NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of September 1969, the 11th Marine Regiment continued to provide close and continuous fire support for the First Marine Division (Rein) in defense of the DA NANG Vital Area and in other operations throughout QUANG NAM Province. In addition, the 11th Marines continued to provide supporting fires for Division and Force Reconnaissance Teams, Combined Action Platoons, USA, CIDG, ROKMC, and ARVN forces.

The month was characterized by a fairly consistent, but relatively low level of enemy activity. The only significant enemy actions were small, scattered and ineffective attacks by fire, with the exception of one unsuccessful sapper attack against the 1st 175mm Gun Battery on the night of 5 September. The attacks by fire against the DA NANG Vital Area and 11th Marine units included 16 rocket attacks, six mortar attacks, three "lob bomb" incidents, five sniping incidents and one command detonated mine. Apparently the enemy has experienced difficulty with fuzing his "lob bombs", since of the 21 bombs "lobbed" into the 11th Marine positions, 15 failed to detonate, including one 250 pound bomb which lodged in a bunker in the Second Battalion, 1st Marines area.

The most significant event in regards to enemy activity occurred on 3 September when the President of North Vietnam, HO CHI MINH, died. In his honor the NVA/VC declared a three day truce. However, there were several violations of that truce by the enemy in the form of sniping incidents, mortar attacks, and several attempted sapper penetrations including the unsuccessful attack on the 1st 175 Gun Battery on the night of 5 September mentioned above.

Various intelligence sources indicated that the enemy would launch a major ground offensive, in commemoration of HO, at the end of the truce. The indicated ground attack did not materialize. However, commencing at 0100 on 6 September the enemy launched over 40 rockets in nine separate attacks, five of which were directed at the DA NANG Air Base. At the same time AN HOA Combat Base sustained an attack of approximately 20 82mm mortar rounds, eight RPG's and 50 rounds of small arms fire.

Though the enemy declined to initiate any further ground troop action, there were many sightings of large groups of NVA/VC made during the month, illustrated by these significant fire missions:

At 1800H, on 2 September, Batteries D and F fired on 20 NVA/VC at grid AT 834410, observed from Hill 200 (Recon OP), resulting in 13 confirmed KIA.

At 2230H, on 2 September, Batteries D and F fired on an estimated 60 NVA/VC at grid AT 845512 observed from Hill 200 (Recon OP), resulting in 20 confirmed KIA.

At 1000H, 3 September, Battery H fired on caves and bunkers at grid AT 984295 observed by an observer from 2/7, resulting in 96 secondary explosions.

At 1847H, 9 September an 11th Marine Aerial Observer sighted an estimated 25 - 30 NVA/VC with assorted weapons and equipment. The helicopter took heavy ground fire at the time of the sighting. While waiting for an artillery mission, the observation ship and its chase gunship took the enemy under fire with their own ordnance and then adjusted artillery fire on the target, resulting in ten confirmed and 15 to 20 probable NVA/VC KIA.

At 0550H, on 10 September, Batteries A and B fired on 35 NVA/VC in the open at grid BT 074635 observed by an observer from 2/1, resulting in nine confirmed enemy KIA and 17 probable KIA.

At 1750H, 13 September, Battery H, fired on 13 NVA/VC at grid BT 006394 observed by an observer from 2/7, resulting in 12 confirmed KIA.

At 0820H, on 22 September, Battery G fired on 30 NVA/VC in the open at grid BT 025504, observed by an observer from 3/7, resulting in six confirmed and 15 probable KIA.

At 1110H, 28 September, a MACV Advisory Team with a Regional Forces unit reported taking small arms fire from an unknown size enemy force at grid BT 087507, and requested fire support from Third Battalion, 11th Marines. Battery I and 81mm mortars from the 7th Marines took the target under fire. The Regional Forces unit then swept the area and discovered 26 NVA KIA. Interrogation of nearby villagers disclosed that the enemy carried off 40 WIA from their village.

Apparently the enemy's goal during September was to collect rice and other foodstuffs, and to establish storage sites before the advent of the seasonal rains expected in October. An extensive rice denial program has been put into effect by the 1st Marine Division and the 11th Marines in an attempt to halt, or at least severely hinder, NVA/VC rice collecting actions. The result of this program is still undetermined, but it is considered to have been somewhat successful.

Other significant events occurring during the month of September 1969:

On 1 September Colonel Don D. EZELL relieved Lt. Col. Corbin J. JOHNSON as the Commanding Officer of the 11th Marine Regiment at an informal change of command ceremony attended by all subordinate commanders and their Sergeants Major/First Sergeants.

