**Narrative Summary**

During the month of November 1969, the 11th Marines continued to provide close and continuous fire support for the First Marine Division (Rein) in defense of the DA NANG Vital Area and in other operations throughout QUANG NAM Province. In addition, the 11th Marines continued to provide supporting fires for Division and Force Reconnaissance Teams, Combined Action Platoons, USA, ROKMC, CIDG, and ARVN forces.

The month was characterized by a fairly consistent, but relatively low level of enemy activity. The only significant enemy actions were small, scattered and ineffective attacks by fire. The attacks by fire against the DA NANG Vital Area and 11th Marine Units included one rocket attack, one "Lob Bomb", four small arms incidents, and one road mining incident.

On 110635 November 1969, 26th Marines reported explosions at coordinates AT950758 and AT961753. Crater analysis team investigation disclosed three rockets impacting at AT950758 and one at AT961753. All four were 140mm rockets.

Heavy seasonal rains continued throughout the month causing a general slow down in ground activity throughout the Division's TAOR. During November, apparently one of the enemy's goals continued to be collection of rice and other foodstuff and to establish storage sites. An extensive rice denial program continued in effect for most of the month by the 1st Marine Division and the 11th Marines in an attempt to halt or hinder NVA/VC rice collecting actions and to keep them in the high grounds and mountains.

Previous intelligence sources had indicated that the enemy would launch a major offensive early in November to continue through early December, but this plan failed to materialize. Various intelligence sources now report, and indications support, that the enemy is in Phase I of his winter/spring (TET) offensive. During this phase the enemy plans to gather and store rice, reequip and rearm, and rest his troops for the more active Phases II and III.

Though the enemy declined to initiate any further ground troop action, there were many sightings of large groups of NVA/VC made during the month. In 11 of these sightings there were twenty or more NVA/VC. For a listing of significant fire missions see Part III paragraph (2) Intelligence.

Operation PIPESTONE CANYON, under the control of 1st Marines, and supported by the 1st Battalion, 11th Marines and other 11th Marine units was terminated on 7 November. For details of Operation PIPESTONE CANYON see enclosure (1) of Appendix 5 to Annex C.

During the month, there were no major artillery moves within the Regiment except south of the QUE SON Mountains where Battery I, 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines was helo-lifted from FSB BUSHWHACK to LZ BALDY.

Six Integrated Observation Devices (IOD) are now emplaced throughout the Division TAOR, concentrating on areas of known enemy activity, such as the ARIZONA area and the QUE SON Mountains, and to date have achieved considerable success. This month they have been credited with 463 kills. This amounts to 72 percent of the EKIA's accredited to artillery and 42 percent of all EKIA's in the Division TAOR during November. The last four of the six IOD sets were emplaced and became operational during November. Also, four forward observer teams received one week of instruction and practical application of employment of the IOD during this time period.

11th Marines began calibrating tubes again during the month of November with twenty-two (22) tubes being calibrated.

On 10 November, Headquarters Battery, 11th Marines observed the 194th Anniversary of the Marine Corps with the traditional cake cutting ceremony and dinner.

A total of 169,609 rounds were expended on 17,213 missions during the month of November 1969. Artillery fires accounted for 639 of the 1098 confirmed kills within the Division TAOR during the same period. Besides the normal missions, such as contact missions, intelligence targets, rocket and mortar suppression fires, preemptive fires and preparation fires. A considerable amount of artillery was expended in an effort to suppress the effects of the Surprise Firing Devices used by the enemy.

Unannounced OP and counter-rocket drills continued nightly throughout the month. Chart operators, observation post personnel, fire direction personnel, gun crews and communicators derived invaluable benefits and increased their skills as a result of these drills.

Extensive efforts continued throughout the 11th Marine Regiment to repair damages and to minimize effects of heavy rains and flooding conditions on ordnance, units' facilities, and motor transport during the month of November 1969.

