicle engineer equipment.

6. Civic Action Report for Headquarters Battery, 11th Marines

During the month of June, 1,088 Vietnamese patients were treated at the Da Son Clinic. The Medoap continues to be run five days a week from 1300 to 1500 every day except Wednesday and Sunday. Visits to the German Hospital Ship "HEIGOLAND" were also continued each Wednesday and Sunday. A new elementary school is being planned for Da Son and 45 bags of cement were picked up and delivered to the village by the S-5 Section in conjunction with these plans. The remaining material is to be picked up at a later date.

7. Air Observation

The 11th Marines AO Unit flew 79 sorties during the month of June in support of the 11th Marines and other 1st Marine Division units, for a total of 254.4 hours of aircraft flight time and 132.7 hours of AO on-station time.

During the month of June, the AO unit was supported by light observation helicopters attached from A Company, 123rd Aviation Battalion, Americal Division, USA. In addition, HU-1E gunships from the 282nd Aviation Battalion, USA, were provided as cover aircraft and flew a total of 121.7 hours in support of the 11th Marines AO unit.

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It is estimated that approximately 12 hours of scheduled flight time were lost due to cancellation of 8 scheduled missions. The primary reasons for cancellation can be attributed to aircraft maintenance requirements and weather.

8. Northern Sector Defense Command

Northern Sector Defense Command is a rear area defense organization commanded by the Commanding Officer, 11th Marines. During the month of June, Condition III was set 26 times, and Condition II was set 4 times.

Northern Sector Defense Command patrolling activity during the month included 92 daytime reconnaissance and 30 daytime combat patrols; 129 night combat patrols and 144 night ambushes for a total of 395 patrols and ambushes during the month of June.

9. Psychological Operations

Eleven movies were shown during this reporting period which approximately 700 Vietnamese civilians attended. Leaflets and Vietnamese newspapers were also distributed in conjunction with the psychological operations listed above.

1. Headings:

- a. Unit or Section:
 - (1) Enter designation of unit if this is a unit journal for regiment, air group, or smaller unit.
 - (2) Enter designation of section if this is a section journal maintained by a general staff section.
- b. Place: Enter coordinates or name of locality.
- c. From: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is opened.
- d. To: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is closed.

2. Body:

- a. Time In:
 - (1) Unit Journal. Enter time information is received within unit. In most instances this would be TOR at unit communication center.
 - (2) Section Journal. Enter time information is received within section.
- b. Time Out:
 - (1) Unit Journal. Enter time outgoing information is delivered to addressee. In most instances this would be TOD by unit communication center.
 - (2) Section Journal. Enter time outgoing message is delivered to originator's communication center for transmittal, or time information is transmitted by releasing section.
- c. Serial No.: Number each entry consecutively as information is received by keeper of journal.
- d. DTG: Enter date/time group of radio message.
- e. Incidents, Messages, Orders:
 - (1) Important incidents, messages and orders are recorded as they are made known.
 - (2) Although brief, entries must include all vital elements of information; such as what, where, when, how, and who.
 - (3) Original entries should not be altered, but should be supplemented or corrected by later entries when necessary.
 - (4) A synopsis of written or oral messages is entered in the journal, leaving the full account for the journal file and other supporting documents.
 - (5) Oral messages are reduced to writing and processed like written messages.
- f. Action Taken: This column is used to indicate administrative action taken, such as, routing to cognizant unit staff officer(s), dissemination of pertinent information and/or filing of message. Some of the more common symbols used to indicate action taken are: "M", posted on situation map; "S", circulated to unit staff; "T", information disseminated to troops or subordinate units; "F", filed in journal file.

3. Ending:

- a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."
- b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

4. Journal File:

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.

1. Heading:**a. Unit or Section:**

(1) Enter designation of unit if this is a unit journal for regiment, air group, or smaller unit.

(2) Enter designation of section if this is a section journal maintained by a general staff section.

b. Place: Enter coordinates or name of locality.**c. From:** Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is opened.**d. To:** Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is closed.**2. Body:****a. Time In:**

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time information is received within unit. In most instances this would be TOR at unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time information is received within section.

b. Time Out:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time outgoing information is delivered to addressee. In most instances this would be TOD by unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time outgoing message is delivered to originator's communication center for transmittal, or time information is transmitted by releasing section.

c. Serial No.: Number each entry consecutively as information is received by keeper of journal.**d. DTG:** Enter date/time group of radio message.**e. Incidents, Messages, Orders:**

(1) Important incidents, messages and orders are recorded as they are made known.

(2) Although brief, entries must include all vital elements of information, such as what, where, when, how, and who.

(3) Original entries should not be altered, but should be supplemented or corrected by later entries when necessary.

(4) A synopsis of written or oral messages is entered in the journal, leaving the full account for the journal file and other supporting documents.

(5) Oral messages are reduced to writing and processed like written messages.

f. Action Taken: This column is used to indicate administrative action taken, such as, routing to cognizant unit staff officer(s), dissemination of pertinent information and/or filing of message. Some of the more common symbols used to indicate action taken are: "M", posted on situation map; "S", circulated to unit staff; "T", information disseminated to troops or subordinate units; "F", filed in journal file.

3. Ending:

a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."

b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

4. Journal File:

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.
