NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of August 1969, the 11th Marine Regiment continued to provide close and continuous fire support for the 1st Marine Division (Rein) in the defense of the Danang Vital Area and in other operations throughout the Quang Nam Province. In addition, the 11th Marines continued to provide supporting fires for Division Reconnaissance Teams, Combined Action Platoons, USA, CIDG, KMC and ARVN forces.

The lull in enemy activity, which was first noted during the week of 22 - 28 June and continued throughout the month of July ended abruptly the night of 11 August when the enemy launched varied and multiple attacks against Free World Forces throughout the Quang Nam Province. The enemy made a strong and determined attempt to penetrate the area encompassed by the 1st Division CP, DAI LOC Pass and the 11th Marines CP. The unsuccessful sapper attack on the 11th Marines CP commenced at 0030 on the morning of 12 August resulted in 10 NVA/VC KIA and two POW's, one of which was WIA and the capture of two RPG launchers with eight rounds, three AK-47 rifles, four bangalore torpedoes and 104 Chicom hand grenades. 11th Marines personnel sustained two minor WIA's. During the night of 11 August and the early morning hours of 12 August the enemy had launched five separate rocket, two mortar and one "lob" bomb attacks in such wide spread areas as the DANANG Air Base, the 1st Division CP, Hill 55 and AN HOA Combat Base. The enemy continued a high level of activity which culminated in the early morning hours of 19 August with a particularly vicious sapper attack that succeeded in penetrating the perimeter wire of Echo Battery, Second Battalion, 11th Marines at AN HOA Combat Base. The attack commenced at 190230H, and an estimated 15 NVA were inside the battery area, firing small arms and throwing satchel charges and hand grenades. An enemy force outside the perimeter fired 10 - 15 60mm mortar rounds and 15 - 20 RPG's. One sapper threw a grenade down the muzzle of a 105mm howitzer, damaging the tube and breech block. The attack was successfully repulsed by 190530H. At first light nine NVA bodies were found. The Marines sustained one KIA and 10 WIA, five of which were Med-Evaced. Three Marines were recommended for Silver Stars and ten for Bronze Stars for gallantry in action as a result of that night's battle.

During the month of August the enemy had initiated a total of 14 rocket attacks, nine mortar attacks, six "lob" bombs and two sapper attacks against 11th Marine units and the DANANG Vital Area.

Other significant events during the month of August 1969:

On 8 August Lt. Colonel Corbin J. JOHNSON relieved Colonel Charles E. WALKER as the Commanding Officer of the 11th Marine Regiment at an informal change of command ceremony attended by all subordinate commanders and their Sergeants Major/First Sergeants.

On 15 August the Division extended its operating area south of the QUE SON Mountains. The new AO is bordered on the south by the QUANG-NAM QUANG-TIN Province boundary and is located generally in the QUE SON District. This expansion of the AO necessitated displacing most of the 11th Regiment's Artillery assets. The Third Battalion moved from Hill 55 to LZ's BALDY and ROSS south of the QUE SON Mountains. The First Battalion moved from Hill 34 to Hill 55. The Second Battalion displaced Battery D to Hill 65 in order to support the expanded 5th Marines AO, and the First Battalion, 13th Marines moved Battery B to FSB Six Shooter. The general support artillery assets were moved and reorganized in order to provide the entire Division AO with an equitable artillery mix. However, as those assets include only six 8" howitzers to support four infantry regiments, the Third Battalion was reinforced with two 155mm howitzers (towed) for additional fire support in the QUE SON District. Additional 8" howitzer support has been requested from higher headquarters, in order to provide the desired fire support mix in the expanded area.

A total of 186,449 rounds were expended on 15,272 missions during the month of August 1969. Artillery fires accounted for 259 of the 665 confirmed enemy killed within the Division's area of operations. Also, there were a reported 245 probable enemy KIA's. In addition, 11th Marine units fired 17 missions on a reported 652 NVA/VC and three active mortar positions during the month. Normally the only surveillances possible were "Rounds on target, no observed casualties", due to darkness or the elapsed time between the fire missions and a survey of the target area by aircraft or patrols. Besides the normal fire missions such as contact missions, intelligence targets, rocket and mortar suppression fires, preemptive fires and preparation fires, a considerable amount of artillery was expended in an effort to suppress the effects of the surprise firing devices used extensively by the enemy.

