PART II

During the month of March 1970, the 11th Marine Regiment continued to provide close and continuous fire support for the First Marine Division (Rein) in defense of the DANANG Vital Area and QUANG NAM Province. Additionally, the 11th Marines continued to provide supporting fires for Division and Force Reconnaissance Teams, Combined Action Platoons, USA, ROKMC, CIDG and ARVN forces.

Enemy activity remained at a relatively low level throughout the 1st Marine Division TAOR. The only significant enemy actions were small scattered and ineffective attacks by fire. There were no rocket attacks or mortar attacks against the DANANG Vital Area. Attacks against other areas within the TAOR consisted of one mortar attack (Hill 55) and 2 lob bomb attacks (Hill 55 and A/1/1 CP).

The anticipated enemy post Tet offensive failed to materialize during the month of March 1970. Intelligence sources indicated that there may be an upsurge in enemy activity during the early portion of April 1970. During the month, the enemy continued his reconnaissance, counter-reconnaissance, and logistical efforts in an attempt to prepare the battlefield as well as continue his counter-pacification activity. The number of enemy ground assaults decreased from the previous month, and sightings of large groups (20 or more) of NVA/VC decreased from 26 in February to 16 in March.

For a listing of significant fire missions see Part III paragraph (2) Intelligence.

Weather during the month continued mild and pleasant, this afforded Headquarters Battery the opportunity to continue the improvement of the cantonment.

A total of 139,870 rounds were expended on 10,046 missions during the month of March 1970. Artillery firing accounted for 207 of the 473 confirmed kills within the Division TAOR. Besides firing normal missions, such as contact missions, intelligence targets, rocket and mortar suppression fires, preemptive fires, and preparation fires; artillery also employed in an effort to neutralize areas containing surprise firing devices used by the enemy.

As part of the PHASE III withdrawal, on 3 March 1970, personnel from the 5th 175mm Gun Battery were transported from DONG HA to DANANG by air. On 4 March, the remainder of the personnel and their equipment were transported to DANANG by water. On 3 March 1970, OPCON was passed from the XXIV Corps to 1st Marine Division (Rein) and simultaneously to the 11th Marines. On 3 March 1970, the 5th 175mm Gun Battery, and platoon "A" of the 5th 8" Battery commenced "stand down" at Hill 34 in DANANG. The battery boarded the USS VANCOUVER on 11 March 1970 and sailed at 1800 enroute to CONUS via Okinawa.

On 6 March 1970, Headquarters Battery, Battery A, Battery C, and Mortar Battery of the 1st Battalion, 13th Marines, were relieved in position by units of the 1st Battalion, 11th Marines and displaced to Hill 34. Battery B and Battery C were assigned the tactical mission of General Support/Reinforcing First Battalion, 11th Marines for the period 7-9 March. During the period 10-19 March the Battalion was at stand down and preparing to embark by aircraft for deployment to CONUS. On 19 March command passed from CG 1st Marine Division to CG 5th Marine Expeditionary Brigade.

On 23 March 1970, the Regimental Survey Section commenced instruction on a 3½ week survey school for the ARVN. The class consists of Officers, NCO's, and enlisted personnel. The classes will include all phases of survey instruction to include field work and completing the course with one week of actual surveying of several ARVN artillery batteries.

There were 22 artillery moves during the month of March 1970. These moves consisted of the 1st Battalion, 13th Marines being relieved in place by the 1st Battalion, 11th Marines. The 1st Battalion, 11th Marines with their Headquarters at the Northern Artillery Cantonment (NAC) grid (AT921793), continued in direct support of the 1st Marine Regiment and the 1st Battalion, 13th Marines moved to Hill 34 for stand down. Other moves were: on 5 March, Platoon "A", 1st 175mm Gun Battery displaced from Hill 34 (AT985719) to NAC (AT920801); on 6 March, Mortar Battery, 2/11 displaced from AN HOA (AT876473) to grid AT865471; Platoon "A" 3rd 175mm Gun Battery displaced from NAC (AT920801) to AN HOA (AT877476); on 6 March, Battery "F", 2/11 displaced from AN HOA (AT864471) to Hill 55 (AT963605) where they temporarily emplaced until 7 March when they emplaced at grid (AT965619); on 7 March, Battery K, 4/13 displaced from NAC to Hill 34 for stand down; on 7 March, Battery L, 4/11 displaced from Hill 55 (AT965619) to NAC (AT921797); on 11 March, Battery H, 3/11 displaced from LZ BALDY (BT131450) to FSB RYDER (AT946344); Battery G, 3/11 displaced from FSB RYDER (AT946344) TO LZ BALDY (BT131450); on 15 March, four (4) guns from Battery I, 3/11 displaced from LZ ROSS (BTO27341) to FSB BUSHWHACK (BT016464). On 21 March, one 155mm towed was displaced from NAC to Hill 270 (AT865681).

