PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of February 1970, the 11th Marine Regiment continued to provide close and continuous fire support for the First Marine Division (Rein) in defense of the DA NANG Vital Area and QUANG NAM Province. Additionally, the 11th Marines continued to provide supporting fires for Division and Force Reconnaissance Teams, Combined Action Platoons, USA, ROKMC, CIDG, and ARVN forces.

The month of February 1970 was characterized by a fairly consistent, but relatively low level of enemy activity throughout the 1st Marine Division TAOR. The only significant enemy actions were small scattered and ineffective attacks by fire. There were no rocket or mortar attacks against the DA NANG Vital Area. One rocket attack and one mortar attack were launched against the AN HOA Cantonment vic AT870480 and AT878475.

Weather during the month continued clear and pleasant, lending many opportunities to continue the improvement of the cantonment and to perform needed maintenance on rolling stock.

During February, Headquarters 11th Marines continued to improve their defensive positions by completing a new wire barrier and refurbishing new fighting positions along the perimeter.

The anticipated enemy Post-TET offensive failed to materialize during the month of February 1970 but intelligence sources now indicated that there may be an upsurge in enemy activity during the month of March 1970. The enemy continued his reconnaissance, counter reconnaissance, logistical efforts in an attempt to prepare the battlefield as well as continue his counter pacification activity. However, he did not find the opportunity in the Division TAOR to launch offensive actions.

Although there were few ground assaults, enemy movement was noticeable. There were many sightings of large groups of NVA/VC; 26 separate sightings of 20 or more were made by artillery FO's/AO's.

For a listing of significant fire missions see Part III paragraph (2) Intelligence.

A total of 156,010 rounds were expended on 16,796 missions during the month of February 1970. Artillery fires accounted for 418 of the 723 confirmed kills within the Division TAOR. Besides firing normal missions, such as contact missions, intelligence targets, rocket and mortar suppression fires, pre-emptive fires and preparation fires, artillery was also employed in an effort to neutralize areas containing Surprise Firing Devices used by the enemy.

On 23 February the 5th 175mm Gun Battery (SP) reinforced with the 1st Platoon 5th 8" Howitzer Battery (SP) was ordered to stand down and to turn over six (6) 175mm Guns (SP) and the two (2) 8" Howitzers (SP) to 1st Battalion, 39th Artillery, U.S. Army. Two (2) additional tubes one (1) 175mm Gun (SP) and one (1) 8" Howitzer (SP), which were utilized as "float" guns were returned to Force Service Regiment. The 5th 175mm Gun Battery (SP) fired its last round in Viet Nam at a ceremony attended by the Regimental Commander on 26 February 1970.

There were nine (9) major artillery moves within the Regiment. On 1 February, Battery "I", Third Battalion, Eleventh Marines displaced from FSB RYDER grid AT946344 to LZ ROSS grid BTO27341, this was an exchange of position areas with Battery G, Third Battalion who in turn emplaced at FSB RYDER. On 3 February 1970, 3rd 175mm Gun Battery displaced one (1) gun from NAC AT920800 to HILL 34 AT989714 and two (2) guns from HILL 34 to HILL 65 AT878577. On 5 February, three (3) guns from the 3rd 175mm Gun Battery displaced from HILL 65 to the Northern Artillery Cantonment (NAC). Also on 5 February, three (3) guns from 1st 175mm Gun Battery displaced from NAC to HILL 34. On 15 February Battery "B", First Battalion, Thirteenth Marines displaced from LOS BANOS AT921794 to NAC and Mortar Battery (Prov) First Battalion, Thirteenth Marines four (4) tubes, displaced from LOS BANOS to NAC. On 16 February Battery "B", First Battalion, Thirteenth Marines, displaced from NAC to HILL 65. This completed the moves for the month.

The Regimental Survey Section during the period 6 February to 20 February, established survey control throughout the entire southern portion of the DA NANG Barrier. The area surveyed covered from south of the SON TUY LOAN River grid AT9070 to west of the SONG YEN River vicinity grid AT9564. This work was requested by and performed for the Ground Surveillance Section of 1st Marine Division G-2 Section.