Improved Conventional Munitions (FIRECRACKER) also continued to be employed throughout the 1st Marine Division TAOR. A total of 1979 FIRECRACKER rounds were fired during the month. In addition to normal targets, the improved ammunition was utilized in counter-rocket fires and in a newly developed concept of close in defensive fires for isolated artillery batteries and to pursue the enemy by fire as he attempts to break contact after sapper attacks.

Significant Fire Missions:

At 191810H, a forward observer with 2/7 reported 100 NVA at grid AT 988355. H/2/7 moved into blocking positions and H/3/11 took the enemy under fire resulting in 30 NVA KIA by artillery fire.

At 242000H, 1st Platoon, 1st 175mm Gun Battery; 1st Platoon, 3rd 175mm Gun Battery; 2nd and 3rd Platoons, 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery; Battery K, 4th Battalion, 13th Marines and Battery L, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines fired on 100 NVA/VC at grid BT 000481 reported by Recon Team TURF CLUB, resulting in 27 NVA/VC KIA.

During the month of August 1969 the 11th Marines participated in two named operations; DURHAM PEAK and PIPESTONE CANYON. Operation DURHAM PEAK commenced 20 July by the 5th Marines with the Second Battalion, 11th Marines in direct support, terminated on 13 August. Operation PIPESTONE CANYON, conducted by the First Marines with the First Battalion, 11th Marines in direct support continued through the month of August. For details of Operations DURHAM PEAK and PIPESTONE CANYON see enclosures (1) of Appendix 5 and Appendix 6 respectively to Annex C and the Second Battalion, 11th Marines After Action Report attached.

Unannounced rocket drills continued during the month. Chart operators, observation post personnel, fire direction personnel, gun crews and communications derived benefits and increased skills as a result of these drills.

2. Intelligence

a. There was a marked increase of enemy initiated activity against the Danang Vital Area and 11th Marines units during the month of August 1969, especially during the period of the 12th through the 19th. There were a total of 14 rocket attacks, five of which were directed against the Danang Vital Area. Units of the 11th Marines also sustained nine mortar attacks, six suspected "lob" bomb attacks, two sapper attacks, one other small arms incident and two explosions of undetermined cause.

b. The following significant events occurred during the month of August 1969:

(1) 021220H: A patrol from 1/7 found four bodies and part of a fifth, dressed in NVA uniforms in graves approximately 2 to 3 weeks old, at grid AT 812467. The NVA were apparently killed by artillery fire.

(2) 052130H: An unfused 105mm, apparently catapulted, landed in the perimeter of A/1/11. It did not explode and there were no casualties or damage.

(3) 080345H: W/2/11 received a suspected catapulted bomb of unknown type approximately 125 meters outside the perimeter. No casualties or damage.

(4) 120030H: An unknown number of sappers attempted to penetrate the perimeter of Headquarters Battery, 11th Marines. The attack was successfully repelled, resulting in 10 NVA/VC KIA and two POW's, one of which was WIA. The Marines sustained two minor WIA's. Captured enemy material included two RPG launchers with eight rounds, three AK-47 automatic rifles, four Bangalore torpedoes and 104 Chicom hand grenades.

(5) 120120H: M/4/11 reported that Hill 65 received a large, number of mortar rounds. There were no friendly casualties or damage.

(6) 120150H: 3/11 at Hill 55 sustained an attack of five rounds of unknown origin. Later investigation indicated that at least one of the rounds was a 250 pound aerial bomb that had probably been catapulted into the position. There were no friendly casualties or damage.

(7) 120245H: Headquarters Battalion sustained an attack of approximately four 140mm rockets and an unknown number of 82mm rounds, inflicting minor damage to structures in the area.

(8) 120312H: AN HOA Combat Base received two rockets of unknown caliber inflicting no friendly casualties or damage.

(9) 120420H: 2/11 at AN HOA Combat Base received one rocket of unknown caliber outside the perimeter. There were no friendly casualties or damage.