On 9 March 1970, CG, XXIV Corps assumed operational control of III MAF and all subordinate units. Prior to and during the transition phase, the CO and S-3 of the 11th Marines conferred often with senior artillery officers of the XXIV Corps to discuss artillery tactics, techniques, and new reporting procedures.

On 25 March Col E. R. REID Jr. relieved Col D. D. EZELL as Commanding Officer, 11th Marines. The Change of Command Ceremony was held at the Northern Artillery Cantonment with the commanding Officers of all subordinate units participating. The Ceremony was viewed by Commanding General, III MAF, Commanding General, 1st Marine Division and visiting dignitaries from other U.S., ROK, and RVN Units.

On 22 March 1970, provisions for a Command and Control Helicopter was approved for the 11th Marines by CG, 1st Marine Division. This will greatly enhance the ability of the command to control and coordinate subordinate

2. Intelligence

a. March 1970 opened with a lull in enemy activity. The only significant enemy actions were small, scattered and ineffective attacks by fire.

b. The IOD with 6 operating teams, further displayed its effectiveness.

3. Organization and Operations. Units of the 11th Marines participated in no major operations during the month of March 1970.

4. Training

a. Artillery forward observer training for non-artillery personnel continued through the month of March 1970. 227 personnel from Force

Logistics Command, Combined Action Group, First Reconnaissance Battalion, 7th Engineers, and Headquarters Battalion attended the eight classes presented during the month. Each class consisted of two to three hours of classroom instruction and four to six hours of live fire exercises.

b. The 11th Marines sent five Officers and 15 enlisted Marines to Division, III MAF, and out-of-country schools. Three Officers attended Jungle Escape Survival Training School, one officer attended Officers Leadership School, and one officer attended Registered Publications System (RPS) course. Six enlisted Marines attended NCO Leadership School, two SNCO's attended SNCO Leadership School, and one enlisted each to RPS, Basic Infantry Weapons Repair, and Ammunition Technician School.

5. Logistics

a. During March, motor transport augmentation by 1st Marine Division was sufficient to resupply outlying units.

b. During this reporting period, final preparations were completed for redeployment of 5th 175mm Gun Battery (SP). This unit embarked and departed RVN at 1800 hours on 12 March 1970. No problems were encountered. 1st Battalion, 13th Marines plus Kilo Battery, 4th Battalion, 13th Marines prepared for redeployment. Upon being inspected by agriculture personnel at the POE, several vehicles were rejected and required re-cleaning. The unit was prepared for embarkation and departed RVN at 0115 hours on 22 March 1970. Lessons Learned pamphlets were prepared, approved and distributed to all units of the regiment. A CMMI courtesy inspection was conducted for 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines and the Embarkation Officer informed of all discrepancies. On 28 March 1970, the CMMI was conducted. Embarkation Rating was Satisfactory with Discrepancies.

c. Services performed by FSR for ordnance maintenance is sufficient. The same services performed by the LSU's are below par. A lack of qualified personnel and repair parts result in unnecessary down time for weapons while contact teams go back and forth to their sites or FSR for repair parts and equipment.

d. During March, DODAG C704, 4.2" Mortar, HE rounds issued by the LSU at BALDY was unserviceable due to corroded extension and damp propelling charges. Division Ammunition Officer was notified and FLSG BRAVO was directed to make appropriate change. FLSG BRAVO sent more of the same to BALDY and this was also unserviceable. As the reporting period ended, this situation still existed.

6. Civic Action

During the past month there have been several changes in the Civil Affairs staff. Both 1st Battalion, 11th Marines and Headquarters Battery, 11th Marines have new S-5's and personnel changes. With the redeployment of 1st Battalion,

13th Marines those hamlets that had been covered by this office have been transferred to 1st Battalion, 11th Marines who occupy 1st Battalion, 13th Marines old position at the Northern Artillery Cantonment.