2. Intelligence

a. The enemy began February by launching 139 mortar rounds at friendly positions in a series of widespread, but ineffectual, harassing fire incidents against ARVN and Marine positions. One attack was directed against a resettlement hamlet near AN HOA Combat Base. The first of two rocket attacks occurred on 1 February when a nine round volley of 140mm rockets was directed against AN HOA Combat Base resulting in negative damage. The second rocket attack was four 122mm rockets impacting at TAM KY with negative damage.

b. In the remaining days of the reporting period the enemy continued preparation for the still-scheduled offensive. As his efforts continued to be blunted by Marine offensive activity, the time-frame of the offensive continued to slip.

c. The IOD continued to display outstanding effectiveness this reporting period, accounting for 346 kills with zero friendly casualties.

d. In addition to the above, there were sightings of significant numbers of VC/NVA, as illustrated by the following significant fire missions:

(1) 01073CH: IOD, OP RYDER spotted 40/VC/NVA with packs and rifles moving west on trail vicinity AT938366, enemy appeared to be larger stature than normal. Battery "I", 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines and Battery "K", 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines fired the mission. SURVEILLANCE: 30 KIA.

(2) 02073CH: Six 140mm rockets impacted AT870480. Two 140mm rockets impacted AT878475, counter rocket fired.

3. Organization and Operations. Units of the 11th Marines participated in no major operation during the month of February 1970.

4. Training

a. Artillery forward observer training for non-artillery personnel continued through the month of February 1970. 288 personnel from Force Logistics Command, Combined Action Groups, First Reconnaissance Battalion, 7th Engineers and Headquarters Battalion attended the five classes presented during the month. Each class consisted of two to three hours of classroom instruction and four to six hours of live fire exercises.

b. The 11th Marines sent four officers and 28 enlisted Marines to Division, III MAF and out-of-country schools. Three officers attended Aerial Observer Ejection Seat and Pressurization Training Course and one officer attended the Registered Publications System Course. 13 enlisted Marines attended NCO Leadership School, three attended Basic Ammunition Technician Course, two attended Career Planning and one each attended Vietnamese Language School, Enlisted Embarkation Course, and Infantry Weapons Repair Course.

5. Logistics

a. During February, motor transport augmentation was sufficient except for low bed trucks. The priority placed on movement of Huskies to An Hoa seriously affects the ability of this Command to maintain the tracked vehicles assigned.

b. Engineer support during this period was non-existent. No fork-lifts, front end loaders or road graders were available during the entire month.

c. During this reporting period the Regimental Embarkation Team (1 officer, 3 enlisted men) spent 10 days at Dong Ha Combat Base preparing 5th 175mm Gun Battery (SP) for movement to Da Nang and redeployment to CONUS. All MEDS cards were updated and readied for submission.

6. Civic Action Report for Headquarters Battery, 11th Marines

a. In view of the redeployment of U.S. forces and the increased emphasis placed on Vietnamese participation in all phases of the war, the civic action programs of the battalions and separate batteries of the 11th Marine Regiment have adopted an increasingly more mature and realistic orientation. Emphasis has been transferred from "give-aways" and seemingly limitless American material support to projects funded, organized and maintained by the Vietnamese.

b. This new emphasis is evident in several of the projects conducted by Headquarters Battery, 11th Marines and 1st Battalion, 13th Marines, now operating jointly. In the hamlet of Dai La, seven private citizens joined in a commercial venture to purchase a rice mill. They asked 11th Marines for aid in locating a mill to meet their designs and, after this was done, they pooled 144,000 piasters to buy the equipment. Aside from furnishing transportation, American participation was limited to an advisory role. In another instance, the hamlet of Van Dung requested American Aid in constructing a school. Rather than responding in traditional fashion and giving them the materials for the school, 11th Marines directed them to the GVN authorities. After filing a request through proper government channels they received the materials, a process which greatly bolstered their faith in the Vietnamese government's ability to provide for them. In a true community spirit they then raised, among themselves, 43,000 piasters to pay for masons to build the school. Again American participation was limited to advising and helping the people organize.