(10) 120615H: At least six, and possibly more, 140mm rockets impacted in the area encompassed by Headquarters Battery, 11th Marines, Army Flying Crane Unit, 1st Recon Battalion, and Headquarters Battalion. One Butler Building was severely damaged and other structures in the area were slightly damaged.

(11) 120630H: While reconnoitering the village and adjacent agricultural areas to the perimeter, following the previous night's sapper attack, a patrol from Headquarters Battery, 11th Marines found evidence of a prepared rocket or mortar site and prepared harbor sites. Though not tactical, but still significant to command interest, the patrol found and confiscated 228 marijuana cigarettes, 8 boxes of IMMENOCAL and one box of ANSIONAL in the village of DA SON.

(12) 121000H: While patrolling the perimeter wire, at grid AT 982707, a patrol from 4/11 spotted 4 Vietnamese who started running when approached. The patrol gave chase and captured one. The other three, joined by three other Vietnamese who were armed disappeared in a wooded area. The patrol then returned to their unit and turned the detainee over to the Southern Sector Defense Command.

(13) 121630H: 2/11 at AN HOA Combat Base sustained an attack of five 140mm rockets. There were no friendly casualties or damage.

(14) 130405H: Danang Air Base sustained an attack of five to seven 140mm rockets. Two fuel tanks and four buildings were hit by fragments.

(15) 130628H: 2/11 at AN HOA Combat Base received three rockets of unknown caliber. There were no friendly casualties or damage.

(16) 132105H: 3/11 at Hill 55 received what was apparently two recoilless rifle rounds, wounding two Marines, one of which was Med-Evaced.

(17) 132210H: 3/11 at Hill 55 received seven mortar rounds of unknown caliber, sustaining no friendly casualties or damage.

(18) 132215H: Hq/1/11 received approximately 30-40 rounds of small arms and automatic rifle fire. There were no friendly casualties or damage.

(19) 132300H: C/1/11 at grid AT 991675 reported a single explosion in the perimeter wire, 20-30 meters in front of Gun Five, suspected to be a thrown satchel charge. The explosion struck the power line to the perimeter standing lights. There was no other damage, and there were no casualties.

(20) 152130H: B/1/11 at grid BT 069654 reported hearing two explosions just outside their wire. Later investigation proved them to be 105mm rounds which had apparently been catapulted to the position. There were no friendly casualties or damage.

(21) 160210H: The advance party of Mortar Battery, 3/11 at LZ BALDY received approximately ten 60mm mortar rounds inside the perimeter. The party sustained four WIA's who were Med-Evaced.

(22) 172230H: H/3/11 received four incoming 60mm mortar rounds, sustaining no friendly casualties or damage.

(23) 190208H: Marble Mountain Air Facility sustained an attack of seven or eight 122mm rockets. There were two friendly KIA and seven WIA. Sickbay was heavily damaged, and the runway, a fire truck and telephone lines were slightly damaged.

(24) 190230H: E/2/11 at AN HOA Combat Base sustained a strong and determined attack by an unknown number of enemy sappers firing small arms and throwing Chicom grenades and satchel charges. The enemy also fired 10-15 60mm mortar rounds and 15-20 RPG rounds. Approximately 15 sappers penetrated the perimeter. The attack was finally repulsed at 0530H. At first light a total of nine NVA bodies were found. The battery sustained one KIA and 10 WIA, five of which were Med-Evaced. Also one tube and breech block of one gun was damaged from a hand grenade thrown down the tube. The 2nd Platoon of the 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery near the same vicinity also received small arms fire, mortar and RPG's during the battle, resulting in one WIA from the 5th Marine unit.

(25) 190370H: Four NVA were spotted at grid AT 984369 by the OP at LZ ROSS, H/3/11 fired 30 HE rounds resulting in four NVA KIA.

(26) 191010H: 2/11 at AN HOA Combat Base reported receiving seven rockets of unknown caliber resulting in negative friendly casualties or damage.

(27) 191810H: A forward observer with 2/7 reported 100 NVA/VC in vicinity of LZ ROSS. H/2/7 moved into blocking positions and then H/3/11 took the enemy under fire resulting in 30 enemy KIA by artillery fire.

(28) 192000H: 1/3/11 at Hill 55 took what is suspected to be a "lob" bomb burst in the air approximately 150 meters outside the perimeter. There were no friendly casualties or damage.