2. Intelligence

a. Enemy activity continued to be characterized by an almost complete lack of overt activity during the month of November 1969. The only significant enemy actions were small, scattered and ineffective attacks by fire. The attacks by fire against the DA NANG Vital Area and 11th Marines units included one rocket attack, one "Lob Bomb" incident, four small arms incidents, and one road mine incident.

b. It was reported in last month's Command Chronology that the enemy would possibly launch many small scale attacks by fire in late October followed by a major offensive effort in early November. This plan did not materialize. Various intelligence sources now report, and indications support, that the enemy is in Phase I of his winter/spring (TET) offensive. During this phase the enemy plans to gather and store rice, reequip and rearm and rest the troops for the more active Phase II and III. The enemy will also avoid significant contact with the FWMAF forces.

c. Though the enemy failed to initiate any further ground action, there were many sightings of groups of NVA/VC made during the reporting period, as illustrated by the following significant fire missions:

### 3. Organization and Operations

a. Units of the 11th Marines participated in one operation during the month of November: Operation PIPESTONE CANYON, from 1-7 November 1969. For details see Appendix 5 to Annex C.

### 4. Training

a. Forward observer training for non-artillery personnel was again conducted during the month of November. Recipients of this training were personnel from Combined Action Group, IOD, Scout Snipers, SEABEES, and 1st Recon Battalion. Personnel. A total of 450 received two to three hours of classroom instruction and four to six hours of practical application.

b. Classes of instruction and practical application on employment of the integrated observation device (IOD) were given to the forward observer teams, which were formed to operate the IOD's. Two one-week training sessions were given, with two teams being trained during each period. Each team consists of one officer and five enlisted Marines. Also one Naval Gunfire Spot Team was trained.

c. During the month 11th Marines sent to Division Schools six officers and 16 enlisted Marines. The officers attended the Officer Leadership and RPS classes while twelve of the enlisted Marines attended Staff NCO or NCO school. Three enlisted Marines also attended the Projectionist school and one attended the Vietnamese Language School.

### 5. Logistics

a. During the month of November a rapid increase in motor vehicle deadline was experienced. This increase was proportionate to the rains of the monsoon. The AN HOA Combat Base and LZ BALDY units were critically affected. Brake shoes, wheel cylinders and radiators became unserviceable very rapidly. Radiator pores became clogged with mud, reducing air circulation which eventually resulted in unserviceable radiators. Brakes and wheel cylinders were seriously worn and damaged by constant submersion in mud and water. Lubrication was greatly affected and parts deterioration rate of universal joints, wheel bearings and seals was excessive.

b. The addition of two 105mm float weapons at both LZ BALDY and AN HOA has contributed greatly to the coverage of weapons in a "down" status during this reporting period. The average deadline rate for this period was 3%.

c. During this reporting period motor transport augmentation was provided by the Division for movement of Class V to FSB LOS BANOS. Additionally, Division transportation was provided to augment organic vehicles in moving Class II and IV supplies to LZ BALDY and AN HOA. The augmentation vehicles aided in overcoming the effects of the monsoon rains which made the roads to LZ BALDY and AN HOA impassable for more than a week at a time.

6. Civic Action Report for Headquarters Battery, 11th Marines

a. Lt W. F. FORESTER, S-5, submitted a report to the CO, 11th Marines Regiment and to Major HENRY, Deputy Commander, Northern Sector Defense Command, concerning the condition of defense procedures of the DA SON Hamlet CIDG. Although there are many areas to be improved upon, this CIDG is considered to be one of the best in the area. This report was compiled during 10 nights of activities in and around DA SON by Lt FORESTER and the CIDG. Major HENRY was instructed to review the situation and act on the report's recommendations. Further action is forthcoming in the form of a CAP unit for DA SON in the near future.

b. On Sunday, 9 November, dedication ceremonies were held at DA SON Elementary School. Speeches were given by a representative of HOA VANG District, the HOA KHANH Village Chief, Col D. D. EZELL, CO, 11th Marines and school officials. Col D. D. EZELL cut a ribbon symbolizing the dedication, and then refreshments were served. Also in attendance were Captains W. F. ELLIS and R. V. OLSON of Headquarters Battery and Lt W. F. FORESTER and SSgt B. HARRIS from the S-5 Section.

c. Cement, bricks and lumber have been procured for the construction of the permanent market place for DA SON Hamlet. This office also assisted in the basics of the construction on 30 November with completion expected approximately 10 December. The original dimensions for each building of 20 meters by  $3\frac{1}{2}$  meters were revised to 15 meters by  $3\frac{1}{2}$  meters so that the buildings would fit the level ground available.