Artillery operations in the expanded TAOR south of the QUE SON Mountains was marked by the air mobility of the firing batteries of the Third Battalion, 11th Marines. All of the firing batteries of the Third Battalion were involved in a total of six helicopter operations, in which there were five lifts of 105mm batteries and one lift of a 4.2" mortar platoon. Also in the same area Marine Engineers and SEABEE's continued building bunkers and living spaces in each of the battery positions. Additionally, FSB BUSHWHACK, a new fire support base, was constructed atop a mountain peak in the QUE SON Mountains (VIC BT 016464) and was occupied by a 105mm firing

battery. Construction of FSB BUSHWHACK is part of a plan which includes the selection and preparation of other sites in the QUE SON Mountains which will present a series of mutually supporting fire bases which can be occupied with little or no preparation.

On 11 September, the mission of Battery M, Fourth Battalion, 11th Marines was changed from General Support to General Support/Reinforcing Second Battalion, 11th Marines. At the same time the mission of Second Platoon of the 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery was changed from General Support to General Support/Reinforcing Third Battalion, 11th Marines. On 18 September, the mission of the Second Platoon of the 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery was again changed to General Support/Reinforcing Second Battalion, 11th Marines.

A total of 132,446 rounds were expended on 13,474 missions during the month of September 1969. Artillery fires accounted for 217 of the 501 confirmed kills within the Division's area of operations. Also, there was a reported 314 probable enemy KIA's. The 11th Marine units fired 8 missions on a reported 807 NVA/VC during the month. Of these missions, the only surveillances possible were "Rounds on target, no observed casualties", due to darkness, bad weather, or the elapsed time between the fire missions and a survey of the target area by aircraft or patrols. Besides the normal fire missions, such as contact missions, intelligence targets, rocket and mortar suppression fires, preemptive fires and preparation fires, a considerable amount of artillery was expended in an effort to suppress the effects of the surprise firing devices used extensively by the enemy.

During the month of September 1969, the 11th Marines participated in only one named operation: Operation PIPESTONE CANYON, which was conducted by the 1st Marines, with the First Battalion, 11th Marines in direct support. For details of Operation PIPESTONE CANYON see enclosure (1) of Appendix 5 to Annex C.

Unannounced counter-rocket drills continued nightly throughout the month. Chart operators, observation post personnel, fire direction personnel, gun crews and communicators derived benefits and increased their skills as a result of these drills.

Extensive preparations against the expected heavy rains and possible flooding conditions during the rainy season continued throughout the 11th Marine Regiment.

2. Intelligence

a. The month of September 1969 was characterized by a fairly consistent but relatively low level of activity. The most significant event occurred early in the month when HO CHI MINH, leader of North Vietnam died, presumably of old age. In commemoration, the NVA/VC declared a three day truce. Various intelligence sources indicated that a major offensive in memory of HO would commence at the conclusion of the truce. However, the expected offensive failed to materialize.

During the month, there were 16 rocket attacks, six mortar attacks, three "lob bomb" attacks, five sniper incidents, one mining incident and one sapper attack. The enemy is apparently having difficulty fuzing his "lob bombs", because of the 21 bombs "lobbed" into friendly positions, 15 failed to detonate, including one 250 pound bomb which lodged in a bunker in 2/1's area.

b. The following significant events occurred during the month of September 1969:

(1) 021800H: An artillery observer on Hill 200 spotted 20 NVA at grid AT 835510 and 60 NVA at grid AT 848512. Fire missions resulted in 33 confirmed NVA KIA's.

(2) 030005H: 2/11 at AN HOA Combat Base received sniper fire, resulting in one Marine sustaining a minor wound.

(3) A patrol from Hq Battery, 11th Marines discovered a suspected mortar position at grid AT 957764. A small tree was cut and placed in the ground at an angle pointing at the Division CP. The position and marker were destroyed.

(4) 031300H: An ammunition convoy returning to A/1/11 was hit by sniper fire at grid BT 028640. No casualties; one truck was slightly damaged.

(5) 052305H: A small force of approximately 12 NVA/VC attempted to penetrate the CP position of the 1st 175 Gun Btry at grid AT 984717. They were spotted by the outpost and taken under fire as they approached the defensive wire. Movement in front of the wire continued throughout the night. At first light a patrol from the battery captured an NVA Master Sergeant who was wounded, and they found a small cache of weapons which included three satchel charges, one RPG launcher with two rounds, eight homemade grenades in C-ration cans and an AK-47 magazine with 52 rounds. Interrogation of the prisoner by 1st ITT disclosed that the enemy's mission was to destroy the 175mm guns and as much of the CP as possible. They had expected, but did not receive, mortar support during the attack. No friendly casualties resulted from this action.