(29) 190830H: E/2/7 discovered seven NVA bodies freshly killed by artillery at grid BT 015405.

(30) 192230H: 3/11 at LZ BALDY received two 82mm mortar rounds in the perimeter. No friendly casualties or damage.

(31) 201915H: H/3/11 received 16 rounds of 82mm mortar fire inside the perimeter. One gun was damaged, one Marine KIA and seven WIA Med-Evaced.

(32) 202200H: A/1/11 reported a large explosion at grid AT 968685, 600 meters east of friendly position. This was suspected to be an unsuccessful "lob" bomb attempt.

(33) 212307H: The Regimental Southern Metro Station on Hill 55 received an attack of three 140mm rockets. There were one USMC KIA and three WIA. The RAWIN set was heavily damaged (later code Xed), and one hut and one tent were slightly damaged.

(34) 212210H: LZ ROSS received an unknown number of 82mm mortar rounds, RPG's and small arms fire, resulting in two USMC WIA from H/3/11.

(35) 220120H: Hill 55 received two 140mm rockets resulting in one USMC WIA and the destruction of the 1st Marines Chapel and one bunker.

(36) 220135H: Danang Air Base was attacked with ten 122mm rockets, resulting in one KIA, 38 WIA; one living quarters, one storeroom destroyed and two CONEX boxes of foodstuff destroyed; two trucks heavily damaged and two impacts on the runway.

(37) 220215H: L/4/11 reported two large explosions of unknown origin or course at grid AT 966620. Negative casualties or damage.

(38) 220850H: 2/11 at AN HOA Combat Base sustained an attack of four 122mm rockets with delay fuzes resulting in one USMC WIA and the loss of 50 gallons of hydraulic fluid.

(39) 252100H: H/3/11 at LZ ROSS received five 82mm mortar rounds resulting in one WIA Med-Evaced.

3. Organization and Operations

a. Units of the Regiment participated in two operations during the month of August: Operation PIPESTONE CANYON from 1-31 August 1969 and Operation DURHAM PEAK from 1-13 August 1969. For details see Appendixes 5 and 6 to Annex C.

4. Training

a. Forward observer training for non-artillery personnel was again conducted this month. Recipients of this training were personnel from Combined Action Group, Scout Snipers, Force Logistic Command and 1st Reconnaissance Battalion. A total of 450 students received two to three hours of classroom instruction and four to six hours of practical application.

b. Two officers and 23 enlisted Marines attended in-country Division level schools and eight enlisted Marines attended out-of-country schools.

5. Logistics

a. During the reporting period, Operation PIPESTONE CANYON continued, and two direct support battalions and one separate gun battery displaced to new positions in conjunction with realignment of the Division TAOR.

b. It was necessary to increase the ammunition supply rate (rounds per tube per day) for 105mm (DOD A/C C444/C446) from 53.1 to 60.4 and for 107mm (DOD A/C C704) from 2.4 to 2.7 to support expanded Division operational requirements.

c. Supporting operational firing commitments, the Regiment was augmented with three tractor-trailers for the movement of 30 tons of munitions to various artillery positions within the Division TAOR. Additionally, 12 lowboy tractor-trailers were provided to assist in displacement of units, involving movement of tracked vehicles to LZ BAILEY and FSB ROSS.

6. Civic Action Report for Headquarters Battery, 11th Marines

Da Son MEDCAP, held daily from 1300 to 1500 except Sunday and Wednesday, treated 987 villagers this reporting period, 1-31 August.

During the same reporting period, DENT CAP, held concurrently with MEDCAP on Friday, treated 35 villagers with various dental problems.

Da Son villagers completed the remodeling of their elementary school on 26 August. During the past month, S-5, 11th Marines contributed white paint, tin, and lumber to help further the project's completion.

Pham Tieng, village chief of Da Son, departed Da Son on 30 August to travel to Saigon for six weeks of school.

Stray rounds from ASP #1 struck and wounded one woman from Da Son and one villager's cow on 23 August.

After immediate treatment at 1st Medical Battalion, the woman, suffering from a flesh wound of the right calf, was transported to USOM Hospital in Danang, where she remains for further treatment.