c. On January 1, 1970 Headquarters Battery, 11th Marines formed a liaison unit to work in the hamlet of Da Son. From an original purpose of providing increased security for the regimental CP, this program was expanded to become an extremely effective training vehicle for the local Popular Self-Defense Force. Given the dual mission of providing military security for the hamlet and aiding in the Revolutionary Development campaign of I Corps, the unit undertook to advance the level of training and efficiency of the PSDF's. This was accomplished by both practical example in joint patrols and ambushes, and by formal training on the Division quick fire course and rifle range. Popular reaction to the unit has been very favorable and a noticeable improvement has been very favorably observed in the quality of the PSDF's. As with every mature effort to aid, it is the aim of the liaison unit to gradually work itself out of a job preparing the PSDF unit in Da Son to operate in an efficient manner independent of a Marine presence. Projects aiding the economic development of hamlets have been received greater emphasis in the last few months in line with 11th Marines desire to strengthen the self-sufficiency of the Vietnamese people. In particular, attempts have been made to increase vegetable production. Several gardens have been started with the assistance of the Chinese Agricultural Training Mission to demonstrate that vegetables can be raised profitably with little initial expense. At

present, a swine feed test is also being conducted in Da Son to illustrate the benefits of a carefully planned diet. The materials used in the diet are readily available on the local market at a price only very slightly higher than garbage. People in the hamlet have shown great interest in the project and several have begun to feed their animals a diet similar to the one used by us in the project.

d. Medical and Dental Civic Action programs are extensively employed. Working together, Headquarters Battery and 1st Battalion, 13th Marines now conduct 10 Medcaps and 1 Dentcap each week treating on an average of 180 persons. Here, too, the emphasis has been on Vietnamese participation. Medcaps have been conducted jointly with ARVN units and several Vietnamese medical aides have been trained. A particularly striking instance of this effort has been the training of a Vietnamese dental technician now able to perform extractions, injections, diagnosis simple restorations and capable of maintaining dental records. Attempts are being made to have her certified by the Vietnamese government so that her skills will not be lost after the departure of American forces. A fund has also been started to pay for her further professional education.

e. The Civic Action program of the 11th Marine Regiment in accordance with the pacification effort throughout Vietnam, no longer has its goal "winning the hearts and minds" of the Vietnamese people. Instead, it has set itself a more realistic and beneficial goal; helping to prepare the Vietnamese to meet and solve their problems independently.

7. Air Observation

The 11th Marines AO Unit continued to fly sorties during the month of February 1970 in support of the 11th Marines and other 1st Marine Division units. A total of 284.3 hours of AO on-station time were recorded.

During the month, the AO unit was supported by light observation helicopters attached from Company A, 123rd Aviation Battalion, Americal Division, USA. In addition, UH-1E gunships from the 282nd Aviation Battalion, USA were provided as cover aircraft and flew a total of 75.0 hours in support of the 11th Marines AO Unit. OH-6A "Bird Dogs" were provided for observation and registrations by the 21st Reconnaissance Aircraft Company (RAC), USA, 29.3 hours were flown with 21st RAC. To provide additional coverage of the rocket belt, Helicopter Medium Light 167 (HML-167) Squadron provided UH-1E's for observation. 114.9 hours were flown with HML 167.

8. Northern Sector Defense Command (NSDC)

a. The Northern Sector Defense Command is a rear area defense organization commanded by the Commanding Officer of the 11th Marines.

b. During the month of February, enemy activity remained at a very low level around the Da Nang Vital Area. Condition III was set only twice, while condition III (Modified) was set 16 times.

c. The Deputy Commander met with the subsector commanders and Hoa Vang District Officials continually during the month to further improve the coordination of activities and intelligence gathering. Arrangements were made to clear as many grids as possible with Hoa Vang District on a monthly basis.

d. Plans were made for changes in boundaries and responsibilities necessitated by the redeployment of a tenant unit and the entry of new units into the northern sector. Further coordination will be made by the Deputy Commander as the situation becomes more formalized.

e. Attention was devoted during the high threat period of the Tet New Year to the improvement of defensive positions. During the past month there were 29 day recon patrols, 102 day combat patrols, 6 night combat patrols, 352 ambush patrols and 29 night security patrols for a total of 518 activities in February.

9. Psychological Operations

There were no movies shown to the people in the village of DA SON during the month of February 1970.