With the continued interest shown in the Liaison Unit they now have the additional task of being a limited police force. This additional mission with the hamlet people's help has effected the apprehension of many UA and off limits Marines.

In view of the redeployment of U.S. forces continued emphasis is being placed on Vietnamese participation in the civic action programs of the battalions and separate batteries. This emphasis is being centered primarily on getting the Vietnamese to use their own government channels and local businesses.

Through the purchase of a rice mill in Saigon, a local Vietnamese merchant is now stocking this same rice mill. This same firm is also in the process of stocking wheeled tractors which could be put to good use in this part of the country.

One of the individuals involved in the rice mill purchase is also interested in buying a tractor with plow and an insecticide sprayer. He plans on using the tractor for his own use plus hiring out its services to other farmers in the area.

There was a Vietnamese insecticide salesman from DANANG who came out and talked to the farmers in DAI LA about the implementation of insecticides. He seemed quite successful and sold part of his samples, prompting one individual into wanting a sprayer for application.

The pig feed test continues to show the desired results from our diet as compared to the diet most Vietnamese pigs are placed on. We have suffered one setback with a GVN sponsored pig project in DAI LA. An epidemic has wiped out one fifteen pig herd and other herds in the area have suffered considerable losses. Presently we are in the process of trying to get the pig project in DAI LA refunded.

The DAI LA Chief has expressed a desire to build a school and hamlet office. I have instructed him in the proper channels to go through and hopefully he will be able to see the GVN channels at work.

There has been increased participation by the 10th Political Warfare Battalion (ARVN) in our area. They have held eleven Medcaps and shown movies twice in the past month. They now have a regular schedule of hamlets to go to on Medcaps and are doing this on their own without being escorted around by S-5 personnel.

This month also saw the completion of an all Vietnamese Dental Hygiene movie. Assistance was given by the 1st Marine Division photo section in filming and development.

The Civic Action Program continues to emphasize the use of Vietnamese personnel and government channels in all our projects. Difficulty is being encountered in getting the Vietnamese to have faith in their system, but hopefully they will see it work. In our absence their channels will be all there is available.

7. Air Observation

The 11th Marines AO Unit continued to fly sorties during the month of March 1970 in support of the 11th Marines and other 1st Marine Division units. A total of 235.1 hours of AO on station time were recorded.

During the month, the AO unit was supported by light observation helicopters attached from Company A, 123rd Aviation Battalion, Americal Division, USA. In addition, UH-1E gunships from the 282nd Aviation Battalion, USA were provided as cover aircraft and flew a total of 107.6 hours in support of the 11th Marines AO unit. Ol-G "Bird Dogs" were provided for observation and registrations by the 21st Reconnaissance Aircraft Company (RAC) USA, 193 hours were flown with 21st RAC. To provide additional coverage of the rocket belt, Helicopter Medium Light 167 (HML-167) Squadron provided UH-1E's for observation. 51.7 hours were flown with HML-167.

8. Northern Sector Defense Command (NSDC)

During the month of March, Northern Sector Defense Command, 1st Marine Division Rear Area, continued to coordinate the improved defenses of tenant units within the 35 grid squares of responsibility. Tactical alert condition III modified was set nineteen (19) times as a result of intelligence information and small enemy contacts. Subsector Commanders continued

to deny the enemy avenues of approach to the Division Rear Area by scheduling a total of 526 patrol activities. Of these, 361 patrols were conducted during darkness. Subsectors reported nine (9) sightings of enemy movement; four (4) incidents of taking these enemy movements under fire; NSDC patrols were credited with one (1) enemy KIA, one (1) POW, and three (3) detainees; two (2) AK47 enemy weapons and other small articles of equipment were captured; three (3) enemy incidents of throwing grenades at NSDC patrols was reported and two (2) friendly WIA's from enemy small arms fire (AK47).

Two (2) incidents of enemy terrorist were reported which involved one (1) VN female being shot three times in her home and one (1) satchel charge was thrown from two motor bikes resulting in three (3) KIA and twelve (12) WIA Vietnamese civilians.

The Commanding Officer, 9th Engineer Battalion officially assumed command of Subsector "C", NSDC, on 19 March 1970. Colonel E. R. REID Jr. assumed command of the Northern Sector Defense Command on 25 March 1970. The NSDC staff continued to make liaison visits to Vietnamese Government Agencies in order to better coordinate and cooperate the defenses of the Vietnamese people and FVMAF against the insurgent enemy forces.