(6) 060100H: Seven 140mm rockets impacted at grid AT 948815 near the Northern Artillery Cantonment, resulting in negative casualties or damage.

(7) 060200H: 2/11 at AN HOA Combat Base sustained an attack of approximately 20 rounds of 82mm mortar, eight RPG's and 50 rounds of small arms fire, resulting in 1 USMC KIA and 1 WIA medevaced.

(8) 060800H: CP Crows Nest reported that a CAP patrol discovered four weapons pits and six 122mm rockets, seven 82mm mortar rounds and one Chi Com grenade.

(9) 060152H: Three 122mm rockets impacted in the III MAF area, grid BT 042783 resulting in 57 USMC WIA's, eight buildings partially destroyed and one 2,500 gallon metal tank destroyed.

(10) 060202H: An undetermined number of rockets were fired from suspected grid AT 865812. Impact area unknown.

(11) 060257H: Two 122mm and three 140mm rockets impacted on DA NANG Air Base resulting in 3 minor friendly WIA's, one SEA HUT destroyed, one AF truck slightly damaged and a 5,000 gallon fuel tank punctured causing all the fuel to leak out.

(12) 060325H: Six 140mm rockets and two 122mm rockets impacted on DA NANG Air Base, resulting in four friendly WIA's, and slight damage to a 5,000 gallon fuel tank and one truck.

(13) 060336H: One 140mm rocket impacted on DA NANG Air Base, resulting in no casualties, but heavy damage to two air conditioners.

(14) 061020H: DA NANG Air Base sustained an attack of an unknown number of 140mm rockets, resulting in negative casualties or damage.

(15) 061020H: DAI LA Pass area received three 140mm rockets, resulting in no casualties, but a 7th Engineer rock crusher sustained heavy damage.

(16) 061300H: 2/11 at AN HOA Combat Base sustained an attack of seven 140mm rockets, resulting in negative casualties or damage.

(17) 071545H: 2/11 at AN HOA Combat Base sustained an attack of 6 rockets of undetermined caliber, resulting in negative casualties or damage.

(18) 091650H: A truck from D/2/11, while on a fuel run between Hill's 65 and 34, received sniper fire and sustained a flat tire. Negative casualties.

(19) 091847H: An 11th Marine AO sighted an estimated 25-30 NVA/VC with assorted weapons and equipment. The helicopter took heavy ground fire at the time of sighting. While waiting for an artillery fire mission the observation ship and its chase gunship took the enemy under fire with their own ordnance and then adjusted artillery fire on the target, resulting in 10 confirmed and 15-20 probable NVA KIA.

(20) 111905H: A 2/11 FO with E/2/5 relayed a fire mission from a squad of Marines with an RF unit. The target was 300 NVA/VC with various weapons and packs. The FO's reported surveillance was three secondary explosions, one secondary fire and 125 probable NVA/VC KIA.

(21) 120202H: FLC at grid AT 944793 received five RPG-2's, resulting in negative casualties or damage.

(22) 120315H: 2/11 at AN HOA Combat Base received three rounds of mortar fire of undetermined caliber, resulting in negative casualties or damage.

(23) 121257H: 2/11 at AN HOA Combat Base sustained an impact of three 140mm rockets, resulting in negative casualties or damage.

(24) 122250H: 1/11 at grid AT 969618 received two 105mm artillery shells "lobbed" into their position with negative casualties or damage.

(25) 132115H: B/1/11 reported a multiple "lob bomb" attack in and around their position at grid BT 070655 consisting of 10 105mm rounds and five 155mm artillery rounds and one 250 pound bomb. All but one 105mm round failed to detonate. There were no friendly casualties and only minor

damage when the 250 pound bomb lodged in a bunker.

(26) 140200H: K/4/11 and surrounding units on LZ ROSS sustained an attack of five or six 122mm rockets and one 82mm mortar, resulting in negative casualties or damage.

(27) 141400H: A convoy from 3rd 175 Gun Battery was hit with four RPG's and small arms fire at grid BT 100415, resulting in one USMC WIA and slight damage to one truck.

(28) 150200H: 3/11 at LZ ROSS received four or five 122mm rockets, resulting in negative casualties or damage.