d. Fire wood, in the form of dead trees, was requested by the DA SON Hamlet Chief. The chief specified trees currently on the 11th Marine cantonment and, after obtaining the necessary permission, four trees were cut. More timber will be given to the villagers after the currently lumbered trees are available to be used for firewood. 7th Engineers is providing the use of a chain saw and an operator to assist in the project. Completion will depend on the availability of the saw and the number of workers provided by the hamlet; two weeks are expected for the completion.

e. After supplying building materials to Mr. PHAM DO of the HOA KHANH Vocational Center, this command has not to date, witnessed any effort by said center to rebuild a bridge between DA SON Hamlet and HOA MY (to facilitate easier transportation for DA SON villagers desiring to attend the Vocational Center). Effort will continue to be made to contact Mr. PHAM DO and decide the disposition of this project.

f. Arrangements have been made with 7th Engineers to breed our hamlet's sow with one of their hamlet's boars. One of the litter will be given to the 7th Engineers' hamlet as payment for the breeding service.

g. Two pregnant rabbits have been purchased from the Sacred Heart Convent located near Marble Mountain. The convent has the only successful large-scale rabbit farm in this area and the lineage is excellent. Techniques used at the convent will be used in their program. A good profit can be realized on a herd which can easily be maintained by a single family. Adult rabbits sell for approximately 600 piasters.

h. MEDCAP, held daily, from 1300 to 1500, except Sunday and Wednesday, treated 827 villagers this reporting period.

i. DENTCAP, held on Fridays in conjunction with MEDCAP, treated 30 villagers with various denture problems.

#### 7. Air Observation

The 11th Marines AO Unit flew 88 sorties during the month of November in support of the 11th Marines and other 1st Marine Division units. A total of 226.2 hours of aircraft time and 170.9 hours of AO on station time were recorded.

During the month, the AO unit was supported by light observation helicopters attached from Company A, 123rd Aviation Battalion, Americal Division, USA. In addition, UH-1E gunships from the 282nd Aviation Battalion, USA, were provided as cover aircraft and flew a total of 55.3 hours in support of the 11th Marines AO unit. Also O1-G "Birddogs" were provided for observation and registrations by 21st Reconnaissance Aircraft Company (RAC), USA. 44.8 hours were flown with 21st RAC.

8. Northern Sector Defense Command

a. The Northern Sector Defense Command (NSDC) continued to provide defense security for the northern and western approaches to the DA NANG Vital Area. Included in this area are 23 separate commands of Marine, Navy and Army forces, and 31 Vietnamese hamlets and villages. The terrain is a mixture of hills (highest elevation 364 meters) with heavy scrub brush, flat rice paddy land, separated by villages, and a large expanse adjoining DA NANG Harbor with vast sandy areas. The entire area is over 40,000 square meters in size.

b. NSDC offensive measures during the month of November included the following: 75 daytime combat and reconnaissance patrols; 45 nighttime combat and security patrols; and 356 night ambushes.

c. During the month of November NSDC commenced to eliminate the unnecessary handling of grid clearances and on-call targets which have characterized the supporting arms activities in the past. Target lists were compiled to reflect a flexible capability between each subsector and the fire support actually available. Daily grid clearances were programmed to include the necessary, but not the superfluous.

d. Tactical Alert Condition IV remained in effect throughout the month, except for the night of 30 November when a Modified III was set. This change in alert conditions was prompted by the failure of Vietnamese Nationals to show for nighttime work assignments and a noticeable black-out of all villages and hamlets within NSDC.

e. Enemy contact during the month was light. Monsoon rains are believed to have curtailed most enemy movement. Most significant during this period was the enemy-initiated rocket attack that occurred at 0640H on 11 November. A total of 4 140mm rockets impacted within B subsector, causing minor damage to the 26th Marines' LZ and destroyed one bunker at 1st Motor Transport Battalion. Two Marines occupying the bunker were injured, one seriously, and were med-evacuated. Other enemy activity, particularly on the night of 20-21 November, are believed to be enemy reconnaissance missions which are characteristic of the enemy preparing for future attack.