An Army veterinarian, also from 1st Medical Battalion, administered to the cow. The veterinarian will re-examine the animal in the near future.

Solatium payments have been made to the woman and to the farmer who owns the cow.

7. Air Observation

The 11th Marines AO unit flew 99 sorties during the month of August in support of the 11th Marines and other 1st Marine Division units. A total of 331.2 hours of aircraft time and 211 hours of AO on station time were recorded.

During the month the AO unit was supported by light observation helicopters attached from A Company, 123rd Aviation Battalion, Americal Division, and O&D aircraft from the 1st Platoon, 21st Reconnaissance Aviation Company, 212th Aviation Battalion, USA. In addition, HU-1E gunships from the 282nd Aviation Battalion, USA, were provided as cover aircraft and flew a total of 120.2 hours in support of the 11th Marines' AO Unit.

8. Northern Sector Defense Command

Northern Sector Defense Command is a rear area defense organization commanded by the Commanding Officer, 11th Marines. During the month of August, Condition III was set 25 times, Condition II was set five times, and Condition I was set one time.

Northern Sector Defense Command patrolling activity during the month of August included 83 daytime reconnaissance and 32 daytime combat patrols and one daytime ambush. 155 nighttime combat patrols, and 143 nighttime ambushes, and one nighttime reconnaissance patrol, for a total of 415 patrols and ambushes during the month of August.

*c. Serial No.: Number each entry consecutively as information is received by keeper of journal.**d. DTG: Enter date/time group of radio message.**e. Incidents, Messages, Orders:*

- (1) Important incidents, messages and orders are recorded as they are made known.

- (2) Although brief, entries must include all vital elements of information, such as what, where, when, how, and who.

- (3) Original entries should not be altered, but should be supplemented or corrected by later entries when necessary.

- (4) A synopsis of written or oral messages is entered in the journal, leaving the full account for the journal file and other supporting documents.

- (5) Oral messages are reduced to writing and processed like written messages.

- f. Action Taken: This column is used to indicate administrative action taken, such as, routing to cognizant unit staff officer(s), dissemination of pertinent information and/or filing of message. Some of the more common symbols used to indicate action taken are: "M", posted on situation map; "S", circulated to unit staff; "T", information disseminated to troops or subordinate units; "F", filed in journal file.*

3. Ending:

- a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."*

- b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.*

4. Journal File:

- Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.*

INSTRUCTIONS FOR KEEPING JOURNAL

1. Heading:

- a. Unit or Section:
 - (1) Enter designation of unit if this is a unit journal for regiment, air group, or smaller unit.
 - (2) Enter designation of section if this is a section journal maintained by a general staff section.
- b. Place: Enter coordinates or name of locality.
- c. From: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is opened.
- d. To: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is closed.

2. Body:

a. Time In:

- (1) Unit Journal. Enter time information is received within unit. In most instances this would be TOR at unit communication center.

- (2) Section Journal. Enter time information is received within section.

b. Time Out:

- (1) Unit Journal. Enter time outgoing information is delivered to addressee. In most instances this would be TOD by unit communication center.

- (2) Section Journal. Enter time outgoing message is delivered to originator's communication center for transmittal, or time information is transmitted by releasing section.

c. Serial No.: Number each entry consecutively as information is received by keeper of journal.

d. DTG: Enter date/time group of radio message.

e. Incidents, Messages, Orders:

- (1) Important incidents, messages and orders are recorded as they are made known.

- (2) Although brief, entries must include all vital elements of information, such as what, where, when, how, and who.

- (3) Original entries should not be altered, but should be supplemented or corrected by later entries when necessary.

- (4) A synopsis of written or oral messages is entered in the journal, leaving the full account for the journal file and other supporting documents.

- (5) Oral messages are reduced to writing and processed like written messages.

- f. Action Taken: This column is used to indicate administrative action taken, such as, routing to cognizant unit staff officer(s), dissemination of pertinent information and/or filing of message. Some of the more common symbols used to indicate action taken are: "M", posted on situation map; "S", circulated to unit staff; "T", information disseminated to troops or subordinate units; "F", filed in journal file.

3. Ending:

- a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."

- b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

4. Journal File:

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.