(29) 160020H: LZ ROSS sustained an attack of 50 mortar rounds, resulting in 11 WIA from 11th Marine units and 11 WIA from 2/7.

(30) 190030H: H/3/11 and 2/7 at LZ ROSS sustained an attack of 10 82mm mortar rounds, 24 recoilless rifle rounds and two 122mm rockets resulting in one USMC officer KIA.

(31) 231950H: The enemy fired one LAAW and three bursts of automatic weapon fire on 1/11 CP, resulting in negative casualties or damage.

(32) 240255H: A/1/11 at grid BT 013625 received two "lob bombs" of unknown caliber. One bomb burst in the air, the other detonated on the ground, resulting in negative casualties or damage.

(33) 251000: An NVA sapper surrendered to a wire-laying party from B/1/11 at grid BT 070655. He turned in three M-26 hand grenades and a cartridge belt with three M-16 magazines.

(34) 271530H: A truck from K/4/13, traveling between LZ's BALDY and ROSS, detonated a mine, resulting in no casualties and no damage to the truck.

(35) 271935H: L/4/11 reported two mortar rounds of unknown caliber and small arms fire impacted on NE side of Hill 55. Negative casualties and damage.

(36) 281110H: A MACV Advisory Team with a Regional Forces unit reported taking small arms fire from an unknown size enemy force at grid BT 087507, and requested support from 3/11. Battery I and 81mm mortars from the 7th Marines fired on the target. The Regional Force then swept the area and discovered 26 NVA/VC KIA. Interrogation of villagers disclosed that the enemy carried 40 WIA from the village.

(37) 281926H: One rocket of unknown caliber impacted outside of the wire north of AN HOA Combat Base, resulting in negative casualties or damage.

(38) 292040H: During a fixed wing strike on grid AT 906615 approx-

imately six kilometers west of Hill 55, air crews and ground observers reported large intense secondary fires indicating presence of enemy ammunition supply area.

3. Organization and Operations.

a. Units of the Regiment participated in one operation during the month of September: Operation PIPESTONE CANYON from 1 - 30 September 1969. For details see Appendix 5 to Annex C.

4. Training.

a. Forward observer training for non-artillery personnel was again conducted for the month of September. Recipients of this training were personnel from Combined Action Group, Combined Action Platoon Schools, 1st Engineer Battalion, Scout Snipers and 1st Reconnaissance Battalion. A total of 206 received two to three hours of classroom instruction and four to six hours of practical application.

b. One officer and 29 enlisted Marines attended in-country Division Level schools, and three officers and four enlisted Marines attended out-of-country schools.

5. Logistics.

a. On 26 September 1969, while I/3/11 was involved in a helicopter movement, a 105mm howitzer was dropped from a helicopter. Due to the extensive damage to the piece and the inaccessability of the area the howitzer was destroyed by thermite grenades.

b. It was necessary to increase the ammunition allocation for 105mm (DOD A/C C462) by 950 rounds; for 155mm (DOD A/C 561/62/63) by 200 rounds; for 8" (D684) by 70 rounds. An increase of large enemy sightings and rocket attacks against the DA NANG Vital Area necessitated this increase.

c. Only 3 lowboys were provided by Division to augment transportation for movement of tracked engineer equipment to various locations in the Division TAOR. No vehicles were requested for movement of munitions.

6. Civic Action Report for Headquarters Battery, 11th Marines.

a. On Wednesday, 10 September, a cow injured by stray U.S. rounds from ASP #1 on 23 August died. A claim has been filed against the government for equitable monetary restitution. The woman from Da Son injured in the same incident of 23 August remains at U Son Hospital in DA NANG. She suffered a flesh wound of the right calf. A solatium payment has been made to her by this office.

b. An outing was held in the Da Son Civilian Internal Defense Group compound on Sunday, 14 September. Most notable individuals present were Captain W. F. ELLIS, C.O., 11th Marines, the Hoa Vang District Chief, the Hoa Khanh Hamlet Chief, the Assistant Village Chief of Da Son, and Lt.

G. W. O'NEILL and Staff Sergeant B. HARRIS. Following speeches, Lt. O'NEILL and SSgt. HARRIS were presented certificates of merit for their endeavors in the village of Da Son. Seventy-five Vietnamese and 20 Marines enjoyed steaks, salad, beans, and other refreshments.

c. On Wednesday, 17 September, a boy from the village of Da Son was struck by a motor vehicle from 11th Motor Transport Battalion. He was treated at the 11th Marine RAS and transported to NSA Hospital. Three days later on Sunday, 20 September, the boy died in his sleep. The body was transferred to U Som Hospital in DA NANG where it was picked up by the boy's family and representatives of this office. This office provided transportation and an escort to the village of Ha Lay on Monday, 22 September, enabling the family to bury the boy in the family burial plot.

d. Four-hundred pounds of food were given to the villagers of Da Son on Saturday, 27 September. A meeting was held between members of this office and the Da Son Elementary School teachers to determine the specific school supplies and books needed for that school. On Friday, 26 September, a list was submitted by the headmaster of the school to this office, where it was forwarded to Force Logistics Command for fund approval. On Saturday, 27 September, the request was approved, and the books were purchased from the Ky Son Book Store in DA NANG. A total of 334 books were purchased for 18780\$VN.

e. MEDCAP, held daily except Sunday and Wednesday from 1300 to 1500, treated 1178 villagers during September.

f. DENT CAP, held on Fridays in conjunction with MEDCAP, treated 50 villagers with various denture problems.

7. Air Observation

The 11th Marines AO Unit flew 60 sorties during the month of September in support of the 11th Marines and other 1st Marine Division units. A total of 198.2 hours of aircraft time and 129.0 hours of AO on station time were recorded. This is a decrease from the previous month due to poor flying weather and aircraft mechanical problems.

During the month the AO Unit was supported by light observation helicopters attached from Company A, 123 Aviation Battalion, Americal Division, USA. In addition, UH-1E gunships from the 282nd Aviation Battalion, USA, were provided as cover aircraft and flew a total of 69.2 hours in support of the 11th Marines AO Unit.

c. From: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is opened.

d. To: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is closed.

2. Body:

a. Time In:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time information is received within unit. In most instances this would be TOR at unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time information is received within section.

b. Time Out:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time outgoing information is delivered to addressee. In most instances this would be TOD by unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time outgoing message is delivered to originator's communication center for transmittal, or time information is transmitted by releasing section.

c. Serial No.: Number each entry consecutively as information is received by keeper of journal.

d. DTG: Enter date/time group of radio message.

e. Incidents, Messages, Orders:

(1) Important incidents, messages and orders are recorded as they are made known.

(2) Although brief, entries must include all vital elements of information, such as what, where, when, how, and who.

(3) Original entries should not be altered, but should be supplemented or corrected by later entries when necessary.

(4) A synopsis of written or oral messages is entered in the journal, leaving the full account for the journal file and other supporting documents.

(5) Oral messages are reduced to writing and processed like written messages.

f. Action Taken: This column is used to indicate administrative action taken, such as; routing to cognizant unit staff officer(s), dissemination of pertinent information and/or filing of message. Some of the more common symbols used to indicate action taken are: "M", posted on situation map; "S", circulated to unit staff; "T", information disseminated to troops or subordinate units; "F", filed in journal file.

3. Ending:

a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."

b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

4. Journal File:

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.

1. Heading:**a. Unit or Section:**

(1) Enter designation of unit if this is a unit journal for regiment, air group, or smaller unit.

(2) Enter designation of section if this is a section journal maintained by a general staff section.

b. Place: Enter coordinates or name of locality.**c. From:** Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is opened.**d. To:** Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is closed.**2. Body:****a. Time In:**

(1) Unit Journal: Enter time information is received within unit. In most instances this would be TOR at unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal: Enter time information is received within section.

b. Time Out:

(1) Unit Journal: Enter time outgoing information is delivered to addressee. In most instances this would be TOD by unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal: Enter time outgoing message is delivered to originator's communication center for transmittal, or time information is transmitted by releasing section.

c. Serial No.: Number each entry consecutively as information is received by keeper of journal.**d. DTG:** Enter date/time group of radio message.**e. Incidents, Messages, Orders:**

(1) Important incidents, messages and orders are recorded as they are made known.

(2) Although brief, entries must include all vital elements of information, such as what, where, when, how, and who.

(3) Original entries should not be altered, but should be supplemented or corrected by later entries when necessary.

(4) A synopsis of written or oral messages is entered in the journal, leaving the full account for the journal file and other supporting documents.

(5) Oral messages are reduced to writing and processed like written messages.

f. Action Taken: This column is used to indicate administrative action taken, such as, routing to cognizant unit staff officer(s), dissemination of pertinent information and/or filing of message. Some of the more common symbols used to indicate action taken are: "M", posted on situation map; "S", circulated to unit staff; "T", information disseminated to troops or subordinate units; "F", filed in journal file.

3. Ending:

a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."

b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

4. Journal File:

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.
